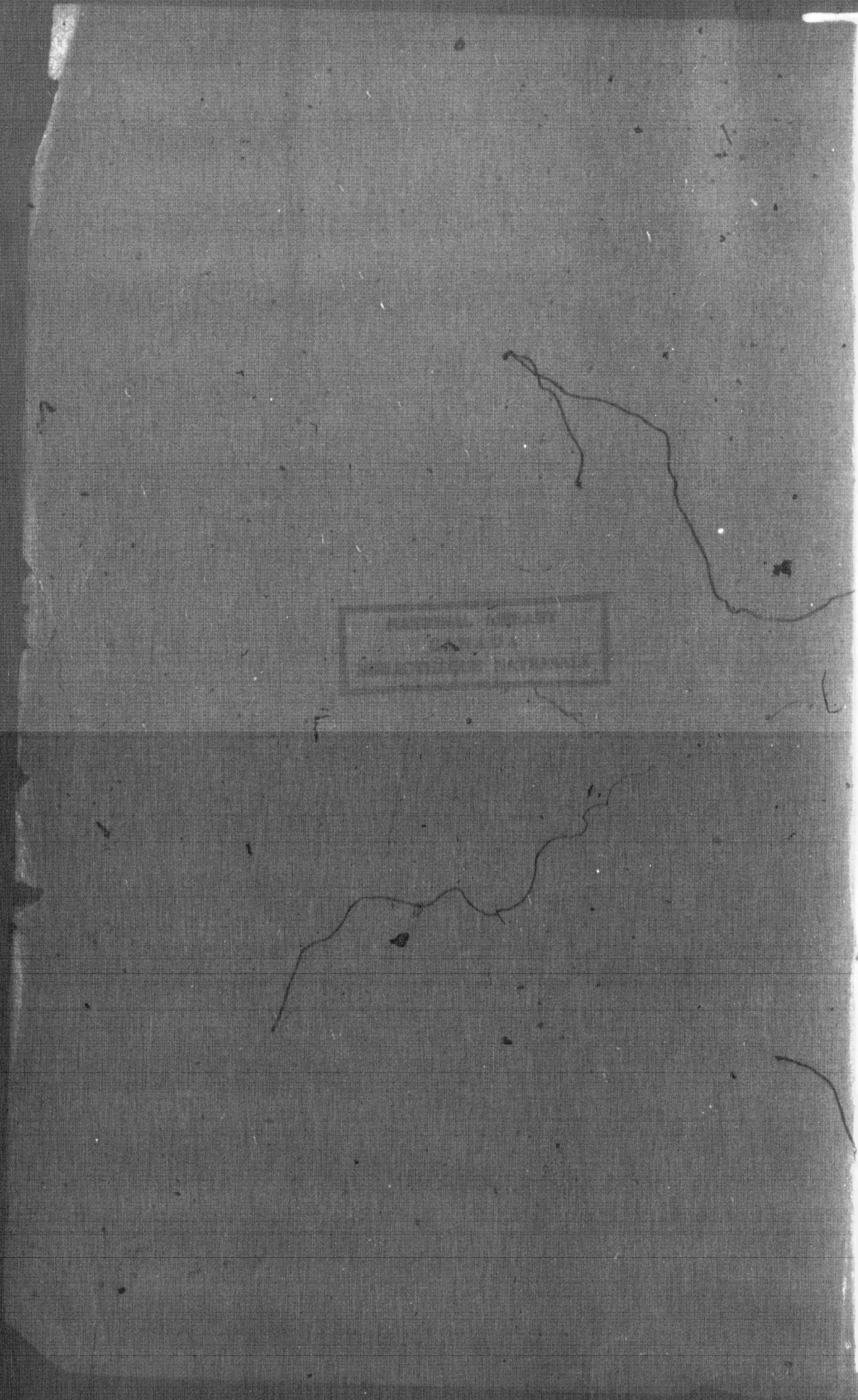

TWENTY-SECOND ANNUAL SESSION
OF THE

FIRST DAY.

