# FIGFITEEINTTE SEBSIOIT. <br> (Being the first under the Synod Act of Incorporation, 1874.) 

## FIRST DAY.

The Synod met in Löndon, Wednesday, June 23rd, 1875.
Divine Service was held in the Chapter House at 10 o'clock a.m., when the Holy Communion was administered by the Bishop to the Clerical and Lay members of the Synod assembled.

The sermon was preached by the Right Rev. the Lord Bishop of Niagara, from the words, "Occupy till I come." $*-$ Luke xix;1\%.

The Synod assembled in the Chapter House at half past 2 o'clock p.m.,

THE BISHOP'S ADDRESS.
His (Lordship the Bishop then delivered his. Annual Address
to the Synod, as follows :Beloved Brethren,-
"Grace to you, and peace from God our Father and the Lord Jesus Christ." My heart is greatly cheered to see so many familiar faces from every part of the Diocese, and I feel truly thankful, that in the gracious providence of God, we are permitted once more to meet as a Synod, collectively an'd unitedly, to deliberate and take brotherly counsel together, how best to maintain and advance the spiritual and temporal well-being of our belbved Zion. With a unity of purpose, and the blessing of God upon our efforts to extend Christ's kingdom, we may confidently rely upon the promise that our labors will not be in vain in the Lord; nay, that he will prosper our handy work upon us.

We meet on this occasion under somewhat altered circum-stances-as "The Incorporated Synod of the Diocese of Huron."
' The union of the Church Society with the Synod - in accordance with resolutions passed by both bodies-was legalised, during the last session of the Ontario Legislature, by a special Act of Parliament.

We expect the happiest results from this union, for while no changes or alterations will be made in the objects and principles which the late Church Society endeavored to promote, the management of our funds will from henceforth be administered by the Synod, instead of as heretofore by a few members of the Church Society. Now every measure, whether financial or ecclesiastical, affecting tha well-being and good government of the Church, must meet with the sanction and approval of this legislative body, who represent the whole Church of the Diocese.
${ }^{2}$ I I feel sure when this is once understood we shall enlist and secure more than ever the warm-hearted sympathy and cooperation of the members of the Church in all our works.
May the Holy Spirit who presided in the councils of the blessed Apostles, be poured out upon us in rich abundance; may our hearts be quickened to a deeper love and zeal for the work of Christ committed to ,our trust; may all our deliberations be carried on in a spirit of union and brotherly love; may we be enriched with that wisdom which is from above, and which is "first pure, then peaceable, gentle and easy to be entreated, full
of mercy an hypocrisy."

## the new diocese of niagara.

Since we last met in Synod another important step in advance has been taken by the Church of our Ecclesiastical Province in sanctioning the sub-division of the Diocese of Toronto.

Considering the wealth and importance of the territorial area which constitutes the new Diocese of Niagara, with its large Church population and goodly number of Ministers, it must be admitted by all who desire the growth and prosperity of the Chureh, that this step has not been taken too soon. The new Bishop is one who has long and valiantly served in the army of Christ; a man of large experience, and of acknowledged administrative ability, all of which we feel sure he will make subservient to the cause of our Lord and Saviour Jesus Christ, and will earnestly contend for the maintenance of the doctrines and principles of the Chureh of ourMartyred Reformers. Our fervent prayer is that the God of all grace may bless and prosper every effort of the new Diocese, for the promotion iof His glory and the extension of the Redeemer's kingdom.

## DIOCESAN MISSION WORK.

Although the past year has been one of unusual financial stringency and difficulty throughout the country, from which every secular enterprise has more or less suffered, it is yet a cause of much thankfulness to God, that so far as we have been able in this large and increasing Diocese, with our limited resources of means and men to occupy our mission field, it has been on the whole cultivated with mueh vigor end success. We can but feel that this is due under God, to the loyalty, faithfulness and zeal, both of the Clergy and Lay members of the Church, in the different parishes and missions.

Nor have we far to look for such gratifying evidences of progress and success:-(1.) Several missions have in compliance with a suggestion made in my address of last year, cheerfully and voluntarily relinquished the grants hitherto made to their Pastors from the Mission Fund, guaranteeing to their Clergy a salary of not less than $\$ 800$ per annum and a parsonage, or its equivalent in rent, thus raising their missions to the dignity of Rectories, according to our Canon. (2.) Other missions again, realizing the necessity of the case, have by strenuous and self-sacrificing efforts, been enabled to make good to their clergy the reduction of their grants which the Mission Board was constrained to effect, so that I am truly glad to be able to report that I do not know of a single instance, in which a faithful and diligent Pastor, has been to any serious extent a sufferer from any withdrawal of support, which the Mission Board has felt it incumbent upon it to make, owing to the heavy debt contracted through a long series of years, in order to meet the mission grants made from time to time by the late Church Society. In some cases, it is true, and those not a few, we would fain see the stipends of the Clergy more in accordance with their real necessities and the just claims of their position; but it is surely something to be grateful for, that through a period ot such general depression as we have lately experienced, we have been enabled to maintain such a condition of affairs as I have just described, when even families accustomed to all the comforts and appliances of wealth have had to exercise the strictest coonomy and self-denial, and been compelled to cireumscribe within narrower limits the stream of their Christian benevolence. We should take it as a mark of the Divine favor that/His ministering servants have still experienced the fulfilment of His precious promises to His people; and that in reply to theiroLord"s inquiry as to whether they "lacked anything"
essential to their well-being whilst engaged in His service, they can exclaim with His faithful disciples of old, "Nothing!"

In addition to other unfavorable circumstances, and those likely injuriously to affect our finances, we should note the severity of the past winter, and the inaccessible character of the roads, which in very many instances prevented the holding of the usual missionary meetings, reducing largely also our Sunday collections, thus interfering seriously with the anticipated returns.

But fully to realize what has been accomplished in the Diocese at large, as to Church support and extension during the past year, we must take into acccount not only what has been raised for the Mission Fund, but what has been subscribed to meet the reductions made in the different grants; also what has been done towards building, restoring and repairing churches and parsonages,and reducing and liquidating debts on the same.

Calmly reviewing, beloved brethren, all these circumstances, and fairly estimating the period through which we have passed, I think you will agree with me that it is a cause for deep thank-) fulness to God, that our funds have not suffered more, than has, been stated by our Secretary in the report read to you last evening at our Missionary Meeting.

And here, let me remind you, my brethren, in what under God the true stability and success of our Church consists:-It is not found in State endowments, however acceptable in the hour: of need; it is not in the benefactions of the worldly-minded; however princely, but in the systematic, scriptural, self-sacrificing efforts of her own children. The sooner we learn, and practically carry out this truth, the better for the Church and for ourselves.

