
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

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CONSTITUTION OF THE SOCIETY.

The Society shall be onlied The Diogream Church Society of New BRUNSWICK.

No constitution, by-law, rule or regulation of the Society, nor any abrogation, repeal, change or alteration of the same, shall be of any force or effect until it shall have been sanctioned and confirmed by the Bishop of, or administering, the Diocese for the time being, by writing under his band.

The payment at any one time of a sum not less than Ten Pounds, shall constitute a Life Member; and the payment annually of any sum, however smull, shall constitute the person paying the same a Member of the Society.

The Society shall have a President, who shall be the Lord Bishop of the Diocese; two or more Vice Presidents, of whom the Archdescon shall be the first; one or more Treasurers; one or more Secretaries; two Auditors of Accounts; and an Executive Committee of twenty-four Lay Members of the Society, being Life Members of the Society or Subscribers of at least One Pound to the funds of the Society, who, with the exception of the President and Vice Presidents, shall be annually elected at the Anniversary Meeting.

The Officers of the Society and the Clergy of the Diocese shall be sz officio members of the Committee: five to be a quorum, and three of the five Laymen.

The Society shall embrace the following objects and none other, viz:

Missionary Visits to places where there is no settled Clergyman, and aid to new and poor Missions.

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> 2. The establishment of Divinity Scholarships at King's College, Fredericton; and assistance where necessary to those who may be under preparation for the Ministry, especially Sons of Clergymen.

3. Aid to Sunday and other Schools in which Church principles are taught,

and the training and encouraging of Schoolmasters and Catechists.

4. The supply of Books and Tracts, in strict conformity with the principles of the Established Church.

5. Aid to the building and enlarging of Churches and Chapels.

6. Aid to the building of Parsonage Houses.

7. The creation of a fund towards the augmentation of the stipends of poor Clergymen—towards making a provision for those who may be incapacitated by age or infirmity—and for the widows and orphans of the Clergy—and towards the education of the children of poor Clergymen.

The Society will employ no Clergyman on Missionary services, without the Bishop's liceuse and appointment, and will submit its choice of Divinity Scholars to his Lordship's approbation.

VIII.

The Society will circulate no Books which are not in the catalogue of the Society for Promoting Christian Knowledge, except such as the Bishop shall approve

IX

It shall be competent to any member of the Society to limit his subscription to any one or more of the objects above recited, which he may be most auxious to promote.

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The Members of the Society in each Mission, or in each parish of each Mission, at the discretion of the Missionary, shall constitute a Local Committee,

YI.

It shall be competent to each Committee to recommend any of the above recited objects to the special consideration of the General Committee, in the appropriation of the funds of the Society.

XII.

The Society shall hold its Anniversary Meeting at Fredericton and Saint John alternately; at the latter place on the Thursday after the third Tuesday in January, and at the former place on the Thursday after the second Tuesday in February in each year.

XIII.

The Committee of each Parish or Mission shall hold an Annual Meeting, on some convenient day, previous to the Anniversary Meeting, when the recommendation to the General Committee of special objects shall be determined on.

TIV.

Each Local Committee shall be empowered to depute two of its Lay Members, to be elected at the Annual Meeting of the Committee, to assist the Missionary in submitting the recommendations of the Committee to the consideration of the General Committee.

XV.

For this purpose the Missionaries and the Lay Deputies shall meet in General Committee on the two days, or more if need be, previous to the Anniversary Meeting, to make the annual appropriation of the funds of the Society.

XVI.

The Executive Committee shall meet either at Fredericton or Saint John, on the first Wednesday in January, on the day after the Annual Meeting, on the first Wednesday in March, on the first Wednesday in June, end on the Wednesday after the first Tuesday in October.

XVII.

The Clergy are requested to preach annually two Sermons in their respective Churches, with a Collection on each occasion for the General Purposes of the Society.

XVIII

No Article of the Constitution of this Society shell be rescinded, altered, or amended, except with the concurrence of two thirds of the Members present at a General Meeting: and notice of any motion shall be given at the General Meeting previous to the one at which such motion is to be made.

Read the Report of the Executive Committee.

REPORT OF THE EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE.

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In making the Report required of them by the Society, the Executive Committee of the Diocesan Church Society submit the following Abstract of the Reports of the several Local Committees.

SAINT JOHN.

The Saint John Local Committee held their Annual Meeting on December 22d, when the Secretary submitted the following statement.

