Mail Contract

SEALED TENDERS will be received at the Post Office, and will be opened at 12 o'clock, noon, on Monday, the 22nd day of November, for the conveyance of the Mail, once per Week each way between St. John and St. George, and St. George and St. Andrew's.

The route to be made in suitable vehicles drawn by one or more horses.

The route pursued in the conveyance of the Mail to be from St. John to St. George, and from St. George to St. Andrew's, and back again, once or twice each way, serving all the Way Offices on the route, of which may hereafter be established. The completed distance from St. John to St. George is nine miles. The rate of mail, to be no less than four miles per hour, including stoppages for all purposes.

The day and hours of Arrival and Departure will be determined upon hereafter, and the right of the Postmaster General to alter the same should he consider it advisable so to do.

The Contract if satisfactorily executed, will continue in force for a term not exceeding five years; the Postmaster General reserving the right to terminate the agreement at any time previous to the expiration of five years—should he be of opinion that the public interest requires it—by giving the Contractor three months previous notice of his intention.

All expenses as to the route for Tolls, Forage, &c. must be defrayed by the Contractor.

Each tender to state the price asked per annum, in words at length, and to be accompanied by the written guarantee of two responsible parties, undertaking that, in the event of the tender being accepted, the Contract shall be duly executed; and also to become bound with the contractor in the sum of Two Hundred Dollars for the due performance of the service.
