PROCEEDINGS

OF

Annual Meeting of the Society.

The TWENTY-EIGHTH ANNUAL MEETING of the MISSIONARY SOCIETY of the W. M. CHURCH IN CANADA, was held in Adelaide Street Church, Toronto, on Tuesday Evening, the 11th day of October, 1853, Rev. JOHN RYERSON, Co-Delegate, in the Chair. The Meeting was opened with singing and prayer, and the Report having been read by the General Superintendent of Missions, the following Resolutions were adopted :—

I. Moved by Rev. R. JONES, seconded by Rev. J. SPENCER,—

That the Report, an abstract of which has now been read, be received, printed, and circulated.

II. Moved by Rev. G. R. SANDERSON, seconded by Rev. WM. CASE,—

That the success which continues to attend the labours of the several Evangelical and Protestant Missionary Societies, calls for grateful acknowledgment; and that this Meeting especially offers its devout thanksgiving to Almighty God, for the gracious visitations which have been vouchsafed to the Society's Missions among the Indian tribes and destitute settlers of this Province during the past year.

III. Moved by the Rev. H. WILKINSON, seconded by Rev. P. JONES,—

That this Meeting, affected by the consideration of the many hardships and difficulties, in the midst of which our faithful Missionaries have to prosecute their labours, earnestly recommends more earnest and importunate prayer, that Almighty God will be pleased still to support and protect his devoted servants in their self-denying toils, to overrule all events to the advancement of his cause, and to pour out his Spirit more copiously on his Church, and the world at large.

IV. Moved by Rev. J. DOUSE, seconded by Rev. L. TAYLOR,—

That the very cordial thanks of this Meeting be presented to the Officers and Collectors of the different Branch Societies, and to the Subscribers and Donors for the very liberal assistance they have afforded this Society the past year.

REPORT.

Pleasurable emotions are awakened by reviewing the position and prospects of this Society. The prayer of David is realized by the Missionary Church,—“Peace is within her walls”—not the apathetic, deathly peace, but that which the Head of the Church left as the priceless legacy resulting from his own sacrificial atonement,—“My peace I leave with you”—and “Prosperity is within her palaces;” not the prosperity which can be secured by wealth or legislation—by human plans or wisdom—but that which has ever attended a faithful exhibition of the Doctrines of the cross by converted and faithful men, when, by the visitation of the Spirit, there have been “showers of blessings.”

One thing has been apparent to men of sober and scriptural views,—as the marvellous agencies which have been brought into existence to such perfection of late years have wrought great changes in Society, and given a different aspect to the globe itself, annihilating distances, and bringing mind into intercourse with mind, though separated by valleys and mountains, by rivers and channels of the ocean,—the Church of the living God maintains the same essential features as when the Saviour spake of her as leaven, leavening the whole lump; or as a city upon a hill, unchanged in the elements of which she is constituted, imperative in the laws to which she claims obedience, and benevolent in the bestowment of her rich and glorious privileges. Wherever her truths are delivered, there, as the grain of corn cast into the earth, she multiplies and increases; or, as the mustard seed beginning to vegetate, she stops not until her branches spread far and wide for shelter and protection.

This simple feature of a truly apostolic Church has been apparent in all ages and in all places: whether Paul or Apollos; Luther or Melancthon; Whitefield or Wesley; Ward or Coke, have proclaimed the “unsearchable riches of

Christ," the human mind has yielded to devotional truth, and the human heart has felt the power of grace Divine: whether we look at the European amidst the fields and crowded cities of a civilized population—to the Laplander in the region of everlasting snows—to the African under the burning beams of an equinoctial sun—to the Arab and Hindoo amidst the spicy plains of Arabia and India—to the fierce and cannibal New Zealander—to the ferocious Feejeean, or to the dark and pitiable Indian amidst the dense forests of America, from all these classes of mankind, and in all these places, triumphant trophies can be gathered worthy of the Redeemer's name.

If our work be less imposing than that assigned to other sections of the Church in extending the borders of Zion, it is not less important, for "all souls are mine, saith the Lord:" if there be less present honour, there is not less success: the time may come, (confidence in our principles will prompt us to say, the time assuredly *will* come,) when as piety, and wealth, and power advance, the agents of this Society will be found labouring side by side with the heralds of the cross from the great Missionary Institutions of Europe and America, and the periodical literature of this Connection shall be adorned with communications from China and Japan, from Bochara and Africa. To others may be assigned the duty and honour of carrying forward the high destiny of this Society; to us belongs the obligation of providing the means of grace for the wandering Indian tribes of Canada, and to our own race who are the pioneers of our future cities and towns, but now contending with the formidable difficulties attending the first settlers in a wilderness.

The records of the year, from which the following statements are selected, are of an encouraging nature. Many visitations of grace have attended the ordinary labours of Missionaries ministering the word of life among Indian bands of different tribes and languages. Under all the disadvantages which try the fidelity of the pastor, and test severely the sound conversion from Heathenism to Christianity of the members of our Indian Missionary Churches, the joy of conquest and progression has often been heard in the lonely reserves occupied by the remnant of a once-powerful people. Without venturing an opinion of what may probably be their ultimate destiny, it is manifestly the duty of the Church to bring their agencies and institutions to bear upon the present generation, leaving future developments of Providence to be met by

those whose wisdom, benevolence, and piety may guide the Missionary movement. To the "preaching of the word" the Great Head of the Church hath set his seal of approbation; a brief review of the Society's Stations and Missions will show the success which still attends its delivery.

INDIAN MISSIONS.

ST. CLAIR.

"In presenting the report of this Mission, we have nothing very remarkable to record. The Indians in this part of the country are not nearly so far advanced in civilization as those with whom we laboured last. Their roaming habits make sadly against them in this respect. The greater part of them spend at least six months in the year from their homes, and during this long absence they are, of course, exposed to innumerable temptations, and contract a distaste for anything like steady application to the labours and usages of civilized life. They are now beginning to see the necessity of working their land, as the country around is fast being occupied, and the game is either driven away or killed off.

"As to their spiritual state, many of them are in a good state of mind, and would not compare unfavourably with those who possess far greater advantages. We have, through the blessing of the Most High, had a few conversions during the past year. Some have died and gone to heaven; but we are constrained to acknowledge also, that we have been obliged to enforce the discipline upon those who have fallen from grace.

"We found, on our arrival, that many of the women were in a very ignorant state, but Mrs. B. has endeavoured, when health would permit, to instruct them in knitting and sewing, and she finds many of them who very readily learn these things. Some of the husbands and parents encourage them, and make every effort in their power to procure the necessary materials; but there are too many, alas, who care for none of these things. Upon the whole, therefore, we can thank God and take courage."

MUNCEY AND MOUNT ELGIN.

"Through the mercy of the God of Missions we have been kept in the field another year. Its labours, its trials, and its privileges are fled. A retrospective view produces some joyous and some sorrowful emotions. Many and

continued efforts have been put forth, by those labouring on this Mission, to carry 'on to perfection' those previously converted to God, and 'to turn from darkness to light, and from the power of Satan unto God,' the remnant of the heathen living here. These efforts, thank God, have not been wholly in vain. It is said by those longest and best acquainted with this Mission, that, with the exception of the Oneidas, who were at the close of the last year in a very prosperous state, but who have suffered by the absence of their native teacher, Rev. A. W. Sickles, who laboured the last year on the Grand River, it was never in a more prosperous and healthy condition. God has graciously blessed the labours of the Rev. John Sunday, among the Ojibwas, and Charles Halfmoon among the Munsees,

"Had it not been for the continued exposures of the Indians to the wiles of the drunkard makers, by whom, as in former years, the devil has succeeded in retaking many of those who had clean escaped his detasing vassalage, but who, by these faithful allies of his Satanic majesty, have again been brought under the yoke of bondage, it would have been our joyous privilege to have rejoiced over most, if not all, of the Indians here as the saved of the Lord.

"Many have been reclaimed; some converted from the error of their heathen ways, and several have died happy in the Lord, and joined the Church above.

"After filling up the vacancies occasioned by deaths, removals, and expulsions, we are enabled to report an increase in numbers over any previous year. But still we have to mourn over lost spirits, seeking rest and finding none, fast passing away, leaving nothing behind them but their bones, the frame-work of their earthly tabernacles, to whiten the fields of the white man, and to remind him that he has succeeded to these possessions because enriched by the wisdom of the Gospel of Christ. Yet, while these wander this side of the valley of the shadow of death, the Missionary, following the example of Him who came to seek and save the lost, *must go* after them, crying, 'Behold the Lamb of God that taketh away the sin of the world.'

"There are, beside the three Day Schools, three Sabbath Schools,—one among the Ojibwas; one among the Oneidas, and one among the Munsees, in successful operation, giving instruction to over 90 children and youths, who are taught to read the scriptures and sing the praises of God in their own languages."

MOUNT ELGIN INDUSTRIAL SCHOOL.

"This Institution, of which a particular account has been given in the two last years' Missionary Reports, has, as its importance demanded, received every possible attendance, and continues to afford the fond hope, that it will fully repay the labour, anxiety, and expense expended on it. Its halls have been crowded, and many applicants for admission have unavoidably been rejected. Although restricted to the number of 36, we have, of necessity, 42 boarded and clothed in the Institution, besides 36 day scholars, to whom a meal-a-day

is given. We hope, however, to keep the expenditure as low as the appropriation. Their literary improvement has been very satisfactory. Their moral improvement has far exceeded our expectations, while their religious knowledge is becoming such as to lead us to the hope, that while practising religious duties, they will become experimentally and savingly acquainted with Christ.