The Secretary of the Saint John Local Committee begs leave to represent, that in accordance with a Resolution passed at the last meeting, the Gentlemen who were appointed to solicit subscriptions have made their returns, from which the following statement is compiled.

'The Members of the Committee being impressed with the belief that a large number of persons in the Parish are unable to procure sittings in either of the Churches, deemed it expedient, while engaged in the work of collecting funds, to undertake also the task of making such inquiries throughout their respective districts, as would enable them to place before the Church Society some useful information on this head. Want of time has prevented this work being fully carried out, and the returns are therefore not entirely accurate and complete. It is believed that many hundred of persons are at this present time debarred from attendance on the public worship of the Church.'

1st. That the statement now read by the Secretary be received, and a copy thereof forwarded to the Secretary of the Executive Committee.

2d. That the Committee for soliciting subscriptions be requested to

collect without delay the respective amounts subscribed, and pay over the same to the Treasurer of the Local Committee on or before December 29th instant.

3d. That the same Committee be requested to continue to receive Subscriptions, and furnish a supplemental list to be laid before the General Meeting of the Society.

4th. That Le Baron Botsford and Frederick A. Wiggins, Esquires, be appointed Lay Deputies to represent this Committee in General Committee.

5th. That Mr. Levi II. Waterhouse be appointed Treasurer, and George Wheeler, Esquire, Secretary of the Committee for the ensuing year.

FREDERICTON.

The Fredericton Committee met on the 7th December, and appointed a Committee to collect the contributions for the year. At a meeting on the 29th, the Committee reported that they had obtained the following Subscriptions:

Taking into consideration the objects they should recommend to the General Committee, it was resolved to suggest that as large an importation of Books be made this year as may be consistent with the means of the Society, so that the Depositories may always contain a considerable variety of those publications which have done, and are doing great good throughout the Province; and an opinion was expressed that the Depository at Fredericton should be placed on a more efficient footing.

The thanks of the Committee are tendered to the Society for the grant made to it last year, which was taken up chiefly in Books suitable for the use of Schools in connexion with the Church, including Bibles and Prayer Books; and a similar appropriation is requested this year, by means of which the National School in Fredericton may be provided for.

It was resolved to recommend an application from New Maryland, for a grant in aid of the enlargement of the Church.

J. Ambrose Street, and George Botsford, Esquires, were appointed Lay Deputies to represent the Committee in General Committee.

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NEW MARYLAND.

The New Maryland Committee report a collection of £5 9s. 3d. for the General Purposes of the Society; request another small grant of Books for their Lending Library; and request aid in the enlargement of the Church. They propose making an addition by which nearly one third more accommodation will be provided, and solicit such aid from the Society as will enable them to complete the work during the ensuing summer.

PORTLAND,

At a meeting of the Portland Local Committee, it was resolved that the Honorable Charles Simonds, and Jacob Allan, Esquire, be their Lay Deputies to the General Committee. It was also Resolved, that a grant of Books be solicited for the augmentation of the Parochial Lending Library, that object being looked upon as one of great importance, and from which much good may be anticipated. The subscriptions amount to £50; of which £10 4s. 10d. is limited to Missionary Visits, and £1 13s. to the Widows and Orphans Fund. The Committee return their warmest thanks to the Society for the liberal grant of Books made to them last year.

WOODSTOCK.

The Woodstock Local Committee held their Annual Meeting on the 8th December; among the Resolutions then passed was the following:

Resolved, That this Committee Rewing the Church Society as a means for disseminating more generally the truths of the Gospel, and

the doctrines of our Apostolic Church throughout this Diocese; and believing that the prosperity of the Church depends in a great degree

upon unity of action among her members, cannot but deem it not

only an imperative duty, but the highest privilege for all who are in

the full enjoyment of its ministrations, cordially to join their fellow

Churchmen in aid of a Society whose sole efforts are directed towards securing the spiritual welfare of their fellow creatures.

The Committee return thanks for the grant of Books to their Parish

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and some adjacent Settlements, and having suggested the fermation of a Depository at Woodstock, express a hope that they shall be again remembered at the next appropriation.

A. K. Smedes Wetmore and G. A. Bedell, Esquires, are the Lay Deputies from this Committee to the General Committee.

CHATHAM.