It is not on uncertain aids that we must learn to lean, but simply upon God and upon each other. The sooner the Pastor: learns to look to those to whom he ministers for his entire support ; the sooner old established and able missions feel it to be not only their duty to provide for the temporal wants of those who labor and care for their spiritual well-being, but deem it a high and holy privilege to render assistance to the poorer missions in the Diocese, the sooner will the Church attain to a position of true stability, and her progress will keep pace with. her necessities, and the desires and aspirations of our hearts to provide all within this rapidly growing Diocese, with the means: of grace, will be sooner realized. Mission grants are needful to the formation of a mission, where the population is scattered
and poor, but with the growth and prosperity of a parish, there should be a readiness on the part of the people, not only to relinquish the mission grant enjoyed for many years, but a disposition to aid liberally those localities which are exactly in the same needy condition as they once were.

In a living Church, with ample temporary resources, there will be no abject reliance on extraneous aid. Growth and extension are to her the simple effects of her being; the energizing influence of the Holy Ghost, and the constant presence of Him who is her divine Head, and Whose grace is all sufficient for her, renders her instinct with life and power.

Beloved brethren, while gratefully recognizing the goodness and love of God, in what He has been graciously pleased to do for us and by us, and for the increase also in the number of our Clergy and Communicants, I must confess to a feeling of sadness and great uneasiness, when I contemplate the wide mission field which lies altogether beyond the reach of our present efforts,and to which we have not even attempted to minister. I mean the 61,000 Church members and the 36 townships, altogether destitute of Church ordinances and the preaching of the Gospel-Kingdom, to which I drew your serious attention in my last Address to the Synod. This subject has ever since engaged my most anxious thoughts. For want of means, I have been constrained to follow the example of my revered predecessor, who, finding that all the funds-including the surplus commutation moneywere inadequate to meet even the existing grant to the Missionaries of the Diocese, without increasing the debt ${ }_{4}$ warned the candidates for ordination that he "could not promise any support from the Church Society, and that they should enter upon their missions at their own risk."

The care of the missionary work of the Diocese presses specially hard upon the Bishop. Clerical and Lay Delegates return from the Synod to their respective spheres of duty, and their minds are naturally occupied, if not altogether absorbed, with local Church demands, while the Bishop, without intermission, is left to bear the burden and "the care of all the Churches." The continual "Macedonian cry for help" from every part of the Diocese reaches him chiefly, and is perpetually ringing in his ears, with the painful consciousness that he has not "the wherewith" to answer the call, and render the help appealéd for.

Is it not, possible, I ask, to do something effectual for our fellow-churchmen, in that large portion of territory within our Diocese, which the Lord has committed to our charge, and which

I do appeal to my brethren, by all the consideration of loyalty to the Church, but above all for the love of Christ to devise some plans and means by which we can at least alleviate the spiritual necessities of those, whom we are bound to help by all that is dear to the heart of Christ.

I feel very, very deeply upon this point-fore than language can express; so much so that I think it would be a great sin to leave this place, in which we have met to deliberate for the good of the Church, and where we have solemnly invoked God's help and blessing, without grappling with the question in downright earnest, and with the godly determination, not only to legislate upon but to do at once, and that effectually, the work which stares us in the face.

As your Bishop, and as one responsible together with you before God, for any slackness in this all important matter; I solemnly call upon you, and entreat you, to take up this duestion "with all your might," and let us not break up this Synod until we have done something, that will tell to the Church and the world that we really care for our brethren in their wilderness, and desire them to be made recipients of those Gospel privileges, which we so richly enjoy.

I look to yof, beloved brethren, for your aid in this matter. I feel that it is due to me, for the burden is truly heavier than I can bear alone. Let us enter upon this undertaking in the spirit of faith and prayer, and surely God, even our own God, will give us His blessing

Let us believe in the promises of God, which in Christ are, Yea, and in Him, Amen. Let us work while it is day, and we may rest assured that God will own and honor His own work in which we are engaged, and make us equal to our duty in this matter.
"Now our Lord Jesus Christ, Himself, and God, even our Father, which hath loved us, and hath given us everlasting consolation and good hope through grace, comfort your hearts and establish you in every good word and work."

## REPORT OF THE COMMITTEE ON THE SURPLUS OOMMUTATION FUND,

which report was presented as follows :-

## CANON ON THE DISTRIBUTION OF THE SURPLUS OOMMUTATION FUND.

Be it further enacted by and under the authority of the Act of Incorporation of the Diocese of Huron ( 38 Vic., Cap. 78, 1874), and by and with the sanction of the Bishop of the said Diocese, that the surplus of the Clergy Commutation Fund shall be apportioned as follows:-

## SURPLUS DEFINED,

1. That all income over and above that required for the payment of the original claimants, and for the payment of the expenses connected with the fund or of any rate for which the fund may be assessed for expenses, shall be considered for the purposes of this Canon as Surplus.

## HOW SURPLUS SHALL BE APPLIED.

2. That in addition to the stipend derived from the Parish and Diocesan funds, every clergyman, not under ecelesiastical censure, of eight years and upwards active service in this Diocese, who is nöt on the Commutation Fund, or who is not receiving a salary from any other source than the funds of the Diocese, or from any Society which contributes to Ohurch work in the Diocese, saving and except clergymen who are employed in teaching with the Bishop's consent (not being more than onesuch olergyman for each school or college), and who have received the Bishop's license for clerical work, shan receive $\$ 200$ per annum, beginning with the clergyman of longest standing, is far as the surplus permits.
3. That if, after paying the above, there remains a surplus of $\$ 200$ or more, each of such clergymen of ten years' standing, beginning with the one of senior standing, shall receive an additional $\$ 200$ per annum.

## excerptions.

4. That the provisions made above shall not extend to any clergyman so long as and while he is enjoying an income from Endowment, pew rents and salary, or from any other source whatsoever (private fortune, fees and offerings and house-rent only excepted), of $\$ 1,600$ and over per annum, provided always that when a clergyman is once placed on the list for either of the above sums, no further names shall be added until a surplus remains over and above what is required to meet the claims of those who have been placed on the list.

## grants from mision fund.

5. That whenever a clergyman is placed on the Commatation Fund Surplus List for a second grant of $\$ 200$ per annum, the grant, if any,' which his parish receives from the Mission Fund shall be withdrawn.

## SUPERANNUATED CLERGYMEN.

6. That each of the original commuted clergymen who may be placed on the Superannuated List of this Diocese, shall receive a grant of $\$ 400$ a year in addition to his income from the Commutation' Fund; and any of such noncommuted clergymen as are described in section two of this Canon, who, having been licensed for eight years in this Diocese, may be superannuated before his name has been placed on the list for a grant of $\$ 200$ per annum, shall have a first claim on the fund for $\$ 200$ per annum whenever surplus shall accrue, and all such clergymen as may be superannuated shall have a claim for the second $\$ 200$ per annum, as soon as surplus shall accrue, if they have been licensed for ten years in this Diocese, before any further names are placed on the list for the first $\$ 200$ per annum.

