BYE-LAWS

OF THE

INCORPORATED

DIOCESAN CHURCH SOCIETY.

1st. At all the meetings of the Society or its Committees, before entering upon business, the "appointed prayers" shall be said.

2nd. His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor for the time being, if a member of the Church of England, shall be respectfully requested to be joint Patron of this Society, with the Societies for the Propagation of the Gospel, and for Promoting Christian Knowledge.

3rd. The Bishop of the Diocese shall be President of the Society, and no alteration shall be made in the Bye-laws, or any proposition be adopted by the Society or the Executive Committee thereof to which his dissent shall be expressed, until the same shall have been submitted to the next Annual general meeting of the Society, and if such alteration or proposition be again adopted at such other meeting, it shall then take effect, notwithstanding such dissent.

4th. The very Rev. the Dean and the Archdeacon of Nova Scotia shall be ex. officio, Vice Presidents, whose number shall be limited to eight. There shall be also a Secretary, an Assistant Secretary, and a Treasurer.

5th. All members of the Church are invited to unite with the Society as Subscribers; and every Clergyman licensed by the Bishop, and all Lay-members of the Church of England subscribing not less than Five Shillings annually, or Ten Pounds at one payment, shall be members of the Incorporated Society, and entitled to vote at all meetings of the same. But no Subscriber shall enjoy any of the privileges of an Incorporated Member, whose subscription is more than one year in arrear. The annual subscriptions shall be considered due upon the first day of January in each year.

6th. The Executive Committee shall consist of the President, Vice Presidents, Secretary, Assistant Secretary, and the Treasurer of the

Society, who shall fill the same offices in the Committee ; of all Clergymen licensed by the Bishop of the Diocese, being members of the Society ; together with twenty Laymen to be chosen as hereafter provided ; and such other members of the Society as may be chosen by the local Committees, according to the ninth Bye-Law.

7th. An Annual Meeting of the Society, open to all its members shall be held at Halifax in the month of October, or at such time as the Executive Committee shall appoint ; at which meeting the vacancies in the Executive Committee shall be filled up, the Secretaries and Treasurers shall be elected, and any vacancies in the number of Vice Presidents may be filled up at the pleasure of the Society. A Special General Meeting may be called at any time when the President, or, in his absence, two or more Vice Presidents, or the Executive Committee, shall consider it desirable to appoint such Special General Meeting.

8th. The Executive Committee shall meet monthly during the year, with the exception of July, August and September ; and a Special Meeting may be called by the President, or in his absence, by a Vice President,

9th. The members of the Church in every part of the Province, are invited to co-operate with the DIOCESAN CHURCH SOCIETY, by forming Local Committees under the direction of their respective Clergymen, either in each Mission or Parish, or in more than one Mission or Parish united, as shall be deemed most convenient, and in strict accordance with the designs and Rules of the DIOCESAN CHURCH SOCIETY. Every Rural Local Committee shall have the power of appointing any one member of the Society to be a member of the Executive Committee. It is recommended to the Local Committees to forward their funds, as they may be collected, to the Executive Committee, who will faithfully apply them to the general objects of the Society.

10th. The following objects shall more particularly engage the attention of the Society, as soon as their means may enable them to afford such attention :—

- 1.—Provision for Clergymen.
- 2.—Missionary visits to neglected and destitute places, under the direction of the Bishop.
- 3.—Assistance to the Endowment of Parishes.
- 4.—Assistance to the erection and enlargement of Churches and Chapels belonging to the Church of England in peculiar or extreme cases.
- 5.—Supplies of Books and Tracts published by the Society for Promoting Christian Knowledge, and such other Books and Tracts in strict conformity with the principles of the Church of England, as having been first carefully examined and approved by a Committee of Revision to be appointed by the Executive Committee, shall then have received the approval of the Executive Committee ; and, lastly, the written approbation of the Bishop.

- 7.—Assistance to deserving young men, desirous of being qualified for the Ministry of the Church, but requiring aid in pursuing their studies at the Collegiate Establishment at Windsor.
- 8.—Aid to Sunday and other Schools, in which due attention is paid to instruction in the principles of the Church of England.
- 9.—Encouragement to the instruction and training of respectable Teachers for Sunday and Daily Schools.
- 10.—Upholding, by all possible and proper means, the Collegiate Establishment at Windsor.
- 11.—It shall also be one of the objects of the Society, to provide for the Widows and Orphans of deceased Clergymen, and for superannuated and incapacitated Clergymen ; but no part of the Society's funds shall be appropriated to these objects, except such as shall be specifically given and paid into the Society therefor.

