PARIS MINISTRY NOW CONTROLS AND AGITATION PASSES AWAY

Question of Church and State Must Be Settled at Once to Forestall People's Action by Ballot.

Paris, Feb. 5.—The new ministry is installed in office on Monday and has chosen president of one group of the senate and Leguay, one of the principal dissidents, as chosen vice-president of the chamber.

Outside the chamber the chief subject of discussion has been the order in which the reforms on the program ought to be submitted to parliament.

Must Be Settled Quickly.

\$2 FROM EVERY LABOR MAN TO FREE TEMPLE FROM DEBT

TIME NOW TO RECIPROCATE

Other Fellows Agitating for Reprisal Duty—Canadian Dealers Favor Free Trade.

At the annual meeting of the National Tea Association in New York on Saturday, President Thomas A. Phelps said:

"We have discovered that our Canadian friends have been seeking trade along the states bordering on the dividing line and underbidding our market. While they have a special duty against all goods coming from the States to Canada of ten per cent, over and above all other duties which they impose from other countries and which they actually forbid our seeking the markets of Canada, we have no such protection.

There is a mistaken idea of expected reciprocity, congress repealed the law which existed for our protection. We find that the re-enactment of this law is absolutely necessary to put us on an equality with our Canadian friends."

According to local opinion from those interested, the protest is reasonable. P. C. Larkin of the "Salada" Company, which does by far the largest trade with the United States, explained that while tea coming into Canada was nominally duty free yet it had the 10 per cent restriction, which was applied to all imports from the United States, whereas Canadian dealers were at liberty to send their goods across the line without duty.

"Our government has been unjust in keeping that 10 per cent duty against tea," declared Mr. Larkin. "My argument is that a merchant should not need protection when he is on an equality with his competitor. But if the dealer can't import and sell to the consumer as cheaply as possible, the Canadian government should have taken that duty off tea in the States and we would then have been in the same relation to the States as they are to us. We have talked of reciprocity, and in this instance where the States are willing we do not meet them half way."

Mr. Phelps said he had on several occasions written to government officials at Ottawa relative to the matter, but without result. He did not think that the removal of the duty would affect the tea trade here.
