The deficiency in the Cotton crop of the United States—stated in round numbers to exceed 750 000 bales-is developing the results in beating down freights, which New Orleans and Southern journals chronicle. The short export is telling upon the New York market, from whence shipments have been made to Havre at the low figure of d of a cent per lb. for Cotton. Of all the products of the soil shipped from this side of the Atlantic to Europe, Timber is without question the one which regulates its value by the ascending or descending freight meter-and its intrinsic value being enhanced or diminished by the abundance or scarcity of vessels seeking freight, we may accept as tolerably safe guide-the rule that when the Cotton crop at the South is short, that Timber freights from Quebec will decline, and Timber itself rise in value, unless the market be over stocked.