The Twenty-second Annual Meeting of the Synod of Montreal was held on Tuesday, the 21st day of June, 1881. Divine Service was held in the Cathedral, with Sermon and Holy Communion, at half-past ten o'clock. The Sermon was preached by the Lord Bishop of this Diocese. The Bishop then read his address to the Synod as follows:

DEAR BRETHREN OF THE CLERGY AND LAITY,—

I am grateful to Almighty God for the permission, once more, to meet you on the occasion of the annual gathering of the Synod of this Diocese. The past year has not been marked by any great local events in our Church. Our duties have been plain and continuous. We have been seeking rather to hold the ground we possess than to extend our operations. Still the year's work is one that I believe we may look back on with some degree of satisfaction, and for which we should heartily thank our Heavenly Father, while taking courage for the future. By the mercy of God, I have been enabled to repeat my diocesan visitation without being hindered from keeping a single engagement, either by the accidents of travel or by personal disability. And I am able also to report that health and general well-being pervaded the districts into which my duties carried me. I do not know that any great advance in wealth has been made over the previous year, but the gloom which then overhung our lumbering and agricultural interests was, for the most part, passing away, and if men were not much richer, they were, at least, more hopeful. I wish I could add that with the better times, enjoyed by church members generally, our clergy had a fair prospect of better remuneration for their services. I have to remark, and with keen regret, that there is not a proper recognition of the fact, that the stipends offered by the several congregations to their pastors do not, as a rule, reach the sum laid down by the Synod as the minimum justly required. It is neither wise nor right to take advantage of a clergyman's necessities in order to get from him the greatest possible amount of service for the least possible amount of pay. Our best men, morally and mentally, will not suffer such treatment a moment longer than they are obliged, and unless constrained by love of Christ, or by circumstances, will leave us after a while. I am constantly invited to admit this or that stranger into the Diocese, on the plea that they will be willing to accept the miserable stipends offered, while our good and tried men, our young and energetic men, are allowed to leave, seeking elsewhere the justice denied them at home. I may here

remark that where congregations are limited in membership they may not always be able to raise an adequate stipend so as to secure the whole time and services of a properly qualified clergyman. In such cases it would be better for two or three congregations to combine, and to receive alternate services from one pastor, than to continue the present unsatisfactory changeful mode of procedure. Just now the tie between pastor and people is frequently too hastily formed and too lightly severed.

FINANCE.

The balance in the Synod treasury, reported at the last meeting of the Executive Committee, cannot fail to be most gratifying to us all. It shows on the one hand an active spirit of Christian benevolence on the part of the Church generally, and on the other a careful administration on the part of our executive officers; and I must be permitted to single out for special thanks our inestimable Treasurer, C. J. Brydges, Esq. But I hope the balance will not tempt our older mission churches to make application for larger grants from the Mission Fund. Self-support does not mean Mission Fund grants, but increased liberality from church members towards their own pastors. I think this should be more clearly put at the Deanery meetings. There, rather than in Synod, the actual provision made by each mission church for the clergyman can be ascertained and dealt with. Our Mission Fund balance is wanted; first, for the supply of vacant missions; and second, for the opening of new work. The vital question then still before the Church in this diocese is that of self-support. There is, however, in this particular, considerable difference between town and country. Citizens live close together, and numbers, or wealth, or both, effect that which is impossible in a poor and scattered community. Congregations containing within themselves either of these advantages can build churches and parsonages, maintain clergy and teachers, and surround themselves with the privileges and even the luxuries of church life. But in the country, especially in the lumber districts, it is not so. If they are to have the ministrations of the Church at all, they must have a certain measure of pecuniary help from the towns and cities. This has been so often repeated that I almost feel an apology to be due for bringing it forward again; but I am conscious that it has not yet obtained a practical hold upon us, and until that has taken place I am bound to repeat and repeat again. How has the Church in the country parts been hitherto maintained? Chiefly by grants from the venerable Society for the Propagation of the Gospel in Foreign Parts. When Montreal and Quebec were united under one Bishop, that is from A. D. 1784 to 1850, that Society carried on its shoulders the heaviest part of the burden of all the churches in the country besides some also in the city. During the 17 years episcopate of our late beloved Bishop Fulford, while that energetic prelate was striving to accomplish the difficult task of organizing the new diocese, the Society strengthened his hands with munificent gifts. Since the independence of the See, that is within the last 30 years, we have received from the S. P. G. more than