The Chatham Committee held their Annual Meeting on the 15th December, and passed the following Resolutions:

1st. That the members of this Committee view with much satisfaction the increasing prosperity of the Church Society of this Diocese.

2d. That the best thanks of this Committee be communicated to the Executive Committee for the liberal grant of Books made by them for the use of the Parochial Lending Library at Chatham.

3d. That the thanks of this Committee be given to the Society for the timely and liberal grants made in behalf of Saint Peter's, at Nelson,—a Church undertaken and nearly made fit for the celebration of Divine Service through the indefatigable exertions of the Reverend J. Hudson, the Visiting Missionary in this County.

4. That J. A. Street, and W. Carman, Jun., Esquires, be the Lay

Deputies from this Committee to the General Committee.

The Reverend S. Bacon, is transmitting the foregoing Resolutions, recommends to the consideration of the Society the Stone Church about to be built in the Parish of Newcastle.

GLENELG.

The Glenelg Committee held their Annual Meeting on the 26th December, and passed the following Resolutions:

1st. That this Committee have great satisfaction in according their undiminished confidence in the general management of the Church Society, and sincerely hope that nothing may occur to prevent the Society from enlarging the sphere of its benevolent labours, and becoming the instrument of spreading in this Diocese, Evangelical Truth and Apostolic Order.

2d. That there be respectfully urged upon the favorable consideration of the Executive Committee, the propriety of making a liberal grant towards building a Stone Church in the Parish of Newcastle, now about to be undertaken.

3d. That the Visiting Missionary, Reverend J. Hudson, be requested

to make a timely application for a grant of suitable Books for the use

of the Parisbioners.

4th. That George Wheeler, and W. D. W. Hubbard, Esquires, be the Lay Deputies from this Committee to the General Committee,

The Reverend J. Hudson, in transmitting these Resolutions, expresses his hope that the contributions of the year will not fall short of those of the last; solicits a grant of at least £50, to meet his own intended donation of a similar sum, towards the proposed Stone Church in the Parish of Newcastle, where Divine Service is now performed once a fortnight. He informs the Society that the Church at Nelson will be ready for Consecration early next summer : and concludes with offering to the Society his dutiful and hearty thanks for the assistance hitherto rendered to him in his humble labours on the Miramichi, and assures its members that he has always endeavored to act as a faithful almoner of the means intrusted to his care.

RICHIBUCTO.

The Reverend T. N. De Wolfe writes on behalf of the Richibacto Committee, that the contributions amount to £12 1s. 2d. This being a larger contribution than that of last year, shews that their love for the Society, and the great work in which it is engaged, has not grown cold, and that they are still willing and ready to give some assistance. He hopes the people of his charge will every year manifest an increasing attachment to the Church Society, which is calculated to do so much good, and is deserving of their hearty co-operation; and he has reason to believe that whenever an appeal is made to their liberality, they will gladly respond to it. He concludes with thanks for the Books granted last year.

SACKVILLE.

The Reverend J. Black writes on behalf of the Sackville Committee. that he is requested to return thanks for the late grant of Books, and to solicit another during the present year. The Contributions amount to £15 2s. 10d.

DORCHESTER.

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. Mr. Black, on behalf of the Dorchester, Committee also returns thanks for the grant of Books, and makes the same request. The Contributions are £6 17s. 10d.

SAINT ANDREWS.

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The Reverend Dr. Alley forwards a list of Contributions from the Saint Andrews Committee, amounting to £15; and observes that various other incidents which call upon the liberality of the congregation prevent the Subscriptions being larger. The Committee, he writes, among other Resolutions have passed one thanking the Society for the late grant of Books, and soliciting another. G. D. Street, and C. V. Forster, Esquires, are the Lay Deputies from this Committee to the General Committee.

SAINT STEPHENS.

The Saint Stephens Local Committee held their Annual Meeting on 24th December, the Reverend Dr. Thomson, Rector, in the Chair. Prayers having been read by the Curate, the Rev. Mr. Tippet, the Chairman addressed the meeting, and concluded his address with an earnest entreaty that his people might support, according to their means, the Diocesan Church Society. A report of the proceedings of the Local Committee was then submitted by the Secretary, Rev. Mr. Tippet; and a series of Resolutions passed, among them one instructing the Lay Deputies to ask for aid towards enlarging the Parish Church by the addition of a Chancel.

CARLETON.

