





### COMMEMORATING THE SIEGE

A Medal Will Be Struck Bearing the Legend, "Men, Not Walls, Make a City."

SCENES IN BRITISH LEGATION.

A Great Crowd of All Nationalities fostled Each Other—Shells Did Awful Work.

Pekin, Aug. 14, by post, via Tien Tsin,dege of Pekin. It will bear the legend,

In the grounds of the Brifish Legation

along the stretch of turf extending beyond the Tartar wall,

A Much-Mixed Crowd.

Thru the ruins of the foreign settlement an eager, cosmopolitan crowd is jostling—lindians, Cossacks, legation ladies, diplomats, Americans from the Philippines, and French disciplinarians from Saigon, who kept discreetly to the rear while the fighting was in progress, but came conspicuously to the front when looting began, Only Japanese, who have earned the first place, are absent. Luxury of Immunity From Bullets.

Resident foreigners welcome the luxury walking about and immunity from bulets, The newcomers are anxious to inspect the evidences of an historic defence. These barricades are, after all, the most wonderful sight in Pekin. The barriers nedging the British Legation are a market of stone and brick walls and earthworks. Sandbags shield every space. The tops of the walls have niches for riflemen, and the buildings, at their portices and windows, have armor boxes, bags stuffed with dirt, and pillows, too.

dirt, and pillows, too.

"Fort Myers."

Back of the United States Legation is a work named "Fort Myers," which the marines held, completely screening both sides of the wails, with steps leading to it. There is a loop-holed barrier across the wall which faces a similar Chinese work a few yards away. Another wall bars Legation-street in front of the German Legation; and confronting the enemy's barricades within those limits are yet more walls, enabling the foreigners to contract the area of defence, if pressed.

Torn by Chinese Shells.

The tops of the American and British buildings were badly torn by Chinese shelis. The rest of the foreign settlement was al-

The rest of the foreign settlement was al-nost demolished. Two thousand eight hun-dred shells fell there during the first three weeks of the bombardment, 400 in one day. Buckets full of bullets were gathered

Eleven Civilians Killed. Four hundred and fourteen people lived in the compound thru the greater part of the siege.
