REPORT OF THE KIRK SESSION.

A faithful survey of our Congregation's record for the last twelve months cannot but stir up feelings of sincere gratitude. God has richly proved to us that He loveth the gates of Zion more than all the dwellings of Jacob, and that it is pleasant to go into His tabernacles and to worship at His footstool. Many of God's people have been edified, and some who were far off have been brought nigh by the faithful preaching of Christ and Him crucified.

The Sacrament of Baptism has been administered to seventeen children. We note with pleasure the high and holy esteem in which this ordinance is held by the parents of the Congregation. Except in cases of sickness this sacred rite is always dispensed publicly in the House of Prayer.

The Sacrament of the Lord's Supper has been administered quarterly to large and devout assemblies of communicants. Ten of our fellow-members have been, during the year, removed to the Eternal Feast of Love in Heaven; thirty-six by change of residence, and thirteen by change of connection have been translated. The gain is sixty-four, and the present number on the roll, which was corrected one year ago, is 754.

The number of contributing families is 335, and the number under pastoral oversight 364.

The In Memoriam list is unusually striking on account of the large number of tried old friends, eminent Christian workers and liberal contributors it contains. In many of them the whole Congregation, as well as the families to which they belonged, realize a painful sense of bereavement. The tenderest dews of grace fall in blessings from the Lord on all

who mourn the loss of that noble band of men and women who have answered to the roll call of the Unseen World.

In this connection it is a simple act of justice to note that the late Mrs. Wm. Clark has crowned her life-long beneficence by a bequest of \$2,500 to the Home and Foreign schemes of the Church. A noble example.

In view of the continued increase in the membership, the Congregation has duly chosen thirteen additional Elders to the Session. We trust that fuller oversight of the spiritual interests of the Congregation will immediately result. Assisted by the Board of Managers, the Elders are making a thorough visitation of the households, and we hope thereby to reach a larger measure of cohesion and coöperation.

We feel, as a congregation, a great loss in the translation of Mr. Andrew Thomson to London South, a gentleman whose ceaseless and self-denying service for the good of the Congregation it is hard to supply. There are indications, however, that his mantle has fallen upon others whom the Lord is raising up in the true Apostolic succession of Christian service.

The annual meeting for the review of Christian work, held on the 14th inst., proved that a large amount of Christian force is at work in the Congregation. Allied to the power of the Holy Spirit wonders shall be accomplished.

Two new societies have been organized during the year.

(a) The Y. P. S. C. E., which has started with great energy and expectations. We pray it may prove a Pentecost to the young people of the Congregation.

(b) The *Sunbeam* F. M. Band of thirty little girls, whose object is "the world for Jesus."

The contributions for all purposes reaches a most encouraging aggregate.

It may be interesting to note that during the fifteen years of the present pastorate, the number of new communicants

THE FORTIETH ANNUAL REPORT

—OF THE—

Board of Managers of St. Andrew's Church

BEING FOR THE YEAR 1890.

1. In presenting the Annual Report the Board of Managers respectfully submit herewith a yearly statement of the weekly offerings received through the means of envelopes, showing the names and amounts contributed by each, and a quarterly summary of the whole, including the amount of Sabbath collections. The yearly Financial Statement of the funds contained in the above is also submitted, showing in detail how the funds were disposed of, and the same verified by the Auditors, whose certificate is attached thereto.

The Reports and Statements of all the Associations connected with the Church are embodied in this Report.

2. During the year many families connected with St. Andrew's were called upon to mourn the loss of dear friends who had been removed from amongst us by death, but we record especially the sudden death of Mr. S. W. Wilson, our esteemed organist, on account of being officially connected with the Church, and express our warmest sympathy with his widow and children.

In consequence of this sad bereavement immediate steps were taken by the Session and Managers to appoint a successor. The matter was placed in the hands of a committee, who in the meantime engaged the services of Mr. Fewings until a permanent organist could be obtained. In response to advertisements several applications had been received for the position, but Mr. C. E. Wheeler's application

having been the most satisfactory, he was unanimously appointed, and took charge of the musical department on the first day of August last.

3. About the middle of May last the Rev. Mr. Murray's failing health caused much anxiety to the congregation, and, on the advice of his physician, he was relieved from his pastoral labors about the beginning of June, and took a trip to the Northwest and British Columbia for the benefit of his health. During his absence his pulpit was ably supplied by the Rev. D. McLeod, of New York, and other clergymen until his return about the end of August, greatly improved in health and strength.

4. In the early part of the spring your Managers having decided to repaint the exterior woodwork of the Church and Manse, called for separate tenders for each, and Mr. A. T. Corp's tenders having been the lowest, the two jobs were awarded to him, and the work done in the fall. The amount of his account, \$280.80, was settled by note at four months.

