

Any dispute or scandal on such a subject would be mortifying, discreditable and dangerous to the country.

The actory of the Empress having been put under arrest arose, no doubt, from the fact that on the death of the sovereign the sentinels are always doubled around the palace in which his remains are lying and that the new Empreor ordered a cordon to be drawn in order to find out what newspaper reporters were within the palace or what ones