"An important epoch in the history of those connected with this Institution, from its commencement, has arrived,—the time for them to leave those to whom they have been wont to listen for daily direction in all things; by whose hands they have been clothed and fed,—the time for them to settle in life, and to provide for themselves. But where shall they go? Back to the wretched abodes of misery and filth, to be again associated with, and influenced by ignorance and indolence? Can those who have been elevated intellectually, morally, and socially, again find companionship in the degraded ones they had left behind—a contented home in the abode of filth? *Never*. And yet, when they leave what, with delight, many of them now call *home*, where shall they go? This is the question that has occupied my mind till it has distressed it. I have cared for them so long, that I cannot dismiss them without the deepest anxiety about their future welfare. There are means, ample means, by which these youths might be assisted in settling on their own lands, among their own people, follow out the directions and instructions given them in the Industrial School, and prove a blessing to their own people; but these means are in other hands. Representations to those who have the superintendency of Indian affairs have been made; and we hope, not made in vain.—Meanwhile these youth are waiting and hoping that something will be done. But "hope deferred maketh the heart sick." They are poor, and yet there is *of their father's*, though not *in their father's house*, 'enough, and to spare.' By affording them the means of commencing the world for themselves, the temptation to wander about the country would be removed; they would prove a blessing to their own people, become useful members of Society, and thus at least a remnant of a once noble race would be saved from utter extinction, and the fond hopes of those who have watched over them for years, with sleepless anxiety, would not be disappointed; justice to a long-neglected and deeply-injured race would be done; the beneficent designs of Christianity would be carried out, and God would be honoured. But who will speak for them?"

S A U G E E N .

"It is encouraging to the friends of Missions to know that their "labour is not" altogether "in vain in the Lord;" and although they may not always reap an abundant harvest, yet that there is some good effected is a cause of gratitude—gratitude to God who condescends to employ the humble offerings of his people in ameliorating the condition of those who have hitherto "sat in

the region and shadow of death;" hence I am prompted to present the following brief report of the state of this Mission:—

"During the year our Sabbath services have been well attended, by old and young, most making it a point of duty to be in their places in the house of God, on the Lord's day, if within a reasonable distance. Owing to a variety of causes, principally the migratory habits of the Indians generally, taking their children with them on their fishing and hunting excursions, the School has been but very irregularly attended to. The numbers in Society are about as last year. I cannot but believe that some of the Indians are truly pious; but not so happy in their piety as they might be, owing to their natural indolence; hence we want something in the shape of an *Industrial or Manual Labour School* in this section of country."

NEW CREDIT.

"I am thankful to our Heavenly Father that I am able to make a far more favourable report of this Mission than I found I could on my arrival here last June. This Mission is decidedly improving in every respect. We have now 5 native classes, numbering 85 members. We have received, during the year, 27 on trial—2 by letters—one was excluded from the Church; 5 dropped for neglect; 2 removed; 7 have died—5 adults and 2 children—2 of the adults in great pain; the others I cannot say anything about as I had not the opportunity of visiting them before their death. One of the children, a lad about 10, was as happy and as triumphant a Christian as I ever saw in the last struggles of nature. He said, he was not afraid to die—was going to Jesus. This was the last son of brother John and Betsey McColum. There have been 7 births—3 sons and 4 daughters;—3 marriages and 7 baptisms.

"We have regular stewards and leaders' meeting once each quarter, and sometimes oftener. Our quarterly meetings have been seasons of great comfort, the Lord being present in an especial manner. Our congregations are large and respectable, and are continually increasing. This Mission has suffered much by sickness and death, since the Indians came here; however, the place is becoming more healthy, as the "woods yield to the axe-man's blows." Some of our brethren here are becoming very respectable farmers. They begin to see the necessity of self-reliance, and are preparing to help themselves and others. They have about 200 acres of wheat growing, which looks finely; besides they have sown about 180 bushels of oats, and are doing a very fair seeding of potatoes and corn. They have been driving their new saw-mill with pretty fair success.

"The School has been continued up to the first of May, when, for want of proper support, it was closed. There have been 36 children attending the School at different times, not regularly. Those who attended regularly made

very commendable improvement. This people have had many things to contend with since they came here. The land being generally level, the water is hard, and tastes very strong of the clay. The soil is very rich and heavy timbered. The roads are all but impassable for about four or five miles, east and west, during the spring and autumn. They have suffered much for want of a resident Pastor. They have had no Minister living with them since they came here, until the year past, and the change for the better is very obvious. Many of the families on this Mission are living very comfortably; their houses are kept clean and neat, and all the members make a very decent appearance at Church, &c.

"My prayer is that our Divine Master will keep them from the evils to which they are especially exposed, and finally bring them with the Israel of God to rest forever. Amen!"

SNAKE ISLAND.

"It is truly gratifying to mark the developments of saving grace in those who were without God in the world, and especially in those who were once under the influence of a benighted understanding and an erring conscience; given up to strong delusion; the subjects of the deep, dark, and degrading superstitions of paganism; and it is only by contrasting their former with the present happy state of such as are brought under the benign influence of the Gospel, that we can form any correct idea of the wondrous change that has been wrought in their behalf. With regard to this Mission in its spiritual aspect, it has presented, at different periods, the varied phases of encouragement, hope, and disappointment. During the past year we have passed through the different states of feeling just mentioned. When at home, the attendance of Indians on the preaching of the word has been uniformly good; on class-meetings and prayer-meetings generally good. While present at some of the latter exercises, the fervor and pathos with which prayer was offered up to Almighty God, in their own language, was to us deeply affecting. The love-feast and sacramental occasions have been "seasons of refreshing from the presence of the Lord." The deep-toned feelings evinced in the relation of their Christian experience; the emphasis with which they dwell on the precious name of Jesus, which kindles in the Indian heart a holy rapture—

"The name that charms the Indian's fears
And bids his sorrows cease,"

And enables him with hope and confidence to look up to *Ishpeming* as his future home, while tears of joy course freely down the tawny faces of these sons and daughters of the forest; and often, on these delightful occasions, do they sing the sweet melodies of Zion with the whole Church militant,—

"Then let our songs abound,
And every tear be dry;
We're marching through Immanuel's ground,
To fairer worlds on high;"

The solemn reverence with which they approach the Lord's table and receive the eucharistic emblems of the Saviour's dying love, cannot but excite in the heart of the Missionary, and all who are in any way identified with this blessed work, the deepest emotions of gratitude to the Great Head of the Church. This is the Lord's doing, and it is marvellous in our eyes.

"In conclusion, I would say, while retrospectively viewing the past history of this Mission, some "have died in the faith," and are now in paradise. With regard to the present, we can say others are on their way thither; and, while contemplating the future, we trust there are those in the course of training, who will, in the providence of God, occupy spheres of usefulness at no distant day. Thus at the close of another Methodist Missionary year, through much mercy, we are enabled to thank God and take courage."

ALDERVILLE.

"In presenting the report of this Mission for the year now closing, we can add but little to what has been repeatedly brought before the public, year after year, by my excellent and esteemed predecessor, the Rev. Mr. Case, who has been in charge of this Mission from the time of its formation, in the year 1837, to the year 1852, a period of 15 years. To his indefatigable labours, untiring zeal, and 'continuance in well-doing,' it owes, under God, its present state of prosperity. None feel this more sensibly, or acknowledge it more readily, than do the Indians themselves. Soon after their conversion to God in 1826, he succeeded in gathering them together on Grape Island, near Belleville, and thus early introduced among them several of the mechanical arts, and also instructed them in agricultural pursuits; but having cultivated the soil for the space of ten years, it was found that the island was by far too small to carry on advantageously their farming operations, and, in 1837, the whole tribe, with their faithful and devoted Pastor at their head, removed to this place. And now, in retiring from the more active and onerous duties of an itinerant life, how pleasing and consoling to know, that, almost without exception, this whole body or tribe of Indians, after the lapse of more than a quarter of a century, continue to 'mind the same things, and walk by the same rule. Behold this day I am going the way of all the earth, and ye know in all your hearts, and in all your souls, that not one thing hath failed of all the good things which the Lord your God spake concerning you; all are come to pass unto you, and not one thing hath failed thereof.' Thus spake Joshua to ancient Israel when about to take his departure from them; and thus may the venerable father Case, in view of his separation from this people, address himself to them.

"We number on this Mission, at the present time, 113—65 Indians and 48 Whites. In the Indian classes, the quarterly tickets have been regularly issued, and we have not met with a case during the year deserving expulsion.

In one instance disciplinary action has been taken. The offender has admitted his guilt, and leaves our number. The truly penitent, we saw or heard of none. The last time I was very happy, a might never see that he should antly. In one instance there has been a departure from our rules, but by a mild disciplinary course the evil has been removed, and the offender saved. We have admitted 5 on trial, but the removal of several others from the Mission, leaves our numbers about the same. One adult only has died: he was a backslider. The first or second time I saw him during his sickness, he was truly penitent, and prayed most fervently to be reclaimed. I think I never saw or heard a person confess his sins with more contrition and earnestness. The last time I visited him (the evening before I left for Conference) he was very happy, and when I told him I was about to leave for a few days, and might never see him again on earth, he replied, in language of strong assurance, that he should meet me in heaven. He died, before my return, most triumphantly. We have four appointments among the white population, one of which, in a new settlement, has been taken up within the last three months. In the Industrial School there are 21 boys and 10 girls, most of whom are making commendable proficiency in all their studies; many of whom are far advanced in Arithmetic, Geography, and English Grammar, and have a partial acquaintance with ancient and modern History. They have also performed a good deal of labour, both in the field and in the house. With the assistance of one hired man, the boys cut 30 acres of wheat, 25 acres of wheat, 7 acres of peas and oats, dug 200 bushels of potatoes, 80 bushels of turnips, and 50 bushels of carrots, besides cutting and preparing all the wood for ten stoves and fireplaces. The girls, under the direction of the matron, spun 65 pounds of wool; knit 80 pairs of stockings, socks, and mittens; made 13 bed-quilts, 70 pairs of trowsers, and coats, for the boys, besides making all their own clothing, and attending to their own domestic affairs, as washing and ironing, milking, churning, &c.

