REPORTS OF COMMITTEES.

REPORT OF SUNDAY SCHOOL COMMITTEE.

It is with feelings of profound thankfulness and gratitude to God that your Committee presents to the Manitoba and North-West Conference their twelfth annual report. It is our joy to report that success has attended the faithful efforts of the workers in this department of our Church, and although we regret there has been a falling-off in some things, there has been a decided gain in spiritual results.

Your Committee would call the attention of the Conference to the fact that during the year 612 of our scholars have united with the Church, this being an increase of 21 over the previous year; but we are compelled to point out the fact that in spite of this large addition there is a decrease in the total membership of 18.

The question that has forced itself upon your Committee is this: How is it that with such a host of workers, such noble helps, and such a magnificent organization, greater and better results have not been achieved? And we are compelled to come to the conclusion that it is mainly the result of defective preparation for this great work. Many lessons are not prepared at all, others are poorly prepared, and others are well prepared as to topography, manners and customs and surface exposition, but are so lacking in spiritual force and pointed application to the child's heart and conscience that no saving results follow.

Your Committee would therefore earnestly recommend that each pastor use every possible means to remedy this sad defect, and endeavor to keep before the workers the necessity of more thorough preparation for the class.

To this end we would call attention to the importance of holding teachers' classes for the systematic study of the lesson; and believing that the main channel through which our schools can be reached is the

pastor, we would recommend that this report be read by the pastor (or superintendent) in each school or congregation, and that he be requested to emphasize the importance of each scholar possessing the Word of God, and that the study of the lesson in the schools should be from the Bible, and not from the lesson helps, which should be used only in studying the lesson at home. This would help to bring before the mind of the scholar the value and importance of the Bible, and we feel sure would create a love for it.

Your Committee would very earnestly recommend that each pastor devote a few minutes every Sabbath if possible to the delivery of a short sermon to children. By this means the service would be brightened and made more interesting, and we believe would greatly help to increase the number of children in attendance upon the services.

We would draw your attention, with regret, to the fact that out of 13,235 enrolled scholars, only 835 have been studying the catechism, being a decrease of 188. We recommend that the Methodist catechism be more uniformly taught in our schools.

We strongly recommend the "home department" of Sunday School work to the attention of those dwelling in sparsely settled districts. Information with regard to this department may be obtained at the Book Room.

FUNDS.—We are pleased to report a substantial increase in the Missionary, Educational and Superannuation Funds.

PERIODICALS.—Your Committee is pleased to report a considerable increase in the number of our own periodicals taken by our schools. This is encouraging in view of the very high standard of excellence of our own publications, as compared with foreign periodicals. And we would urge all pastors, superintendents, and Sunday School workers to adopt our own literature as far as possible in all our schools.

It would appear from information before your Committee that there is a demand in our schools for a "scholars' quarterly lesson help" adapted to the uses of all the intermediate, and even senior classes, comprising a portion of the lesson notes and other matter now contained in the *Banner*, and published at a very low price so as to be within the reach of all the schools. Your Committee would therefore recommend that the attention of the publishing department be called to this point for their careful consideration.

Your Committee desires to state that the Sunday School Aid and Extension Fund is one of the most helpful agencies in our western work. New schools in sparsely settled districts receive grants of papers and books, enabling them to open a school even where there are no financial resources with which to begin the school. We very much regret that there has been a decline of funds of over \$50, and hope every school will loyally support this very helpful and necessary branch of our work.

In conclusion we would urge that each worker adopt for his motto, "My class for Christ and like Christ," and we believe if all kept this ideal constantly and persistently before them, that in the year upon which we have now entered we shall have occasion to rejoice in many more conversions and greater accessions to our Church.

REPORT OF THE COMMITTEE ON THE STATE
OF THE WORK.

The occasion of the meeting of the Manitoba and North-West Conference, for the first time in the North-West Territories, furnishes a suitable opportunity for a brief reference to the development of Methodism in this part of our Dominion. The first part of this report deals with the three districts of white work in the North-West Territory, Moosomin, Regina and Calgary, and does not touch the few missions on the Birtle and Deloraine Districts which are situated in Assiniboia.

The territory covered by the above-named districts reaches from Fleming on the east to Banff on the west, a distance of 712 miles ;

and from the International boundary on the south to the limit of White Settlement on the north (excepting the few people who are scattered in the Peace River country), a distance of about 400 miles.

