French War Office Report on the Fighting of Sunday-Very Efficient Markmanship by the Allies

Paris, Jan. 18-The French War Office this afternoon reported:

"From the sea to the Oise, there was, yesterday, a violent storm, particularly in Belgium. The day saw artillery fighting at certain points.

"Near Autreche, to the Northeast of Vic-Sur-Aisne, two German attacks were repulsed. In the sectors of Soissins and of Rheims, there was no change.

"In the region of Perthes there was very efficient markmanship on the part of our artillery on the positions of the enemy.

"In Argonne the German attacks on Hill 263, to the west of Boureuilles, brought no result. We took passession of several German field moreky the start was the

brought no result. We took possession of several German field works to the northwest of Pont-A-Mousson, in the only part of the forest of Le Prete which is still in the hands of the enemy. We here, later, repulsed a counter attack, and maintained all our gains.

FIVE GERMAN STEAMERS HIT MINES IN BALTIC AND SINK


