ADVERTISEMENT.

THIS is emphatically the age of experiment; look where we may, and we see it illustrated. The publisher, therefore, by way of performing his part, in a small way, in the acts which Time alone can criticise, offers this little work to the patronage of the citizens of Halifax. If such a publication is wanted, they will find it to contain, besides a General Directory, all the information suitable for the pages of an Almanac. The Calendar and other calculations will be found to sustain that character for correctness for which Cunnabell's *Nova Scotia Almanac* is proverbial. The lists connected with public offices, Courts of law, the Army, Navy and Militia, and also the associations for benevolent, literary and other objects, may also be referred to with confidence. All have been obtained from the best sources, and arranged with the utmost care.

The Business Directory is a new feature in an Almanac in this province, but less novel in other countries. Its usefulness it is presumed, will be highly appreciated; the publisher, however, regrets that it is not in his power to give a more definite index to the locality of the various places of business referred to. But until the houses are regularly numbered in this city, similar means must be used, to that which is here adopted, to describe them. The method referred to will be better understood by the use of the following *initials*, with their respective significations; viz. n s indicates *north side*, s s *south side*, e s *east side*, w s *west side*,—c *central*,—n e *north end*, s e *south end*, e e *east end*, w e *west end*. The plan resorted to in collecting the names for this department, will better illustrate the necessity for using the above *initials*. If the place of business is found in a street running north and south, the letters w s or e s will direct to the *side*, and by supposing the street in three divisions, the letters n e, s e or c will describe whether the place is situated towards either *end*, or *centrally*. If the street runs east and west, the letter n s or s s, e e, w e or c will afford a similar direction as to the *side* and *division* of the street in which the place of business is to be found.

The word *street* is omitted in the Directory, in order to save room, which however will be just as well understood as though it were inserted.

As intimated at the commencement, this publication is *an experiment*; and therefore its continuation depends on the patronage the present number receives. It is also issued as a substitute for a **COMPLETE DICTIONARY**, which it is the Subscriber's intention to publish, by subscription when the houses are numbered, and other improvements (contemplated by the City Government) are made.

Encouraged by the success which the *Nova Scotia Almanac* has always met with, the **CITY ALMANAC** is presented to the public, in the hope that it may become as great a favorite in Halifax, as its contemporary is in the Province generally. **W. CUNNABELL.**

ECLIPSES.

There will be **FIVE** Eclipses in this present year, viz :—three of the **SUN**, and two of the **Moon**, but none of them visible.

I. An annular eclipse of the Sun, on January 11th, only visible around the South Pole.

II. A partial eclipse of the Moon, on January 26th : the eclipse will just end as the Moon rises with us.

III. A total eclipse of the Sun on July 8th, visible in Europe, Asia, and Africa.

IV. A partial eclipse of the Moon on July 22d ; happening at noon, the Moon is consequently on the lower meridian at the time.

V. An annular eclipse of the Sun on December 31st, visible in South America and the Southern Pacific Ocean.

There will be no Occultations of the Moon and Planets visible in North America, during the current year.

THE PLANETS.

\varnothing Venus will be with the Sun and scarcely visible until June, when she will be an evening star till October, after which she will again be approaching the Sun's rays.

\exists Mars, an evening star, from January to April ; he will then be with the Sun till September, when he will be visible, as a morning star, to the end of the year.

\exists Jupiter will be morning star till June, then an evening and morning star till August, and an evening star till the end of the year.

\exists Saturn will be a morning star until June, and an evening star for the remainder of the year.

EXPLANATION OF THE CALENDAR PAGES.

1st column, days of the Month ; 2d, column, days of the Week ; 3d, Planets, Holidays, &c. ; 4th, Sun's rising and setting; 5th, Moon's Setting ; 6th, High Water at Halifax; and 7th, Sun's Declination.

To review old writing.—Immerse the writing in water in which copperas has been dissolved ; if the writing is suffered to dry, the copperas will make it reappear with as much freshness as if it were new.

Baits for catching fish.—Fish are wonderfully attracted by strong smelling substances, as camphor, assafoetida, &c. Artificial insects are much used in catching fish, especially trout ; they are made of different colours, according to the hours of the day, in order that they may imitate the natural objects which appear at these different periods. Those who fish in fresh water, employ cheese sometimes as a bait, and prefer that which emits the strongest smell.