To these objects, generally, the contributions will be applied ; while those who desire it may have their individual contributions scrupulously confined to any one or more of these objects. And as some members of the Church, who are not unmindful of the great spiritual wants of their own neighbourhood, still feel constrained, in pious gratitude for the blessings they enjoy, to allot something, however small from the means with which a gracious Providence has blessed them, towards the spread of the glorious Gospel among the nations which still sit in darkness—

11th. This Society will gladly receive and forward to the Society for the Propagation of the Gospel whatever sums may be given for the conversion and instruction of the Heathen ; to which object such sums will be strictly confined by the East India Committee of that Society.

12th. The Accounts of the Society shall be closed on the 31st December in each year, and shall be audited in one month from that time, by auditors to be appointed by the Executive Committee.

13th. At each Annual Meeting of the Society, the first five on the Executive Committee shall go out of office, but all or any of them shall be eligible for re-election. The new members shall be first proposed and seconded, then elected by ballot and placed at the bottom of the list.

14th. None of the above Bye-Laws shall be altered, except at a General Meeting of the Incorporated Society ; and a full year's notice of a proposal to change any of them must be given previous to the meeting at which the proposed alteration is to be effected.

PRAYERS.

APPOINTED TO BE USED "AT ALL MEETINGS OF THE SOCIETY, AND OF COMMITTEES," BEFORE THEY COMMENCE BUSINESS.

Prevent us, O Lord, in all our doings, with thy most gracious favour and further us with Thy continual help; that in all our works, begun, continued, and ended in Thee, we may glorify Thy holy name, and finally by Thy mercy, obtain everlasting life, through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.

O God, from whom all holy desires, all good counsels, and all works of piety and charity do proceed, we beseech Thee to visit with thy favor our Sovereign Lady, Queen Victoria; and so to rule her heart that she may in all things seek Thy honor and glory. Prosper with thy blessing the designs of this Society. Comfort with thy grace those benefactors who contribute to its support. Bless the ministry of Thy servants, the clergy; and the endeavors of all who are engaged in promoting the knowledge of true religion. And may Thy Holy Spirit direct all our consultations to the advancement of Thy Glory and the good of Thy church, through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.

O merciful God, who hast made all men, and hatest nothing that thou hast made, nor wouldest the death of a sinner, but that he should be converted and live, have mercy upon all Jews, Turks, infidels, and heretics, and take from them all ignorance, hardness of heart, and contempt of Thy Word, and so fetch them home, Blessed Lord, to Thy flock, that they may be saved among the remnant of the true Israelites, and be made one fold under one Shepherd, Jesus Christ our Lord, who liveth and reigneth with Thee and the Holy Spirit, one God, world without end. Amen.

Almighty God, Father of all mercies, we Thine unworthy servants, do give Thee most humble and hearty thanks for all thy goodness and loving kindness to us and to all men; more particularly for the providential support by which this Society has been hitherto sustained; but above all for Thine inestimable love in the redemption of the world by Thy Blessed Son, for the means of grace, and for the hope of glory which Thou hast given us in the same our Lord and Saviour Jesus Christ; to whom, with Thee and the Holy Ghost, be all honor and glory, world without end. REPORT OF THE EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE.

THE *Thirty-eighth* Report of the Executive Committee is of more than usual interest, both with respect to the present position of the Society, and also, to its future existence.

During the past year the Committee have been enabled to continue, and slightly to increase, the work before undertaken, and to meet all the payments which have been promised. Yet to effect this they have been forced to draw upon funds which were reserved from the income of the past. The grants to parishes under the "Quebec scheme," terminate with the year 1876; and, in accordance with the rules, they must be revised. New arrangements and altered conditions may be made. The Missions will be required to make application for renewal of grant, at least, three months before the end of the year.

In consequence of expectations raised, that a larger amount would be given by one of the leading parishes, the Executive Committee have been induced to make several special grants to meet pressing wants. These expectations, however, have been disappointed, and it will be necessary, if not to retrench our usual expenditure, yet certainly to confine our payments during the next year to those Missions, who are already receiving aid under the Quebec scheme, or which may be placed upon its list.

The Committee regret to state that, in general, the receipts from the Local Committees have been less in 1876 than in the previous year. They are aware that this is not caused by any diminution of interest in the work of the Society, but by the great depression of business transactions, which has affected, more or less, all classes of society. Letters received from several of the Local Committees express their regret for the lesser amount sent in, and plead their inability as the only reason. This reduction of income is discourag-

ing, especially when the Committee were hoping to raise the minimum salaries to \$800.

With reference to the special objects of the Society, your Committee state:—firstly, that the income of the “Widows’ and Orphan’s” Fund is still sufficient to meet the pensions at the present rate of payment; but, that the demands upon the fund have so far increased that they are now nearly equal to the income.

The Superannuation Fund has had no further charge upon its income, and is therefore slowly increasing. Your Committee think that probably the time is not far distant when there will be many more calls upon the fund than its income will be able to meet.

Since the reservation of the one-fourth of its contributions by any parish has been disallowed by the Society, the funds of the Endowment Committee have increased only by interest, and by money conveyed to them in TRUST. These amounts are held and disbursed according to the rules of the Society.