## DIOCESAN REGISTER.

7. That there shall be kept a Diocesan Register of the non-commated clergy.

That up to June 6, 1871, seniority in respect to those who have been ordained in the Diocese, shall be reckoned according to the order of signature at Deacon's orders in the Bishop's register, and that after June 6, 1871, the Bishop shall immediately after any ordination furnish the order of seniority in which the newly ordained are to be placed in the Diocesan register.

With reference to those clergymen who, previous to June 6, 1871, have been received into the Diocese, the time when they commenced duty, with the Bishop's consent, shall be taken as the time from which they shall date, and for the future the order in which clergymen received into the Diocese are licensed and registered by the Bishop, shall be the order of seniority in which they shall be entered in the Diocessan register.

## CERTIFICATE OF CLAIM.

11. That before being placed on the list of annuitants on the fund, and on the lst day of May in each year, every clergyman claiming to retain or to receive an annuity by virtue of this Canon, shall furnish to the Committee, through the Secretary-Treasurer, a certificate in the following terms:"I, .................................. do solemnly declare that I am entitled to an annuity of $\$ \ldots . . .$. . from the Commutation Fund of the Synod of the Diocese of Huron; that my whole income for the past twelve months from Endowment, pew rents, salary and offerings, or from any source whatever (private fortune, fees and house-rent only excepted), has not exceeded $\$ \ldots \ldots$. , and that in estimating the same no deductions of any kind whatsoever, except as above, have been made." And any clergyman failing to forward such certificate by the time above named, shall be held to have ceased for the time being to claim upon the fund.

## list of annuttants to be published yearly.

12. That the names of the clergymen who are entitled to rank on this fund according to the order in which they stand in the Diocesan Register, shall be entered in the journal of the Synod, and the Clerical Secretary of Synod shall at each meeting of Synod read out the names of those clergymen who have been placed on the list since the last Synod, and, being approved, such additional names shall also be entered in the Synod Journal.
13. Nots-This is presented as the report of the majority, the Chairman dissenting therefrom on certain points.

The Bishop addressed the Synod at length on this subject and stated that dissenting from several important provisions of the proposed Canon, he had determined upon preparing a Canon himself for submission to the Synod. Desiring to save the time of the members by avoiding needless discussion, he had
sought the sense of the Standing Committee as to the most appropriate time for him to introduce his canon, and their unanimous council was that it should be brought forward at the "opening of the question rather than after discussion had taken place.

He concluded by presenting the following canon, printed copies of which were circulated among the members:-

## CANON ON APPROPRIATION OF ACCRUED INTEREST OF THE COMMUTATION FUND.

Be it further enacted by and under the anthority of the "Act to Incorporate the Synod of the Diocese of Huron," (38 Vic., Cap. 98, 1874) and by and with the sanction of the Bishop of the said Diocese, that the interest of the Clergy Commutation Fund shall be appropriated as follows?-

1. That all accrued interest over and above that required for the payments of the original claimants, and for the payment of expenses connected with the Fund, or of any rate for which the Fund may be assessed for expenses, shall be appropriated in the following manner and order: --
2. That each of the original Commuted Clergymen, who may be placed on the Superannuation List of this Diocese, shall receive such a grant from the acorued interest of the Commutation Fund as shall make his income not less than $\$ 600$ per annum.
3. Any clergyman who, having been licensed for eight years in the Diocese, and may be superannuated in accol dance with the "Canon on Superannuation, shall receive from the accrued interest of the Commutation Fund a grait of not less than $\$ 400$ per annum.
4. Every elergyman, not under ecelesiastical censure, of eight years and upwards aictive service in this Diocese, according to seniority, shall be entitled to such a grant from the acorued interest of the Commutation Fund as shall make uphis clerical income to not less than $\$ 800$ per annum.
5. That after the above claims have been fully and first satisfied, in the order as set forth in this Canon, the balance, if any, shall form part of the Mission Fund.
6. That this Canon shall take effeot from October İst, 1875, and all previsions, by-laws and Canons respecting the surplus of the Commutation Fund, and amendments to such by-laws shall be and are hereby rescinded from and after October lst, 1875.

if possible, the existing missions, without incurring fresh responsibility.

The Secretary reported that several parishes, receiving grants from the Mission Fund, have not made any returns for the usual Parochial Association Collections, and thereby seriously diminished the income of the Diocese.

The Board deeply regret to hear this report, and they would recommend that, for the future, no grants be paid to missions so long as they neglect to comply with the rules laid down for the annual collections.

The amendment, thus altered, was put to the Synod and carried.

The 4th Section being amended to read as follows:-
"Every Clergyman, not under Eeclesiastical censure, of eight years' active service in this Diocese, according to seniority, shall be entitled to such a grant from the acorued interest of the Commutation Fund as shall make up his Clerical income in the aggregate to 8800 per annuum, and every such Chergy. man of 10 years and upwards active servioe, in like manner; to an aggregate of $\$ 1000$, including in each case the amount received from his parish, as assessed by the Mission Board, and exclusive of fees and house rent; and sheh aggregate amounts shall stand as the absolute maximum to which ssid Fund shall contribute."

# THE FINANCIAL REPORT  

, FOR THE YEAR ENDING MARCH $81,187 B$.
[Being the first under the Act of Incorporation.]

The report for the past year exhibits a statement of affairs which, on the whole, is encouraging, and affords ground for devout thankfulness to Almighty God that he has been pleased to continue to our labours his fayour and blessing

The unexampled severity and duration of the past winter, the monetary pressure which has existed, the consequent stagnation in commercel which hassensued, and the increasing cost in the necessaries of life, will mainly account for the somewhat diminished offerings which have been contributed to our Diocesan work; and when it is takensinto consideration that our Parochial Association collections are made at the close of our financial year - period which has brought them within the full influence of the commercial and monetary difficulties which have recently prevailed, and which stin exist, it may be truly deemed a cause for great thankfulness that the deficiency is no greater.

## INCOME; oitusiteno') orl' (1) II

The income of the past yeat, derived from volunitary subscriptions and donations, and exclusive of receipts for rent, interest and sale of lands, is $\$ 11,737.62$, being $\$ 904.44$ less than the income of the previous year. It must, however, be borne in mind that a considerable reduction has recently been made in thengrants from the Mission Fund, and that several parishes and missions have, during the year, become selfisupporting, and that thereby an increased monetary responsibility has been borne by those parishes in their laudable efforts "8 "angmént and sustain the stipends paid by them to their ministers.

In the more northern parts of the Diocese, too, our missionary meetings, and even our Sunday services, have been most injuriously affected by the inclemency of the weather; in several missions the roads have been completely blocked by snow, and all traffic and communication suspended for the time being.

In some parishes it is to be noticed and deeply regretted that the annual collections for our missionary work have been neglected to be made, and this, too, in missions that have been for years past, and even now are, in the receipt of grants from the Mission Fund.

On the other hand, it is pleãsant to be able to record the increased liberality of many missions, and the active interest that seems to be awakened in the hearts of both clergy and laity to-do all in their power to promote the cause of Christ and to assist in the spread of the Gospel.

