AN OPPORTUNITY FOR LUMBERMEN.

Lumbermen wishing to increase their holdings of timber will be given an opporcunity of securing an excellent limit on December 18th, when Mr. Peter Ryan will offer for sale at the Board of Trade Rooms, Toronto, Townships 111 and 117. known as Gough and Dunlop. These townships are situated on the north shore of Lake Huron and comprise 36 square miles. The purchaser will be permitted to take off not only the pine, but all other varieties of timber, of which there is a considerable quantity.

CURRENT TRADE CONDITIONS. ONTARIO.

Manufacturers express absolute satisfaction with the volume of orders for white pine lumber, and seem confident that current prices will continue throughout the winter. There is more building in progress than at the corresponding time last year. In Toronto work is about to be started on a large apartment house to cost \$150,000, and several other large buildings are projected and will be commenced this fall or early in the spring. Much building is under way in Ottawa, where contractors are finding difficulty in securing workmen.

The remarkable strength of the pine market is no doubt due in part to the almost certainty of a short log crop this winter on account of the many difficulties with which operators in the woods are meeting. Manufacturers are refusing to contract for logs at the prices which jobbers are asking, while it is not likely that those who put in their own camps will operate very heavily. Many reports are heard that the movement of lumber is being curtailed by the scarcity of cars. A Georgian Bay manufacturer writes that he is unable to fill orders, and that he looks for an advance in the price of hemlock and some grades of pine. Hardwoods are moving more liberally, severa large shipments having lately been made to the United States. Mill owners are asking \$15 for mill run ash, mill culls out, \$14 for basswood, and \$12 for soft elm. Birch and maple flooring are in good demand. Shingles are particularly active, and there is a moderate enquiry for lath.

QUEBEC AND NEW BRUNSWICK.

There appears to be a further improvement in spruce. The number of enquiries received by mill men shows that there is a strong disposition on the part of shippers to conclude arrangements for next year's supply, and it is believed that prices will show a substantial advance over those of the current year. The United States is buying largely of clapboards, dimensions, and shingles. The supply of clapboards is light. Sales have been made at \$31 to \$32 for extra spruce, and \$29 to \$30 for clears, Boston delivery. Some of the largest shippers of cedar shingles are sold out. The price of extras on Boston freight rate is \$3.10 to \$3.20; clears, \$2.75 to \$2.85. Higher prices are asked for lath, 1 34 inch bringing \$3.10 and and 11/2 inch \$2.90. No transactions are reported in square and waney timber, although several deals are said to be pending for the coming winter's output.

GREAT BRITAIN.

A somewhat pessimistic article appears in one of the British timber trade journals pointing out the fallacy of expecting that the proposed curtailment of the log crop in Norway and Sweden this winter will benefit lumber prices during the early part of next year. It is shown that the logs cut this winter will not reach the unils until the middle of next year, and many of them not until the following season. The first-open-water shipments will be the product of logs now at the mills. While these statements are doubtless correct, the fact remains that if a limited quantity of logs is cut this winter, there must be a corresponding decrease eventually in the quantity of lumber to supply the demand. This is the view taken by the trade generally, and it has inspired a degree of confidence. Speculators have entered the market, believing that purchases made at present prices will show a good profit next year. It is not expected that active buying will commence until towards the close of the year. White pine of best quality is in excellent demand, very little of this class being offered at auction sales. Spruce is also firm. A Liverpool importer is offering £7 per standard c.i.f. for a cargo from Nouve'le, Que. Buying is advised wherever suitable specifications can be obtained. A few lots of 12 feet x 3 x 9 inch first quality spruce, from Quebec, was recently, sold in London at £12 per standard. In timber the market is quiet excepting in the case of oak, which is advancing in price owing to the light import.

UNITED, STATES.

The log crop of the coming winter is one of the factors tending to strengthen the white pine market. It is estimated that the cost of taking out logs in the Minneapolis district will be 50 per cent. above normal, and that the supply for the Minneapolis mills will be lessened at least 100,000,000 feet by this cause. The scarcity and high cost of labor is the great difficulty. Reports of satisfactory trade come from the Lake Superior district and from the eastern distributing points

Buffalo and Tonawanda dealers have recently made large sales throughout the Eastern States and are likely to go into the winter with less stock than last fall. In Clevéland trade is quite brisk. Several sizes of Norway pine have been advanced there one dollar per thousand, and 114, 11/2 and 2 inch No. 1 shelving has also been marked up. In the Chicago market common inch is in excellent request at \$17 for a fair grade. Piece stuff is also wanted, Norway bringing \$13.50 to \$14 and white pine a little more. There is a good demand in Chicago for white cedar shingles at \$2.65 for 8-inch and better and \$2.70 to \$2.75 for 10-inch. Lath are selling freely at \$3.25 for No. 1 white pinc, \$2.75 for No. 1 mixed pine, and \$2.25 for No. 2 mixed pine and hemlock. Spruce prices throughout the Eastern States are firm. At Bangor it is reported that the demand for spruce lumber was never better. The spruce mills are operating to their full capacity, but are unable to meet the demand. A liberal amount of hardwood lumber is going into consumption, but there has been no improvement in prices. Manufacturers do not expect much activity in demand this year, but are looking for a good trade during the early part of 1902. Birch has shown some strength of late, being asked for more than the other woods.

THE OFTAWA VALLEY. [Correspondence of the CANADA LUMBERMAN.]

Aithough the local mills will shut down shortly, shipping, especially by water, continues fairly active. Speaking of the export trade, Mr. J. R. Booth said: "Things look better in the English market. They were rather dull all summer, but there is now a better feeling amongst shippers." Mr. Booth stated that too much talk was made out of the change in the culling regulations, which were held partially responsible for the dull feeling in the English market. "It would take a

shrewd, sharp man to detect any marked difference between the old and new order of things," stated Mr. Booth. The readjustment was in the interests of both buyers and sellers.

Speaking about prices, Mr. Booth stated that the market, while showing no advance, is stiff, and not likely to show any decline. The available stock is not a large

The Hull Lumber Co. recently closed a contract to supply the General Electric Company, of Schenectady, N. Y., with a considerable quantity of pine lumber at

also. Mr. Alex. Lumsden, M.L.A., the wellknown lumberman, will likely contest Ottawa city again in the next provincial elections. Mr. Denis Murphy, also well-known to the trade, is spoken of as a likely Conservative candidate.

The officials of the Ottawa River Transportation Company state that only two-thirds the regular number of barges, or about 50 in all, were engaged in the lumber traffic during the past six months. The shortage in shipments was in the lum-

ber billed for the English market. The unsettled condition of the market caused by the continuance of the Boer war is held in part responsible. A fleet of six barges was run on the Oswego route with American shipments. Shipping is brisk at present, but the lumber is nearly all being forwarded to the Montreal yards.