A communication had been received in the spring from Mrs. Murray, on behalf of the ladies of the congregation, asking permission to put a furnace in the Manse; permission was granted on the terms stated in the letter, and Mr. Stevely was engaged to make a furnace and construct an apartment for its accommodation, which cost \$244.00. The ladies issued circulars and envelopes to members for contributions to defray the expense, but only realized \$39.05 from the transaction. The balance still remains unpaid.

In consequence of the city officials having changed the location of the sidewalk in front of the Church grounds to the outside of the boulevard, the improvement of the grounds necessitated a considerable outlay of money for removing the post and rail fence, for repairing the sodding and for laying down new walks leading to the Church and Manse; and with

some repairs done to both buildings the expense amounted to \$170.00.

5. The Church debt, which amounted to \$2,400 at the last Annual Meeting, has been reduced to \$2,000, and although we have used our utmost endeavors to keep the expenditure within the income, still our liabilities have been creeping up without a corresponding increase in the revenue, and, therefore, it was found impossible to reduce the debt yearly to the extent pledged to the bank. The Finance Committee would therefore recommend that the present Church debt, amounting in all to about \$3,000, be consolidated, and that a loan be procured on a note given by authority of the Church, and that arrangements be made to pay off the same from time to time as funds can be spared, and that no further liabilities be incurred until our present debt is paid.

6. The amount of money contributed during the year for the ordinary revenue is as follows:—Through the means of envelopes \$5,175.13 and by open collections \$522.76, making a total of \$5,697.89, which shows an average per Sunday of \$109.34, being 66 cents less than last year's average. As our liabilities have largely increased during the year in consequence of certain improvements required to be done, which could not be delayed any longer, we trust that all those who are earning money, and have not yet adopted the envelope system of weekly offerings will begin now, and give as the Lord may prosper them, so that at the end of this year your Managers may be able to render a more satisfactory account.

7. The Managers desire to express their appreciation of the efforts put forth by several members of the congregation to establish a branch Sabbath School in the northern part of the city for the convenience of those residing in that direction, and of purchasing a site and of erecting a good and substan-

tial frame building thereon ; and as the funds for the erection of the building were raised by a mortgage on said property, and the yearly interest thereof, say \$120.00, guaranteed by the Congregation for five years, it is to be hoped that with the blessing of God it will prosper and increase in favor and be self-sustaining before the expiration of that time.

8. The thanks of the congregation are due to the Organist and Choir for the efficient manner in which the musical services of the Church have been conducted by them during their incumbency.

The thanks of the congregation are also due to the Ushers and the Auditors for the valuable services rendered by them.

9. The following members of the Board of Managers who now retire from office by rotation are : Messrs. John Marr, Donald McDonald (Talbot St.), John Ferguson, D. A. Denham, J. B. Laidlaw and M. H. Rowland; all of whom are eligible for reëlection.

All of which is respectfully submitted.

ANNUAL REPORT, 1890.

The work of the Sabbath School, considering the accommodation, has, upon the whole, gone on very satisfactorily during the year.

There is a slight increase in the average attendance of boys, and a corresponding decrease in the average attendance of girls, the total average attendance for the year being the same as that of last year. There is a marked improvement in the attendance of the teachers; their average for the year is ninety-three per cent., and speaks well for them:

Besides the above, one class (girls) contributed \$2.06 for the N. W. Mission, and a class of boys contributed \$11.24 for the China Inland Mission. These sums were over and above their regular Sabbath collections, and make the aggregate collected for Missions during the year \$331.07.

The library was thoroughly overhauled, the best books being selected out and repaired. We expended \$56.83 of the Miss Davidson bequest in purchasing 112 new books for it.

We regret to have to record the death of Miss Edith McIntosh, which took place on the 17th of July. She was a member of the senior class and much esteemed by her classmates.

The teachers were supplied with the "Sunday School Times," or the "Westminster Teacher," according to their choice. The scholars have been supplied with the "Sunbeam," "Northern Messenger" and schemes.

On the 8th of July we united with the other Presbyterian schools of the city and held a picnic at Port Stanley. The gathering was one of the largest of the season and was highly enjoyed by those who attended it.

Instead of the usual anniversary we gave the scholars an at home on the evenings of the 15th and 16th of December. The evenings were much enjoyed by the scholars.

We are pleased to note that there has been a great improvement in the singing. This is due largely to the efforts of Miss Muir, our organist, and Mr. Gillespie, our choir leader.

Our thanks are hereby tendered to the Church Choir, the Teachers, Organist, Choir Leader, Librarian, Treasurer, Janitor and Secretary.

