APPLES IN SOUTH AFRICA.

(From the Trade and Commerce

(From the Trade and Commerce Report, Ottawa.)

The S.S. Benin arrived early this week and delivered in fairly good cold storage condition apples from British Columbia, Ontario and Nova Scotia. A new mark, almost entirely Jonathan brand, was received from British Columbia, the color of the fruit being very good and the number per box being packed according to requirements.