## MISSION FUND.

It will be learnt with pleasure that, notwithstanding the djfficulties and reductions of the past year, the parochial quarverly collections for this fund have been increased by $\$ 95.14$ over those of the previous year, and that an increase of $\$ 66.19$ has also been received from the collections made on the day of General Thanksgiving appointed by the House of Bishops, and the proceeds of which are given to this Fund.

The amount received from the Missionary meetings is $\$ 70.41$ less than last year, and the decrease may readily be accounted for by the fact that the meetings happened to be held at about the nost stormy season of the whole year.

## MISSION BOXER.

From no apparent reason the interest taken in this means of supplementing the Missionary work seems to have almost died out, the whole amount contributed from the Diocese being only $\$ 149.43$, of which $\$ 47$ was given by Grace Church, Brantford.

The following are the details of receipts for the five years during which the boxes have been in circulation :-

The total debt of the Fund is now $\$ 10,038.32$, being an increase of $\$ 2,492.30$ since the last report. This, of course, was
anticipated, as the reduction in the scale of grants only commenced from October last.

Hitherto, under the existing by-law of the Widows' and Orphans' Fund, an annual grant has been made to it from the General Purposes Fund, and the balance of the latter Fund, after payment of the charges upon it, has been carried to the credit of the Mission Fund. During the years now past the W. and O. Fund has thus received from the G. P. Fund over $\$ 10,000$.

Under the existing prosperous state of the W. and O. Fund, and in view of the facts of its continuous annual increase, and that a second annual collection has for the last three years been made for it by the order of his Lordship the Bishop, it is a question well worthy of careful consideration whether this grant from the G. P. F. (amounting now to $\$ 1,000$ per annum) should not be applied to the Missionary Work of the Diocese.

## WIDOWS' AND ORPHANS' FUND.

It is very gratifying to be able to report of the continued prosperity of this most important Fund. Its present invested capital consists of

being nearly $\$ 5,000$ more than was shown at the last report. There is also a balance of $\$ 1,000$ still uninvested.

The hearty response which the appeals on behalf of the Fund always receive from the Diocese, is most encouraging, and the effect has been that it has steadily increased year after year, and is now firmly established and placed in a safe and most satisfactory condition; and we feel confident that the Diocese will always render their sympathy and active support to this good work, and that a special blessing will be vouchsafed to our labors in its behalf from Him who is the "Father of the fatherless and defendeth the cause of the widow, even God in His holy habitation."

## SUSTENTATION FUND.

This being the last year in which the subscriptions to this Fund matured, the receipts have been but small. The Fund,

Amount contributed to maintenance and support of Clergy

It must, however, be remembered that the Mission Fund is at the present time overdrawn about $\$ 10,000$, and steps will have to be taken to meet this debt, so as to relieve the Fund from an incubus which has been pressing upon it for some years past.

The Bishop desires to place on record his grateful acknowledgment for the grant of Six Thousand Dollars, made by the Church Society in June, 1872, towards the erection of the Cathedral Chapter House, but as this grant might be misunderstood by some contributors to the funds of the Society, and thas be mide prejudicial to its intereets, the Bishop would prefer that the $\$ 6,000$ should be considered as a loan, to be repaid by the Society at the option, either of the Bishop, Dean and Chapter, or of the Church Society. In the meantime, the Society should hold a first mortgage for the above ampunt on the Chapter House, thel interest to go in lieu of rent. The Bishop is desirous, should it please God to prosper his undertaking, that the Society should ultimately enjoy all the acoommodation required for their use, free of
rent.

# Act of Incorporation. 

38 Vict. Caf. lexily. Ont. Statr.

An Act to Incorporate the Synod of the Diocese of Huron, and to unite the Church Society of the Diocese of Huron therewith. Assented to 21st December, 1874.

Whereas the Synod of the United Church of England and Ireland of the Diocese of Huron have petitioned for an Act for the incorporation of the said Synod, and for union with the Church Society of the said Diocese; and the said Church Society have also petitioned for the same, and it will greatly facilitate the objects for which the said Synod and Church Society were established, to grant the prayer of the said petitioners;

Therefore Her Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Assembly of the Province of Ontario, enacts as follows:

## INCORPORATION.

1. The Synod of the United Church of England and Ireland of the Diocese of Huron shall be, and the same is hereby incorporated by the name of "The Incorporated Synod of the Diocese of Huron.""

## SYNOD, OF WHOM COMPOSED.

2. The said Incorporated Synod shall consist of the Bishop of the said Diocese, who shall be the head of the Synod, and any Suffragan or Coadjutor Bishop thereof, the Priests and Deacons of the same licensed by the Bishop or Suffragan, and of the lay delegates or representatives elected or to be elected according to the constitution of the said Synod, as the same exists at the time of the passing of this Act, or as it may from time to time be altered by the said Synod after the passing of this Act; and so far as the financial affairs of the Synod are concerned, the following shall also be members thereof, that is to say, the life members of the said Church Society, and each other member of the said Society who prior to the passing of this Act appears on the books of the said Society as having contributed in annual subscriptions to the said Society the aggregate of fifty dollars: Provided always, that each and every of said life and other members of the Church Society seeking admission to any meeting of the Synod under the authority of this section shall, before being admitted thereto, deposit with the Secretary of the Synod, a certificate from the incumbent of the parish where such member for the time being resides, that he fis eligible to be elected a lay member of the said Synod.

THE CHURCH SOCIETY INCORPORATED WITH THE SYNOD.
3. The Church Society of the Diocese of Huron shall be, and is hereby united to and incorporated with the said Synod of the Diocese of Hupon, and shall hereafter be called and known as "The Incorporated Synod of the Diocese of Huron."

## PROPERTY HELD BY CHURCH SOCIETY VESTED IN THE SYNOD.

4. All the property of what nature or kind soever now held by or vested in the said Church Socief shall be, and is hereby declared to be vested in the said Incorporated Sxnod of the Diocese of Huron withoutany conveyance thereof by the said Guffch Society to the said Synod; and the name of the said Incorporated Synod is and shail stand and be in the place of the name of
the said Church Society in all deeds and other writings relating to the property and affairs of the said Church Society, and in all suits and proceedings either at law or in equity by or against the said Church Society.

## PROPERTY HELD FOR CHURCH PURPOSES MAY BE CONVEYED TO THE SYNOD,

5. All property of what nature or kind soever now held, or whlch may hereafter be acquired, by any person or corporation for any church purpose in connection with the Church of England in Canada, within the limits of the Diocese of Huron, may, by such person or corporation, be conveyed to the said Incorporated Synod, and thenceforth the said Synod shall perform the trusts relating thereto, and the person or corporation so conveying such propirty shall be discharged from such trusts.