Prior to 1883, the year before the Manitoba Conference was organized, our white work was represented in these regions by Edmonton and Prince Albert only.

In June, 1882, Rev. W. J. Hewitt was appointed to the "Qu'Appelle Valley," and during the year decided to make Regina his centre of operations. The stations for 1883 were :

The year's work is partly shown by the statistical report, which gives 173 members, \$18.25 raised for Superannuated Ministers' Fund, \$74.17 for missions, and less than \$2,000 for all purposes.

In 1890 there were 24 missions and 24 missionaries, with Calgary and Regina among the list of self-supporting circuits, a membership of 1,012, \$355.60 having been contributed for the Superannuated Ministers' Fund, \$833.45 for the missionary, and upwards of \$20,000 for all other purposes.

The next quadrennium witnessed steady advance in the face of great discouragements. The membership increased to 2,239, or 121 per cent.; the amount raised for missions to \$1,882.60, or 125 per cent.; for Superannuated Ministers' Fund to \$648.01, or 82 per cent. Seven circuits are reported as supporting their own ministers.

A census of the population of the North-West Territories of Canada, taken by the mounted police, has been recently received at the Department of the Interior. It is presumed the report is approximately correct. The figures give the following as the population of whites and half-breeds in the Territories, compared with the census of 1891: Total, 1891, 52,230; total, 1894, 73,506; increase, 21,276, or 40 per cent.

It will be gratifying to the friends of the Methodist Church to learn that she has more than kept pace with the increase of population. This is clearly shown by the following table of statistics :

Moneys contributed to Wesley College are not included in the above returns.

It will be seen that while the increase of population is placed at forty per cent. the average increase in the various departments of our Church work is upwards of sixty per cent.

This showing is all the more gratifying when it is borne in mind that so considerable a percentage of the immigration during the last few years are not English-speaking people, and have added nothing to our membership or to our material resources.

Another significant fact, and one that promises well for our Church and its institutions, is the larger percentage attained in the contributions to the connexional funds of our Church, especially for missions, where the handsome increase of seventy-eight per cent. is reached in the three years. This growing connexional sentiment means much for the people themselves and for the Church at large.

Just at the present time another comparison will prove interesting and suggestive of progress. A few years ago the Regina District covered the ground now known as the Regina and Moosomin Districts, with the exception of the Moosomin Circuit, which at that time belonged to the Brandon District.

We call attention to the fact that the membership schedule shows a leakage of 932 under the headings withdrawn and dropped, revealing the necessity of greater care being exercised in taking names on our membership roll.

Our Sabbath School report shows an increase of 123 teachers and 697 scholars, with an extra report of 1,047 Methodist scholars in union schools.

The Epworth League Department shows an increase of sixteen leagues and also of 849 members.

We are devoutly thankful to be able to report an increase of 544 members, which, after all, may be regarded as representative of the most important department of our statistical returns; for, does not this indicate in large measure the Church's activities and triumphs along spiritual lines?

That the financial returns are not larger is no indication of waning interest or failing liberality, but is accounted for by the fact of very little money being in circulation during the year. As a rule, our people, when able, freely contribute towards the various schemes of the Church, whether local or connexional.

Our Indian work is steadily moving on. During the year spiritual progress has been made on all our missions. In education and civilization there is change for the better, and while of necessity this work is slow, still we are glad to report real advance. The interest in the Industrial schools is growing rapidly and awakening a desire for better things on the part of a people so long in the night of ignorance.

Good work has been done at Red Deer and also at Morley, in the training schools, and our day-schools are better manned and in better condition than at any time in the past. Now that the Brandon school is being opened, we hope that a brighter future is before our Church in this department of her work.

Our Indian brethren are staunch temperance people—loyally do they stand by the teaching of the Gospel on this question. Godly and consistent living and triumphant dying is witnessed on all our missions both north and west.

Indications point to the necessity of the enlargement of our work, especially in northern Alberta and in various parts of the Saskatchewan Valley. The merits of these sections are becoming known. Settlers are rapidly entering and building their homes. Edmonton and Prince Albert are now important and growing centres, and destined to increase in size and importance as the years go by.

These sections give promise of early and rapid development, and consequently call for special attention at the hands of our Church.