The most important matter before the Society at present is the proposal to transfer all its funds under certain conditions, and its responsibilities also, to the Diocesan Synod. It has been thought that greater centralization of Church Government would be of advantage to the Diocese. The Synod has agreed to accept the trust, provided conditions mutually approved can be agreed upon. The basis of this agreement has been proposed by the Executive Committee of D. C. S., and accepted by the Committee of the Synod. Care has been taken to preserve the special funds intact, and to provide that the general objects of the Society shall, as far as possible, be carried out. The final consent of both parties will probably be given at their next meetings. After which there will be necessity for some Legislative action before the union can be completed. Your Committee trust that the interest which Churchmen have hitherto felt in the D. C. ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING.

THE Annual General Meeting was held on Friday, July 2nd, 1875, in the National School Room, at 2 o'clock, p. m.

There were present, The Right Reverend the Lord Bishop in the Chair, and thirty of the Clergy, and sixteen Lay Representatives from the Country.

In the Opening Address the Bishop drew especial attention to the proposed union with the Synod.

The following Officers were elected for the ensuing year :

Canon Gilpin, Secretary ; C. B. Bullock, Asst. Secretary ; Canon Gilpin, Treasurer.

Members of Executive Committee :—Messrs. W. H. Wiswell, W. M. Brown, W. Gossip, J. W. Marling, and J. R. DeWolfe, M. D.

A Report from the Church Endowment Committee was presented (this has been printed in the last Report.)

The following Report was presented and adopted; and the Executive Committee were requested to endeavor to carry out its intention :—

The Sub-Committee, appointed to bring before the Society the proposal to increase the Minimum Salary of the Clergy to \$800 per annum, submit the following Report:

They are of opinion that the present minimum of \$700 is not sufficient for the support of the Clergy, and has not enabled some of them to escape pecuniary difficulties. They are aware that the inadequate salary paid in this Diocese has occasioned the loss of several of our best men, who have been compelled to remove to other fields of labor, where there is better provisions made for their support. They fear that others also will follow their example, unless efforts be made to prevent it. Your Sub-Committee cannot but think that the insufficient income which the Clergy now receive is one reason for the want of men in the Ministry; and, also, for the scarcity of Divinity Students at our College. Time and money must be expended for their education; and yet young men cannot look forward to so large a salary as is paid to superior clerks in our Mercantile Establishments, and to head workmen in our Factories, while the necessary expenses of the Clergy are greater.

Your Sub-Committee think that it is absolutely necessary to provide better incomes for the Clergy, and they recommend that the minimum rate, for the present, (at least for those in Priest's Orders) be \$800, and that the D. C. S. use every exertion to bring the present salaries up to that standard.

The Society now pays annually, toward the support of Missionaries, \$5,820.

A memorandum is submitted, shewing the probable additional amount (\$1,300) to be provided, if the proposed increase be adopted. It is based upon the supposition that the Parishes and Mission will increase their payments to meet larger grants from the Society.

The D. C. S. is already pledged to the full extent of its income, and to meet the proposed increase of payments, the Subscriptions to the Society must also be largely increased.

As one means to effect this the Sub-Committee would suggest that the above statements be published in the Annual Report, and also, that circulars be printed and distributed in the Diocese, containing the same information and an appeal to Churchmen to use their best efforts to meet the necessary increase in the income of the Society.

Your Committee would recommend that no change be made in the present grants and conditions until the expiration of the three years for which they were made, unless any Parish or Mission should make application for an increase of grant, accompanied by an agreement to meet the required additional sum from the people.

The recommendation of the W. & O. Committee, (notice of which had been given last year) so to alter the 11th Rule as to allow holders of certificates to travel within the limits usually allowed by Life Insurance Companies, was adopted.

An appeal was presented on behalf of the widow of the late Rev. W. Jamison, against the action of the W. & O. Committee, in refusing her a pension. It appeared that Mr. Jamison had applied to the Bishop's Commissary for leave of absence, and that he might have supposed that such leave embraced permission from the W. & O. Committee to go out of prescribed limits for benefit of his health. It was—

Resolved, “That this Society do empower the W. & O. Committee to pay to the widow and orphans of the late Rev. W. H. Jamison, the usual pension, on such conditions as in their wisdom, they may deem proper to impose.”

With reference to union with Diocesan Synod, it was—

Resolved, “That the Executive Committee be instructed in conjunction with the Executive Committee of Synod to arrange for the union of the two bodies, provided it can be done on a basis mutually acceptable to the Executive of this Society and the Executive of the Synod ; and to report the same at next Annual Meeting for Confirmation.”

Notice of motion was given for such alteration in the Constitution of the D. C. S. as may be necessary under the proposed union with the Synod.

The 5th and 6th Bye-laws of the Society were altered (in accordance with notice given last year) so as to apply the qualification for membership of D. C. S. to the Clergy as well as to the Laity.

