Asphalt

It is well-known fact that Fort McMurray is in the Centre of the Largest Tar Sand Deposit in the World.

Agriculture

McMurray will compare very favorably with any other district in Northern Alberta in the way of Agriculture.

The soil consists of a mixed clay and sand loam, topped with a thick layer of decayed vegetable mould, which mixes up well, making as fine a seed bed as any country can boast of.

Dairying, Chicken Raising, and Stock Raising will soon do a thriving business for those so engaging.





Transportation

With the completion of the A. and G. W. Railway in the latter part of 1915, Fort McMurray will have connections with Edmonton and the outside world.

We have goo.' Steamboat Service on the Athabasca River Six Months of the Year, making connections at Fort Smith and Smith Landing for Mackenzie River and Arctic Ocean points.

The Clearwater is navigable for lighter craft for 60 miles and over.





Location

Fort McMurray is situated at the confluence of the Athabasca and Clearwater Rivers, distance about 250 miles N.E. of Edmonton, is the head of Navigation for the Great North Country, a geographical center of a vast rich but undeveloped district, the position itself being, indisputably, the most beautiful and conveniently-located natural City site in Canada.



General Information

THE object of this pamphlet is to explain, in a few words, the great opportunities of Fort McMurray and Country tributary.

With our long, sunshiny days in Summer, and comparatively cool nights, Fort McMurray cannot fail to be an unusually healthy place to live in.

From a vegetation standpoint we consider the McMurray District almost incomparable; and, with the land, which is soon to be thrown open to Homestead Entry, we expect a great influx of settlers into McMurray.
