CAPT. COLIN HARBOTTLE IS ARRESTED—WAS ANXIOUS TO GOME HOME ANYWAY, THEY SAY.

After being detained in his hotel at Havana, Cuba, by Pinkerton Detective Agency operatives, who have been on his trail since he left the city in November last, Captain Colin C. Harbottle, abounding secretary of the Toronto Club and of the Ontario Rifle Association, for whose apprehension some half-dozen warrants are now in the hands of the Toronto police, was officially taken into custody by the Cuban police yesterday morning. Chief Grasset of this arrest Chief Grasset received official notification yesterday afternoon. It was made upon request of the attorney-general's department, transmitted thru the department of Justice at Ottawa and upon representation made upon this request, forwarded by Lord Strathcona to the English secretary of state, who in turn communicated with the British minister at Havana. Chief Grasset was notified by the Pinkerton agency Monday morning and set the wheels in motion.

The Pinkerton men, who have been in close touch with the city police thruout, first located Capt. Harbottle at Caracas, Venezuela, some seven or eight weeks ago. Not sure that he could be extradited from there, a scheme was framed to move him away. Enquiries were made for him, and he was lured to Havana, Cuba. He jumped out, but not far enough. More ostentatious enquiries produced another jump, and then he was arrested until he finally landed in Cuba four weeks ago. A watch was then set until the position with regard to extradition was definitely ascertained. It was found that the British treaty of 1905 with the Cuban republic, which is set out in the Dominion statutes of 1906, was clear in its terms and the fugitive was nabbed at his hotel.

The British consul at Havana refused to act unless instructed by the British secretary of state. The operation was secured as described.

Never has such effort been made by the local police to bring a man into custody as in this case. Over 15,000 circulars were sent to every place of any importance in the world, and the catch was set in several languages. More than \$500 was expended in postage.

Chief Grasset was notified of the arrest yesterday. He was assisted by authorities, thru the Canadian high commissioner at London, thru the secretary of state, thru the British consul at Havana, and the Cuban high commissioner. The attorney-general's department will be notified this morning.

Not Welcome News.
The news of Captain Harbottle's arrest was received with mixed feelings. There are hundreds whose former friendship for the young man makes them genuinely sorry to hear of his return, and who are glad to see him. He has been supplied with money from Toronto, and has constantly been kept in receipt of news of every new move here. He had with him, when arrested, many copies of the circulars which were sent out to secure his arrest. He said that Norman Cooby, one of his close friends, who has been with him for a time, will return with him to Toronto.

Harbottle left Toronto Nov. 28 last, after officials of the Toronto Club had discovered grounds for suspicion and had asked Harbottle for an explanation. He appeared before several members of the house committee. He admitted the shortage, but promised to make it good.

The Duke of Argyll, Lord Abercrombie, Derby, Lansdowne and Minto recently issued an invitation to a number of distinguished persons supporting a fund to be raised here as a substantial public contribution towards the £500,000 understood to be necessary in transforming the historic battlefields into a public park.

GREAT WORKS LET OUT TO TENDERS ASKED FOR

Dredging Company Tenders in Same Handwriting for Different Amounts—Collusion Charged.

OTTAWA, April 14.—(Special)—Mr. Bennett moved adjournment this afternoon to discuss a question of urgent public importance relating to the dredging at Timm and Victoria Harbor. He said that according to statements of Mr. Pugsley it was proposed to let contracts for dredging at these points without calling for tenders, at prices for which the same work was performed last year. Mr. Bennett said he knew something of the prices of last year, but there was no report of civil service commission evidence that they were extravagant. In the past two years the firm of Bodens & Co. had been paid over \$2,000,000, Great Lakes Dredging Co. \$1,350,000, and the Owen Sound Dredging Co. \$350,000. And Mr. Pugsley had already informed the house that he had secured consent of his colleagues to giving contracts for work amounting to half a million dollars without calling for tenders.

In Same Handwriting.
Mr. Bennett challenged the minister to produce the original tenders, upon which he would base his figures for the work. It would be seen that there were two tenders, one from the Midland Dredging Co., of which F. W. Langshere Dredging Co., of which Dr. Spohn is secretary-treasurer, and both tenders were in the same handwriting.

For work at Midland the Grant Co. tenders at 53 cents and Spohn Co. at 57 cents. But there was a third tender, from the son of the member for Ottawa for 30 cents. Mr. Bennett charged that there was collusion and fraud between the Grant and Spohn companies, and he challenged the minister or prime minister to have tenders laid on table. Sir Wilfrid Laurier declared he had no authority to order the production of the papers, but Mr. Bennett thought parliament was big enough to do it. Finally Mr. Bennett sent a page after the papers.

The whole thing, said Mr. Bennett, hinged on whether the scows were filled. The country paid inspectors who were never there. This had been proved in one case, and no one was prosecuted for conniving at fraud.

JUMPED FROM LAUNCH IN A CHINESE PORT

Mr. Rennie, Well Known Canadian Flour Exporter and Promoter, Ends His Life.

HONGKONG, April 14.—A sensation has been created here by the death of Mr. Rennie, a Canadian flour miller, who committed suicide by jumping from a launch, carrying a despatch-box.

WELL-KNOWN IN MONTREAL.

MONTREAL, April 14.—(Special)—Mr. Rennie, who suicided in Hongkong, was well known here to the flour trade. As a young man he was private secretary to the Hon. John Norquay when that gentleman was premier of Manitoba. He proceeded to Hongkong and accepted the agency of a San Francisco milling establishment and gradually branched out as one of the largest importers of American flour in China. About two years ago the Canadian trade learned that Rennie had formed a milling company for the manufacture of flour in one of the large Chinese cities and with the exception of receiving circulars from time to time, very little is known here as to the result of the venture.

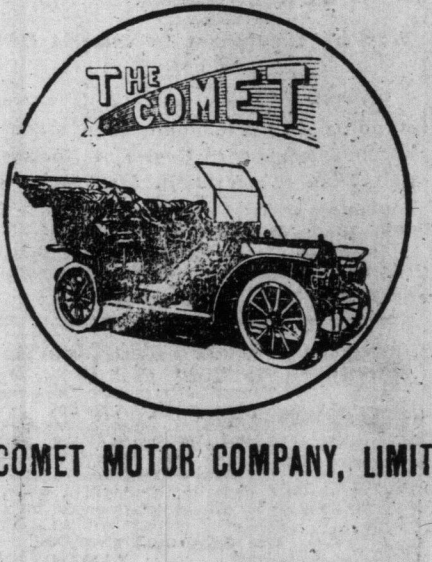