REPORT OF THE MEMORIAL COMMITTEE.

Your Committee on Memorials beg leave to report as follows:

1. The Medicine Hat hospital. We would recommend that the Conference recognize the claims of Medicine Hat hospital, and would commend the said hospital to the favorable consideration of our people in the North-West Territories, and would further recommend that the collections for one Sunday in each year be set aside and given to the support of the

said hospital; that we gladly recognize the good work done by the said hospital, and that wherever such institutions are established we strongly commend them to the sympathy and financial support of our people throughout the Conference.

2. The equalizing of travelling expenses. Your Committee would recommend that a collection be taken up in each congregation during the year, said collection to be devoted to a general fund from which each member of Conference whose expenses (travelling) are more than ten dollars shall have a *pro rata* claim, and that the Conference appoint a committee to adjust such claims.

3. Appointment of Immigration Chaplain from "All People's Mission," Winnipeg. Your Committee would recommend that the matter be referred to the favorable consideration of the Stationing Committee.

4. As to the memorial concerning the reading and exposition of the Rules of Society, we recommend that no action be taken, as the Committee is of the opinion that the disciplinary provisions are sufficient to meet the case.

5. The General Conference having recommended that this Conference take action *re* statutes of Manitoba respecting marriage, and the matter having been laid before your Memorial Committee, the said Committee would recommend as follows:

That a special committee of this Conference be appointed, composed of the President, Rev. W. G. Henderson and Hon. J. W. Sifton, to negotiate with the presiding officers of other religious bodies in the Province of Manitoba in order to secure concerted action in presenting to the Legislature of the said province a memorial praying that an Act be passed prohibiting ministers not in good standing in their respective churches from solemnizing marriage.

REPORT OF THE COMMITTEE ON TEMPERANCE.

Your Committee on Temperance beg leave to report as follows :

Whereas, the direct evidence placed before the House of Commons and the Legislatures of the respective provinces, of the views of the voters in those parts of the Dominion in which the people have been called upon to decide as to the continuance of the traffic in intoxicating liquors as beverages ;

And whereas, such opinion has been unmistakably expressed that such traffic should be prohibited, by a majority vote of 132,918, as set forth by the result of the plebiscite taken in the following Provinces, viz. :

Prince Edward Island	7,226
Manitoba	12,522
Nova Scotia	31,401
Ontario	81,769

Yet no direct action has been taken by the House of Commons or the Legislatures of the said provinces to grant the boon of Prohibition to the people.

It is true that the Government at Ottawa appointed a Royal Commission to enquire into the effects of the liquor traffic. Some months elapsed before the names of the Commissioners were announced. After the appointment it was naturally expected that the Commissioners (a paid body) would at once proceed with their work, but a long period of time elapsed before their report was ready for presentation to the House.

Their report sets forth that the Commissioners found that in those places in which Prohibition had been tried it has been a failure, and they therefore recommend the continuance of the license system.

Your Committee is satisfied that this is contrary to the well-known, positive statement frequently expressed by the Governors of the States in which Prohibition has been tried, which statements have been borne out by many, very many reliable persons living in those States, and is also contrary to the evidence furnished with regard to the work of local prohibitory laws in the Dominion of Canada.

It is an undeniable fact, that in every city, town and hamlet in which the traffic has been licensed, the license law has been a dead failure, arising from the cupidity of the licensees, and, if it be found that the one mode of dealing with the traffic has (as asserted by four out of the five commissioners) been a failure, so also has the other ; therefore your Committee are of opinion that the Commissioners who signed the report did not do themselves any credit when they recommended the continuance of a law that has universally failed.

One member of the Commission, viz., Rev. Dr. McLeod, of New Brunswick, could not consistently sign the report, and he therefore presented a minority report, based on the evidence placed before the Commission. Your Committee therefore recommend that the Conference, through its Secretary, thank Rev. Dr. McLeod for the upright, straightforward and manly part taken by him in the work of the Commission.

Your Committee regret to learn that the Dominion Government has permitted the establishment of a brewery in the town of Neepawa, which has always been under the operation of a prohibitory law, and that the License Commissioners of the Province of Manitoba have granted a license to sell intoxicating liquors to a party in the village of Napinka, notwithstanding the fact that the municipality of Winchester, in which said village is located, has been under local option for the past five years. We beg respectfully to call the attention of the authorities to this injustice.

