## THE CHRONICLE.

SAINT JOHN, SEPT. 24, 1847.

The Mail Steamer *Hibernia* brought the first Spectator Mail to Halifax on Friday last, in 123 days from Liverpool. The letters were brought to this City on Saturday morning, by express from Halifax, but the newspapers did not arrive until Monday by the regular Mail—Messrs. Peter, Mr. and Mrs. J. A. Morrison, and Mr. W. Morrison came passengers in the *Hibernia*.

The steamer ran ashore on Cape Race, New foundland, but was fortunately backed off without serious damage.

The news of great importance, and we have endeavoured to give as much as our limits will admit. Failures to a very heavy amount have taken place among some of the principal merchants of the United States, and a continued pressure upon the market.

The weather in Britain continued fine for harvesting, causing a further reduction in the price of wheat, while we expect to have a good harvest. The *Hibernia*—The Liverpool *Advertiser* says the *Hibernia*—the very awkward position of foreign affairs with regard to America and Italy, and the conduct of the Duchess of Franklin in Paris, form the principal topics of the British press. The *Hibernia*, which made her passage the most remarkable in France, and shaken society in Paris to the very centre—both on account of the elevated position of the minister, and the manner in which he treated the French Government, are openly accused of being in the master's service more than a connivance at the suicide's death as a state policy, in order to avoid the consequences of his crime by one of the aristocracy and a Peer of France, has created.

The steamer *Westerly* arrived at Liverpool a little past midnight of the 23d, and a few hours later—The Liverpool *Advertiser* says that the *Times* quoted in the record, but out of date, at least of the first homeward passage of the *Hibernia* was fully performed in 54 days.

The steamer *Saint Sands* arrived at Liverpool on the 24th—The eighteenth day after she left New York. She sailed again for New York on the 26th.

An opinion has gone abroad, that, by a recent set of papers, worth of names may be written upon newspapers, that it is a mistake to suppose that there is no such a mistake, as it is in this respect, it is still in force, and no mark or writing of any kind is allowed upon the cover, except the name and address of the person to whom it is sent.

The Queen Dowager, attended by a limited number of attendants, left the Palace of Monserrate at the end of the month. This illustrious lady will occupy the Governor's residence at that island during her sojourn there.

In Glasgow, part of the collection of Messrs. Simpson, in Barrington, has been held over, and is to be sold by the sum of £20,000, and £10,000, as well as some 100 hands thrown out of employment.

A company has been incorporated by royal charter, under the name of "The Royal Company of steam boats to run between India and Australia," thus completing the steam communication between this country and Sydney. It is calculated that the entire service will be accomplished by this time in about 64 days; of these 42 days are to be spent from England to Singapore, 10 days in the Port of Port Essington, and 12 days from Port Essington to Sydney.

Miss Matilda, eldest daughter of the Rev. Mr. St. John, in Bath, has married, and, in the interests of Exeter, has signed her signature to the fund of Ransum, in which, for some years past, she had been unhesitatingly led to join herself.

This year exports £600 post offices and receiving houses in the United Kingdom, of which about 500 are situated in and near the metropolis.