£80,000 sterling. In 1852 they voted, for 6 years, the large sum of £3,600 per annum, for the establishment of missions, with the expressed understanding that from and after the 1st July, 1858, the said grant should be reduced by not less than 10 per cent. Now in 1881 the Society's grant is £1,000, the reduction still going on. Notice has been received that a further reduction of £200 is made for the year 1882, from £1,000 to £800, which latter "sum will cover the amounts at present received by Messrs. Anderson, Johnston, Lonsdell, Pyke, Jones, Sutton and Young, who were appointed prior to November, 1849, and the pensions of Messrs. Johnson and Whitten and Mrs. Abbott, and on the death of any of the recipients above named, the grant to the Diocese will *pro tanto* be diminished."

This, in brief, is the history up to this time. What provision have we made,—are we making,—for the future? Let us come down to facts. We have, according to last year's report, 80 parishes and missions in the Diocese, of which, just now, 5 (Glen Sutton, Adamsville, Hemmingford, Huntingdon and Chelsea) are vacant; 11 are in the city of Montreal, 69 in country parts. All in the city, save 2, and 21 in the country, are self-sustaining; 8 still enjoy S. P. G. grants, and 5 rank on the Clergy Trust Fund. Of our city churches all but 4 are in poor districts; all but St. Thomas' Church are without endowment; and 5 of the number, I grieve to say, are heavily encumbered with debt. Yet upon these must come the support of our missionary work in the proportion, year by year, in which the venerable S. P. G. leaves us to ourselves. Of the self-sustaining country churches we cannot expect much. That they should ask nothing of us is a relief in itself. I would say, however, to the more wealthy of these churches, "If thou hast much give plenteously, if thou hast little do thy diligence gladly to give of that little; for so gatherest thou thyself a good reward in the day of necessity." Of the 50 churches receiving aid, 18 are served by privileged clergymen, that is, by ministers who from the S. P. G. or Clergy Trust Fund have grants secured to them for life. I have to say, with some pain, that when I have been looking over the statistics of the Diocese, it has seemed to me that in some cases church members are wanting in liberality. Ought not congregations, so assisted, to make a right and wise provision for the future, so that when their day of necessity arises, that is, when they lose their present ministers, they shall not come upon the neighbour churches for support? The greater number of these places are able to do this, for our privileged missionaries are among the oldest and most advanced of our mission stations. But further, if for local or personal reasons objection lies against the system of endowment, ought not then these same places to send every year a liberal exceptional contribution to our Mission Fund, or to our Sustentation Fund? Ought they to absorb the mission money as if Christianity were a selfish and not a benevolent thing,—a business and not a religion? There are two funds in particular which should be ministered to whenever the Lord prospers us. I mean the Sustentation Fund and Superannuation Fund. These must be built up. These specially claim our attention at the present moment, when the depression

of trade is disappearing and a term of prosperity may, under God, be confidently looked for. It seems to me therefore, and I hope you will be of the same mind, that advantage should be taken of the present time of commercial prosperity to add to the capital of our Sustentation Fund. Upon this fund mainly rests that missionary enterprise which gives health and activity to our Church; and in this work also I shall be glad of your advice and co-operation during the ensuing session. In passing from home mission work to other subjects, I wish to suggest to you the suitability of the present time for an address to the venerable Society for the Propagation of the Gospel, seeing that we all, lay and clerical, in this Diocese are so largely indebted to the Society. The Society was formed in A.D. 1701; it has therefore been 180 years in existence. It worked for the first 80 years, I believe, almost exclusively on the American continent, and from A.D. 1784 to the present time, it has been the mother of the Church in Canada, especially of the Church in Lower Canada. It is not necessary that I should indicate the terms in which to address our foster-mother. You know our obligations, and will be glad to express our warm thanks and grateful congratulations on her present high position amongst the preachers of the Christian world.