## TERMS UPON WHICH PROPERTY MAY BE HELD BY SYNOD.

6. The said Synod shall be subject to all the liabilities of the said Church Society, and shall hold all property vested in trust in the said Society upon the same trusts as such property was heretofore held by the said Society; and shall administer the same according to such trusts; and may sell and absolutely dispose of all or any property of what nature or kind soever, now trust; and shall hay time hereafter become vested in the said Synod on any the said property had been the proceeds thereof upon the same trusts as the application of any money paid by him but no purchaser shall be hable for rights, suits, actions, canse and causes of suit and such sale; and all claims, this Act be brought, prosecuted or enforced, by any action which might but for bodies corporate whatsoever, against the sa, by any person or persons, body or of Huron, may be brought, against the said Church Society of the Diocese and against its funds, property anded and enforced against the said Synod, relieve any officer or corporator of effects; and nothing herein contained shall claim or liability at law or in of the said Church Society from any existing of any corporator of the said Squity, or take away any right of action or suit in respect of any of the affairs or property of the said Society.

7. BOARDS AND COMMITTEES OF SYNOD.
9. The said Synod may exercise all its powers by and through such boards or committees as the said Synol may from time to time appoint by by-law or by-laws, for the management of all or any of the affairs or property of the said Synod.

## APPOINTMENT AND REMOVAL OF OFFICERS.

10. The said Synod may appoint and remove all such officers as may be found necessary for the management of the affairs and business of the said Synod, and provide for their remuneration.

## PRESENT MANAGEMENT OF THE PROPERTY AFTER SYNOD.

11. Until other provision is made under this Act by the Sypod, all the property and funds of the said Church Society shall continue to be managed by the committees and officers of the said Church Society, and under the by-laws thereof, but subject to the supervision and control of the Synod, to whom all reports respecting the same shall be made.

## investment of funds.

12. The said Incorporated Synod may invest all or any of the funds intrusted to its care, including those derived from the sale of rectory lands, in government securities, municipal debentures, the stocks of any chartered bank or permanent building society or other incorporated financial company in Canada, or in mortgages of real estate: But nothing in this Act contained shall be construed to give the said Incorporated Synod power or anthority to apply the income derived from any such investments otherwise than in strict accordance with the special trusts relating to such funds respectively.

## Canons.

## I.-Election of Bishop.

The Bishop of the Diocese shall be elected in the manner laid down in the Constitution of the Synod.

## II.-Certiflcate of Election.

The Bishop shall receive from the Chairman and Secretaries of Synod a certificate of his election by the Clergy and Lay Representatives, in accordance with the rule of the Diogese.

Such Bishop elect shall resign all the preferment which he holds in the Church previous to his consecration, except in the case of a Coadjutor, who shall resign all such preferment previous to ais taking full charge of the Diocese.

## III.-Coadjutor B1 .op.

When the Bishop of the Diocese shall feel himself unable to perform his duties, by reason of age or other permanent cause of infirmity, or be incapacitated by mental infirmity from discharging his 'Episcopal duties, a Coadjutor Bishop may be elected by and for the Diocese in the manner provided in Canon I. The Coadjutor Bishop shall in all cases succeed the Bishop in case of surviving him. The Coadjutor Bishop shall perform such Episcopal duties and exercise such Episcopal authority in the Diocese, as the Bishop shall assign him ; and in case of the Bishop's inability to assign such duties, the Coadjutor Bishop shall, during such inability, perform all the duties, and exercise all the authority, which appertain to the office of Bishop. If, any difference shall arise between the Bishop and his Coadjutor respectlively regarding the same, the matter shall be decided by the House of Bishops of the Province.

## IV.-On the Appointment of Dignitaries and other Offlcers, and their Duties.

There shall be in the Diocese the following dignitaries and other officers, viz. :-
1.-One Dean of the Cathedral, together with Canons to constitute the Chapter; one or more Archdeacons, and such number of Rural Deans as may ha required: one Chancellor; one Registrar, and whan necpeanry nop

## V.-Candidates for Orders.

1.-Candidates for the Holy Orders of Deacon or Priest shall be required to take a degree in Arts in some University, and attend the theological course in some College in connection with the Church, or with the approval of the Bishop, have attended the theological course in some Church College, but these requisites may be dispensed with when the Bishop considers the candidate posseses special qualifications.
2.-No person shall be admitted into the Holy Order of Deacon until he shall have been examined by one or more Presbyters, appointed for that purpose by the Bishop. At his examination he shall satisfy the examiners that he is sufficiently acquainted with the Hebrew, Greek and Latin languages; that he is fairly conversant with the Old and New Testament Scriptures, with the Greek Text of the Gospels and the Acts, with Christian evidences, with the history of the Canon of Holy Scripture, and of the Church (especially that of the Church of England), and with the Articles, Creeds and Formularies of the Church, both in their history and interpretation, and that he can compose a sermon on any given text of Holy Scripture.
3.-Before a candidate's admission to examination, the Bishop must be satisfied of his good life and conversation, by letters testimonial, in the usual form, and by an attestation that the form usually called "Si Quis" has been publicly read in the congregation of which he is a member; and no one, unless in special cases with the consent of the Bishop, shall be admitted to Deacon's Orders who is over forty years of age.
4. - No one shall be promoted to the Order of Priest until he shall have passed an examination in the Greek Text of the Epistles, together with a full examination in some of the higher branches of the subjects mentioned in Claûse II.

## VI.-Lay Readers.

Lay Readers may be appointed by the Bishop on the recommendation of any Clergyman who may require assistance in his Parish or Mission, or who, from illness, may be unable to perform all his duties; and in case of a vacant or new Mission, on the recommendation of the Archdeacon or the Rural Dean.

## VII.-Admission of Strangers to Offliate.

1.- No Minister or other person shall be permitted to officiate, permanently or occasionally, in any frongregation of this Church, except he shall have been Episcopally and Canonically ordained, and shall also conform to the doctrine and discipline for Che Church.
2.-No Clergyman shall officiate in any congregation in this Diocese for more than one month, without a written license under the hand of the Bishop, and no Clergyman who has availed himself of this implied permission shall be allowed to officiate again in the same Church within a period of three months, unless he obtain the license of the Bishop; provided that Clergymen holding the Bishop's license for temporary duty shall not be considered members of the Diocesan Synod.
3.-Every Clergyman who officiates in any congregation in the Diocese, shall be required to inscribe in a book, which shall be kept in the vestry for that purpose, his name, his present preferment, and the day when he so officiated in the Ohurch.