The meeting was dismissed with the apostolic benediction.

EXTRACTS FROM THE MINUTES OF THE EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE.

JUNE 18TH, 1875.—The Report of the Sub-Committee, relative to the Minimum Salary of \$800, was presented. It was *resolved* that the report be adopted and brought before the General Meeting of the Society.

A grant of \$100 per annum was made for Missionary work at "Five Islands" and "Economy," for two years from the first of 1875.

OCT. 15TH, 1875.—The Secretary reported that the W. & O. pension to Mrs. W. H. Jamison had been paid.

A Committee was appointed to consider the proposal of union with the Synod, and to prepare a scheme of conditions, and to report before the end of the next three months.

The Bishop stated that the Block Sum from S. P. G., for 1876, would be £2,250 stg.

The following resolution was unanimously adopted:—Whereas, the S. P. G. has not carried into effect the proposed annual reduction of £100, on which the Endowment Scheme was based: so that the grant for 1876 is £500 more than it would have been if the anticipated reduction had been continued. This Committee will sanction the continuance, by the Block Sum Committee, of the present grants to Missions, where they are still required, notwithstanding the occurrence of vacancies, which would technically bring such cases under the operation of the Endowment Fund Scheme; it being understood that the said Committee shall not make any new grants, nor continue any of the present grants if the S. P. G. shall reduce the "block sum," to the extent expected when the prospectus was issued.

A memorial from Lunenburg asking aid to a mission there was presented and referred to the "Quebec Scheme Committee."

A report was presented from the mission of Falkland.

Nov. 5TH.—SPECIAL MEETING.—A grant of \$150 was made to Glace Bay Mission.

The Bishop stated the object of the present Special Meeting, viz.: to represent the difficulty in which he is placed by the refusal of the Church Endowment Committee to continue the payment for grants to fill the vacancies on the S. P. G. list to places.

The action of the Block Sum Committee was reported relative to the above, viz.: "Inasmuch as the S.P.G. has given two lists, one containing the names of certain clergymen who are to receive salaries during their life time, and the other containing the names of places to which certain specified grants were made, and the "Block Sum" has been granted on condition that the D. C. S. should fulfil all the obligations of the S. P. G."

Resolved, "That the Secretary be instructed to continue the payments to the places severally named in the above mentioned second list, at all times when he shall be certified that a clergyman is resident in the said place or places."

The action of the Block Sum Committee was confirmed.

J. W. Marling was appointed a member of the Block Sum Committee, vice H. Pryor resigned.

J. R. DeWolfe was appointed a member of the Block Sum Committee, vice A. M. Uniacke removed from the Diocese.

Nov. 19TH.—With reference to the memorial from Lunenburg, the "Quebec Scheme" Committee reported that the present position of the D. C. S. will not allow them to recommend a grant toward supporting a clergyman as proposed. The Committee also drew attention to the fact that for the last two years the Parish of Lunenburg omitted to make any return to the general funds of the Society.

The recommendation of the Committee was adopted.

Attention was also drawn to the fact that no return had been made for the last year from St. Margaret's Bay.

DEC. 17TH, 1875.—A special grant of sixty dollars was made to the Rev. W. H. Grocer.

The report of the Sub Committee relative to union with Synod was presented and read.

JAN. 21, 1876.—A grant of \$80 was made to the Rev. Bruce Mackay toward an outfit.

The report of the Sub Committee relative to union with Synod was taken up and considered, amended and adopted for communication with the Executive of Synod. (The result of this combined action will be found on another page.)

FEB. 18, 1876.—An application from Rev. O. M. Grindon, for a retrospective grant, was deferred to a future meeting.

MARCH 17.—A grant of \$50 was made toward the completion of a Church at "Five Islands," on the usual conditions. The title of the land to be in the D. C. S.

Messrs. E. P. Archbold and J. W. Marling were appointed Auditors for 1876.

It was agreed that the W. & O. Committee be requested to give in the Annual Report a list of all Clergymen holding certificates in the Fund.

APRIL 21.—The Secretary submitted a statement of funds, shewing that when all the grants were paid for 1876 there would be a deficit of at least \$500.

Under these circumstances it was decided that an application for a retrospective grant could not be granted.

The Annual General Meeting of the Society was appointed for Tuesday, 4th July, in the evening, at eight o'clock.

The following Sub-Committee were appointed to make arrangements, in cooperation with the Executive Committee of Synod, for a public meeting:—Rev. J. W. Ancient, Rev. J. Bell, Messrs. W. M. Brown, and R. J. Wilson.

MAY 19.—Several applications were considered, but it was decided that the support of the Missionaries in the Parishes, now

on our list, have the first claim, and that the means of the Society were inadequate to any further grants.

A draft of the 38th Report of the Executive Committee was presented, amended and adopted for publication.

It was directed that the terms of transfer of the D. C. S. Funds to the Synod be published in the Report.

