FREDERY BRAY WITE MAL.—For winter feeding, where estile are kept in shalls and heavily feel, there is no bester divisor for corn meal that wheat bran. It is also chans and farminan what the corn meal lacks. When cattle are fed on corn meal as the principle food for feeding, is is apt to cloy if fed in too large quantities, hence our best feeders are is the habit of using bran as the chespest and best means for rendering the meal fed more digestable. In this each feeder must use discretion as to the preper quantity to be used. One quarter of the bulk of feed in bran to three-quanters of corn meal may be taken as a good general rule, to be varied according to circumstances. For working horses fed on cut feed, this proportion will also be found to be nearly right. For horses doing fast work, cats fed whole are of course the best pessible feed. In winter, for driving horses, about one-quarter the weight of the feed may be good sound corn, mixed with the cats. Where bran is cheap, and it usually is so in the West, it will be found a valuable adjunct for dairy cows in the winter, in connection with corn meal. These will be found as among the most valuable of any used, in proportion to the east, for making milk in winter.

Ontario Cheese Items.

The patrons of the Brusefield cheese factory met on Jan. 3 te wind up the business of the year. The managers and patrons of the Bluevale factory met last week, and after selling the 800 Mr. Leach had left thexa, and collecting all dees, declared 33 per cent, to pay off the patrons with. Some fifty farmers have taken shares in a joint stock company to run a factory themselves, seen more largely than before. The former manager of the cheese factory at Been, Ont., W. E. Bond, is removing to Ordlin, where he is to engage in cheese making, for which he is, competent, and other business. The Brussel factory made in four and a half smonths 41,030 Hz. of the cheese from 412,000 Hz. milk. The September and October preduct shipped to Liverpool has sent no return yet, but 81 Sc. was the eyerage price of the yield of the other months. A dividend of 17 yernest, was declared on the paid up stock of the Kinburn factory, at the meeting on the 11th inst. A million at a guarter pounds of milk were used te make 122,749 hb. of cheese, which was seld to 80,876, or a fraction over 80 per lb. The rate per lb for making the cheese was 23c, and the patrons have agreed at a like rate for next season if 60 tons or over are made, or 25c, if but 50 tons A second shipment of 500 boxes of cheese was made from Cowansville, Que., last week, to Mentreal per S. E. Chambly Railway. Fifty-four farmers supplied Roiseville factory last season with a fullion pounds of milk. This made 103,265 lbs., of cheese which sold at 74c., 8c., 94c. and 10c., netting the farmers 61c, per 100 lbs. for their milk. The value of the make of cheese was \$0,000. Monselary Times.