Your Committee recommend that the Conference, through its Secretary, memorialize the governments of Manitoba and the North-West Territories to pass such legislation at their next sessions as will make it imperative on each applicant for a liquor license to prove under oath that he has fulfilled all the requirements of the law in the application, and in the petition of householders, and so far as the Manitoba Government is concerned, the following be added to the said memorial: That the protest of eight of the nearest twenty householders shall prevent the renewal of the license of an applicant during one year from the date of its expiry, and that it be made compulsory for the Boards of License Commissioners to hear each protest against the granting of licenses in the place from which the protest comes.

And whereas, the Liquor License Act of the North-West Territories is unsatisfactory in its working in the above and other important particulars, your Committee recommend Conference to appoint the following to act with representatives of other organizations in trying to obtain the necessary amendments, namely: Rev. S. R. Brown, B.A., and Mr. J. W. Smith, of Regina.

In regard to the proposition made to take a Dominion plebiscite, we are in full accord with the opinion expressed by the standing Committee on Temperance of the General Conference of our Church, "that any further plebiscite to ascertain the mind of the people of Canada on the liquor question, except in the provinces where such vote has not been taken, would be not only a useless delay, but a serious trifling with the frequently expressed sentiment of the people on the question. Nor do we see a sufficient reason for this proposed action in the difference between the franchise of the Dominion and the Provinces."

We therefore unreservedly condemn such a proposal as an evasion of this great question, and urge our people to unite in the demand for immediate Prohibition.

The Committee desire to emphasize the following declaration of principles adopted by the General Conference.

- 1st. That the liquor traffic cannot be legalized without sin.
- 2nd. That it is the duty of the civil governments to prohibit the trade in intoxicating drinks.

3rd. That the candidate for no political party, who refuses to commit himself publicly to the destruction of the liquor traffic at the earliest possible moment, should have the support of Christian electors.

In accordance with the above, we would strongly urge upon all our people the importance of vigorous opposition to the granting of liquor licenses, not merely by declining to sign recommendations for applicants, but also by signing protests, wherever practicable, against the granting of a license, and at all points presenting a solid front to the legalized liquor traffic. We would further urge the absolute necessity of organized efforts to obtain a Dominion act for the total prohibition of the manufacture and sale of intoxicating liquors as beverages.

Your Committee are pleased to report that they have had laid before them a communication from the Secretary of the Dominion Alliance, conveying the greetings of that body, and expressing its appreciation of the great work done by the Methodist Church in the cause of Temperance. We are glad to know that our efforts are appreciated by the Dominion Alliance, and trust that the day is not far distant when those efforts will be crowned with success. In the communication referred to, the Secretary requests the appointment of four persons to act as members of the Alliance Council (which will meet in Toronto this year), to consult upon the position of temperance reform, and make recommendations for united action, by all who desire the overthrow of the terrible evil of intemperance.

Your Committee respectfully recommend the appointment of Rev. W. A. Vrooman, Rev. O. Darwin, and Messrs. John Dobbin and J. W. Sifton.

REPORT OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF WESLEY COLLEGE.

To the President and Members of the Manitoba and North-West Conference:

In presenting this their seventh annual report, the Board of Directors of Wesley College feel that their first words should be words of praise and gratitude—praise to our people for continued liberality, and gratitude to God for blessing us with another year of prosperity and progress in the important work committed to our care.

It is a matter of congratulation that, at the close of a year which from a financial point of view has been one of the severest in the history of this country, our Bursar is able to report a practically clear sheet as the result of the year's receipts and expenses for the sustentation of the College. Some Districts of the Conference, owing to various causes, have fallen short of the amount to be raised by them for the sustentation of the College, but thanks to the liberality of others and the economical and efficient management of Principal Sparling, we hope to close the year free of debt. We sincerely trust that the time will never come in the history of our College when it will be necessary to report a deficit at the close of any year. With the brethren in those Districts from which the amount apportioned has not been raised, the Board heartily sympathizes, feeling convinced that they have done their best under adverse circumstances; but now, with good crops practically assured and brighter prospects in the near future, which we trust may be realized, the Board looks forward confidently to the full realization of its hopes in respect to every District throughout the Conference for the coming year, and that in future the burden will be more equally distributed over the whole country.

