THE PROGRAM FOR ROYALTY PAPER COMBINE ENQUIRY

A Provisional Schedule Sent Out From Rideau Hall Which is Subject to Change.

WILL REACH TORONTO OCTOBER 7, MINUTES OF MEETINGS SHOWN.

Remains Five Days, and During That Time Make Runs to Other Points.

Ottawa, June 5.—(Globe Special).—A provisional program of the movements of the Duke and Duchess of Cornwall during their stay in Canada was issued today from Rideau Hall. Their Royal Highnesses will arrive at Quebec on Monday, Sept. 16, on H.M.S. Ophir, where they will be officially received by the Governor-General, Sir Wilfrid Laurier, the members of the cabinet and others of state. The following outline of the tour of the Duke and Duchess has been approved: Quebec—Arrive Monday, Monday, Sept. 16; leave Wednesday morning, Sept. 18; Montreal—Arrive Friday morning, Sept. 20; Ottawa—Arrive Friday morning, Sept. 20; leave Tuesday morning, Sept. 22; Winnipeg—Arrive Thursday morning, Sept. 25; leave late in the afternoon of same day; Vancouver—Arrive Monday, Sept. 30; Toronto—Arrive Tuesday, Oct. 1; leave Thursday, Oct. 3; Victoria—Arrive Monday, Oct. 7; leave Saturday, Oct. 12; St. John, N.B.—Arrive Tuesday, Oct. 15; Halifax—Leave on Monday, Oct. 21; their Royal Highnesses will be the guests of the Governor-General at the Citadel at Quebec and at Government House while in Ottawa.

More Evidence to Connect Increase in Price With Formation of the Association.

Commission Will Meet Again in Montreal to Hear Evidence From Manufacturers' Standpoint.

Important evidence in the paper combine enquiry was given before Justice Taschereau yesterday by C. M. Robertson, Secretary-Treasurer of the Ottawa Journal.

The enquiry was concluded after a half-hour session in the afternoon, and further evidence will be produced at Montreal on July 3. Statement of Negotiations. Mr. Robertson gave a detailed statement of the negotiations between his paper and the Eddy Company. Before the Hull trial, he said, they had a contract for a supply of paper, the price of which was gradually reduced. In the afternoon of July 3, 1900, the organization in 1900 was put in, and left to the judge to pursue before the next sitting of the commission. It was developed in the evidence that the Montreal Star had a contract with the Canada Paper Company, the figure being \$1.87, which is considerably below the price quoted by the trust.