“We have much cause for thankfulness to God, that, during the year, the children, with one exception, have been remarkably healthy. One of the larger boys, a young man from Rice Lake, who returned home early in the spring, in consequence of ill health, has since died. He was a member of Society, and died in great peace. With that exception, all have enjoyed excellent health; nor have we had occasion to administer anything in the form of medicine, except occasionally the cold bath. The Sabbath School and Bible Class have been well attended during the year. The work in the white settlements has prevented me from being present as much as I could wish; but from the devoted Superintendent of the School (G. I. Dingman) I have been furnished with the following facts:—‘The attendance has varied from 40 to 60. Thousands of verses have been recited. Henry Jones, from Owen Sound, recited between 2 and 3,000 alone. Others have approximated Henry, and done admirably, but none have been able to commit so many verses, and to recite them as accurately. Considerable proficiency has also been made in Nos. 1 and 2 of our Catechisms. Several of these children are hopefully pious. Often in the Bible Class and Sabbath School, I have seen the silent tear rolling down their dark and brawny faces; and when besieging a throne of grace in their behalf, I have heard them weeping and praying for mercy.’ Such are the effects produced by the instructions imparted in the Sabbath School and Bible Class. May all these children be brought early to a saving

acquaintance with the Lord Jesus Christ! This, added to the educational and industrial training which they are now receiving, will more certainly accomplish the great and important object for which this Institution has been established, and more fully qualify them for usefulness in future life."

RICE LAKE.

"The Rice Lake is one of our oldest Missions, and a large portion of these Indians still remember the days of their pagan darkness, and speak in terms of heartfelt gratitude of the vast contrast between their present and their former condition. Last New-year's day, at their accustomed feast, the good old chief, Paugaush, in his speech, pointing to the table, well spread and supplied with the luxuries of the season, said,—'This is not according to our ancient custom, for when we would make a feast formerly, we would take our hook and line, and fish until we had caught a maskanunge, and then we would cook it before the fire; and for our table we would have the sand of the shore, on the bare ground, and for our dishes leaves or bark; but now, see here our fine dishes, with roast beef, turkeys, geese, fowls, with plumb pudding, pies, and a great many other good things; and this is what the Gospel has done for us. Sometimes I see some gentlemen walking along the road, and I wonder what strangers are coming to visit us. When they get a little nearer, I see they are our own young men, whom I can scarcely distinguish from white gentlemen. At other times, I see ladies walking along the road, and I wonder who they are, until they get near enough, and then I see they are our own young women. We are getting nearly equal to the white people; and this the Gospel has done for us.'

"This literal extract shows their estimate of the temporal blessings derived from the Gospel. Our members have been steadfast through the year, and four have died in the triumphs of the faith. There is, however, still great room for improvement. Our teachings, mostly in the English language, have left a large portion of them too scantily supplied with religious and mental aliment. Where there is no reading, there is little or no reflection, and, consequently, not that maturity and soundness in the faith as where direct access to the Word of God furnishes an increasing supply of that living water which springs up to everlasting life.

"As it regards their temporal matters, they form and raise stock of various kinds; but a great error was made in the first settlement of the Indians, in placing them on farms entirely too small—generally, I believe, about sixteen rods in breadth—so that with the present size of their farms, they can never excel in this department."

"The Indians continue to show considerable regard for the public worship of God, and for the Sabbath. I preach to them every Sabbath at 10 o'clock, A.M.; also, on Thursday, at 6 o'clock. There are four places—one on the Island, one in Cartwright, and two in Mariposa, that I visit alternately on Sabbath afternoon, and preach to the inhabitants; always returning home in time to attend prayer-meeting with the Indians, on the evening of the same day.

"I have received into Society, during the year, 18 Indians and 8 whites; whole number, 32 Indians and 8 whites, and they are all walking as becomes the followers of the meek and lowly Jesus, adorning the doctrines of God their Saviour, by a well-ordered life and godly conversation.

"Number of deaths during the year, 7—2 adults and 5 children. The adults—one a boy, 14 years of age, of much promise, the other a girl of 20—both died in the triumph of faith, rejoicing in hope of heaven."

"Nothing has occurred on this Mission, during the past year, out of the ordinary routine of duties. We have still to complain of the irregular roving habits of the Indian, which takes them for so much of the time from under the ministerial oversight and pastoral care of the Missionary; yet, after diligent enquiry, we are thankful in being able to report, that, in nearly every instance, when absent from the Mission, they have conducted themselves with Christian propriety.

"The School has suffered, perhaps, more from this cause than any other interest of the Mission. The children's absence during hunting in the fall; sugar-making in the spring, and during their frequent sojourns among the white settlements, for the purpose of earning provisions; hence their advancement is painfully slow; yet the God of Missions has been with us, preserving the membership in the love and faith of Christ, restoring some who had fallen by the way, and adding a few to the number of those whom we hope shall be eternally saved. One of our best men, a leader and exhorter, has gone to rest. The benefit of the religion he had professed and tried, for more than twenty years, was apparent in death, for his end was peace.

"One man of this village, a great drunkard, and very hostile to the progress of the Mission, was recently drowned when in a state of intoxication. 'He that being often reproved, hardeneth his neck, shall suddenly be destroyed, and that without remedy.'"

BEAUSOLIEL.

Can anything be more truly Christian than the following unadorned and graphic statement of the honored native labourer who gives the account of a Love-feast? In this solitary island, washed by the waters of the Georgian Bay, itself a portion of Lake Huron, there dwell as simple-minded, industrious, and devout a people as can be selected from any portion of Indian tribes in North America. Far removed from the noise and commotion of the civilized world, these converted Indians worship the Great Spirit; and whilst commendably attending to the secular departments of life, essential to the acquisition of food and raiment, attend those ordinances of grace among themselves, by which they prepare for "the life to come:—"

"The prospect of this Mission for the past year is very encouraging, notwithstanding the many difficulties we have to contend with in teaching our brother natives of the forest the way to God. The attendance in general to the means of grace is good. Our last Quarterly Meeting was a happy meeting; all present on the occasion, I believe, felt the love of God shed abroad in their hearts; and, animated by the influences of the Holy Spirit, felt that it was good to be there. And especially one aged sister said, relative to her experience,—'I have been religious for nearly thirty years, and during that period of time, I am not weary yet. I have served the Great Spirit the best of my ability, according to the direction of the black-coat man; and I have had many refreshing seasons, and have been very happy in my heart indeed, and I never felt so much of that heavenly blessing in my poor heart until now. I am now above 80 years of age, and, notwithstanding my old age and decrepitude, I feel very happy, and I feel so light, I believe I can outrun a smart girl of ten years of age.'

"There have been two deaths the past year. The present number of standing members of our Society are 49, and two more have recently been added to the Church, and the total number is 51. To God be all the praise! And only one has been suspended from the Church.

"The native brethren of this Mission deeply express their gratitude to Almighty God, and to the good Christian white men, for sending Missionaries among them, and they send the right hand of Christian fellowship to the great Council of black-coat men to sit at Hamilton, and say, 'forget us not.'

"The School is very promising; the attendance in general has been good. The teacher, I am happy to say, is doing very well, and very attentive to the children. Notwithstanding the disadvantages of the native children in using the English elementary school books, they are learning very fast."

"This Mission is beautifully situated at the head of Owen Sound, an arm of the great Georgian Bay, which extends about fifteen miles in the country, and is surrounded with excellent land on both sides, and forms one of the most spacious and best harbours to be found on any part of the shore of Lake Huron. The Indians composing this band are Ojebways and Pottawatamies. The Ojebways are the original owners of the soil; the others were admitted into the tribe from other parts.

"A little improvement has been made by these Indians in agricultural pursuits, but many of them are still inclined to a life of indolence. We have used our best endeavours to cultivate in them habits of industry and frugality; but in this our hope of success is principally with the youth. An Industrial School at this place would greatly tend to promote this object. The Indians are very desirous of it, and will contribute largely for its establishment, and will give two or three hundred acres of excellent land for a farm connected with such an Institution.

"Since the 1st of September last, the School has been taught by brother George Blaker, and some improvement has been made; but many obstructions have been in the way. The temporary removal of many of the families, at certain seasons of the year, to their fisheries, their hunting grounds, and to their sugar bush, very materially interrupts the moral culture and improvement of the children.

"The Sabbath School has been very well attended, and the means of grace have been seasons of much spiritual comfort. There are no pagans connected with this band, and only two or three instances of intemperance have occurred during the year. All are, at least in some degree, under the influence of Christianity. During the year, seven have been hopefully converted to God, and are united with us in Church-membership; and many of our members are evidently growing in grace. Upon the whole, we consider the Mission in a healthy and somewhat prosperous condition."

GARDEN RIVER.

"Appreciating the deep interest which the friends of Wesleyan Missions have ever manifested in the welfare of the native tribes of our country, I have designed to be explicit in referring to the work of God as connected with this distant point of Missionary labour. Twenty months ago I made my first landing among this people, and never shall I forget the circumstances connected with that period. Our voyage from Penetanguishene had been unusually boisterous; and having arrived at our place of destination, we disembarked

in the midst of a heavy rain, without house or friends to receive us. The Indians were on the eve of starting for the Mahnetooshning to receive their presents; many of them at the time in a state of intoxication; and we soon ascertained, that, but three individuals out of three hundred abstained from the fire water. They were, in fact, a drunken community.