REPORT OF THE WIDOWS' AND ORPHANS' SUB-

The income for the year 1875 was \$2387.24, derived from the following sources:—

Referring to the calculation upon which the fund was based, the above will shew that the premiums from the clergy are \$291 above the estimated amount, while the collections and donations are \$122 below that amount, which it was thought would be annually collected. The income for 1875 is \$144.54 above that for 1874.

The payments from the fund during the year have been \$2051.-38, leaving \$335.86 to be funded.

There are now within the Dominion of Canada 49 Clergymen, holding certificates. Several Clergymen, formerly of this Diocese, have removed to other fields of work, and, in accordance with our rules, still hold their certificates and pay their premiums.

In forwarding to you, the amount of the subscriptions to the D. C. S. from the Parish of Hubbards Cove, it is, no doubt, expected, they would be accompanied by a few remarks from me. But in complying with the request; I dread I will be repeating to some extent, what has been already stated by me, and printed in an annual report a year or two ago.

A letter has appeared in the *Church Chronicle*; of the 30th March last, over the signature of. "A Subscriber of 21 years," in which many good suggestions are given, for making the objects of the Society more generally known, and consequently increasing its funds ; and one in particular, as stated by the writer, is to the following effect. "That if the Clergy would at the time of taking up the subscriptions, make a house to house visitation themselves, (and not leave the work of collecting to be done by others, who for many reasons, cannot have the same amount of influence) explain fully to all, that the funds of the Society are expended, chiefly in bringing the means of grace within the reach of the most destitute, in distant localities, the good results would be soon visible, not only by the amounts sent in annually, but also by the kindly feeling of members of the Church, one towards each other." From long and practical experience, I can, without fear of contradiction, endorse the writer's statements. I have for the last twenty-five years, taken the work of collecting into my own hands, and in doing so, I had innumerable opportunities of conveying instruction in various ways ; and also of sending in on an average \$70.00 per annum. Whereas, if I left it in the hands of others, anxious though they may be to do their duty, the collection might not amount to over \$20.00 per annum. That it will be the means of keeping those who engage in it, busily occupied, connected as it must be with the various duties of the Parish, and that it is attendant with a certain amount of drudgery, cannot be denied, but what of that, if it will be the means of advancing the work of God, and the interests of His Church. Before I commenced the work of collecting this season, I did not expect to do a great deal, owing in some degree, to the very limited circulation of ready money in the Parish. Yet even so, when the work was completed, the subscription amounted to the sum of \$75.00, which I take great pleasure in enclosing, together with the list of the subscribers. Hoping all may be in good time for insertion in the coming annual report.

APPENDIX.

RULES OF THE WIDOWS' AND ORPHANS' FUND.

The following is the 11th object of the Diocesan Church Society :

"It shall also be one of the objects of the Society to provide for the Widows and Orphans of deceased Clergymen, but no part of the Society's funds shall be appropriated to this object except such as shall be specifically given and paid into the Society therefor."

1st. In accordance with the above, the Society will open a special account for the object to be called "The Widows' and Orphans' Fund." This fund shall be formed and consist of all subscriptions, donations, legacies, and other contributions, given and paid to the Society for this special object, and of all premiums received under these rules, and of all benefits arising therefrom ; and this fund shall be held and applied to and for this particular object, and no other.

2nd. A standing sub-Committee of seven members shall be appointed, in whom, together with the Secretary of the Diocesan Church Society, (who shall be paid as Secretary of this sub-Committee,) shall be vested the whole management of this Fund, subject to an appeal to the whole Society.

3rd. The Diocesan Church Society undertakes to pay, out of this Widows' and Orphans' Fund, the pensions which become due under the following rules.

4th. Every Clergyman of the Church of England within the Diocese wishing to avail himself of the benefits of this fund, shall, within six months from the 10th October, 1855, or within one year from taking orders, or from his admission into the Diocese, apply to the Secretary for a certificate of pension, and shall pay the annual sum or premium therefor, as hereafter mentioned.

5th. Any applicant, after such period of time, shall only be permitted to receive such certificate at the option of the sub-Committee, and upon such terms as they shall direct.

6th. The following shall be the rate of the yearly sum or premium payable by every clergyman applying for a certificate, according to his age at the date of his first application ; it being understood that any parish or congregation contributing to the fund more than \$8.00, then the excess be counted toward payment of the premium of the minister or ministers for that year :

7th. If any clergyman marry the second time he shall pay the annual sum or premium for the age he may be when he marries the second time.

8th. Upon payment of the first sum or premium, the applicant shall receive a certificate, as hereafter mentioned, and the same sum shall be paid by him, up to the time of his death, on the first day of January in each year.

9th. If any person fail to pay the amount of his premium within forty days after the payment become due, all claim to the pension under his certificate shall be forfeited, and the same shall thereupon become null and void. But if he desire to have his claim to the pension renewed, it shall be in the power of this Committee to readmit him on such terms as they see fit.

