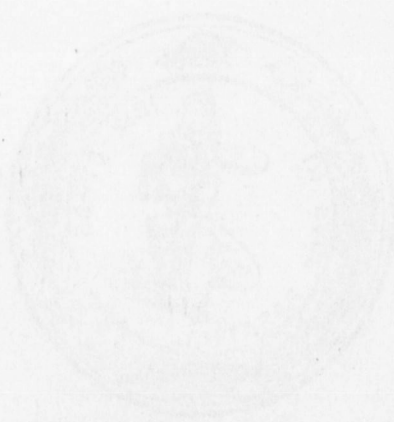

CONSTITUTION AND BY-LAWS

OF THE

ONTARIO RIFLE ASSOCIATION.

CONSTITUTION.

1. That this Association be denominated "The Ontario Rifle Association."
2. Any Person being a subscriber of \$1 per annum, shall become a member of the Association.
3. Donors of \$20 at one time to the funds of the Association, or of a prize of not less than \$40, to be competed for at the annual prize meeting, shall be entitled to be enrolled as life members of the Association.
4. Any Battalion or Rifle Association in the Province subscribing not less than \$10 annually to the funds of the Association, shall be considered as being in connection with it, and shall be entitled to a number of memberships, in the proportion of one to every half-dollar thus subscribed. Each subscribing Association is to elect from its members the persons to hold such memberships, and return their names and addresses, when elected, to the Secretary of the Association, to be registered by him one week previous to the match.
5. There shall be a Patron and Vice-Patrons named by the Council.
The Lieut.-Governor of the Province of Ontario, for the time being, shall be respectfully requested to become "Patron."
6. There shall be a President.
7. There shall be four Vice-Presidents,—one for each Military District.

8. There shall be a Council, composed as follows :—

1st. Four members from each of the Military Districts, who shall be elected primarily at this meeting, and hereafter at the annual meeting.

2nd. The Deputy Adjutants General of Militia.

3rd. The Brigade Majors.

4th. The Presidents of local affiliated Associations and Clubs, being members of the Association,—

Five of whom shall form a quorum ; and in the event of vacancies occurring in the elective members, from any cause whatever, the remaining members of the Council shall have the power of filling such vacancies.

9. The Council shall choose from the members elected the President of the Association.

10. There shall be a Vice-President for each Military District, selected from among the members of the Council for such District, and who shall be elected by the Council.

11. There shall be a Treasurer, and there shall be a Secretary at Toronto, both to be appointed by the Council, and holding office during pleasure.

12. The Council shall have the sole management of the income and funds of the Association, rendering an account to the yearly meeting—such account having been previously audited by a person or persons not members of the Council, who shall be annually named by the Council for that purpose. The Council shall also have the entire management and superintendence of all the affairs and concerns of the Association, and shall or may do all such acts and deeds as shall appear to them necessary or essential to be done for the purpose of carrying into effect the object and views of the Association.

13. The Council shall be regulated in their proceedings by such by-laws as may from time to time be enacted by them ; no by-law being in any case altered, or new one proposed, without at least one month's notice of such intention being given to each member of Council.

14. The annual prize meeting shall be held at such times and places as may be determined on by the Council.

15. The prizes shall be competed for in accordance with such regulations as may be passed by the Council from time to time.

16. An annual report, embracing the audited account of the finances, shall be drawn up by the Secretary, and shall (having been previously submitted to the Council) be published as soon after the prize meeting as may be found practicable.

17. There shall be an annual meeting, to be held at such time and place as shall be selected by the Council.

Secretaries of Rifle Associations affiliated, or desirous of affiliating with the Ontario Rifle Association, will confer a favour by forwarding the names and addresses of the office-bearers of their Associations, as soon after their election as possible, in order that they may be published in the annual report.

BY-LAWS.

The next annual meeting of the Association shall be held at Toronto, on the Third Tuesday in June, 1873.

There shall be two ordinary meetings of the Council; the first of which shall be held on the day after the Annual meeting of the Association, and the second at such other time as the Council may then determine upon.

Extraordinary meetings shall be summoned by the Secretary, if required by any six of the members of the Council—notification being sent to each member of the Council at least ten days previous to such meeting—and the requisition for the meeting, and the notices to the members, must state the object or objects of such extraordinary meetings.

The Council shall keep minutes of its proceedings at all meetings, which shall be entered in a book kept for that purpose by the Secretary, and open to the inspection of any members of the Council.

There shall be a Finance Committee, consisting of three members of the Council.

The Treasurer is authorized to deposit from time to time in the Savings Department of the Ontario Bank, all sums of money paid over to him on behalf of the Association.

All expenditure of sums for current expenses which may be required by the Secretary, must be authorized by the signature of the President of the Association, or, in his absence, by some member

of the Finance Committee, and the Treasurer shall pay all orders duly signed in such manner.

Other expenditures of a general nature are to be made only upon the authority of the Council of the Association.

A detailed statement of all Receipts and Expenditures shall be rendered annually to the Council by the Treasurer.

