London, April 27.-Although the Germans have puah ed out onto the Ypres plain a few hundred yards in the las twenty-four hours, the tone of Field Marahal - Haig's com munique encourages the Britiah and French. The latter armies in the field have stiffened their defense considerably and fresh all points. Ill points. The British troops holding Pilkem Ridge, east of Ypres, are in much the same position as they were preliminary to the withdrawal from Passchendaele Ridge when the Germans took Nouve Eglise and Bailleul.