## VIII.-Candidates for Orders who have been Ministers of Other Denominations.

1.-When a person who, not having had Episcopal rdination, has been acknowledged as a Minister or Licentiate among afy denomination of Christians, shall desire to be ordained in the Diocese, he shall give notice thereof to the Bimop, which notice shall be accompanied with a written certificate from at least two Presbyters of the Church, stating that, from personal knowledge of the party, or satisfactory evidence laid before them, they believe that his desire to leave the denomination to which he has belonged has not arisen from any circumstances unfavorable to his religious faith and moral character, or on account of which it may be inexpedient to admit him to the exercise of the Ministry in this Diocese, and they shall also add what they know, or believe on good authority, of the circumstances leading to said desire.
2. If the Bishop shall think proper to proceed, the party applying to be received as a candidate shall produce the same testimonials of literary qualifications as are required of other candidates; and also a testimonial from at least six members of the denomination from which he came, or six members of the Church, or six persons in part members of the denomination from which he came, and in part members of the Church, satisfactory to the Bishop, that the applicant has for the three years last past lived piously, soberly and honestly; and also a testimonial from at least two Presbyters of the Church, that they believe him to be pions, sober and honest, and sincerely attached to the doctrines, discipline and worship of the Church.
3. Candidates admitted as above may, at the expiration of a period of not less than one year, unless the Bishop shall see fit for special reasons to shorten the time, be ordained, on their passing the same examination as other candidates for Deacon's orders; and in the examination, special regard shall be had to those points in which the denomination whence they came differs from the Church, with a view of testing their information and soundness in the same; and also to the ascertaining that the are adequately acquainted with the Liturgy and offices of this Church, provided that in their case the testimonials shall be required to cover only the time since their admission as candidates for orders, and provided also, that the provisions of the Canon concerning candidates for orders, as far as the same relates to the age of the person to whom the dispensation may be granted, and the mode and restrictions, in and under which the same may be granted, shall apply to the persons mentioned in this Canon.
4. When any person who has been acknowledged as a Minister among any other denomination of Christians shall apply for orders in this Diocese, the Bishop shall require of him, in addition to the above qualifications, satisfactory evidence that he has resided at least one year in this Dominion previous to his application.

## IX. -Of the Discipline of the Clergy.

Section I.-Every Clergyman duly licensed by the Bishop, or holding any charge under the jurisdiction of the Bishop of the Diocese, shall be amenable for offences committed by him to the Bishop, in the manner and according to the provisions set forth in this Canon of Discipline.

Srction IL.-There shall be a Standing Committee of Discipline appointed every third year at the annual meeting of the Synod, consisting of the Dean and Archdeacons, ex-officio, and of twelve Clergymen of at least ten years' standing in Priest's orders, or being in Priest's orders shall have attained the age of forty years, six of whom shall be appointed by the Bishop, and six elected by ballot, by the Clergy; and from this Committee the Board of Triers, as hereinafter provided, shall be taken; such election shall be next in order

after the election of delegates to the Provincial Synod; provided always, that if two or more vacancies occur, such vacancies shall be filled up, respectively, by the Bishop or by the Clergy, as the case may be, at the next meeting of the Synod.

Section III.-Of offences for which the Clergy may be tried: Every Clergyman shall be liable to trial for any crime or immorality, or for any scandalous or disorderly conduct, for teaching or maintaining doctrines contrary to the teaching of Holy Scripture, as set forth in the Liturgy and articles of the Church of England, such teaching or maintaining being by way of writing, or printing, or preaching, or teaching, or circulating books containing unsound doctrines; for holding service in any other Clergyman's Church or Parish without his consent; for irregularity or indecorum in the performance of divine offices; for contumacy or disrespectful conduct towards the Bishop; for the introduction of innovations and novelties in the performance of divine worship; for schism or separating himself from the communion of the Church; for discontinuing the exercise of the Ministry without lawful cause; for exercising any lay profession or occupation incensistent with his sacred calling; for living in the habitual disuse of public worship, or of the Holy Communion, or for the violation of the constitution or Canons of this Diocese.

Provided always, that no proceedings shall be instituted under this Canon unless the same be commenced within six months of the time when the offence complained of was brought to the knowledge of the person or persons making the complaint; provided that no such complaint shall be entertained under this Canon, after three years from the term of the alleged commission of the offence. Nevertheless, when proceedings are taken under this Canon, in respect of any matter which has been the subject of inquiry and adjudica. tion in a court of justice, the proceedings under this Canon may be commenced against a Clergyman in respect of the same matter, or of any matter arising out of the same or connected therewith, within three months of the period when the knowledge thereof shall have reached the Bishop, or the person or persons complaining to him.

Skction IV.-1. The trial shall be on a presentment in writing addressed to the Bishop of the Diocese, specifying the offences of which the accused is alleged to be guilty, with reasonable certainty as to time, place and circumstances, which presentment may be made by three communicants of the Church, or by any three Presbyters, or whenever the Bishop shall have reason to believe that any Clergyman is under the imputation of having been guilty
of any offence or misconduct, for which he is liable to be tried and that the of any offence or misconduct, for which he is liable to be tried, and that the interest of the Church requires an investigation. 2. The Bishop shall then nominate five members of the Committee of Discipline, not being parties to the presentment, as a Board of Triers, and cause a, list of their names, together with a copy of the charges, to be served on the accused, who shall, within fourteen days after such service, have the right, if he so desire, to object to any three of them, and notify their names in writing to the Bishop; and upon his objecting to one or more, then the Bishop shall name one or more of the said Committee of Discipline, as may be required, and those so selected shall form a Board for the trial of the accused, and shall meet at such time and place as the Bishop shall direct, and shall have power to adjourn from time to time, and from place to place (but always within the Diocese), as they shall think necessary. Provided always, that any Clergyman who is charged with any offence under this Canon shall have the privilege of a preliminary investigation, should he so desire, and signify such desire to the Bishop, in writing, within ten days after the service of such notice of trial; and in such case the Bishop shall appoint three members of the Committee of Discipline to examine the case, a majority of whom may make such examination, and report to the Bishop whether, in their opinion, there is good ground
for proceeding to trial. 3. A written notice of the time and place of their first meeting shall be served, at least fourteen days before such meeting, on the accused, and also on one of the persons making the presentment. 4. If a Clergyman, presented, shall confess the truth of the allegations contained in the presentment, the Bishop shall proceed to pass sentence ; and if he shall not confess them before the appointment of a Board for his trial, as before mentioned, he shall be considered as denying them. 5. If a Clergyman, presented, after having had due notice, shall not appear before the Board appointed for his trial, the Board may, nevertheless, proceed as if he were present, unless for good cause they shall see fit to adjourn till another day. 6. When the Board proceeds to the trial, they shall hear such evidence as shall be produced, which evidence shall be reduced to writing and signed by the witnesses respectively. If, on or during the trial, the accused shall confess the truth of the charges as stated in the presentment, the Board may dispense with hearing further evidence, and may proceed at once to state their opinion to the Bishop as to the sentence that ought to be pronounced. 7. Upon the application of either party to the Board of Triers, and it being made satisfactorily to appear to them that any material witnesses cannot be procured upon the trial, they may appoint a commission to take the testimony of any such witness : and both parties may attend and examine the witness, and the examination shall be reduced to writing and signed by the witness, and shall be in the words of the witness as far as possible, and in the first person, and certified by the commissioner, and enclosed under his seal and transmitted to the Board, and shall be received by them as evidence. 8. The Board having deliberately considered the evidence, shall declare in writing by them, or a majority of them, their decision on the charges contained in the presentment, distinctly stating whether the aocused is guilty or not guilty of such charges respectively, and also stating the sentence which, in their opinion, shall be pronounced; and their decision, together with the evidence, shall be delivered to the Bishop, who shall pronounce such Canonical sentence as shall appear to him to be proper, provided the same shall not exceed in severity the sentence recommended by the Board. 9. Before pronouncing any sentence, the Bishop shall summon the accused, and any three or more of the Clergy, to meet him at such time as may, in his opinion, be most convenient, in some Charch of the Diocese, which shall for that purpose be open at the time to all persons who may chonse to attend, and the sentence shall then and there be publicly pronounced by the Bishop, or by some person commissioned by him. 10. All notices and papers contemplated in this Canon may be served by a summoner or summoners, to le appointed for the purpose by the Bishop, and whose certificate of such service shall be evidence thereof. In case of service by any other person, the facts shall be proved by such person. A written notice or paper delivered to a party, or left at his place of residence, shall be deemed a sufficient service of such notice or paper. 11. The defendant may have the privilege of appearing by counsel : in case of the exercise of such privilege, and not otherwise, those who present shall have also the like privilege.