REPORT OF COUNCIL
OF THE
ONTARIO RIFLE ASSOCIATION,
1872.

In presenting the fifth annual report of the Ontario Rifle Association, your Council have again occasion to congratulate your Association upon the growing interest taken in its objects by the people of Ontario.

They have the pleasure to report a surplus in the Treasurer's hands, and a considerable augmentation of Association property, notwithstanding the increase in the price of labour and material, and the consequently increased expenditure in the preparation of ranges for the annual matches. They believe, however, that in future this most serious annual outlay will be greatly diminished, since the lease by the Ontario Rifle Association of the Garrison Common from the Dominion Government, which, it is confidently hoped, will render the ranges self-supporting.

They have the pleasure to report that His Excellency the Earl of Dufferin, Governor-General of the Dominion, has consented to become a life member of the Association, and the acquisition as life members of a number of gentlemen whose position and influence will tend largely to increase the reputation of the Association, and who will lend their efforts to popularize its objects. They would, however, again urge upon the public the necessity for an increase in annual memberships, which should be the mainstay of the Association. Few of the loyal citizens of Ontario have failed to view with pride the achievements of our Canadian Team at Wimbledon, and have justly considered their success as a national honour; and yet they do not recognize the source from which these victories spring, and by with-

holding their patronage and support, cripple the efforts of your Association to pave the way to further successes, which can only be secured by substantial encouragement to practice, and making the Association a permanent and lasting institution.

Your Council have again to record the liberal annual grants made by the Dominion and Provincial Governments and by the Canada Company, and the annual donations of His Honour the Lieut.-Governor of Ontario and C. S. Gzowski, Esq. They have also occasion to acknowledge the handsome prizes presented by the merchants of Toronto and by Sir Peter Tait, in the Battalion match; for two Martini-Henry rifles presented by J. Prioleau, in the Affiliated Association and Nursery Matches; for the testimonial prizes presented by a Committee of distinguished noblemen and gentlemen during the Mayoralty of Alderman Besley, "to mark the feeling entertained towards the Canadian Active Militia for the loyalty and valour displayed by them in repelling the Fenian attacks on the Dominion;" to E. M. Reilly & Co., Oxford Street, London, for the match rifle presented in the Small-bore Match; and to His Excellency the late Governor-General, Lord Lisgar, for the silver cups presented as Aggregate Score prizes.

They have also to acknowledge the handsome donation of the late T. C. Street, Esq., and to deplore the loss the Association has sustained in the death of a gentleman who took such a lively interest in its welfare, and, as Vice-President and a member of Council, lent his time and efforts to ensure its success.

For the coming year the Council have to acknowledge the munificent donation of £100 stg., from Thomas Brassey, M.P., as a mark of his feeling towards an Association so generously patronized by his father, the late Thomas Brassey, Esq., and in continuation of the memorial prize already established in the Company Match; and to Messrs. Quetton St. George & Co., Ewing & Co., Copp, Clark & Co., W. C. Morrison & Co., J. Adams, and the Gardner Sewing Machine Co., for prizes to be awarded in next year's matches.

Your Council have the satisfaction to report the addition of eight affiliating Associations to their former list, and have reason to hope that eventually every section of the Province will be represented by its local Association. Already the membership by affiliation amounts to over 3,000, and as each association is in active working order, it is hoped that the roll will soon be doubled. The encouragement afforded by the grant and prize offered by your Association is of

marked benefit, and your Council recommend its continuance, and, should circumstances admit, its extension.

The annual matches took place in September, over the Association ranges, and were satisfactorily attended, and carried out without accident. The weather proved most favourable, and the firing was consequently of the highest class. The changes instituted by the Secretary in the register tickets and other details of firing, proved a great saving of time, and would have been an entire success, if the regulations had been strictly adhered to. To ensure a greater saving of time, however, a committee, consisting of Lieut.-Col. Gillmor, Lieut. J. J. Mason, and the Secretary, was appointed to devise such a scheme as would ensure the completion of the match in four days at furthest.

The aggregate value of prizes presented was \$3,222, consisting of \$1,376 in money prizes, \$1,160 in cups, &c., and \$686 in rifles and ammunition, the whole being divided into 163 prizes.

It is a matter of regret that the National Arms and Ammunition Co., from whom the Martini-Henry rifles were ordered, were unable, from pressure of work, to supply them within a reasonable time. It was consequently judged better to pay the value of these prizes in money than expose the winners to further and uncertain delay.

A pleasing feature of the Association matches was the presence of several members of the New York State National Guard as competitors.

Your Council have to record their thanks to Lieut.-Col. Powell, Acting Adjutant-General of Militia, and to Lieut.-Col. French, commanding K Battery, Dominion Artillery, for their courtesy in supplying markers, to whose efficient services much of the success of match was due. The thanks of the Association are also due to Lieut.-Col. R. B. Denison, Executive Officer, and Major W. D. Otter, Range Officer, for the zeal and ability displayed in carrying out their arduous duties; to Lieut. Cotton, A Battery, commanding the markers and police, for his efficient services; to the Managers of the railway companies for their liberality in carrying competitors to and fro at one fare; and to the reporters of the *Leader*, *Globe*, and *Mail*, for their accurate and satisfactory reports of the matches.