"My first effort on arriving at Garden River was to procure a place to shelter us from the inclemency of the weather. I rented a shanty, but it being unplastered, and roofed with bark, was by no means proof against the driving storm. These difficulties, however, were small, compared with others of a different character, which soon presented themselves. Soon after our arrival here, our village was visited by a professing Protestant Clergyman, who, strange as it may appear, spared no pains in misrepresenting our mission, and endeavouring to destroy our character and influence; and, in the midst of heathenism and dissipation, he claims for himself a "holy and apostolic" Church, comprising almost the entire community. Believing, however, that God had called us to labour among the people of Garden River, we resolved to hold controversy with no man, but with a humble dependence on God for Divine influence, to labour on at his command, and trust him for the issue; and, blessed be God, notwithstanding the combined opposition of Jesuitism and Puseyism, the good seed has not been sown in vain, but has taken deep root even in this once barren soil. Where once there was dissipation and wretchedness, there is now temperance and comfort. Instead of the dismal clatter of the pagan drum, accompanied by midnight scenes too terrible to mention, there is now heard the voice of prayer and praise. So powerful has been the influence of the Gospel, that most of the Catholics have given up their intemperate and Sabbath-breaking habits; and though many of them do not attend our services, yet a spirit of energy is being excited among them, and we believe the way is being prepared for their conversion. Our School, though, subject to many drawbacks, has been made a great blessing to many here. Most of the young people can now read the Scriptures and hymns in their own tongue. We have received on trial, during the past year, 30 members. Many more are almost persuaded. One young man, after enduring great affliction, died in the triumphs of faith. Our band of believers, who never before had witnessed the power of religion in the trying hour, were greatly encouraged.

"The sum of £9 has been given for Missionary purposes; and if we take into account the amount of labour which, during the past year, has been given to the Mission, it would amount to more than £25. Last winter the Indians got out the timber for a chapel, 25 by 35 ft., and this spring the building was put up. The Society has a property now, at Garden River, worth several hundred dollars. It was found to be impossible to work the Mission without first erecting buildings for the accommodation of the Missionary, as none could be rented. We have built a house for the Missionary family, 19 by 27 ft., with a kitchen, 14 by 20 ft.; a house for the Teacher, now occupied by the former, 18 by 28 ft.; a stable, 16 by 30 ft., and the body of a work shop, 14 by 20 feet. In connection with the mission-premises, we have cleared and fenced two acres for the use of the Preacher, and by way of preparing for the anticipated farms, eight acres of land have been cleared, and are now under

If properly conducted it will amply sustain itself, and, at the same time, serve as a means of imparting instruction in agricultural pursuits to the Indians. Such are some of the blessings conferred on, and the improvement made, at Garden River Mission. But what is one solitary Mission compared with the wants of this vast country. I would that we had the power to convey to the friends of Indian Missions, a correct idea of the suffering condition of the pagan bands of this country. Degraded and oppressed by the white man—thirsting for the fire-water—full of all the uncleanness of heathenism, they are fast passing away. Nor are they ignorant of it. Many of them are now ripe for the Gospel. They have long looked to their idols for help, but looked in vain. For the last hundred years they have hoped for help from the Jesuit, but to use the words of one of the old men, 'He brought no heart-religion with him.' The Indian wants Christianity in earnest. There are strong reasons why they should have it now. Yearly, their minds are becoming more and more corrupted by false teachers. Yearly, scores of them are dying in their sins, and in their blood.

'O, Christians to their rescue fly—
Preach Jesus to them ere they die!'

"Difficulties in the accomplishment of this work we may expect. Satan will, doubtless, hold on to his old possessions; but 'The Lord is a man of war, the Lord is his name.' Let the Church of Christ use the means, and hell shall yet tremble at, and heaven rejoice in the full salvation of this people. Amen!"

The Indian appointments embrace fifteen different Stations—Eleven Hundred and Fifty-nine Members, being an increase of forty-eight, after filling up vacancies,—eighteen Missionaries, who use four different languages,—twelve Day-school Teachers, and seven Interpreters.

The Committee have authorised the printing of a new translation of the Oneida Hymn Book, which is nearly completed. They have also in their possession the M.S.S. for a new Ojebway Hymn Book, and the First and Second Wesleyan Catechisms. These are all designed for publication at an early period. To various benevolent friends in Boston, &c., the Society is indebted, through the Rev. Peter Jacobs, for Indian Translations, the Holy Scriptures, and Reward Books, especially adapted to the young, and which are being distributed throughout the Missions.

DOMESTIC MISSIONS.

THE DOMESTIC WORK, which occupies so large a share of the Society's attention, continues prosperous. Eleven new Missions were formed and entered upon at the commencement of the year, all of which continue to be supplied, and are rewarding the labour and means spent upon them. The Committee hastily review the enlargement of the Church in connection with this branch of the work with fervent gratitude to Almighty God for the providential guidance he has vouchsafed, and for the very liberal spirit which the friends of the cause have shown in the maintenance of their enterprise. Three years have only passed away since the Conference formed a new District north of Toronto. This work has so prospered that it was found necessary to divide this Northern District into two. Within this short time there have been 15 new Circuits formed where none existed before; the brethren labouring upon them have sought out the settlers in this new and promising tract of country, from among whom, at least, 1,500 immortal souls have been gathered from the world and united in Church-fellowship. In private dwellings,—in school-houses,—in barns,—and in the open air,—these lonely residents in the forests have been assembled regularly to worship God. Respecting this work, the Chairman of the District forwards the following report:—

BARRIE.

"The period having arrived when, according to the arrangement of our Church, we expect a removal from our present field of labour, permit me to say that, although I bow to the decisions of the Church of my earliest affection, in this and in all other cases, believing that, upon the whole, it may be for the general good, yet I cannot do so in this instance, without feelings of the deepest regret, to tear myself away from a people so greatly endeared to my heart, as are the friends of this and the surrounding Circuits and Missions of this District.

"When I received my appointment to this field of labour, it was with considerable reluctance I entered upon it; but I came, hoping it was my providential position, and I determined to do all I could to advance the interests, temporally and spiritually, of our beloved Methodism. For this I have

laboured these three years, night and day. I trust I can say, I have coveted no man's silver or gold, but have strove incessantly, in my weak way, to build up the Church which Christ purchased with his own blood. During these years I have frequently visited the Indian in his wigwam; and, having to hunt up these lost sheep of the house of Israel, sailed, in a frail and open boat, the waters of Lakes Huron and Superior, and have lain, night after night, on the cold ground, on those northern and dreary shores; but I rejoice that I, and my pious and self-denying co-adjutors, have not laboured in vain. Revivals of religion, equal to any I ever witnessed, have been and are still progressing. New Circuits have been formed which, I hesitate not to say, will, in a few years, rank with the best in our country. Infant Churches have been organized in the wilderness, which have already increased to *hundreds*. Churches have been erected in the desert, which are now more than filled with devout and attentive worshippers of the true God. Parsonages have been built which will compare in architectural arrangement and elegance with any in our work. Sabbath Schools have multiplied, and the work of the Lord has been deepening in hundreds of the lovers of our Zion.

"It will be a source of joy to me, when dispensing the word of life among strangers, or, when in consequence of, perhaps, too early labours and increasing infirmities, I shall have, as I much fear, to retire from the active work of the ministry, to know that there are friends on the Barrie District endeared to me by a thousand happy recollections; friends who have been such in times of family affliction and trial; friends for whom I shall always entertain the strongest affection while I exist on earth, and friends to whom I anticipate being re-united in another and eternal state of existence.

"The more immediate field of my pastoral care is in a state of unparalleled prosperity. The work of justification and sanctification has been progressing, and about 100, during the year, have been converted and added to the Church. To God be all the praise!

PENETANGUSHENE.

"I entered on this Mission at the close of the last Conference, according to appointment, and found it very laborious, extensive, and important. If I am not mistaken, we have here the elements of a good Circuit. This Mission embraces, a part of the following Townships, viz.:—Vespra, Flos, Taney, Medonte, Oro, and Orillia. I have fifteen regular appointments for every four weeks. To meet them, I have to travel upwards of 170 miles over rather rough roads, so that I have but little time for extra efforts. During the year just closed, I held two Protracted Meetings, which were attended with the Divine blessing, and resulted in the hopeful conversion of a score of souls. Although I cannot, like many of my brethren, tell of the conversion of hundreds, I am thankful for the few who have found peace through believing. 'The day of small things should not be despised.' The funds on the Mission, upon the whole, are about as good as they were last year. We have but two small log chapels on the Mission, and have no parsonage, so that the rent of a house is rather oppressive, both to people and Minister. The Mission, for a few years, is not likely to pay anything towards the Missionary's salary. It will about meet family allowance, &c., and horse-keeping, &c.

"I have taken up an appointment at Coldwater—have organized a class of 14 members; and, as to finance, they have outdone all the appointments on the Mission, but White's, although I did not commence preaching to them on Sabbath, until the 12th of December last. So you perceive they merit all the praise we have awarded them; and in them is verified this Scripture,—'The first shall be last, and the last shall be first,' White's appointment excepted.

"We have the honour of being the pioneers on this Mission. We have not been preceded by others, but succeeded by them, as is generally the case in all new places. We should, by all means, retain our ground.

"The greatest part of this Mission, until last year, belonged to Barrie; but Barrie Mission was then too large. It could not have been worked to much advantage with less than three Preachers, in the present enlarged state of these Missions."