Section V.-If, at the time appointed for the first meeting of the Board of Triers, the whole number of five shall not attend, then those who do attend, being not less than three, shall proceed to the trial, and a majority of those attending shall decide all questions. They shall appoint a secretary, who may be one of their own number, whose duty it shall be to keep a record of all the proceedings had before the Board. And they shall, before proceeding with a trial, in case counsel is employed by either the accuser or the accused, or in their discretion, in case no counsel is employed, call to their aid some barrister-at-law of at least ten years' standing at the Bar of Ontario, to act as their assessor, and advise them on all questions of evidence and procedure ; and where such advice is sought, the Triers shall be governed

Section VI.-Suspension Pendente Lite. In every case in which, from the nature of the offence charged, it shall appear to the Bishop, after due inquiry, that great scandal is likely to arise from the Clergyman accused continuing to perform the services of the Church while such charge is under investigation, the Bishop shall cause a notice to be served on the accused, at the same time with the service of the copy of the charge, or at any time pending the proceedings, inhibiting the accused from performing any services in the Church until the matter shall have been finally decided; and the Bishop may make provision for the service of the Church during the period of suspension, which suspension shall not exceed three months.

Secrion VII. -The proceedings upon a trial shall be open to the members of the Church, unless, in the unanimous opinion of the Board, the circum. stances of the case require that the trial should be private.

Section VIII- - Every Clergyman, whose case may have been disposed of and decided adversely to him, and who shall think himself aggrieved by such decision, or who shall make it appear that new evidence, having an important bearing on the case, has been discovered since the trial, of the existence of which he may not have been aware at the time of the trial, may petition the Bishop for a new trial, or a rehearing of the case, either upon objections to be taken to the decision upon the facts, or because the judgment is not sustained by the laws and canons of this ecclesiastical province, or of the Diocese, or for other cause or causes ; or he may apply by petition to the Bishop for an arrest of sentence or judgment, upon causes to be shown; and in either case the Bishop shall, upon receiving such petition, refer the same and the whole subject, together with the evidence and the report made by the Board of Triers, to the whole Committee of Discipline ; and their decision on the above questions shall be final in so far as this Diocese is concerned.

The Triers to whom the examination or trial of any accused person shall be committed, shall be bound by a solemn declaration not to divulge the sentence recommended, until such time as it has been approved and confirmed by the Bishop; and further, that they will at no time whatsoever disclose the vote of any particular member of the Board.

Secrion IX. - In the event that a rehearing or new trial be granted, the case shall be transmitted to a Board of Triers, who shall proceed to hold a new trial, according to the rules hereinbefore set forth, within one month of the notice of such new trial being given to them by the Bishop, but in no case shall more than one new trial be granted.

Section X.-The following sentences may be pronounced, and punish. ments imposed upon offending Clergymen, viz.:-Admonition; suspension from the exercise of his office ; withdrawal of license ; deprivation or removal from his charge in the Church ; deposition or degradation from his sacred
office.

Section XI.-For the offences set forth in the first column hereafter written, the sentences set forth opposite to the same in the second column, and none others, shall be passed by the Bishop or person commissioned by him, upon any Clergyman found guilty thereof.

## FIRST COLUMN.

UPON TRIAL AND CONVICTION.
1.-For crime or immorality.
2. - Scandalous or disorderly conduct.
3.-For irregularities in the performance of Divine offices, or for the introduction of innovations or novelties in the performance of Divine Worship ; or for permitting unauthorized persons to officiate in the Church.
4.-For schism, or separating himself from the Communion of the Church.
5.-For contumacy; for disrespectful and disobedient conduct towards the Bishop.
6.-For discontinuing the exercise of the Ministry without sufficient cause or leave of the Bishop.
7.-For exercising any lay profession or occupation inconsistent with the performance of the duties of his sacred calling, excepting in cases which are provided for by the Canons of the Diocese with regard to disabled Clergymen.
8.-For living in the habitual disuse of Public Worship, or of the Holy Communion, or for violation of the constitution or Canons of the Church in Canada, or of this Diocese.
9.-Habitually and advisedly maintaining or affirming doctrine contrary or repugnant to the Word of God, set forth in the Formularies and Articles of Religion in the Book of Common Prayer.

SECOND COLUMN.
1.-Suspension, withdrawal of license, deprivation or deposition.
2.-Admonition, suspension ab officio for not more than one year, nor less than three months; withdrawal of license, deprivation or deposition.
3.-Same as No. 2, except deposition.
4.-Suspension for one year; withdrawal of license, deprivation or deposition.
5.-Admonition; suspension ab officio for not more than one year.
6.-Admonition ; suspension ; withdrawal of license or deprivation.
7.-Same as No. 6.
8. - Admonition; suspension ab officio for not more than one year; withdrawal of license; deprivation or deposition.
9.-Admonition ; inhibition from the performance of clerical functions; withdrawal of license; deprivation or deposition.

Section XII. - When sentence is pronounced in accordance with the above Schedule, it shall also be specified upon what terms, if any, the disability shall cease. When the penalty of suspension is inflicted, the Clergyman shall not exercise the functions of his Ministy in his own congregation or elsewhere, on pain of deprivation or deposition; and during such suspension the Bishop may appoint another Clergyman to supply the place of the suspended Clergyman, and may apply a part of the income or emoluments of the parish, mission or cure to the payment of such substitute.

Skction XIII. - When the sentence of deprivation or deposition is pronounced, the connection between the minister so deprived or deposed and his parish or congregation shall be ipso facto severed, and all offices, rents, issues, profits' and emoluments which he may have held by virtue of such office or minist1y from which he has been removed, shall wholly cease and determine.