To perpetuate the memory of the victory won by Canadians at Wimbledon last year, your Council recommend the publication, in the appendix, of the winning scores in the Imperial Challenge Cup, and Canadian Prizes Matches. They cannot refrain from recording their

appreciation of the noble reception extended towards our representative Riflemen by the National Rifle Association and the people of England.

In the appendix will also be found the "Regulations for the Government of the Ontario Rifle Ranges," approved by the Adjutant General of Militia under the provisions of the Militia Law (31st. Vic. Cap. 40. Sec. 53) which constitutes the Regulations, a By-law, so far as regards the Active Service Militia Force.

Your Council have decided to vote again the bonus of \$20 to affiliating Associations for 1873, on the following conditions, viz.: The amount, together with a special badge provided by the Association, to be awarded to the highest aggregate score made at the Annual Match of the Affiliating Association during the year 1873; upon the condition, that the holder of the badge shall present himself at the Ontario Rifle Association Matches for 1874, to compete in a match provided for the purpose; as a means of ensuring a full representation from affiliating associations, and to establish a nursery for the representation of Ontario at future Dominion and Wimbledon competitions. And upon the farther condition, that an authorized copy of the winning scores at such match be furnished to the Secretary of the Ontario Rifle Association, on or before the 1st November, 1873.

REGULATIONS

FOR THE

GOVERNMENT OF THE ONTARIO RIFLE RANGES, TORONTO.

Approved by the Adjutant-General of Militia, under 31 Vic. cap. 40, sec. 58.

1. The season for rifle practice shall be from 1st of May until the 1st October in each year.
2. The ranges shall be open for practice from 5 to 7 a.m., and from 2 till 7 p.m., daily, weather permitting, Sundays excepted.
3. The following ranges shall be permanently established: For the 2nd Battalion Queen's Own Rifles, 1 range; for the 10th Battalion Royals, 1 range; for the 2nd Brigade Grand Trunk Artillery, Battery of Garrison Artillery, Field Battery, Governor-General's Body Guard 1 range; Toronto Rifle Club and other Clubs, 1 range.
4. The afternoon practice on Mondays and Wednesdays shall be devoted to practice at long ranges (500 yards and over), and shall be confined to the centre ranges. On other days the firing shall not be over 600 yards.
5. No person shall be permitted to fire over the ranges unless in possession of an affiliated membership ticket of the Ontario Rifle Association, except Militiamen in uniform at company and battalion matches, or in the event of any corps being ordered to carry out the annual drill and target practice of the corps at Toronto, when the use of the ground and rifle ranges would be claimed by the Militia Department for the period of time required, and be then under the entire control of that Department.
6. The affiliated membership ticket shall cost 50 cents per annum to each Militiaman joining as a certified member of an existing corps of active service militia; to each person not in the active militia, it shall cost \$1. Such ticket to entitle the holder to the privileges of entry at the Ontario Rifle Association matches, and to the use of the ranges for practice during the season.
7. Should more than one range be required for a company, battalion, or club match, the Secretary shall be notified in writing at least three days before the ranges are required, that he may give

notification (if necessary) that practice on the ranges shall be stopped during the continuance of such match. Upon no other consideration shall a battalion, corps or club be entitled to the use of more than one range, or take possession of, or fire over, any other than the ranges assigned to their use.

8. For company or battalion matches Militiamen may supply their own markers, or, if so desirous, have them supplied by the Association, at the rate of \$1 each per day.

9. All individuals belonging to a battalion, corps or club, attending for practice, shall be accompanied by an officer, or office-bearer of such corps or club, who shall be held responsible that the regulations of the Association are complied with.

10. The officer, non-commissioned officer or office-bearer accompanying such corps or club shall select the distances over which it is intended to fire, and inform the signal man, who will communicate with the marker at the butts.

11. The officer, non-commissioned officer or office-bearer accompanying each corps or club, shall insert in a book provided at the signal office, the date, corps, number of men present, time of practice and complaints (if any) against the employés of the Association, signing his name and rank in full. He shall be responsible that each man firing is a "bona fide" ticket-holder, and entitled to fire over the ranges. Any person knowingly violating this rule shall be guilty of misconduct, and shall be debarred from further competition over the ranges, or at matches of the Association.

12. Should it be desired by any number of qualified persons, not less than ten, to fire over the ranges before the 1st of May, or after the 1st October, they shall be entitled to do so, by giving one day's notice in writing to the Secretary, at the Ontario Rifle Association's stores, Block House, Old Fort, and on payment of markers' wages, in advance. No such notice to be sufficient unless received by the Secretary twenty-four hours before such range is required. Special arrangements will be made, on receiving notice as above, for any number of qualified persons, not less than five, to practice over their respective ranges between the hours of 10 a.m. and 12 noon, daily, during the season, at the rate of 50 c. per hour.

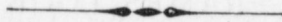
