I.—On the 12th May, a partial Eclipse of the Moon, invisible at Quebec.

II.—On the 26th May, a partial Eclipse of the Sun, visible at Quebec, viz:—

Commencement, at 4 h. 36 m. Afternoon.

Middle ..... at 5 h. 36 m. “

End ..... at 6 h. 36 m. “

This Eclipse will be central and annular in part of the United States.

III. On the 4th November a partial Eclipse of the Moon, invisible at Quebec.

IV. On the 20th November, a total Eclipse of the Sun, invisible at Quebec.
