DIOGENES.



Diogenes was college professor who has reverberated through history, accompanied by pleasing wood cut, as the invenor of the practical joke and the tubular lantern. He was chiefly distinguished for having a keen sense of humor

being the only college professor extant or extinct who was ever accused of concealing any of that commodity about his person. Diogenes is said to have been the author of two of our most side-splitting jokes-rocking the boat and pulling a chair out from un der a stout party, and this endeared him to all with whom he came in contact When Diogenes got to the age when nobody but a hailstone mutual would accept him as an insurable risk, he bit off an allotment of stock in an uplife magazine and lost his home and a new safety bicycle, which embittered him to such an extent that he turned around and stung a number of confiding friends and relatives by selling them the patent rights to his lantern As this was the same lantern with which Mrs. O'Leary's cow kindled the Chicago fire, a few years later, it will be seen that Diogenes did not strengthen his standing in the church to any great extent. Diogenes never married anybody, and history relates that this was due to a fear that a mar riage certificate would turn out to be an assignment of stock in some promising enterprise guaranteeing 60 per cent dividends. He was passionately fond of music and after making a popular hit as slide trombone in the opera house orchestra was engaged by a wealthy family as tutor. 

PEKING, Jan. 23.

Premier Yuan Shi Kai secretly visited the Imperial Palace early this morning and concurred with the Empress Dowager in favour of a resumption of hostilities. He suggested that the Manchus sink their differences and provide the funds necessary for the campaign, but advised awaiting the advance of the revolutionists:

MADRID, Jan. 23.

The Cabinet of Premier Canalejas has virtually resigned. The reasons for the projected return to power of the Conservatives, which is deduced from the audience given to ex-Premier Maura, the leader of the Conservative party, by King Alfonso, are not clear. The Catholic newspapers claim that the change is due to the necessity of combatting the growing republican and socialistic forces. MADRID, Jan. 23. ublican and socialistic forces

LONDON, Jan. 23. Headed by James William Lowther Speaker of the House of Commons, a distinguished party, including a num distinguished party, including a number of members of Parliament, Peers, Bishops and men of affairs have left for Russia. The object of the visit is the desire of persons of various political views and public interests to develop further the ties that exist between the two countries. The party will be received by the Emperor.

PARIS, Jan. 23. Should Italy refuse to accede to the demand of France, that the Turks ar-rested on board the Manorba be turned over to the French authorities, France is prepared to recall her Am-bassador from Rome, and designate French warships to escort and protect French steamers on the Mediter ranean. The French Ambassador in Italy has been instructed to reiterate firmly France's demand. The French Government expects that Italy will accede to the demands made.

PEKING, Jan. 23. The Empress Dowager is inclined think that resumption of hostilities the only solution of the presentuation. This statement is made in the North China Daily News, which is always regarded as the organ of the Foreign Board in Peking. It is understood that the Premier has agreed to fight for the throne. It is believed, however, that he will await an attack by the rebels. The foreign legation, on the other hand, consider that abdication of the throne has been deferred only for a time.

BELFAST, Jan. 23. Several regiments of cavalry and infantry have been ordered to hold themselves in readiness to proceed to Belfast at short notice, in consequence of the inflamed state of awakened among both Nationalists and Unionists by the announcement of the coming demonstration concerning Home Rule. The manoeuvre of the Unionists, threatening to blockade Ulster Hall, has incensed the Liberals and the Nationalists, and trouble looms up distinctly. Brigadier Glei-chen, Commanding Officer of the dis-trict, is returning from Switzerland where he has been on a vacation. Merchants in the city are arranging perties in the vicinity of Ulster Hall.