The Carleton Local Committee beg to feturn their thanks to the Church Society for the grant of Books made to them last year, part of which were given to the National Schools, and the remainder added to the Church Lending Library. They also express a hope that they may be permitted to share in the next distribution. They beg leave to recommend to the special consideration of the General Committee in the appropriation of the funds of the Society, the very important object—"Aid to the building of Parsonage Houses;" as also the importation and circulation of as large a number of Books as the funds of the Society will admit of, comprising with the publications of the Society for Promoting Christian Knowledge, such others not on the catalogue of that Society as the Bishop shall approve. To these objects the contributions of the Committee, which exceed those of last year in amount, are limited.

R. Duncan Wilmot, Esquire, and Mr. F. Coster, Jun., are the Lay Deputies from this Committee to the General Committee.

KINGSTON.

The Kingston Local Committee at their Annual Meeting, December 26th, passed the following Resolution:

That this Meeting bears its humble testimony to the usefulness of the Church Society, views with satisfaction its gradual extension.

and indulges the hope that from the growing confidence in the ma-

' nagement of its affairs under proper Episcopal supervision, the number

of its friends will steadily increase, till every Churchman in the

Diocese shall be enrolled among its supporters.

The Committee recommend a grant of Books for the formation of a Lending Library at White's Point.

Justus S. Wetmore, Esquire, and Mr. David Pickett, are the Lay Deputies from this Committee to the General Committee.

HAMPTON

The Hampton Local Committee held their Annual Meeting on 26th December, and passed the following Resolutions:

That the thanks of this Committee be given to the Society for their liberal grant of £20 to the New Chapel at the French Village, and for the late grant of Books.

'That Dr. Earle and Robert S. Matthew, Esquires, be Lay Deputies from this Committee to the General Committee.'

The Committee inform the Society that the exterior of the Chapel at the French Village is completed, and that the whole will probably be finished, and ready for Consecration by Midsummer. They solicit another grant of Books to increase their very useful Farochial Lending Library.

The Contributions will exceed in amount those of last year.

NORTON.

The Norton Local Committee report, that having been obliged for the last three years to appropriate their funds to the liquidation of debts on the Parish Church, and the erection of a Chapel of Ease (for which they asked nothing from the Society), are now happy in restoring them to their original channel. They report a Contribution of £14, of which £2 are limited to the Widows and Orphans Fund; and solicit a grant of Books for the Parochial Lending Library.

Messrs. Joseph Sivewright and Isaac B. S. Raymond, are the Lay Deputies from this Committee to the General Committee.

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The Springfield Local Committee in thanking the Society for the late grant of Books, regret that they were unable to avail themselves of it, there being no Books in the Depository which they had not already in their Library, and express a hope that the Society will enable them to add to their Library such works as may increase the growing thirst for information on the doctrines and discipline of the Church. They thank the Society for their liberal grant towards a Missionary for Springfield, and hope the Bishop will be enabled to supply the want of immediate pastoral supervision in that Parish during the present year. Messrs. Walter B. Scovil and Vincent White are the Lay Deputies from this Committee to the General Committee.

SUSSEX.

The Sussex Local Committee return thanks for the late grant of Books. The Contributions of the Committee are limited to "Building of Churches and Chapels." They request aid to building two Churches, one at a distance of eighteen, and the other nine miles from the Parish Church, in places where Divine Service has hitherto been performed in a private house.

STUDHOLM.

The Studholm Local Committee return thanks for the late grant of Books, and will be happy if the Society can furnish a few more to their Lending Library, as they anticipate much benefit to the young people from proper publications being put into their hands.

SIMONDS.

The Simonds Local Committee report, that a meeting was held on December 23d, for the organizing the same, agreeably to the 10th Article of the Constitution; at which the following Resolutions were passed:

- as possible, and as there is in the Diocese a Society called the
- "Diocesan Church Society of New Brunswick," the objects of which we cordially approve, and are desirous to promote; therefore
- Resolved, that a Local Committee of the said Society be now formed

for the Parish of Simonds, and that the Subscribers now present, together with such persons as annually contribute any sum, however small, to promote its objects, do constitute the Local Committee.

The Officers of the Committee having been chosen, John Jordan and William DeVeber, Esquires, were elected Lay Deputies from the

Committee to the General Committee.