BRITISH NORTH AMERICAN AND FOREIGN MISSIONS.

At the last meeting of the Provincial Synod an organization was formed for the promotion of mission work in the North-West and Algoma. We are deeply interested in this particular work; in the case of Algoma, the Diocese was the creation of our own Provincial Synod, and in the case of the North-West, it is filling up daily with our own children and friends. I must, however, remind you that enthusiasm, if it is to result in good work permanently effected, should be guided by knowledge and discretion. We can, no doubt, take our part in the domestic mission work of the Canadian Church, as well as support ourselves, if we are not carried away by mere impulse and love of change. It behoves us to understand what we are about. We have four separate interests appealing to our Christian benevolence outside of the duty to the congregations to which we severally belong. 1. There is the Diocesan mission work (about which I have just spoken at length), with its necessary attendant funds for superannuation, for the support of the widows and orphans of the clergy, and for church education. These have first to be provided for; as, saith the Apostle, "If any provide not for his own, and especially for those of his own house, he hath denied the faith, and is worse than an infidel." True, this is spoken of things temporal, but the argument gains strength when applied to things external. 2. There is Algoma. This district in Western Canada was specially set apart by the Canadian Church in 1873 to be her peculiar mission field. We in Montreal have not done so very much on her behalf that we should boast ourselves above our brethren, but I believe I only state a simple fact when I say that of the organized dioceses who were a party to the establishment of the See of Algoma, Montreal alone, so far, has kept faith year by year in the engagements made in behalf of the support of the clergy. I know that

the engagements were so loosely made that the clergy dependent on their fulfilment had no claim in case of failure, but it is on that very account that I remind you that you should give time and attention to the right understanding of our obligations, and not allow our brethren to suffer on account of heedlessness. This Diocese has hitherto sent annually to Algoma, since its establishment, not less than \$1,350, the amount promised, as well as sundry gratuities over and above that amount. 3. And then there is the North-West. In order that we may do our duty as well to Algoma as the North-West, it is necessary that our local Board of Missions should be elected with understanding and placed in regular communication with the Provincial Board. In this connection there occurred in the Provincial legislation what I take to be an oversight. No corresponding Board of Missions was asked for in Montreal (as happened in the other dioceses). There seems to have been an impression that the Central Board, being located in this city, could act on behalf of this Diocese; but this of course was a mistake, and can be obviated by a right legislation at the present meeting of this Synod. 4. And then, again, there are foreign missions or missions to the heathen. The conduct and management of these will also belong to the local Board, which I desire to see duly elected and organized. We have foreign work already on foot; all that remains is to bring it into its right place in our missionary economy, and do our utmost for its support, both by our prayers and our alms. Anxious, however, as I am that as a Church we should do our utmost to extend the knowledge of Christ, and certain as I am that as a body we ought, and could, do much more; still, I feel it to be my duty to direct this Synod, as Administrator of Diocesan Funds, not to exceed the income at its disposal. We must not incur debt. We must not anticipate our income. It is bad to leave missions vacant, but it is dishonest to employ men without paying them according to stipulation, whether at home or abroad. Let, then, all estimates of liabilities be reasonably calculated, rather above than below the mark, and let us be careful to hold the vantage ground to which we have attained.

TRINITY CHURCH.

The difficulty connected with Trinity Church is still unsettled. The building has passed into other hands, and certain questions of law are before the courts.

DIOCESAN THEOLOGICAL COLLEGE.

