





Though for a time Americans ma war with Mexico, they owe the troubled republic an eternal debt for the inven tion of the cocktail which the United States has perfected as a fine art. The name is an Aztec word, from a beautiful maiden Xochiti. who won the heart of the King of Mexico by her skill in preparing a drink which commined sweet and bitter, aromatic and soothing quali-

Hence the name "Xochiti" became New Englished in to "cocktail" though New Englished in to "cocktail" though Washington Irving wrote of the Dutch founders of New York that the 'aim-ed to be "the first inventors of the re-condite beverages cocktail, stone fence and sherry cobbler." Manhattans and Martinis we know, but what was—or is a "atom fence?"

Xochiti, a beautiful Indian maiden of 900 years ago, is responsible for the Mex-ican national drink, pulque, pronounced poolkay. She was the first to drink the sweet liquid from the maguey plant, cousin of the alee, that blooms once in 100 years. The drink in its fresh state is quite harmless but the modern Maxicaus have
