

FRENCH NAVAL LOSSES

Four Battleships Included in Tonnage Loss of 110,000 Tons.

Paris, Feb. 17.—A full list of the French naval losses in the war, which has been published, includes four battleships, the Bouvet, Suffren, Gaulois and Danton; four armed cruisers, the Leon Gambetta, Amiral Charner, Kleber and Dupetit Thouwars, and one fast cruiser, the Chateau Renault. There were, besides, 14 destroyers, 8 torpedo boats and 14 submarines lost. One of the submarines, the Durie, was refloated by the enemy, but was subsequently recovered.
