The 28th Annual General Meeting of the Shareholders of The Eastern Trust Company was held at the Head Office of the Company in Halifax on Tuesday, the 22nd day of February, 1921, at eleven o'clock in the forenoon. The Vice-President of the Company, J. Walter Allison, D.C.L., President, and Col. Byron A. Weston, General Manager of the Company, submitted the Annual Report for the year ended December 31st, 1920, accompanied by the usual statements showing the results of the operations for the year.

The Company's assets during the year increased from \$23,271,221.05 to \$28,816,713.90 (this does not include properties held under trusts of trust to secure bondholders) and during that time estates and funds to the amount of \$335,204.95 were, owing to the closing of the estates and expiry of the trusts under which they were held, distributed to the beneficiaries and written off. The balance to the credit of Profit and Loss at end of 1919 was \$25,672.88 and this is now \$18,019.73. The sum of \$30,000.00 has been transferred to the Company's Reserve Fund. The sum of \$2,000.00 was written off office premises and \$3,571.71 of office furniture. Dividends at the rate of 9 p.c. were paid.

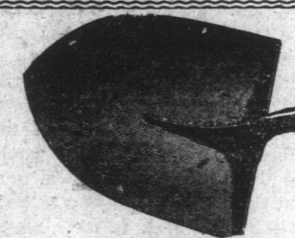
