FORTY-SECOND ANNUAL REPORT
OF THE
INDUSTRIAL REFUGE,
CORNER McMURRICH AND BELMONT STREETS.

The forty-second year in the history of the Industrial Refuge has closed. As we review its work, we would again, with fervent gratitude, acknowledge the protecting care and continued guidance of our Heavenly Father to the inmates of this Institution.

Means have not been withheld, and time and thought have been freely given in seeking to provide a home for those unfortunate and erring ones who have voluntarily committed themselves to our care, and who, in this act, evidence their desire to break from the evil associations with which they were surrounded and strive, with the help extended to them, to live a sober, quiet and industrious life.

The blessing of health has been enjoyed by most. We have to record no serious illness throughout the year.

The stronger ones in the Refuge are engaged in the laundry, the work being carried on under the direction of an experienced laundress. The revenue from this source amounted last year to \$1176.20.

Those more elderly and more feeble occupy themselves with knitting, sewing, quilting, etc. From this source of industry was realized \$20.38, making the total earnings of the inmates \$1196.58, an amount which helps largely to meet the running expenses of the Institution.

On September 30th, 1894, there were in the Refuge 23

inmates. To these have been added 31, making a total of 54. Of this number 27 remain with us; 13 left to secure situations; 8 left before their year of probation had expired; 2 were dismissed; 2 sent to the General Hospital and 2 returned to their friends.

From these figures it will be seen that, as in the past, discouragements in the work are not infrequent. We have need of patience, and we labor on, remembering that our Master has said, "Be not weary in well-doing, for in due season ye shall reap if ye faint not."

There is also much to encourage. Some are content to remain year after year doing good and faithful service. One of the inmates completed a few weeks ago her fortieth anniversary in the Refuge. From others we hear they are not only leading exemplary lives, but are seeking to help others, as they themselves have been helped.

Mrs. Cameron, in her position as Matron, has the full confidence of the Board, and has succeeded by her kind and judicious treatment in winning the favor and respect of those entrusted to her care.

In the death of Mrs. James Lesslie, which occurred in June of this year, this Institution lost one of its earliest and best friends. She was one of its promoters, and continued for many years to take an active and practical interest in all pertaining to it; and, when no longer able, by reason of declining health, to do this, she still did what she could, and up to the time of her death was an honorary visiting member of the Homes.

To the deep regret of every member of the Board and every inmate of the Homes, our beloved and esteemed President has asked to be relieved from the onerous duties pertaining to this office. Reluctantly the Board yields to her request, trusting that in the good providence of God, she may long be spared to aid this Board, by her wise counsel, and cheer them by her kindly presence.

In February, to the regret of the Board, Mrs. Cox and Mrs. Ogden resigned their positions, as Secretary and Treasurer. Their faithful and efficient services have been much appreciated.

To the Y. P. S. of Walmer Road Church we are also much indebted, for several evenings of profitable entertainment. And very cordially do we thank Dr. Britton and Dr. Moore, for professional service gratuitously given. We also desire to thank Messrs. Dudley & Burns for reduced rates in printing.

THE TWELFTH ANNUAL REPORT OF THE
AGED WOMAN'S HOME, BELMONT ST.

In presenting the Twelfth Annual Report of the Aged Woman's Home, we do so with sincere gratitude to Almighty God, for His goodness to us during the past year.

In spite of much depression in commercial circles, our income has increased considerably, until now it is in excess of all previous years. Our expenditure, too, has been kept within reasonable limits, and shows a decrease from last year.

There has, too, been a fair measure of health enjoyed by the inmates ; and we take pleasure in noting the spirit of contentment, which has prevailed.

There are now 39 inmates in our Home, being 8 in excess of the number at the beginning of the year. During the year, 15 new inmates were received and 6 were removed by death, all of whom had passed the allotted span ; two, indeed, had attained the unusual age of ninety years.

We again avail ourselves of the opportunity to express our appreciation of the services of Mrs. Peacock, our Matron, who has shown much solicitation for the comfort and welfare of all under her charge.

We regret the departure of Mrs Stevenson, our late nurse, who had, during her term of service, endeared herself to those under her care. Her place, for a few months, was filled by Miss Rutherford, who leaves to take a course of training. In the appointment of Miss Wilkinson, the Board feel they have secured a competent person for this important position. She comes to us highly recommended, and with confidence we entrust our sick ones to her care.

Our mortgage debt shows no sign of diminution ; and, we need hardly say, this is a matter of much concern to us. We

would, indeed, be glad if some of our Christian friends would come to our aid in this matter. We regard the payment of interest on \$13,000 (the amount of our debt), as a very heavy item, and one which cripples our resources very much.

We take this opportunity of thanking those friends who have so faithfully attended to the various religious services of the Home, viz., Rev. Mr. Jones, who dispenses communion once a month ; Rev. Mr. McColl, Rev. Mr. Young, Mr. Bryce, and the students from Wycliffe, and Knox College ; and to Mrs. Saunders, Mrs. Ball, Miss Blackwood, and the Misses Wilkes, who have regularly visited the Home. We also thank the following friends for kind assistance at various entertainments, etc., during the year, viz., Mrs. Cox and friends ; Messrs. J. W. Bengough, Howarth, Morrison, Senior, and the children of the Jesse Ketchum school.

For professional services gratuitously rendered, we desire to thank our legal adviser, Mr. Wm. Mortimer Clark, and Drs. Caven and Scadding.

In conclusion, we have every confidence in presenting this report to the Christian public of Toronto ; and we feel assured they will not forget the claims of this very deserving Institution. Although not strictly speaking a charity, we are sure the nature of our work will commend it again to those who have shown so much practical sympathy with us in the past ; and we trust, too, that the sympathies of many new friends may be enlisted during the year.

MEDICAL REPORT OF INDUSTRIAL REFUGE.

The medical report for the past year of the Industrial Refuge will be brief, owing to the fact of there having been but few of the inmates sufficiently ill to be confined to bed for more than a few days consecutively. Apart from one case of epilepsy, and one of partial paralysis, the former doing as well as could be expected, and the inmate with the latter ailment, leaving as soon as she was able to go about, there have been no cases of special interest. All of which indicates the healthful state of the institution; and this must, in a great measure, be attributed to the careful management of the Matron, especially in keeping the Home so strictly clean. All of which is respectfully submitted.