The Committee express their thankfulness for the opportunity thus afforded them of becoming a part of the General Society, the beneficial effects of which they have already experienced, and do thankfully acknowledge: and more especially so, when they bear in mind the many years which have elapsed during which they seldom heard the Word of God preached on the Sabbath; but now partly through the bounty of the Church Society, they enjoy the blessings to be derived from the attendance of a resident Clergyman among them, to administer the ordinances of the Church to all who are disposed to partalte of the same.

The Committee return thanks for the late grant of Books, and solicit aid to the formation of a Lending Library: and further represent, that their Clergyman has not yet received any assistance from the Parishioners towards his maintenance and support, and hope the So-

ciety will liberally give their aid towards the Mission.

The Contributions amount to £20.

HAMPSTEAD AND PETERSVILLE.

The Hampstead and Petersville Local Committee report a Contribution of nearly £8, and return thanks for the late grant of Books. They do not wish a repetition of this grant, but solicit aid to the repairs of the Churches of Saint Peter, Petersville, and Saint Stephen, Hampstead.

MAUGERVILLE ...

The Maugerville Local Committee express their regret that their Subscriptions are far short of their zeal in the Society's cause, having so lately incurred a heavy expense in building a Parsonage House. Their Contributions are limited to "Building Parsonage House," and they beg leave to recommend their unfinished Parsonage House to the favorable consideration of the Society. They thank the Society for the late grant of Books, from which they have reason to hope much good will result, and beg that they may not be forgotten in the next distribution.

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KINGSCLEAR.

The Reverend F. J. W. Roberts writing on behalf of the Kingsclear Local Committee, returns thanks for the late grant of Books which have been added to the Lending Library, and give universal satisfaction. The grant to the Church in the upper part of the Parish has not yet been drawn, the conditions of the Grant not having as yet been complied with. The Parsonage House has been completed principally through the indefatigable exertions of George Lee, Esquire, of Rockburn, and the liberality of a few of the members of the Church.

The Contributions this year are smaller in amount than those of the last, owing to pressing demands on other accounts, which though they do not come directly under the notice of the Committee, greatly affect their means of subscribing to its funds. He solicits a grant in aid of the Parsonage House.

Dr. Wetmore and William Henry Scovil, Esquires, Lay Delegates.

STANLEY.

The Stanley Local Committee congratulate the Society on the prospect of an increased Subscription for this year. They return thanks for the late grants of Books which have been found highly beneficial to the Settlement; and request a further grant to carry out the object of the Society:

R. D. James, and E. L. Wigan, Esquires, are appointed Lay Deputies of this Committee to the General Committee.

GRAND MANAN:

The Reverend James Neales in the name of the Grand Manan Local Committee, requests the Society to notice that their Contributions increase in amount every year, and express a hope that they will still be larger by the next Anniversary. He requests aid to an increase of their Lending Library. Contributions amounting to £10 13s.

DOUGLAS.

The Douglas Local Committee acknowledge with thanks the late grant of Books. They regret that so little has been done among them in aid of the Society's funds, for which the reasons were stated fully in a former report. The wants of the Parish are, they say,

urgent. A considerable amount remains due on the purchase of the Glebe and on the Parsonage House. Both the Church and Chapel require repairs, alteration, and painting. Aid to either of these objects will enable the Parishioners to do more for the others, and such aid will be thankfully received. Contributions to the amount of £5 have been raised.

GAGETOWN.

The Local Committee of Gagetown met on 13th January, and with much satisfaction report a Contribution of £19 12s. 1½d., in addition to £1 12s. 6d., the collection at the Sermon on 10th instant. This Contribution is larger than on any former occasion; and they attribute this to the benefits derived from the Parochial Lending Library. Of these Contributions £7 14s. 1½d. is limited to a supply of Books not on the Catalogue of the Society for Promoting Christian Knowledge, to be selected by the Lord Bishop; and £3 12s. to the building of Parsonage Houses. They solicit a small supply of Books for distribution in the Parish of Waterborough, under the direction of Samuel Scovil, Esquire. Aid is also requested to enable them to finish the Parsonage House of the Parish.

SAINT MARY'S.

A collection to the amount of \$10 0s. 2d. is reported in the Parish of Saint Mary, Nashwaak, and aid is requested to the building a Church therein.

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The Reverend T. W. Robertson, on behalf of the Parish of Lancaster, solicits aid to the building of the Parsonage House; also aid to building a Church at Pisirinco in that Parish, and further aid to the Churches at Dipper Harbour and Manawagonish in the same Parish.