10th. Permanent removal of the clergyman from this Diocese to any place beyond the limits of British North America or the United Kingdom, except with the leave of this Sub-Committee, expressed in writing, or under such conditions as they may impose, forfeits all claim to the pension.

11th. If any clergyman shall go beyond the limits of Europe, or of North America 35° North latitude, without the leave of the Sub-Committee, he shall forfeit all claim to the pension.

12th. The widow of Every Clergyman who shall have paid the annual sum or premium (subject to the above exceptions) shall receive a pension of £25 per annum during widowhood.*

13th. If at any time it is the opinion of the sub-Committee that the state of the funds will safely warrant their doing so, they shall have power to increase the amount of the pensions.

14th. If the widow die or marry again the child or children of her deceased husband shall receive the pension. But no part of the pension shall be received by those children who have arrived at the age of sixteen years, if males, or eighteen years, if females, while those who are still under those respective ages will receive the full amount of the pension.

16th. The pensions shall be payable half-yearly on the 1st day of January and the first day of July in each year, and shall commence on the first or those days which sh/ll happen after the decease of each person holding a certificate, and terminate on the first of those days which shall happen after the death of the widow or child, or the happening of any other event by which, under these rules, such pension is to cease.

17th. The clergy of Prince Edward's Island shall be entitled to participate in the benefit of this fund on equal terms with the Clergy of this Province.

18th. The certificate to be granted shall be in the following form * * * * under the seal of the Society and the signature of the Secretary; and on the back thereof or annexed thereto shall be printed the above Rules.

19th. None of the above Rules and Regulations shall be altered except at a General Meeting of the D. C. S., after a full year's notice of the proposed change.

At the general meeting of the Society, Oct. 4th, 1865—"It was the opinion of the meeting that, for purposes of insurance in the W. and O. Fund, Bermuda should not be considered within the limits of British North America."

SUPERANNUATION FUND RULES.

*Extract from the 11th object of the D. C. S.—*It shall be one of the objects of the Society to provide * * * * for superannuated and incapacitated Clergymen; but no part of the Society's funds shall be appropriated to this object, except such as shall be specifically given and paid into the Society therefor.

No. 1.—In accordance with the above, the Society will open a special account for this object, to be called "The Superannuation Fund."

This fund shall be formed and consist of all subscriptions, legacies, and other contributions given and paid to the Society for this special object, and of all benefits arising therefrom; and this fund shall be held and applied to and for this object and none other.

No. 2.—A standing sub-Committee of six laymen shall be appointed, in whom, together with the Bishop of the Diocese as chairman, shall be vested the whole management of this fund.

No. 3.—The Diocesan Church Society undertakes to pay from the proceeds of this fund the pensions which may become due under the following rules.

No. 4.—Any Clergyman of the Church of England within this Diocese wishing to participate in the benefits of this fund, shall make application to

the sub-Committee, who shall decide each case upon its own merits, and have power to grant such amount of pension, (not exceeding \$200,) as they think expedient. But should the sub-Committee refuse to grant the pension, an appeal may be made by the applicant to the Executive Committee of the D.C.S.

No. 5.—No Clergyman admitted from abroad into this Diocese shall receive any benefit from this fund, unless he shall have served for at least seven consecutive years in this Diocese, or shall have paid into this fund a sum to be named by the sub-Committee.

No. 6.—The pension shall be for life, unless circumstances should arise (either from a falling off of the fund or otherwise) which may make a revision necessary.

No. 7.—If the pensioner reside out of this Diocese sufficient proof of his identity shall accompany each draft for his pension.

No. 8.—The pensions shall be paid half-yearly in advance, on the 1st January and the 1st day of July in each year, and shall commence on the first of those days that shall happen after the pension is granted, and terminate on the first of those days that shall happen after the death of the pensioner, or the happening of any other event by which such pension is to cease.

No. 9.—If any pensioner shall be so far relieved from his disability as to be able to resume the discharge of Clerical duty, the pension shall be suspended during his relief from such disability.

No. 10.—None of the above rules or regulations shall be altered except at a general meeting of the Diocesan Church Society; after a full year's notice of the proposed change.

ENDOWMENT RULES.

The following Rules for the guidance of the Endowment Sub Committee were adopted by the Standing Committee, May 17th, 1850 :—

I. The investment of Endowments may be made in lands, houses, stock in banks, or other companies, money invested in mortgages or other securities, to be approved of by the Endowment Sub-Committee, and to be conveyed and held for the benefit of the incumbent or resident Missionary, for the time being, of any Parish or Mission for which they are designed, the said incumbent or resident Missionary to receive the yearly proceeds only of the interests or rents arising from such Endowment.

II. The conveyance or trust of such Endowment may be made either to the Society for the Propagation of the Gospel, or to the Church Corporation of the Parish, or to the Diocesan Church Society.

