



"FORWARD BLACK WATCH."

GRANDFATHER'S STORY.

The forty-second, or "Black Watch," the regiment to which I had the honor to belong, passed through—during the Peninsular war—all the vicissitudes attend ant upon the life of a soldier; but no where did it display itself to better advantage than during the days of the distressing retreat from Astroga to Corunna.

Brave, high of hope, and light of heart were the bosoms which beat beneath the tartan when the British host under Lieutenant General Nir John Moore advanced from Liston to Douro to form a junction with the Spanish General Romana; and not less brave, if heavy and despairing, were those same hearts, when, after the dispersion of the native armies, they turned their facvs resolutely eastward and began that ever memorable retreat.
