The capital stock of the cor-poration, we may state, was fixed at 2340,000 sterling, in shares of £25 each. It appears that \$400,000, of this amount went to pay the vendor of the properly, and, to scence working capital, 1,600 first mortgage debentures of £100 each were issued and disposed of at par. These bonds were to bear interest at the rate of twolve per cent. per annum, and were to be paid off in five years. The prospectus annual profit of £100,000 sterling und the old management.