III. When real property is purchased and conveyed for Endowment, it shall be free from any debt or incumbrance.

IV. The annual proceeds arising from such Endowment shall be withheld from any incumbent or resident Missionary of any Parish or Mission who may be suspended by the Bishop of the Diocese from performing public services in the Churches in his Parish or Mission, during the continuance of such suspension

V. The Endowment Sub-Committee shall hold any sums contributed toward the endowment of any Parish or Missions, in trust for such Parish or Mission, and obtain such a rate of interest for the money as may be practicable, consistent with safety, until an opportunity shall arise of investing it for the permanent endowment of such Parish or Mission; and if, in the judgment of the Endowment Sub-Committee, such opportunity or proposition for Endowment shall come within the true intent and scope of the foregoing regulations, they shall authorize the said sums to be paid to the Parish or Mission so applying for it.

VI. If any difficulty shall arise as to whether any opportunity or proposition for endowment be agreeable to the foregoing rules, or if any other point relative thereto should be disputed or doubted, the question shall be referred to the Standing Committee of the Diocesan Church Society at their next meeting then ensuing.

VII. All applications from any Parish or Mission to the Endowment Sub-Committee for aid, shall be signed by the Rector and Church Wardens of such Parish or by the resident Missionary, accompanied by a resolution of the Local Committee of the Diocesan Church Society in its favor, in such Mission; and shall state the nature, situation, value, and annual profits of the investment desired to be made, the names of those in whose behalf it is to be made, the office where it should be duly registered, the sums that are contributed for its purchase, and all other particulars which may enable the Endowment Sub-Committee to form a correct judgment. All such applications to be made to the Secretary of the Diocesan Church Society, who is ex-officio Secretary of the Endowment Sub-Committee.

The Endowment Sub-Committee, in a Report to the Executive Committee, dated May 11th, 1863, made the following recommendations:—

"That while no restriction is made as to the sum which a Parish may withdraw from its '*Reserved Fourths*,' and invest as heretofore, yet that \$1000 be the minimum to which they should amount before they can be placed in trust with the Society and the interest be payable to the incumbent.

"With reference to the control of the Society over the *Reserved Fourths*, the Committee state that they have no wish to interfere in any way with the right of the Parishes to manage their own property. They would merely, for the better security of this fund, for the support of the Clergy, recommend—That a Rule be adopted which would require that, when an investment made by any Parish from its *Reserved fourths* may be paid off, the money be returned to this Society to be held under the same Rules, and on the same terms as before, until such time as the Parish may be able to procure another satisfactory investment.

The first recommendation was adopted by the Executive Committee,—the second is still under consideration.

QUEBEC SCHEME.

RULES AND REGULATIONS.

1st.—That no grant be ordinarily more than \$200 per annum to one Mission, or to one Clergyman.

2nd.—That in future, where there is no special condition, grants be made for three years from the first of the month either next preceding or next following the date; and that they cease, in every case, at the expiration of that period, unless renewed, at the least six months before their termination.

3rd.—That all parishes and missions receiving aid from the D. C. S. toward the salary of their minister, shall by their wardens, or other representatives, pay to the Secretary of the Society half-yearly, on or before the 30th of June and 31st December in each year, such proportions of the required salary as may be arranged by mutual consent of themselves and the Diocesan Church Society.

4th.—On receipt of the stipulated half-yearly amount from the parish or mission, the Secretary shall accept the order of the minister for the full half year's salary as agreed upon jointly by the two contracting parties.

5th.—Should the minister accept part of the amount payable by the parish or mission in kind at *cash* prices, his receipt for the sum in the form of a Bill of items, may be counted by the wardens or representatives towards making up the amount to be paid by the parish or mission.

6th.—Should the sums agreed to be paid by the wardens or representatives not be paid when due, or within thirty days after falling due, the proportion agreed to be paid by the D.C.S. may be continued for six months, and the Executive Committee shall enquire into the cause of such deficiency, and consider the subject at the ensuing meeting.

7th.—The receipt of the Clergyman for money given at the offertory may be received from the Wardens as part of the conditional payment required by the Society from the people.

CHURCHES.

Every application for aid in the erection of a Church must contain the following information :—

- 1.—The precise situation, especially with reference to the nearest Church and to the amount of population within five miles of the Church.
- 2.—The title of the ground on which the building is to be erected.
- 3.—The size of the building, the numbers it can accommodate, and probable amount of the congregation that will usually attend it.
- 4.—The proposed cost of the building, the progress it has made towards completion, and the amount of contributions on the spot in money or labor.
- 5.—The frequency and regularity of the proposed services in the Church.
- 6.—That all the sittings are to be free and unappropriated.

It is the wish of the Executive Committee that no Clergyman should when building a Church, rely upon aid from this Society, without first ascertaining whether it is in the power of the Society to grant any assistance.