Almighty God, for the numerous mercies by which they have been surrounded, as well as for the degree of Divine unction which has attended their labours. On the other hand there has been no lack of those difficulties common to our new Missions, while there has been ample ground for the exercise of that grace which hopeth all things, &c. &c. In some of our congregations we have had manifest displays of Divine and saving power, while in others we were led to adopt the language of the Prophet, and say, 'Who hath believed our report,' &c. Results like the latter naturally lead us to enquire, whence these effects? If we are not mistaken, the cause will be found in conduct such as is pointed out by the finger of God, Haggai, Chap. i. 2, 6. Now if they would practically attend to the counsel given in the 8th verse of the same chapter, we have no doubt but the results would be speedily manifest in their temporal and spiritual prosperity, while a stone of reproach would be rolled away from their door. Until this is done we fear the consequence. While we have been compelled to use the pruning knife in order to lop off 'withered branches,' as well as those which bore 'wild grapes,' our hearts have been cheered in consequence of others being 'grafted into Christ.' May they abide in Him, and bring forth much fruit—good fruit—fruit which shall glorify God. During the year, we have succeeded in securing in three different neighbourhoods, lots for Church purposes. On one of these in the rising village of Meaford, measures have been adopted for the erection of a Parsonage. The building is to be of plank, an 132 x 24. This we expect will be so far completed as to be occupied before next winter sets in—a thing much to be desired. In Euphrasia, a plank Church, suitable for the locality, is in course of erection. Our funds though far—very far behind the mark, are 30 per cent in advance of last year. In this department of the work, there must be a little more of the progressive spirit of the age, if our work is to prosper. We confidently hope this will be so. This field of labour is very extensive and laborious; but with the assistance of an efficient staff of Local Preachers, we are enabled to cultivate it to tolerable advantage. Viewing the matter as a whole, we have reason to 'thank God and take courage.'

cold sickly formality, there is spiritual life and vigour among all the classes. What news so cheering as to listen to the wonder-working power of the Gospel? The simple and affecting story of believers whose hearts are warmed with the love of Christ, and the soul stirring story of the newly emancipated, who are just brought into the liberty of the children of God, cannot fail to gladden the heart. God is visiting his people here, and they can tell the great things the Lord has done for them,—how they have been strengthened, and their numbers increased. The two last Quarterly Meetings were very numerous attended, and a blessed feeling prevailed; I think about 40 spoke their experience at each of these meetings, and scores of others could have spoken had the time permitted.

“We had two protracted meetings last spring,—one in the town and one in the country. In the former place, I was ably assisted by Brother Vandusen, of Nawash; in the latter place by brothers Wm. Neelands, and John Carson, two useful and zealous Local Preachers. These meetings proved a great blessing in the conversion of some and the comforting of many. Though we had to drop quite a number during the year, yet their ranks have been filled up. Two years ago, we found on the class books about 60 names, and now there are 115, and the future prospect much more encouraging.

“During the last year we sustained the loss, by death, of brother Henry Carson. He was one of the first settlers in these parts, and in the infancy of Methodism here was appointed by the Rev. John Neelands, as Class-Leader. Brother Carson was universally beloved for his mild, amiable and christian conduct. "As it regards talents and piety, both are professed and evidently seen here. There is but one Sabbath School regularly organized on this Mission; and this being furnished with a good library, and proper officers and Teachers, a blessed influence is exerted by it on many youthful minds.

"There is much here at present to encourage the Missionary. The roads are improving; the land is being cleared and cultivated; the people are raising wheat, oats, potatoes, and grass. The Missionary and his horse will be better provided for than they could have been those past years. If our people were able to erect suitable places to worship in, it would be in our favour; but this will be impracticable at present, without assistance from some other quarter. During the past year we succeeded in erecting a small log parsonage. With a little more expense it would accommodate a small family. It is as near being central as can be—a post-office and saw-mill close by. There is half an acre of land attached to the house, which will be deeded to us as long as it is occupied by a Methodist Minister.

"During the two past years we received into Society 240 members; baptized between 60 and 70 children; married 17 couples; and now, the labours of this year being over, we review the past with pleasure. Seasons never to be forgotten we have enjoyed here. Glory be to the Great Head of the Church!"

KINCARDINE.

"Another ecclesiastical year has rolled round, in which it is expected that we detail unto our Conference, and members generally, the work of God during the year. On this Mission, (as well as all infant Missions,) there are a few things of a discouraging character—things that are incident to all new settlements; but these are beginning to disappear. It is well known to the world that our Conference is proverbial for sending their men into the back woods, and destitute settlements, following the sound of the axe, and administering to the wants of a people, that would otherwise be neglected. Our people here are willing to do all they can to promote the cause of Methodism; and we find many other friends whose generosity and love for the cause should not be forgotten, although they are not members. At the present time our congregations are good: the Mission presents pleasing signs of future prosperity. To God be all the praise."

ERIN.

"This Mission was formed last Conference, and consists of parts of the Townships of Erin, Caledon, Chinguacousy and Garrafraxa. It includes the Villages of Jamestown, Cheltenham, Ballinafad, Erin, and Hillsburg. The

rising Village of Orangeville, also, was lately visited by its Missionaries, in conjunction with some Local Preachers from the Brampton Circuit,—9 persons therein having joined our Church.

“The Village of Erin contains about 300 inhabitants, and Orangeville almost as many. Irregularly, through the former part of the year, and regularly for the last three or four months, the Mission has had the advantage of two Labourers, to which, indeed, is to be ascribed its present extent; the one Missionary at first appointed being quite inadequate to cultivate the present field.

“There are each fortnight, on the Sabbath, three appointments in Erin Township (2 of them each Sabbath being in the Erin Village), 3 in Chinguacousy, and 2 in Garrafraxa; also, monthly Sabbath appointments,—3 in Erin Township, one in Orangeville, and 1 in Caledon—besides several Week-day appointments,—making, in all, 21 Sabbath appointments in each month.

“Our congregations in Erin Village and Garrafraxa, and in some other places, tolerable. In membership, we have increased from 50 to 79, including the members in Orangeville. Our zealous friends in Erin Village contemplate the erection of a Wesleyan Chapel therein, and have already commenced a subscription for that purpose.

“The Lord, also, has graciously converted some souls during the year; and on the whole, considering the difficulties arising from the intermixture of other bodies of Methodists throughout the Mission, we have every reason to thank God and take courage.”

DURHAM.

“This Mission was first organized at the Conference of 1852, and is situated north of Arthur Village, where it commences, and extends north, 30 miles, and west, 18 miles; in all, 48 miles, through a new and flourishing country. At present, this field of labour is large enough for two Missionaries, or to be divided into two Missions. The people are in general poor, and, consequently, not able to do much for the support of their Missionary.

“During the past year our hearts have been cheered by beholding the arm of the Lord made bare in the salvation of heathen souls. It is truly reviving to hear several of our members leading in prayer, who, at the commencement of the year, we found without God and without hope in the world.

“We have now on this Mission 6 classes, numbering 60 members. Our prospects through this part of the country are brightening. The Son of Righteousness is shining forth upon his inheritance.”

ARRAN.

"This is the name given to one of the newly-organized Domestic Missions, established in the recently surveyed, and still more recently settled country, bordering on the south-eastern shores of Lake Huron, embracing principally the Townships of Arran and Saugeen. When the writer first visited this part of the country, in the fall of 1852, preparatory to his occupying it as Mission ground, a considerable number of people had been in, and had taken possession of the lots on the principal lines. Several shanties were erected, and tenanted by an industrious and enterprising class of settlers. In order to meet the spiritual wants, as far as possible, of these pioneers of the forest, your Missionary made appointments for preaching, once every three weeks, at the most eligible places. But as the winter approached, several persons dreading its severity in these northern regions, and fearing still more their isolated position, from the badness of the roads, returned to their homes. However, notwithstanding the discouraging circumstances to which reference has just been made, the Missionary still continued to travel through deep snow, and frequently unbroken roads, to preach to some half dozen of persons; but, as the spring approached, matters began to wear a more pleasing aspect. The people returned to their new homes, bringing their wives and their children with them; the congregations increased; three Societies were formed, and subscriptions taken up, and collections made for the different connexional funds.

"There is still great lack of service through the want of ministerial aid; for what is one among so many. To do this rising and promising country justice, another Preacher should be sent. I would fain hope that those who sit at the helm of ecclesiastical affairs will take this matter into their favourable consideration."

BRUCE MINES.

The Honourable Company have kindly granted an excellent house, free of rent, besides contributing to our funds, and the friends have done well in supporting the Gospel; as the prosperity of the mines will encourage the employment of more hands, and as another Company is commencing operations about one mile from the place, much more will be accomplished in this way—as also, making it a more interesting mission.

“Being deprived of a day-school, the Sabbath school is of the utmost importance; and due attention has been given to it. Influential persons have exerted themselves to promote its interests; the library has been enlarged, rewards given, and every suitable means adopted to advance its prosperity. The children have been regular in attendance, ambitious to learn, and industrious in committing large portions of the sacred Scriptures to memory. With strict attention this institution will prove a great benefit to the rising generation.”

AMHERSTBURGH.

“In compliance with your request and the usage of our Church, I proceed to write a few words in reference to the religious state of this Mission. This field of labour, in some respects, is peculiar. A large proportion of the inhabitants of Amherstburgh and the surrounding country are Roman Catholic, and the remaining part is divided into four or five different Protestant Churches. This may, in some measure, account for the small number of members in our Church.