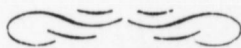

In submitting this Third Annual Report of our North Sabbath School, we desire first to express our thanks to God for the many manifest blessings He has favored us with during the year just closed, and for the many cheering evidences of His direction and guidance in our work that we have had from Him. To His name be all the honor for whatever we have been enabled to do. We also desire to acknowledge the hearty sympathy and generous support we have received from our people, and we hope, and believe, that our work in the north part of the city will prove a blessing, and, we trust, stimulate us to earnest aggressive effort in this and other lines of Christian work, as they may open up to us.

Thus far our work has been attended with gratifying success. The difficulties that seemed to stand in our way a year ago have been providentially removed. Our new building, so convenient and comfortable, has been completed, and on the first Sabbath of November last was dedicated to the service of God, and we now, with an earnest desire to use this building for the Master's honor, look forward to another year of extended privilege and greater usefulness. May our blessed Master fit us all for consecrated service.

Since last report thirty-five scholars have been added to our roll, and twenty-two removed—twenty-one to other parts of the city, and one by death. One officer and three teachers

have been added to our staff, making a total of seventeen in the membership since last report.

In November last a Mission Band and a Band of Hope were organized under very favorable auspices, and we hope to use them for a good work along the lines they represent.

A very pleasing feature of our services has been the frequent letters we have received from our dear friend and associate, Miss Jean Gordon, who went out from us last June to labor in the mission field in India. They have been full of information, fitted to inspire us with more earnest efforts for sending the light of the Gospel to heathen lands.

Our usual anniversary entertainment and midsummer picnic in Queen's Park were held; both were very successful, and were greatly enjoyed by those who participated in them.

Full supplies of the Westminster Lesson Helps are provided for our pupils, along with a copy, weekly, of the Northern Messenger for each family represented, also a copy of the Westminster Teacher, or Sunday School Times, as preferred, to each teacher. We believe these Helps have done good in the way of developing *home study* of the Word of God.

To all our teachers, officers, and those friends who have so kindly co-operated with us, we tender our sincere thanks.

This being done, the constitution and by-laws were adopted at a meeting on October 13th, and officers and a lookout committee appointed out of twenty-three volunteer active members.

The first regular meeting was held October 20th, papers being read on the pledge and the various memberships. Since then the meetings have been held weekly. At the first consecration meeting, on November 28th, thirteen active members were added to the Society, and at December consecration meeting fourteen more were added, the total membership at the New Year being 50 active, 22 associate, and 10 affiliated members.

During the year on which we have now entered we hope to increase largely in membership and in usefulness in Church work.

We have much pleasure in submitting our Annual Report to note what God in His goodness has permitted us to accomplish as a Women's Aid Association.

We have been enabled to assist eleven families belonging to our congregation during the year. A few had their rent paid regularly ; some received occasional assistance ; others whose means were exhausted on account of sickness or want of employment were given temporary relief.

The recipients are all aged people. Most of them are widows who, through no fault of their own, have been left in their old age wholly or largely dependent on the kindness of others. Some of them have been members of St. Andrew's Church for upwards of thirty years. We endeavor, as far as possible, to call on all the families belonging to our congregation once a month. This system of visiting has been the means of fostering a feeling of good-will and fellowship amongst the members of our Church, besides collecting the ten-cent contributions.

We are pleased to be able to state that all the officials of the Church are in full sympathy with the work of the Women's Aid. The Managers allow us the Thanksgiving Offering. The Elders have taken up a collection for the poor at communion seasons.

Our Foreign Mission Work this year has greatly languished, the small attendance each month and lack of interest almost paralyzing the efforts of the officers.

But, convinced that the work was *the Lord's*, we felt the fault must be our own, and that if we used the *right means*, the Living God, who knows the need for earnest individual effort, would certainly bless with success our sincere desire to serve Him in this department of Women's Work.

"Not by might, nor by power, but by my Spirit, saith the Lord;" *therefore* we are not utterly cast down, but now, after our Annual Meeting and reconstruction of methods for the year, are, on the contrary, greatly encouraged at the bright prospect before us!

Last year we were forty-seven members, of whom during the year we lost six by removal to other spheres of usefulness, and three by death, leaving on the old list thirty-eight. Several of the former were most regular, faithful workers, among them Mrs. Thomson, who was with us from the start, twelve years ago, and who now, with her esteemed husband, is counterbalancing our loss by the gain to Knox Church, South London, of their efficient help.

Of those taken from us by death we would reverently mention Mrs. William Gordon, whose ready, Christian activities wherever required had been greatly missed. The other two were Mrs. Clark and Mrs. Strathdee, who, from age and infirmity, expressed their interest by contributions to the cause without attending; but with such a loss—nine in one year—there was reason on the human side for weakness.
