

COMMEMORATING THE SIEGE

A Medal Will Be Struck Bearing the Legend, "Men, Not Walls, Make a City."

SCENES IN BRITISH LEGATION.

A Great Crowd of All Nationalities Jostled Each Other—Shells Did Awful Work.

Pekin, Aug. 14, by post, via Tien Tsin.—A medal will be struck commemorating the siege of Peking. It will bear the legend, "Men, not walls, make a city."

Three the ruins of the foreign settlement an eager, cosmopolitan crowd is jostling—Indians, Cosacks, legation ladies, diplomats, Americans from the Philippines, and French disciplinarians from Saigon.

A Much-Mixed Crowd.—The scene of the siege is a most interesting one. The ruins of the foreign settlement are a mass of stone and brick walls and earthworks.

Back of the United States Legation is a work named "Fort Myers" which the marines held, completely screening both sides of the walls, with steps leading to it.

Torn by Chinese Shells.—The tops of the American and British buildings were badly torn by Chinese shells. The rest of the foreign settlement was almost demolished.

Eleven Civilians Killed.—Four hundred and fourteen people lived in the compound and the greater part of the siege. Three hundred and four marines, assisted by 35 volunteers, commanded by the English captain, Poole, defended the place.

Additional Details.—The army transport, when it reached Peking, was a unique spectacle. Miles of animals, vehicles and coolies trailed behind everything imaginable on wheels.

A Great Reception.—The reception which awaited the army was worth the hardships the troops had undergone. The beleaguered heroism of the British and the British coolies appeared there arose a great commotion on both sides.

An hour afterward Gen. Chaffee, riding at the head of the American infantry, marched to the Tartar wall. When told that the British had entered before him

the American general looked disappointed, but, also the Americans entered behind the last of the British forces, their reception was just as enthusiastic.

On entering the grounds of the British Legation the American troops started in amazement, and inquired if there was a law party in progress. They had expected to find the relieved in a worse condition than themselves, whereas the contrast between the appearance of the rescued and the rescuers was surprisingly in favor of the former.

Two Views of it.—On the other hand, the rescuers were haggard and rough-bearded. They dragged themselves along as ready to drop. Their khaki uniforms dripping with perspiration and black with mud.

Japanese possessed the greater endurance, and, better provided with the best transport, they made the pace. The Russians held second place most of the time. The American and the British were pushed to the utmost to keep up. Gen. Pukushina said the Japanese might have reached Peking two days before. He probably spoke the truth. They seemed never to rest.

Several hundred Americans dropped out from the heat, each day. They came straggling into camp this evening. Even the native Indian troops suffered almost as much. The soldiers drank continually from the muddy river and wells by the roadside, with the result that an epidemic of dysentery set in and the British were pushed to the hottest hours of the day, causing great dissatisfaction among officers and men, who had wished to move in the cool of the morning and evening, like the Japanese.