“This Mission was divided last year, which gives to Amherstburgh preaching twice each Sabbath. There is also regular service on the Sabbath, once a fortnight, at what is called the Indian Village, where we have nine Indian Members of our Church, the fruit of Missionary labour, to whom Brother Alexander Clarke willingly and gratuitously acts as Interpreter. We have also two other appointments in the country, one on the Sabbath and the other on the week-day. On the whole, we have been favoured with good congregations and excellent attention. What this place pre-eminently needs is a revival of scriptural religion. We have had some gracious seasons as a people; but we need amongst us, and around us, an outpouring of the Holy Spirit in his awakening and renewing power. Romanism exerts a baneful influence wherever it exists. To say nothing of its anti-scriptural doctrines and loose moral principles, there is little or no regard paid to the Sabbath, and unless those who have a better faith are strictly on their guard, its effects will be strongly and unhappily felt. It is no common power or influence that will be of much avail here. May God send His Spirit in its mighty operations, that error may give way, that truth may triumph, and that sinners may be saved from eternal death.”

SANDWICH AND WINDSOR.

"When health would permit we have preached in the town of Sandwich, twice every Lord's Day, and once in the village of Windsor. Beside these there are six week-day appointments which we attend once a fortnight. There are in the townships of Sandwich, Maidstone, Rochester, and Gosfield.

"In consequence of the great number of French and Irish Roman Catholics settled in this region of country, in many places our congregations are small, and the circle of our influence very much circumscribed. Yet, amidst the prevailing darkness there are some bright spots. There are those who have received the truth in the love of it, and rejoice that the blessed Saviour has said, 'Come unto me all ye that labour and are heavy laden, and I will give you rest.' By faith they have found direct access to the sinner's friend, and thus have obtained peace with God through our Lord Jesus Christ. Some who were trained up under the influence of the 'Man of sin,' have, through grace, been delivered from his power, and now walk in the 'newness of life.' It is absolutely necessary that two preachers be employed on the ground which I have occupied during the past year, if we would see that amount of spiritual prosperity which is desirable."

PORT SARNIA.

"We look back upon the year now closing with gratitude to Almighty God for all his mercies. The extent of our field, and the great number of regular appointments, would not permit us to do much by way of 'extra effort.' Several, however, have been hopefully converted and added to the Church, in the use of the ordinary means. After deducting 15 as removed, dropped, &c., we have an increase of 12 members. Two new classes have been formed during the year, with a Sabbath School in connection with each; all of which are prospering delightfully. Our Church in the Port has been greatly enlarged, and in other respects very much improved and beautified, at an expense of over four hundred dollars. Preliminary steps are being taken towards building a parsonage, which is very much needed. A suitable house cannot be hired for less than \$60 per year.

"With the appropriation from the Missionary Society, my allowance is fully made up, and we shall pay the Missionary Board over £4 more than we receive. All the other connexional funds are much in advance. In view of these and other facts which might be given, we may safely say, the state of the Mission is healthy and prosperous. One labourer is no longer sufficient to the task of working it efficiently. Our friends on this charge are enlightened and noble-spirited, but they are generally poor, having to contend with bad roads and mighty forests; and many of them have not yet paid for their land. If two Ministers be sent to the White work next year, the Stewards promise to

WALLACEBURGH.

"Our labours on this Mission extend to parts of the Townships of Sombra, Dawn, Chatham and Dover. We have 10 regular appointments every two weeks. During the past year several persons have joined the Society, the most of them on trial, who are now regular members. We have had to drop a few, and several have removed to other parts. The Society at present, numbers 65 members—5 over last year's return. The congregations are generally good and attentive. I have three appointments every Sabbath, and have to travel a distance of sixteen miles, three Sabbaths out of four.

"The progress of the cause is much impeded at almost every appointment, for the want of better Church accommodation; and the friends, being rather limited in their means, are not able to perform what in this respect they wish to see accomplished. We are making arrangements, however, to build a Parsonage House, and a larger Meeting House, in the Village of Wallaceburgh, where I hold service every Sabbath morning.

"Our financial affairs are rather encouraging, all the funds being in advance of any preceding year, the Missionary fund particularly. The people are generally kind and benevolent, and willing to do all they can to help forward the good cause. Upon the whole, we have reason to thank God and take courage. May happiness and prosperity be long enjoyed by this people."

WARDSVILLE.

"The Lord has been pleased on this mission, during the past year, to make the ordinary means of grace a blessing to a number of souls.—Believers have been quickened, and several sinners soundly and hopefully converted to God.

the worship of Almighty God; while financial prosperity is not a sure criterion of true spiritual good, we believe that when the heart is rightly affected, there will be a rendering of secular things, *according to the means possessed*, for the support of God's cause. This Mission has done well. While many have given liberally towards church building, all the ordinary funds are in advance of last year. The Minister and his family have experienced an augmentation of liberality, and while the membership does not exceed 100, the noble sum of £35 has been raised towards the funds of our great Missionary cause."

STRATHROY.

"In our report of the Strathroy Mission, for the year ending June 1st, 1853, our numbers stand as follows:—Admitted during the year, 38; dropped, 24; admitted from other Circuits, 7; removed to other Circuits, 9; deaths, 3; converted during the year, 24. Number in Society, 186; thus showing a small increase over last year.

"As we have, with one exception, attended all the appointments occupied by brother Shaw and I the preceding year, some of them had to be taken on a week evening, and others we could visit only once a-month, and this not regularly, having been afflicted seven or eight Sabbaths during the year. It is, however, a matter of thankfulness to the Great Head of the Church, that we still live, while some of our dear people have been called to their reward; amongst whom is our esteemed brother, John Buttery, whose affliction, inflammation, was short but severe. He was a candid, consistent member, and for several years filled, very acceptably, the offices of Circuit Steward, Class Leader, and Local Preacher. His end was peace.

"Some parts of this Mission are increasing in interest; perhaps all would if duly attended to, but this is impossible for one man. Our Church, in the Village of Strathroy, has been completed, and the receipts of the Mission, this year, surpass those of any preceding year. It is deeply to be regretted, that a greater amount of means and number of men are not at your Committee's disposal, as no part of our work requires more, and receives less, than these new Mission-fields."

WARWICK.

"The past year has been one of toil, anxiety, and care; but, amidst it all, God has graciously preserved the lives and health of your Missionary and family, for which we desire to be truly thankful to Him. We added a few new appointments to those which we had last year. This increased the labour on the Mission, and left me but little spare time. Another circumstance increased the labour, and also resulted in considerable pecuniary loss:

that was getting my horse badly hurt, in consequence of which I had to travel on foot for about five weeks; then I was obliged to purchase another.

"On account of having so many regular appointments, we were unable to hold any "special services"; but notwithstanding, God has owned and blessed the labour of his servant. After making up the vacancies of the removals, dropped, and those that died, we have a small increase in our membership; and although there has not been as great an increase as we desired, yet we thank God and take courage. There are several circumstances that make against the spiritual improvement of the Mission. In several places there are not enough of members to form classes; therefore some are deprived of the means of meeting in class. In other places we cannot get suitable persons to take charge of the classes; and they are only occasionally met. But, amidst all these disadvantages, I think there has been a considerable improvement during the two years that are passed, both temporally and spiritually.

"The financial department of our work is pretty good, considering the newness of the country, &c. All our funds are considerably in advance of any former year. May the God of the Missionary enterprise still continue to own and bless the labours of his servants."

G O D E R I C H .

"The state of the Societies on the Goderich Mission is somewhat prosperous. During the past winter the Lord has favored us with an increase both in grace and in numbers. From forty to fifty profess to have found the pearl of great price. Our prayer is that they may keep it to that day. It is now become evident that more help must be obtained, or the cause will suffer very seriously. It is impossible to serve the Town of Goderich satisfactorily, and fill the appointments in the vast region around. The consequence to our cause will be disastrous if more help be not afforded. The congregation in the Town is unsteady, but mortified because not favoured with the common privileges of other congregations in the same place. The people are making a noble effort to raise a Parsonage, to prevent the waste of sacred money in rent; and it will be seen by the list that they are doing nobly in the Missionary cause. They are decidedly worthy the attentive consideration of the Stationing and Missionary Committees."

BLENHEIM AND STRATFORD.

"It will no doubt be gratifying to you to receive any intimations of religious prosperity in any part of our extended field of operations. A short statement of our operations in this locality may therefore not be unacceptable. Pursuant to arrangements made subsequent to the last Conference, by the respected Chairman of the District, we have been favored with the assistance of Brother John Wakefield, whose labours have been highly acceptable and useful. This arrangement has enabled us to supply the work more efficiently, and to take up some new Sabbath appointments. Our congregations in most places are as large as could reasonably be expected. A gracious influence has generally prevailed in our religious exercises, and numbers have been reclaimed from the world and sin,

"We have a small parsonage property, which is nearly free from debt, and which has been occupied by the Missionary for nearly 18 months. Our spirited people have built a church in the new Village of Plattsville, which accommodates a large congregation every Sabbath. We are greatly indebted to the Rev. K. Creighton, of Brantford, for his services in the dedication of the Plattsville Chapel. This took place on the 16th January. The house was crowded; a gracious influence pervaded the assembly; and the enlightened evangelical discourse of that truly able minister was rendered a lasting blessing to the people. The next evening we had a tea in behalf of the funds of the chapel, in which we were ably and kindly assisted by the Rev. E. Clement, of Paris, and the Rev. R. Rodgers, (Secession,) of Blandford. Then followed a series of services for the revival of the work, which resulted in the conversion of several persons.