The report of the Faculty of the College for the past year is appended hereto. This report, we are pleased to add, shows continued increase in the number attending college, and increase in the number sent up for examination, the results of which have been highly satisfactory. If such substantial progress and sound work can be accomplished by our students under our present conditions, with our limited facilities and scant accommodation, what may we not hope for when under God's blessing and the loyalty of our friends we are permitted to enjoy the comforts and avail ourselves of the facilities of our new college building?

And this brings us to the next important item of our report—the college building. Last year it was our privilege to invite the members of the Conference and our friends throughout the Province to the laying of the corner-stone of the new college, and the opinion was then modestly expressed that, when completed, Wesley College would be one of the finest buildings in this country and an honor and credit to Methodism. The result of the year's building operations, both as to the choice of the site and plan of the building itself, shows that our opinions were well founded, and that, when completed, the building will be in every way worthy of the cause and commensurate with the growth and importance of our work in this country. It is a matter of regret that the Conference does not meet in Winnipeg this year so that all the members might see the building now; but we venture to express the hope that your next year's session may be held here, when we trust we may show you a completed building well equipped for college purposes. We are making strenuous efforts to have the building ready for college work at the opening of the next college year, and we entertain good hopes of succeeding in this purpose.

Owing to unforeseen difficulties the contractor for the masonry work notified the Board early last year that he would not be able to proceed with the work under his contract. After several meetings between the contractor and the Building Committee, it was, however, finally decided that the Board would itself undertake the work, holding the contractor and his sureties responsible until it was completed. the consequent delays have necessarily retarded building operations to a considerable extent, but the Board still hopes to have at least the lower part of the building ready for occupation at the opening of college classes in October next.

The change with contractor, of which mention has just been made, will, it is feared, increase somewhat the cost of the building above the amount of the lowest tender, but we believe it will still be below that of the next lowest tender, and considerably below the originally estimated cost.

The Building Committee have given a great deal of attention and time to the work during the year. The Board desires that its report should not be closed without expressing its high appreciation of the valuable work the Committee has done in this respect.

The report of the Bursar is hereto appended, and will be found to contain full information regarding the financial condition of the College. We may state in this connection, however, that the value of the land and college building, when completed, will be about \$100,000; there have been paid on subscriptions for the same about \$45,000, and the Board confidently expects that about \$20,000 more will be paid in before October next.

Again, as in the past, we have to acknowledge with pleasure the valuable services of Principal Sparling both in and out of the College. The burden laid upon him is heavy, but following the principle, "to discharge the duties is to lighten the burden," he has been indefatigable in his efforts on behalf of the College, and the Board calls upon every member of the Conference to heartily sustain him in the important work committed to his trust.

REPORT OF THE FACULTY.

To the Board of Directors of Wesley College.

GENTLEMEN,—Your Faculty have much pleasure in announcing the close of another prosperous college year.

The attendance this year has been very satisfactory. We are able again to report a decided increase over that of last year, eighty-two students in all having registered during the year. These were distributed as follows:

In Senior B.A. year there were	14	students.
In Junior B.A. year " "	10	"
In Previous year " "	12	"
In Preliminary year " "	35	"
In Medical Entrance " "	6	"
Taking Theological work only	5	"

It will be a matter of great interest to the Board to learn that at least thirty-five of this number are either Conference students or are studying with a view to entering the ministry.

Fifty-four of our students presented themselves at the University Examinations of May last, a few of them, however, greatly against the

wishes of the Faculty, whose advice was amply sustained when the examination returns were published. In this connection we would again emphasize the opinion we have expressed in former reports, viz., that owing to the increased rigor of the preliminary examination for Arts and Medicine, as also the decided increase in the requirements therefor, it is scarcely possible for any student to adequately master the work prescribed for these examinations in one college year. Not less than two years should be spent in this preparatory work.

Twelve students of the senior year proceeded to the degree of B.A. This now brings up the total graduate students to forty, a very creditable showing, we think, for the six years past.

On the whole your Faculty is fully satisfied with the results of this year's labors. In the senior year in the departments of Mathematics, Natural Science, Mental and Moral Science, and the general B.A. course, the only courses in which our students competed, we succeeded in carrying off three medals, as follows :

Mathematics—Silver Medal	J. B. Hogg.
Natural Science—Bronze Medal	J. P. Wadge.
General B.A.—Silver Medal	J. H. Soady.