All grants to Churches are made on the following terms, namely : That the first moiety be called for within one year, and the second within two years from the date of the grant. The first moiety may be obtained when the exterior is finished, the second when the interior is finished. Grants to Parsonages are made on similar conditions.

"The Endowment Sub-Committee receive and hold any money given in trust to the Society for Church purposes, and pay over the annual interest arising from the same, when invested, towards the furtherance of the special object for which it was given."

"It is the opinion of the Executive Committee that it is the intention of the fifth Bye-Law that the annual payment of five shillings to the general objects of the Society constitutes a member, but that any person may devote his money to any particular object which is recognized by the Society."

All donations of Ten Pounds and upwards are funded, and the interest only applied to the general purposes of the Society.

"The Society will not make its usual grant toward the payment of an Assistant Missionary appointed to a separate cure, unless the people there consent to pay toward the *Endowment Fund of their Parish or Mission*, all the proceeds of whatever glebe lands may be in that Parish."

"All subscription lists received before the 31st March in each year, will appear in the next forthcoming report, while those received after that date shall be omitted."

"If reservations and special donations are not mentioned at the time when the contributions are sent in from the Local Committees, the whole amount will be considered as devoted to the general interests of the Society."

¶ The attention of the Local Committees is particularly requested to the above regulations.

"All applications for aid from this Society are proposed at one meeting of the Committee and considered at the next."

"No person shall be qualified to vote at any general meeting of the Society, nor to be elected a member of the Executive Committee, who has not been a Subscriber for three months preceding the day of meeting."

At the General Meeting in 1869 the following Resolution was adopted :—

"The Church property, in any Parish, which is actually occupied by the Incumbent of the said Parish, shall be valued by competent valuers, upon his taking charge, and be considered at the same value for purposes of salary during his incumbency; and the valuers shall be appointed as follows, viz., one by the parish, one by the Executive Committee of D. C. S., and another by those two."

UNION WITH THE SYNOD.

The following is the basis of union proposed by the Executive Committee of D. C. S.:—

1st. That all the property and funds now under the control of the Diocesan Church Society, be transferred to the Diocesan Synod of Nova Scotia, on condition that they be held and managed by one Board, appointed by the Synod, for the various purposes for which they are now held and managed by the Diocesan Church Society; and also that the several objects of the Society be carried on by that Board in accordance with the rules and regulations which now govern the actions of the Diocesan Church Society.

2nd. That the Board consist of all clergymen licensed by the Bishop of the Diocese, and not less than twenty lay-men, to be elected by the Synod, and that the Bishop of Nova Scotia be *ex-officio* Chairman, and the Dean and the Archdeacon of Nova Scotia be *ex-officio* Vice Chairmen of the Board; also—that provision be made for change, from time to time, in the members of the Board.

3rd. That all special funds, such as the Widows' and Orphans' fund, the Superannuation fund, and the fund for the Endowment of Parishes, be held, respectively, distinct and solely for the purposes for which they have been contributed, and no other; and that the by-laws thereof may from time to time be amended, as has hitherto been done by the Diocesan Church Society.

4th. That recommendations 1st, 2nd and 3rd, as above, be held to be permanent conditions of the transfer.

5th. That the Vice Presidents of the D. C. S., now appointed, occupy the same position for life, on the above named Board.

6th. That a list of life members of the D. C. S. be inserted in each printed record of the Synod.

7th. That the "Endowment Fund" be governed by its present Committee, under the prospectus; and that any vacancies in the Committee be filled up by the Diocesan Synod, to whom the Committee shall report annually.

8th. That the present Secretary and Treasurer continue (if willing) to fill those offices, until the Synod shall decide on a permanent course of action relative thereto, when it shall have full power to deal with the whole question, as may be deemed expedient.

9th. That encouragement should be given to the formation and action of local committees in connection with the Board of Synod, as hitherto with the Diocesan Church Society.

The following suggestions have been made by the Executive Committee of the Synod :—

In Clause 11, add after "Board" the words "to be called the Board of Diocesan Missions."

That the 5th Clause be "No layman shall be elected a member of the Board who is not an annual contributor to its funds of at least one dollar, and at each annual meeting of the Synod the first five, or if there are more than twenty, then one fourth of the whole number of lay members of the Board shall go out of office but they or any of them shall be eligible for re-election. The new members having been proposed, seconded and then elected by ballot, shall be placed at the bottom of the list."

That the 8th Clause be "The Board shall meet monthly during the year with the exception of August and September, seven being a quorum for the transaction of business; and a general meeting thereof shall be held annually in July or at the time of the meeting of the Synod, to which matters may be referred from the ordinary meetings of the Board, and such appeals addressed as have hitherto been allowed to the general meeting of members of the D. C. S. A special meeting may be called at any time by the Chairman, or in his absence by a Vice Chairman.

That Clauses 5, 6, 7, 8, 9, as above, be respectively 6, 7, 9, 10, 11.
