Splendid Conservative Victory.

ROSS GOVERNMENT OVERWHELMINGLY DEFEATED.

Corruption Sternly Rebuked.

The Provincial elections in Ontario on Wednesday, January 25th, resulted in the complete and overwhelming defeat of the Ross Liberal Government. The public conscience was aroused; political rascality and corruption were deservedly rebuked, and an indignant electorate grappled with and ignominiously hurled from power those who had brought shame upon the fair fame of Ontario.

The piling up of snow drifts, the blocking of highways and the stalling of trains were not the only inconvenient and disagreeable effects of the storm so far as this Province is concerned. It has also very seriously interfered with our winter navigation, cut us from the mainland and practically isolated the Province.

The Storm and its Effects.

The terrific snow storm which set in on Wednesday evening of last week and continued all day Thursday was one of the worst experienced here for some years. It was a north-eastern blizzard. The snow drifts resulting are tremendous, and traffic has been rendered most difficult.

The storm of yesterday was very severe and almost completely demoralized traffic. The cuttings along the railway line were all filled in again and trains were stalled all over the line.
