Washington, D. C., May 6.—Is the Wilson administration going to succeed on politics and go wrong on society? That is the question which all Washington is asking itself today. 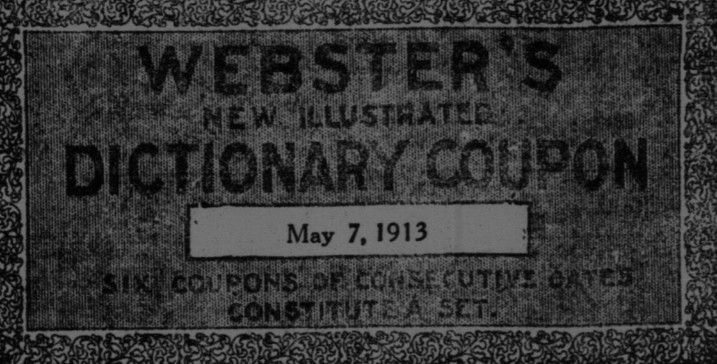

THE LATE DANIEL SIMONDS

Of Daniel Simonds, whose death was reported in the Times yesterday, the Boston Globe says: Daniel Simonds, president of the Simonds Manufacturing Company, and one of the most highly respected citizens, died last night at his summer home in Larchmont, N. Y., of apoplexy. Mr. Simonds was a native of Fitchburg, Mass., the son of Abel and Jane Todd Simonds. He graduated from the Fitchburg High School and a Boston business college, and later went to work for his father, who conducted a small shop, and manufactured sythes in West Fitchburg. He became superintendent of the big Simonds plant in 1881, and was later made president, succeeding his brother, the late George F. Simonds, as the head of the business. He was stricken with apoplexy at a New York hotel two months ago, and he had rapidly grown worse. He was president of the Simonds Fire Company and the Wausonaw Power Company, and a director in the Fitchburg National Bank and the Fitchburg Mutual Fire Insurance Company. He was a member of the Union League Club of Chicago, the Larchmont Yacht Club, Fay Club, Fitchburg Board of Trade and Merchants Association and the Fitchburg Manufacturers' Club. Mr. Simonds was exceedingly prominent with his employees, and in 1909, when the present new plant of the company was dedicated he was presented a beautiful loving cup by them. Mr. Simonds was sixty-five years of age.

MOLASSES CAKE.
One cup molasses, one teaspoon salt, one teaspoon ginger, one teaspoon cloves, one teaspoon cinnamon, three-quarters cup melted lard, one teaspoon saleratus dissolved in one cup of warm water. Flour.

DELICIOUS CAKE.
One-half cup butter, half cup milk, one cup sugar, one and a half cups sifted flour, yolks of two eggs, one and half teaspoons baking powder, whites of two eggs, half teaspoon vanilla. Mix in order given, adding the whites of eggs last and bake thirty minutes in a moderate oven.

FIVE-ACRE FARMS FOR THE ASKING

Endless Chain of Small Farms, House, Barn, Chickens, Pig and Cow For All City Back-to-the-Sealers Who Want Them, Is This Man's Plan

(Times' Special Correspondence) Hartford, Conn., May 5.—An endless back-to-the-soil chain movement, that is to perpetuate itself and eventually become nation-wide and involve the expenditure of millions of dollars, has been launched here by one of the oldest living Yale University graduates, Austin Cornelius Dunham.



The barn is to be stocked with the necessary tools and seeds, and forty hens will cackle in each coop. And each family will get one pig and one cow. Last year I gave the Sheffield scientific school \$55,000. This year I am going to spend \$100,000 on some of the common people. Those who want to get back to the soil will be given an opportunity.

TO ENLIGHTEN PUBLIC ON NEED OF SCHOOL REFORM

Not the least important part of the programme of the International Congress on School Hygiene to be held in Buffalo August 23-30, will be given over to papers and discussions calling public attention to the urgent need of extending medical inspection throughout the individual communities of the United States and Canada.

This need of reform, according to educators, is based upon the findings made by recent medical inspection in schools which show: That of all pupils 26 per cent. suffer from eye strain. That 8 to 12 per cent. suffer from enlarged tonsils. That 12 to 24 per cent. suffer from nasal obstruction.