"The Camp-meeting held in the early part of the Conference year, was a season of great spiritual refreshing. We were favored with the presence and services of the eloquent Chairman of the District. But when we call to mind the multifarious efforts which are being made to proselyte and divide by the different sects and parties that exist on this Mission, we think the increase large and encouraging. There is also an advance in all our Connexional Funds, especially in our missionary gatherings and subscriptions. The means of grace likewise are generally well attended, and through the Lord the Spirit made profitable to the people of the Lord. On the whole, we have reason to conclude the work on this mission is in a healthy and vigorous state; if in the ensuing year it be duly supplied with competent and zealous labourers the work will continue to prosper, notwithstanding any efforts that may be made to impede its progress. There are in this part of our Lord's vineyard some of the most excellent of the earth, whose piety is deep, scriptural, and rational, and who exert a most pleasing and conservative influence, morally and religiously wherever they go. May God increase their number a thousand fold. "I have great cause of thankfulness to Almighty God, for his mercy experienced through the year which is past. In the temptations and distresses, (incident to the itinerant life,) he has gently cleared our way. There are many things to discourage the christian missionary. The enmity of the carnal mind against God and his worship. The want of taste for the truths of the Gospel, and the love for sinful pleasures manifested by the unconverted, make in too many instances the truth of God of no effect; nevertheless we are encouraged to go forward by the promise of Him who cannot lie, that his word of grace shall not return unto him void, but shall prosper in the thing whereunto he has sent it. This has been gloriously fulfilled throughout the whole of our beloved Zion, the year which is now closing. And while on other Circuits, and Stations, they have been favoured with large and abundant outpourings of the Holy Spirit, our Mission has had some droppings from above, which I trust are only the tokens of a more plentiful shower. Thirty redeemed spirits have professed to find peace through the blood of the Lamb. Backsliders have been reclaimed, the weak strengthened, and the lukewarm revived. At Shaver's appointment, we have been encouraged and comforted by the

steady progress of the work of God; not one that embraced religion here has turned back to the world; all are apparently walking in the fear of God, and in the comfort of the Holy Spirit. Our Sabbath Schools are generally doing well. The mission has three Chapels on it which are all out of debt, with the exception of thirty dollars, and subscriptions have been taken up to build two more which are much needed. The missionary funds raised on the Circuit amount to the handsome sum of £38 10s., which is ten pounds above last year, and nearly double what was raised any previous year. Our Quarterly Meetings have been seasons of great refreshing from on high, an uncommon influence of the Spirit seemed to rest upon the people. The regular means have been faithfully kept up, and made a blessing to many. Finally, in reviewing the past there is much to cause humiliation, and much to create a spirit of gratitude—we are deeply humbled because we have not been more devoted and useful, and we are thankful that even in a small degree we have been made a blessing. I pray that you may continue to enjoy the Divine approbation, and be cheered in the discharge of your onerous duties by the Divine assistance."

"The Circuit may be said to be composed of three parts,—one being the Village of Dunnville and the country immediately around it; the second being the country lying on the River Welland, or Chippewa, extending through the Townships of Caister and Gainsboro', and the third part lying on the Grand River, as far as York, taking in several villages. Some of these villages are rapidly rising into the position of towns, and would be greatly benefitted, religiously and morally, if it could be possible to bestow more labour upon them than our present force and circumstances will allow of our doing. In them we have small Societies and some influence; but our visits being something of a flying character, on the fortnightly or the monthly circuit plan, cannot be expected to produce the good to be desired. They need,—they should have public preaching every Sabbath—a thing impossible with our present force. Our work in them would then become, morally and spiritually, remunerative. The people in them are liberal. They contributed very freely to our funds during the past year, and additional labourers would increase our claims and their response. But besides these villages which are important in view of their becoming centres of influence to the countries surrounding them, there are large spaces of country either full, or fast filling with settlers, still more destitute, which are not visited either by your's or any other Missionaries. We could offer them week-day preaching, but, alas! the religious appetite is not there; yet they would be glad to have the monotony of their Sabbaths—spent now mostly in visiting and gossiping—broken by an opportunity to hear a sermon; and this is surely to be considered as Missionary ground, if the absence of religious influence, and the want of Gospel ordinances, and the consequent demoralization and degradation, can make them such. Take a fearful fact to prove this:—More than 3,000 persons are returned upon the census rolls of the County of Haldimand as being of NO RELIGION. This fact I have upon the authority of the Census Commissioner of the County.

"The benefits resulting to the Village of Dunnville from a resident Missionary, and constant pastoral care, give reason to expect a like result to similar influences in other places; but until more labourers and means can be applied to the work, we will, by God's help, do the best we can."

"This Mission is in a prosperous state at present. The number of hearers in our congregation have greatly multiplied. The people in this part of the country are more and more attached to Methodism. Our church accommodation is quite too small for our Quarterly Meetings, and is not comfortable even for the ordinary congregation. It will be pleasing to know that the friends of our Zion are 'devising liberal things.' A lot has been purchased, on which we intend to erect our new church, and also a parsonage-house. We have raised, by subscription, 400 dollars to aid in building a church, 30 by 42 feet. The job is let, and is to be completed the first day of November next. It will cost \$500."

NORWOOD.

"This Mission only comprises a portion of its former territory; the remainder was set off last year to the Percy and Mud Lake Missions. This arrangement is found to be better, at least for us, for many reasons which need not now be entered into. We have now three Sabbath appointments in Otonabee,—one in Asphodel, one in South Dummer, another in North Dummer, and some others on the week day, each of which is regularly visited once in the fortnight. Previous to the division of the Mission, 182 members were returned; but on commencing my work here immediately after it, I found only 108 remaining in this portion.

"Though there were many things rather discouraging to us at first, I found a willing and warm-hearted people, who have cheerfully co-operated with me in carrying on the work of God. We have participated also in the general prosperity which characterized the operations of Methodism throughout this Province during the past year. There are some exceptions it is true, and some unprofitable and withered branches have either dropped off, or had to be cut off from the tree; but the maintenance of godly discipline has produced a more vigorous and healthy action in others, which will result in their bearing much fruit to God's glory.

"At the commencement of the year a new appointment was taken up at Allandale, in Otonabee. I believe I had the honour of preaching the Gospel there the first time its joyful sound was heard in that place. Special efforts

there during the winter were crowned with the Divine blessing, and followed by the hopeful conversion of about 50 persons, who have united with the Church, and, for the most part, are still steadfast in well doing. The influence of this revival extended to two appointments in the vicinity. We have endeavoured to circulate our Methodist publications in this part, and considerable quantities have been disposed of. The reading of these useful books has been made a blessing to many.

"The net increase of members for the year is 45; our total number being now 153. Though the ground occupied is much smaller than it was, yet it will be seen that our Missionary contributions are higher than they were by several pounds, and the aggregate amount of other collections is one-third more than was raised by the Mission, in its undivided state.

"Some improvements have been made in the parsonage property, and we have two chapels in course of erection, viz.: one in Ootnabee, nearly finished, 26 by 36 feet. Thus we have financial prosperity; a more healthy tone of piety among our membership in general; some seals to our ministry, and an increase in our numbers, as the result of last year's operations; and while we are led by this measure of success to 'thank God' for the past, in humble reliance upon the Divine promises, and with confidence in our principles, we 'take courage' for the prosecution of our work in the future."

L I N D S A Y .

"This Mission was formed last Conference, out of what then constituted the Metcalf Mission, now the Metcalf Circuit, leaving three regular appointments, and by report two occasionally visited, with fifty-six members. Now there are 102 in full membership, and sixteen on trial, making in all 118. The Mission includes a part of five Townships, with eleven appointments in the country, and Lindsay every Sabbath. Two of the Sabbath appointments in the country, visited only once in four weeks, and three of the week-day appointments the same. There have been application from as many as five or six neighbourhoods for preaching, which I could not attend. The Mission as yet, is something like a very large farm, the owner of which is only able to cultivate a part for want of men and means; so he cultivates that part which is likely to pay the best, at present leaving that portion which, in all probability would pay the best in future. The friends in Lindsay, are engaged in building a new Church, which is to cost them about two hundred and fifty pounds. We have no chapels in the country; we have to worship in school-houses, and private houses. However, we have 2 new Churches in contemplation, so I hope this difficulty will soon be in part removed. May God continue to revive his work until every opposing power is put down, is the prayer of yours truly."

"Though taking in a part of four Townships, viz.: Tyendinga, Thurlow, Huntingdon, and Hungerford, still it is a pleasant, compact Mission, not extending more than seventeen or eighteen miles from one extremity to the other; and although we are not able to add much to the heart-cheering news that reaches us from time to time, of those refreshing, pentecostal showers, with which the mission field has been so richly visited and refreshed of late, still we rejoice in that we have been neither overlooked nor forgotten by the Great Head of the Church. We have on the Mission seven classes, including in all 153 members, many of whom are truly pillars in the house of God—men who are full of zeal, faith and piety. We have also a noble staff of local aid, five to seven efficient Local Preachers, who are a great help and a benefit to the Mission."

"I am glad to be able to inform the friends of Missions that the Great Head of the Church has been with us in his reviving and saving influences, during the past year: and as the result thirty-nine united with us, most of them having given satisfactory evidence of a sound and scriptural conversion. Four removed during the year to other circuits. One withdrew, but not from any fault found with your Missionary, the Wesleyan Church, or its discipline. Thirteen have been dropped, leaving an increase of twenty-one. We have got a Parsonage-House partially finished; and as a gentleman in Montreal who has property in the Village of Madoc, has promised us a lot to build a church on (free of expense), I think the friends will make an effort to erect one soon, and that this in the course of a few years will become an interesting Mission."

"In submitting the report of this Mission, perhaps it will be proper to state that this is the first year of its ecclesiastical existence, in its present form, it having been formerly connected with the Brighton Circuit, and the Norwood Mission. It includes the whole of the township of Percy, and part of the townships of Seymour and Brighton. We entered upon the duties of this Mission, amid difficulties and discouragements the most disheartening.