In the junior year Mr. W. T. Lathwell added to his honors of last year by taking the first scholarship of \$200 in the special course in classics; Mr. F. W. Sparling, the first scholarship of \$200 in Mathematics, and Mr. E. Woodhull the second scholarship of \$120 in Natural Science; and in the previous year Mr. H. Taylor obtained a scholarship in English and History.

Several very important changes have lately been made in the university work. The preliminary examination has been brought into harmony with the matriculation examination of Ontario universities. The general B.A. course has been remodelled and considerably increased, thus making it fully equal in point of difficulty to any of the other departments of study. The requirements demanded from students taking special courses have also been placed on a much more satisfactory basis, so that we can now claim that the colleges in connection with Manitoba University are doing work fully equal to that done by similar institutions in the East.

The outlook for the future we regard as a very bright one. Students as well as professors are looking eagerly forward to the completion of the new building, where proper facilities for efficiently carrying on our work in all its departments will be furnished. It is also confidently expected that the excellent accommodation thereby furnished will tend to bring us students who, under present circumstances, would be very likely to avail themselves of the hitherto superior advantage offered by our sister colleges.

We cannot conclude this report without tendering our best thanks to all those friends who have so generously remembered the College during the past year in donations of various kinds to the library and reading-room.

REPORT OF THE BOARD OF EXAMINERS, 1895.

The Board of Examiners submit the following report :

The following regulations are hereby recommended for the year 1896 :

1. All candidates who intend writing on the Preliminary Course shall send intimation of the same to the Chairman of the District in which they reside not later than the first day of March.
2. Examiners shall forward to the Secretary of the Examining Board not later than the 15th of February, manuscript questions on the subjects allotted to them, which shall be printed under the supervision of the Secretary, and forwarded by him to the Chairmen of Districts not later than the 15th of March.
3. The examinations shall be conducted in each district where there are candidates, on the third Wednesday in April, by the Chairman and members of the Board resident within the District ; but in cases where the distances are very great, the President may grant permission to Chairmen to arrange for examination of candidates under supervision of the nearest ordained minister.
4. Time shall be considered an element in the examinations, and in all cases shall be strictly adhered to. Each Examiner shall specify the time allowed for writing the paper set by him.
5. Each paper shall be valued at 100 marks.
6. Probationers are recommended to complete the course of study prescribed for one year before entering upon the course prescribed for the following year.
7. All Examiners are urgently requested to report the results of examinations to the Secretary of the Board before the first day of May.

INDUSTRIAL SCHOOL.

Moved by Rev. J. Dyke, seconded by Rev. T. Argue,
That this Conference having visited the Regina Indian Industrial School, and having witnessed with great pleasure the marked evidence of progress in industrial and educational pursuits, coupled with wise moral and religious training;

Resolved,—That this Conference expresses its deep interest in this important department of Christian work, and hereby urges our General Board of Missions to prosecute this department of Christian effort with the greatest vigor, believing that our Church has also its mission in this work.

MANITOBA SCHOOLS.

Moved by Rev. J. M. A. Spence, seconded by Rev. A. Andrews, and
Resolved,—That this ministerial session of the Manitoba and North-West Conference of the Methodist Church, while deeply deploring the strong sectional and religious prejudices engendered through the present agitation over the Manitoba School Act of 1890, which tend to divide our people and divert attention from the needs of the country, and while not presuming to pronounce judgment upon the constitutional questions involved in a settlement of the case, hereby assure the Provincial Legislature of our hearty sympathy and support in the maintenance of provincial rights, and trust that a wise and just solution of the present difficulties will be speedily arrived at. Carried unanimously.

MANITOBA SCHOOL QUESTION.