Skction XIV.-Whenever a Clergyman is so deposed or degraded from the Holy Ministry, the Bishop who pronounces the sentence shall, without delay, cause such sentence to be publicly read in the several congregations of the Diocese, by the respective ministers thereof, and shall also give notice to all the Bishops of the Dominion.

Saction XV.-All the proceedings of the Triers, when approved by the Bishop, as well as the sentence in each case, shall be kept recorded by the Secretaries of the Synod in a book to be provided for that purpose.

Skction XVI.-The expenses connected with the carrying out of the Canon on Discipline shall be paid out of the Synod Assessment.

Section XVII. - In all cases of suspension of a Clergyman by the Bishop, a trial (except in case of confession and submission) shall be proceeded with, within three months of such suspension, or the same shall be null and void.

## X.-On Repairs and Dilapidations.

Section I.-It shall be the duty of every parish or mission to provide a residence for the Clergyman, and, before an Incumbent takes possession of a parsonage, the Bishop shall direct the Archdeacon or Rural Dean to ascertain and certify the state of repair of the parsonage. When the rectory or parsonage and outhouses are put in possession of a Clergyman in a state of good repair, it shall be the duty of the Clergyman to keep the same in good repair and condition, ordinary wear and tear, accidents by fire or tempest excepted; and if the Clergyman shall suffer said buildings to go out of repair, it shall be the duty of the Rural Dean to request him to remedy the same; and in case he shall decline or neglect to do so, the Rural Dean shall notify the Arehdeacon of such neglect on the part of the Clergyman, and if, on representation made to him by the Archdeacon and Rural Dean, the Clergyman shall still neglect to make the necessary repairs, then the Archdeacon and Rural Dean shall report the same to the Diocesan Synod, together with an estimate by a competent mechanic of the cost of such necessary repairs.

Skotion II.-It shall be the duty of the Churchwardens to insure and keep insured the houses and buildings on the premises held by the incumbent, and whenever any improvements or repairs become necessary, from the lapse of time, such as new roofings, external or internal painting, new fencing to protect the premises, the expense of these and all similar repairs and improvements shall be borne by the parish, and in no case shall the Clergyman be accountable for any damage or dilapidation that may occur through the negligence or unwillingness of the vestry to carry out such necessary improvements or repairs; but it shall be the duty of the Clergyman, under such circumstances, to report at once to the Rural Dean the conditions of the premises and the unwillingness of the vestry to improve and protect the same; and if, on further inquiry, the Rural Dean finds that the vestry refuse to take action in the matter, then he shall report the same to the Archdeacon; and if, upon their representation, the vestry still refuse or neglect to make the necessary repairs, then it shall be their duty to report the same to the Synod, provided that, when there is more than one congregation in a parish or mission, it shall be the duty of each to bear its proper share in the repairs of the parsonage and outbuildings in such proportion as skall be determined by the Archdeacon or Rural Dean.

 deaneries.Section IV. - That in cases where the Rural Dean himself is an interested party in any church or parsonage, then the Archdeacon shall act in the premises; and in case of the Archdeacon being an interested party, then the Rural Dean shall act.

## XI.-For Settling Boundaries of Missions and Parishes, and the Subdivision and Union of the Same.

That in each Rural Deanery of the Diocese, there shall be appointed by the Bishop a Committee for the purpose of making a division, and defining the boundaries of each parish and mission therein; that each Rural Dean shall be ex-officio Chairman of the Committee in his Deanery, and after the passing of this Canon, the Committee in each Rural Deanery shall be convened by the Rural Dean thereof, to settle all the questions for which they are appointed, and report the same to the Bishop. And each Rural Dean shall, from time to time, report any changes which may be proposed in such bounds by the said Committee; and the decisions of the Committees in the powers hereby conferred upon them shall be final upon the approval of the Bishop; and the boundaries so arranged, approved and declared by the Committee, shall be the boundaries of the parishes or cures aforesaid, until the same shall be afterwards changed by the same Committee, with the like approval of the Bishop. Provided always, that if any Clergyman shall be dissatisfied with the boundaries of his mission, as arranged by the Committee, the matter shall be referred to the Archdeacon for his decision thereupon, previous to the report being made to the Bishop.

## XII.-On Parochial Registers.

There shall be kept in every Parish and Mission a register of marriages, baptisms and funerals; also of the services, with the names of the preachers, and confirmations in each Church, the attendance of communicants, the number and average attendance of Sunday School scholars and teachers, and the total of all money paid in the parish or mission for parochial, diocesan or general religious purposes.

## XIII-On Appointments to Vacant Parishes or Missions.

The appointment to all parishes and missions shall be vested in the Bishop, but if any Clergyman or candidate for orders shall in any way seek to gain the appointment by soliciting the aid or influence of any parishioner in any movement of an irregular nature, such conduct, if proved, shall be deemed sufficient to prevent such Clergyman or candidate for orders from being appointed by the Bishop to the vacant charge.

## XIV-On Notice to be Given on Leaving a Parish or Mission.

Whenever an Incumbent desires to discontinue the services of his Curate or Assistant, he shall give three months' notice to such Curate or Assistant, and also to the Bishop.

Whenever a Curate or Assistant desires to resign his position in relation to the Incumbent, he shall give the same notice to the Incumbent and to the Bishop.

Whenever a Clergyman desires to resign his charge, he shall give three months' notice to the Bishop and also to the Churchwardens; provided always that the above rules shall not necessarily intefere with any arrangement approved by the Bishop, and which the above parties may agree upon for a more speedy separation.

## XV.-On the License to Clergymen.

That every Clergyman doing duty within the Diocese, except in cases provided for by the constitution, shall be licensed by the Bishop to some

## IV.-Form of Subscription.*

England: three Articles contained in the 36th Canon of the Church of
I. That the King's Majesty, under God, is the only supreme Governor of the Realm, and of all other, His Highness's dominions and countries, as well in all Spiritual or Ecclesiastical things or causes, as Temporal; and that no foreign prince, person, prelate, state or potentate hath, or ought to have, any jurisdiction, power, superiority, pre-eminence, or authority, Ecclesiastical or Spiritual, within His Majesty's said realms, dominions and countries.
II. That the Book of Common Prayer, and of ordering of Bishops, Priests and Deacons, containeth in it nothing contrary to the Word of God, and that it may lawfully so be used; and that he himself will use the form in the said Book prescribed in public Prayer, and Administration of the Sacraments, and none other.
III.-That he alloweth the Book of Articles of Religion agreed upon by the Archbishops and Bishops of both Provinces, and the whole Clergy in the Convocation holden in London, in the year of our Lord God one thousand five hundred sixty and two ; and that he acknowledgeth all and every the articles therein contained, being in number nine and thirty, besides the ratification, to be agreeable to the Word of God.

To these three Articles whosoever will subscribe, he shall, for the avoiding of all ambiguities, subscribe in this order and form of words, setting down both his Christian and surname, viz. : I, N.
