ANNUAL REPORT, 1880-81.

To the Members of the Mechanics' Institute of St. John:

The experience of the past year is sufficiently gratifying to induce the Directorate to assert with confidence that the future of the Institute may be contemplated with as much hopefulness as its past history may be

regarded with satisfaction.

While kindred Societies, formed for the accomplishment of similar objects to those of the Institute, have come into being since its commencement, and have received a large proportion of popular favor and patronage, the Mechanics' Institute has survived them all and, surmounting opposing obstacles, and preserving its vitality amidst depressions, sometimes, as of late, of more than a temporary character, still continues its useful work in the community, and seems with age to acquire fresh vigor.

So far from the roll of members decreasing, as might have been expected during the past season, the sum of \$1,542.00 from the sale of tickets and certificates, shows an increase over the returns from the same sources for

the previous season of \$55.00.

The receipts for rental of the Hall show a like gratifying result, being \$1,798.00 for 1880-81 against the returns of \$1,452.00 from the same source for the previous twelve months.

Unfortunately the exigencies of the Board of School Trustees for the City necessitated the exercise of strict economy by that Body, and the general downward tendency of rentals compelled the Directorate to enter into new arrangements for the leasing of the rooms occupied for school purposes at a greatly reduced rent; and, in consequence, the general revenue of the Institute, although larger than last year, is not so large as it would have been had the rooms in question been rented at the former rate.

The idea expressed in the last Annual Report that it might be necessary to take steps for the improvement of the condition of the Hall, made so great an impression upon the minds of the members of the Directorate, that it was finally determined to proceed with the work

suggested.

Mr. G. Ernest Fairweather, having been called upon for that purpose, furnished preliminary studies, which, having been submitted to and carefully considered by

the Board, were finally adopted.

These plans involve the erection of a permanent procenium; the construction of side galleries, and, as a consequence, the re-grading of the floor of the Hall; the entire re-seating of the main Hall with opera chairs, constructed of iron and wood, and the placing of such opera chairs and wall seats in the side galleries; a slight reduction in the size of the room heretofore used for meetings of the Board; the substitution of a wide flight of steps direct from the entrance to the Hall to the main entrance on the street, in place of the former stairs with landings; the erection of a large portico up to the street line; the re-grading of the sidewalk and the construction of new railings on the street; and also the substitution of sun-burners and a limited number of bracket lights for the chandeliers in present use, and a general improvement in the arrangement for supplying gas to the Hall.

Tenders were invited from and were made by leading mechanics for the completion of all the necessary work, and contracts were eventually made with the following, whose tenders were, in each instance, the lowest, for the

To meet the necessary expenses of all the alterations and improvements, including charges of the Architect and extras, it has been found necessary to obtain a further loan from the Saint John Building Society, which has been effected for ten years at eight per cent. upon balances due from time to time, the principal being returned in half yearly payments of two hundred dollars each, and the whole being a further charge upon the Building and Leasehold interest of the Institute.

The work, which is now progressing, and which is to be completed under the contract by the fourteenth day of May next, will, it is confidently believed, enable the Directorate to realize a larger rental from the Hall than heretofore, and will certainly add greatly to the appearance and to the comfort of members, and of audiences generally, and afford ample means of exit from the building in case of fire, accident or alarm, and will also provide a seating capacity for about one thousand persons in the Hall.

The Board, would, however, call the attention of the members to the fact that the available pecuniary resources are entirely insufficient for decorating or painting the Hall, and suggests that an effort should be made, by subscription or otherwise, to raise at least a portion of the sum required, which is estimated at five hundred dollars, or thereabouts.

The Library and Reading Room continue to be sources of attraction to the members; but the Board exceedingly regret that it has been found impossible, through lack of means, to add to the number of volumes on the shelves of the former.

Several donations have been made to the Museum, and a special contribution to that department has enabled the Board to procure two new cases for use therein. A list of the donations and of the names of the donors is appended.

An Abstract of the receipts and expenses of the past, and also of the previous year, for the sake of comparison,

is submitted herewith.
