The Copper Market. The Mining Journal, London, in its issue of the 22nd inst., makes the following interesting remarks upon the copper market: "This market is affected by considerable manipulation, and some of the American producers, whose reputation really is to sell large quantities of copper to Europe (the United States being at the best only a consumer of a small part of the production), have lately not only refrained from selling their own stuff, but have gone on buying copper here in the open market, with the view of improving prices and eventually getting the European buyers to pay for their American copper higher prices than those that have been ruling from this it will be seen that the position is to a great extent artificial.

FRENCH CONVICTS MUTINY At Cayenne, Near Devil's Island, Where Dreyfus is Prisoner.

Not Unlikely That He Will Be Shot As Guards Were Instructed to Kill their Prisoner if Any Attempt Was Made at Release—Guards Overpowered and Murdered.

London, Sept. 21.—A special dispatch from Paris says that a representative French Guiana in the Chamber has received a despatch announcing that a mutiny has taken place among the convicts in French Guiana, and that the French Guiana. The mutineers, it appears, overpowered and murdered their guards, then stormed the military storehouse and seized the arms and ammunition there. They are now, according to the despatch, besieging the principal prison in the building. Representatives have been telegraphed for to the island of Martinique, but it is said they will not arrive in time to suppress the mutiny.

Dreyfus, the former captain of French artillery, whose alleged unjust conviction in 1894 on the charge of selling important French military secrets to the agent of a foreign power is seemingly on the point of being investigated at Paris, is kept in solitary confinement on Devil's Island, where he may be shot by his guards, as it is understood that the latter had strict instructions to kill their prisoner if any attempt is made to release or if there is any possibility of escaping.