Moved by Rev. G. R. Turk, seconded by John Benson,
Whereas, the last General Conference of the Methodist Church, touching the question of civil and religious liberty, made the following deliverances, protesting against the interference of any Church with the affairs of State so as to make the State subservient to its own interest, and also against grants of public money for the endowment of purely ecclesiastical and sectarian institutions; also, recommending the co-operation of the Methodist Church with other Protestant bodies for the maintenance in general of civil and religious rights and privileges; and

Whereas, this Manitoba and North-West Conference in former sessions expressed its convictions touching these vital questions—notably the Conference of 1890, as follows: "That this Conference desires to record its unqualified endorsement of the Act of the Manitoba Legislature in establishing a national school system that recognizes no creed, denomination or nationality, thereby promoting the unification and cementing of all classes, and at the same time creating a sure and certain safeguard for the education and liberties of her citizens"—

(1) That this Conference endorses the deliverance of the General Conference, also its own former deliverance in harmony with the foregoing.

(2) That we deprecate and protest against any act of our Dominion or Provincial authorities which would look towards the re-establishment of Separate Schools in Manitoba, and the consequent impairment of the national schools as now established by law, which grants equal rights to all without respect to class or creed.

OBITUARY.



REV. WILLIAM WEST.

In the beautiful city of Norwich, Eng., fragrant with the memories of heroic deeds and saintly lives, there was born, on December 27th, 1866, William West, a modern saint of gentle mould. Few were the years of childhood spent in the Old Land, as the stories of the settlers in the New World awakened in the hearts of many the desire to make homes for themselves across the sea. Amongst the number who sought peace and plenty upon our Canadian soil was the father of our beloved friend. It was in the year 1874 that the child of eight years came with the family and settled in the Ottawa District. Hard work on the farm with few educational advantages were his lot in the early years; but he waited not for great opportunities of preparation or service, wisely esteeming the present hour

the grandest opportunity of his life. When but a lad there came to his soul the greatest revelation of God, and with it the Master's call to declare to men the unsearchable riches of Christ. Amid many disadvantages he struggled hard to qualify himself to become a wise workman in the service of God and man, forgetting not to cultivate habits of devotion whilst training his intellect and acquiring knowledge. Having learned that men were needed in the Manitoba Conference he offered himself for the work, and, being accepted, was stationed at Murillo, his first and only field. He entered upon his work with the enthusiasm of youth, though hindered from prosecuting all that lay in his heart by the frailty of his body. With an intense love for the souls of men, he pored over the pages of his Bible that he might learn the way of life more perfectly and grow in the beauty of the Christ-life. His life was a constant prayer, as he ever dwelt in the atmosphere of God. Wherever he went among the people, visiting the homes of the settlers and of the railway employees, his life and prayers were a benediction.

After laboring two years faithfully upon his mission, his health having broken down, it was thought advisable to seek restoration in a warmer clime. Remaining on his field until January last, he bade a long farewell to loving friends, who sorrowed deeply, yet rejoiced in the memories of other days when health and hope belonged to him. Upon arrival at his father's home his constitutional disease gradually strengthened its hold until he was no longer able to attend to his accustomed duties, and hopes of ultimate recovery fled. His last hours were bright with the presence of God and the joyous hope of immortal life. As the sun shone through the window on the last morning of his life on earth, he said, "I would like to go to glory in that beautiful sun." Ere he stepped out into the after-life with God he exclaimed, "Come, Lord Jesus; come quickly." When he passed from earth, one of God's heroes left us, and sorrowing hearts hid their grief in the assurance of his blessed entrance into the realms of the blest, whilst their lips exclaimed,

"O for the touch of a vanished hand,
And the sound of a voice that is still."

He died at Douglas, Ont., on March 21st, 1895. He was a faithful man, beloved by his people, and the impress of his life and work has been left on many hearts. The memory of this young life of saintliness is a gracious benediction to those who knew him, and the close of his career speaks in language more eloquent and inspiring than that which mortals are privileged to hear. We shall meet again in that land where God shall wipe away all tears from our eyes, and where the inhabitants are not sick.

PASTORAL ADDRESS.

TO THE MEMBERS AND ADHERENTS OF THE METHODIST
CHURCH, MANITOBA AND N.-W. CONFERENCE.

DEARLY BELOVED,—It is with unfeigned gratitude to the Author of all good that we again salute you at the close of another eventful year—a year rich in blessing and laden with abundant evidence of our heavenly Father's love, notwithstanding extraordinary financial depression and unusual industrial stagnation.

We must again record our thankfulness for the divine blessing resting upon our labors and resulting in such gratifying success and glorious victory over the kingdom of darkness. And as we review the results of the year's efforts, we are reminded at once of our own weakness and the blessed efficacy of the glorious Gospel in dispelling moral darkness and elevating fallen men to be kings and priests unto God.