"During the year, souls have been converted and added to the Church. On our arrival on the Mission, we found 86 members in society; at the end of the year we return 103, after deducting removals, withdrawals, expulsions, and deaths, leaving an increase of 17. In the course of the year, we have taken up several new appointments, and found one new class of 11 members, and finished the Chapel in Seymour, which had been laying in an unfinished state for some years. We have another Chapel, at the village of Percy Mills, in course of erection, and which we expect to complete during the next year."

"This Mission lies on the banks of the beautiful St. Lawrence, and it embraces a part of the Townships of Pittsburgh, Leeds, Lansdown and Escott. It was under circumstances of a very embarrassing nature we entered upon the duties of this Mission; indeed we have had to wade through many difficulties, arising from complicated grievances and afflictions; yet here we can raise our Ebenezer, 'Hitherto hath the Lord helped and supported us.

"The moral soil is not in general very genial to Methodism, though there are several who are warmly attached to it as the Church of their affection and choice; and I think I never saw Christianity more admirably portrayed, than by the consistent lives of some of the members on this Mission; and I never saw a more triumphant death than I witnessed in the exit of an old disciple from this Mission, during the last year.

"We have been in a very low state, both temporally and spiritually; and although it is not in as flourishing a condition at present as we could wish, yet I think there has been considerable improvement in both. There were several removals and one death; yet the numbers admitted left us a small increase. Our congregations have been increasing during the year. We have now 45 members. I do devoutly pray that peace and increasing prosperity may be long enjoyed by this people."

With but one exception the BYTOWN DISTRICT has reported an increase on all the Missions; of these there are eight in number, with a membership amounting to 1277, supplied by 11 Missionaries. These are Missions requiring hardy constitutions, accustomed to exposure and privation; and Missionary souls animated by ardent zeal and love to God and man. The labours of our brethren in these mountain regions of Canada, are greatly prized and much needed: whatever itinerancy may be in its relationship to dense populations and more privileged communities, there are no agencies or appointments more calculated to supply the wants of these scattered occupants of the soil, than the Wesleyan Ministry. To this Ministry God continues to impart His blessing. Of them and their charge it may be said,—

"He fills them with his choicest store,
He gives them life for evermore."

"During the year now closing, your Missionaries are thankful to be able to report an increasing interest in most of the appointments on the Mission, embracing a wide and laborious field of missionary toil. There are 19 regular preaching places, all of which are attended once a fortnight, and some of them once a week, viz: every Sabbath, making in all 22 appointments, beside some that are occasionally visited. The work on this Circuit, especially that part of it which is essentially missionary, overspreading a wide extent of mountain range, is exceedingly difficult, and sometimes dangerous, having to climb the bare and rugged sides of granite rocks, and descend into deep ravines and defiles, where the sun only penetrates when he stands above them, and to get through among boulders and detached pieces of granite without breaking the horse's legs, or the riders neck, requires strong nerves, a steady hand, and the skill a good horseman can muster; and your missionaries are thankful they have accomplished the toils of another year, with nothing more than a few broken ribs, and abundance of fatigue, and in the midst of these toils they have been cheered by the divine blessing attending their labours. Thirty-one have been received into the Church during the year, leaving an increase after all removals, expulsions, and deaths, of 23; and when I observe, that in attending some of those extra appointments, the writer travelled 100 miles, and held eleven separate religious services, and preached eleven times in four days, you will perceive that this is no sinecure."

OSGOOD.

"During the past year, the benefactor of our lives, and Great Head of the Church, has smiled upon us most graciously. Our enterprising friends of the Methodistic Zion have in the course of erection, 4 new churches, have made improvements on the Parsonage, and to some extent erased its debt; our finances improve; the Lord has been amongst us, demonstrating afresh in the hearts of many souls, his character, 'glorious in holiness, fearful in praises, doing wonders,' that "he is a sun and shield: the Lord will give grace and glory; and no good thing will he withhold;" our congregations larger, Quarterly Meeting and means of grace, seasons of Divine influence and spiritual rapture to his people, and efficiently awakening and converting to sinners. We have taken some new appointments and have fresh openings which we are embracing. May Christianity's aggressions and progressions never cease to ray out the immortal glory of the apostolic character of our enobled economy. We have organized 7 new Sabbath schools.

"Our annual numerical schedule stands thus,—received on trial 83, fully admitted 25, remaining on trial 58, removals 12, dropped 23, 1 death; total membership 220, increase 50, and the opening heavens beaming prosperity

on the future. Not unto us O Lord, not unto us, but unto thy name, give glory for thy mercy and truth's sake."

GATTINEAU.

"This is an extensive and laborious Mission for one man, if it could be avoided. It is situated partly along the banks of the Gattineau River, and extends up this river north a distance of about fifty-three miles. It is for the most part a mountainous country, so that many of its inhabitants are prevented from doing all they could wish for the support of Methodism. During the past year God has graciously visited some societies on this field of labour, and by the outpouring of his holy Spirit, twenty-seven souls have experienced converting grace, one of whom we have reason to hope, has died in the Lord, and gone to join the assembly above: the remainder have united with our Church. Thus after making allowance for removals, &c., we return an increase of thirty-one. While the work of God has been reviving, our people have been devising liberal things. Our connexional funds are all in advance of last year. A small but neat Parsonage has been purchased and nearly paid for. They are about to commence a Church, which will be of much importance to this Mission."

CLARENDON AND PORTAGE DU FORTE.

"This mission extends into the Townships of Litchfield, Clarendon, Onslow, and part of Ardley. We have thirteen regular appointments, and four or five occasional preaching places. We have 175 members, divided into ten classes. We have five Sabbath Schools, twenty-five teachers, 120 scholars, three hundred volumes in library, 1040 hearers. The Wesleyan Methodist Church on this Mission has stood for some years unfinished. In the fall and winter we made an effort to have it finished. The men are now at work, and we are in hopes of having it completed in a little time."

"The Divine blessing and presence have been with us during the past year, causing an evident increase of spirituality amongst our people; a deeper seriousness in the congregations, and a very large advance in the connexional funds. To God be all the praise!"

REPORT.

Christ, preached by the Methodist missionaries has proved the power of God to the salvation of precious and immortal souls; some have experienced its benefits in a dying hour. The Lord has been better to us than all our fears during the past year, and under the painful afflictions through which this mission has been called to pass,—Methodism stands higher than I could have anticipated. The late calamitous fire has, and will embarrass our temporal circumstances for some time to come. There are a few members who steadfastly abide all the shocks which have befallen this mission. We are trying to labour for the salvation of redeemed souls, praying for the out-pouring of the Holy Spirit."

CONCLUSION.

Upon a close examination of the state of the Domestic Missions as compared with the year previous, it is found there are only seven Missionary Stations on which there has been a small decrease, easily and satisfactorily accounted for according to the different reports; the whole of these only amount to a deficiency of 66, being a fraction more than nine members for each Mission, whilst we have the gratification of publishing to the Church and the world, that our Domestic work from Sandwich in the West to L'Original in the East presents a healthy and prosperous condition. To the Triune God of Holiness be ascribed the praise. In the year ending at the June Conference this Society had fifty-nine Domestic Missions, on which were 8135 Members, being an increase of 1708, whose spiritual wants were met by the self-denying and untiring labours of seventy-three ministers.

Uniting the two branches of the Missionary enterprise carried on by this Society there are eighty-four Missions,—nine thousand two hundred and ninety-four Members,—supplied by ninety-one Ministers.

With a view to circulate more religious intelligence by economising in the large amount now paid for printing the numerous subscribers' names for 2s 6d, and giving more information in the body of the Report, the attention of Local Secretaries is invited to the following Resolution of the Committee:—

"That all sums of five shillings and upwards contributed to the Missionary Society shall be acknowledged in the Annual Report; and all sums under that amount, shall be acknowledged as "small sums," or "sums under five shillings."

Rarely have the committee had the privilege of sending forth their Annual Report accompanied by so many tokens of prosperity. First in importance will present itself,—the spiritual character of the work; the preceding pages show that this has encouraged the managers of the Society, as it has doubtless been gratifying to the thousands of friends by whose liberality the resources are provided:—next to this may be classed the ordinary income of the Society: here also we meet with occasion for Devout gratitude,—more than twelve hundred pounds have been raised throughout the Conference above the income of the previous year. In these days of prosperity, when the rural portion of our country share in the great advance in prices given for all descriptions of produce, we may reasonably anticipate that the offerings of 1853-4, will still be in advance of 1852-3. With such an impression the appropriations, made in prospect of the income, have been on a larger scale than in any year previous: to the earnest and powerful advocates of this Holy cause, and to the continued right-heartedness of the Wesleyan community, and other christian friends, we must again look for the necessary means to sustain and enlarge our missionary field. “ And it shall come to pass in the last day, “ that the mountain of the Lord’s house shall be established in the top of the “ mountains, and shall be exalted above the hills; and all nations shall flow “ unto it. And many people shall go and say, come ye, and let us go up to “ the mountain of the Lord, to the house of the God of Jacob: and he will “ teach us of his ways, and we will walk in his paths: for out of Zion shall go “ forth the law, and the word of the Lord from Jerusalem.” Isaiah ii. 2, 3.

The Committee are not without hope that there will be found hundreds of names with the larger sum appended to them which have appeared for some time attached to the smaller. The usages of other kindred institutions of magnitude,—the universal improvements by which we are surrounded,—the loud calls for missionary labour, demanding corresponding liberality,—coupled with the expressed desire to give greater prominency to details of the great work being carried on by the Christian Church, appear to strengthen the expectation that this alteration in issuing the Annual Report will be cordially sustained by the people, and be productive of the advantages anticipated.
