### The Late Lance Corporal Tucker

(Daily News.)

Surgeon Major Macpherson who is apparently once more in London, his letter being dated from the National Club, Whitehall Gardens, S.W., has written a letter to Mr. S. J. Tucker, from which, at our request, we are permitted to take the following extracts. It is dated Oct. 28th. To the sorrowing parents the letter must be a profound consolation. The young Corporal nobly did his duty, paying the price of citizenship and loyalty to Empire and Humanity with his life; and paying it without grudge or regret. The message he leaves is one that will ring out in every hamlet in the Island:—"I would rather be in the condition I am," said the dying hero, "than to have failed to fight for my country." It is because of these words, faithfully recorded by his kind and sympathetic physician, that we urged permission to publish the following extracts. Lance-Corporal Tucker did not live to achieve victory over the foes of Humanity, but he did achieve the greatest victory that man can achieve, the triumph over self, through service, and over the final enemy. "O death, where is thy sting? O grave, where is thy victory?" are questions rarely asked by the young. Walter Tucker may not have asked the questions in words, but he answered them unconsciously. He had done his duty and was content to leave the issue in the hands of his God. Dr. Macpherson's letter will be a precious memory to the parents and family. He writes, in part, as follows:

"I fear to-day has brought you a most painful message by telegraph, that my letter is not breaking to you the sad news of your son's death. I only wish while offering you my deepest sympathy, to tell you that I was with him a great deal during the voyage, and wrote for him the enclosed letter, which was to be continued as he improved. I was with him during his last two hours. He was conscious up to within about 20 minutes of his passing, and could say a few words. From the time of his operation I had spent a good deal of time with him and had watched him closely. Colonel Low, Consulting Surgeon to the Forces, a noted London surgeon, who had performed the operation, also watched him. The piece of shell had passed through the ribs and formed an abscess, which was drained at the operation, but the poor boy succumbed to general peritonitis, though for a while we had great hopes for him.

"On Monday morning I did not like his look, and Monday afternoon I could see he was collapsing. I thought it best to tell him of his condition, and I am glad that I did, for he had not thought he was dying, and I should not have had any message for you. I asked him what he wished me to tell you. His exclamation was: "This will be a wonderful surprise for Mom." A little later he said to tell you that he would rather be in the condition he then was than to have failed to fight for his country. Later he gave me to understand that he was quite prepared for the end, that he had felt this might be the outcome from the day he volunteered. Then finally that it meant Heaven, but the sooner, where he hoped some day to meet you."

### Sensational Arrest Made Saturday

Detective Byrne arrested the former at his home, in the city, and the latter was apprehended by Inspector Bartlett at Bay of Islands and came here by the express Saturday afternoon. Mr. W. J. Higgins has been retained as Counsel for both the accused and obtained bail for them Saturday afternoon, sureties in \$2500 each having been accepted from Hons. M. G. Winter and P. Templeman, and Messrs. R. Wright and J. Sollars.

The accused each gave \$5000, the aggregate bail being \$20,000. The bonds hold good until Monday next, 29th inst., when the preliminary on inquiry will take place. We hear today that three others will be arrested in connection with this case. They are members of the crew of the schooner, and warrants have been issued against them.—Mail and Advocate.

### NEWFOUNDLAND POSTAL TELEGRAPH SERVICE.

POSTAL TELEGRAPH OFFICES are operated throughout the Colony at all the principal places. Messages of ten words, not including address or signature, are forwarded for twenty cents, and two cents for each additional word. A Government cable to Camp, Cape St. John's, connects with the Commercial Cable Co.'s system to all parts of the world. There is no more efficient Telegraphic Service in existence.

A ten word message to Canada, exclusive of signature and address, costs from 85 cents to \$1.00.

A ten word message to the United States, exclusive of signature and address, costs from \$1.10 to \$1.50.

To Great Britain, France or Germany—25 cents per word.

Telegrams are transmitted by means of the Wireless Service during the summer season, and all the year round by steamers equipped with the wireless apparatus, which are due to pass within the radius of the wireless stations at Cape Race and Cape Bay. Telegram messages may be obtained at all Post Offices and from Mail Clerks on Trains and Steamers, and if the sender wishes the message may be left with the P.M. to be forwarded by first mail to the nearest Telegraph Office free of postage.