The numerical strength of our Church has been increased by 554 souls, for which to God be all the glory. We are fully satisfied that our dear people have loyally sustained our various connexional interests and the devoted brethren laboring on the different fields to the full extent of their ability; and yet, owing to the unwonted depression, and the scarcity of money, it is to be deplored that so many of our ministers have received such meagre and inadequate support. We would commend to our people the adoption of the principle of systematic and regular contribution to the different claims of the Church. The benevolence of our people during the past year has been the more remarkable by reason of the monetary stringency of the times, and we feel assured that in many cases this benevolence must have been exercised at expense of great and felt sacrifice. When we reflect on the amounts contributed by our people, often out of their deep poverty, we can only rejoice with them in the grace given and thus manifested, and in the recollection that He who regarded the widow's mite will remember our dear friends in that day when He cometh to make up His jewels.

Vigilance is said to be the price of liberty, and it is also the price we must pay for the preservation of that hallowed institution, the Lord's Day. The growing tendency to carry on traffic on our great lines of railway on the Sabbath, and the recent proposal to introduce Sunday street-cars in the metropolis of the North-West call for earnest and vigorous protest on our part, and we would solemnly exhort our ministers and people to abstain from countenancing any form of Sunday street travel unless it be absolutely a case of necessity.

We have viewed with considerable alarm the determined effort made by the Roman Catholic Church to establish separate schools in the Province of Manitoba, and the attempt to procure State endowment for such schools in contravention of that great principle for which Methodism has successfully contended in the past, viz., the absolute separation of Church and State. We exhort our people to be firm and uncompromising in their opposition to any plan that may be adopted for the mutilating or impairment of our national school system.

One of the most gratifying features of our past history has been the marvellous development of our Sunday Schools. It has been said that the Church that does the most for the young people will be the Church of the future. As this is unquestionably true, we congratulate our people and return thanks to Almighty God for the fact that our beloved Church stands in the very front rank in this department of evangelical enterprise.

Closely allied to the Sunday School work is the Epworth League movement. It has long been felt that we sorely needed some connecting link between the child at Sunday School and the adult at church. At that critical period in a youth's life, between mere childhood and young manhood, something was needed to enlist his sympathies, excite his efforts and utilize his vigor and enthusiasm; and we feel that the Epworth League is the long-looked-for desideratum.

We rejoice in the recent appointment of our former co-laborer, Rev. A. C. Crews to the superintendency of these important agencies of our Church, and while rejoicing in the success of the past, we hail the future as full of promise of still richer harvests and grander achievements.

Every Methodist that visits the city of Winnipeg must feel his heart strangely moved as he gazes upon that stately pile of elaborate masonry that now ornaments Portage Avenue, and is informed that it is the new Methodist institution, "Wesley College." We lift our hearts to God in fervent praise for the generosity of our people here, as well as the princely liberality of eastern laymen, which have crowned this great effort with success.

It has been a year of deep solicitude on the part of those charged with the finances of Wesley College, and we scarcely feel able to express our devout thankfulness to our heavenly Father for the grace bestowed upon our people, which has so promoted their liberality as to enable the management to reach the end of the most trying year in our history without a serious deficit.

An important departure from the historic practice of Methodism has been made this year in the lengthening of the pastoral term in certain cases and under certain circumstances. It is too soon to pronounce upon the wisdom of this movement, but we sincerely hope that it may result in blessing to our Church, and that we may be able to recognize the hand of God in it.

We greatly rejoice at the growing prosperity of our publishing house. The reduction of the price of the *Guardian* is an experiment suggested by the increasing demand of our people, and while we are glad to report a great increase in the list of subscribers, we hope that the day is not far distant when every Methodist home will be blessed by a copy of our beloved church organ.

With our growing numbers, our increasing churches, our splendid college, our host of noble, cultured young men entering our ministry, and, best of all, with the conscious and blessed presence of our God, leading us as assuredly as He did Israel of old, and saying in unmistakable terms, "Go forward," let us gird up our loins and in the name of the sainted dead who planted, where we now labor, in the name of our all-conquering King, let us thank God and take courage and move onward to grander achievements for God and humanity than the past with all its glories has witnessed.
