It has the merit of being a faithful likeness, and will be engraved by Hell, of London.

Many of the views, illustrative both of the events narrated in the history, and of the rich and romantic Highland scenery, are from photographs and drawings taken specially for the work. Others, consisting chiefly of views of towns and fortresses, taken at or near the time of the events they are intended to illustrate, are copied from the rare and valuable work of John Slezer, entitled *Theatrum Scotiae*, published at the end of the 17th century. The facts that Slezer was a military engineer, and that he was appointed by Government to survey the chief towns and strongholds of Scotland, are sufficient guarantees of the faithfulness of these views.—[Fullerton & Co.]

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
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