The Theological College which has been my right hand in all home mission work during the past two years, has been sustained chiefly by the self-denying efforts of some of the clergy, and the liberality of a few of the laity. Our expenses have been kept at an almost nominal sum by the assistance of volunteer lecturers, who undertook and have performed the task of instructing in special branches of theology, leaving the general and comprehensive work to the Principal, whose unremitting attention to his varied duties has been an unspeakable comfort and support to me; and to the young men under his charge immense advantage. An effort, chiefly

in England, through the Rev. Ernest Houghton, has also been made towards raising an endowment fund, and although the sum of money actually in hand is not very large, it was given with expressions of kindness and good-will which have greatly encouraged me. A review of the correspondence in which Mr. Houghton has been engaged on behalf of our College, and other detail of work in the same connection, has conveyed to me a deep sense of the fidelity and painstaking with which he has executed the commission entrusted to him by me. The commission carried with it no emoluments; on the contrary, it benefited by his private expenditure and the sympathy accorded to it by his personal friends. By his judicious advocacy and painstaking explanations of our needs as a diocese, in relation especially to the educational advantages obtainable by the Theological College at McGill University, he has in many instances obtained for us more than money, he has gained that appreciation of our efforts which was wanted, in order that our Theological College should rank amongst our recognized and permanent Church institutions. I believe the usefulness of our Diocesan Theological College is beginning to be very generally admitted, and a greater unanimity of feeling on the subject to exist than in former years. Some changes we seek voluntarily and some are forced on us, and it frequently happens that one change entails another, not always foreseen or desired. When the venerable Society for the Propagation of the Gospel sent her missionaries to these shores to preach the Gospel here and to minister to us according to the usage of the Church of England, they, the missionaries, understood themselves to be an integral part of the Established Church of England, and were so recognized by the Church at home. I take the following from the letter of the Right Rev. George Jehoshaphat Mountain, Bishop of Montreal, dated March 1st, 1836, addressed to the Society for the Propagation of the Gospel—(Report 1836, pp. 123, 124):—"In 1791, when the two distinct provinces of Upper and Lower Canada were established by what is commonly called the Quebec Act, the Royal instructions to the Governors having previously declared the Church of England to be the established religion in the colony, to which instructions a reference is introduced in the Act—a reservation of one-seventh of all the lands in Upper Canada and of all such lands in the Lower Province as were not already occupied by the French inhabitants, was made, for the support of a Protestant clergy. This measure was introductory to the appointment of a Bishop, who went out in 1793, and whose diocese was expressly comprehended in the province of Canterbury in the same manner as any diocese in the same province in England. The Bishop procured the erection of a Cathedral at Quebec, which was consecrated in 1804, and invested with all honours, dignities, pre-eminences and distinctions of right belonging to an Episcopal seat and Cathedral Church." Time would not permit me to trace the history of the disestablishment and disendowment of the Canadian Church even if it were in place. The leading points are known to most of you. I mention it now as one of the greatest of those undesired changes which have brought to our church, in their train, many vicissitudes quite unforeseen and hard at first to accept. But it must not

be thought that the story is all shadows; our independence, which is the fruit of state inaction, is in itself a great boon and must ultimately lead us, under the guidance and by the aid of the Holy Spirit, to strength and maturity. And, then, since the Mother Church as an establishment has thrown us off, it were weak to spend the present time in vain repinings. True wisdom requires that we should make strenuous efforts after individuality and permanence. In my judgment both these are retarded by constant importations into the body of our clergy of men educated in the established Church and imbued with her traditions and sentiments. I must not be misunderstood, I find no fault with these things in themselves, I only lay stress on their unfitness, as qualifications for colonial ministerial work. And here the question arises—where shall we look for our clergy? Where shall we look for men meet and fit for the Master's work both by spiritual call and mental training? The preparation can only be made in colonial colleges. This is now so universally quoted that I will not detain you by discussing the question. I will content myself with an extract from the journal of the excellent and experienced Bishop to whom I have just referred, pointing out the educational advantages of Montreal, past and present. (Journal 1846, p. 21.) He says: "If McGill College should hereafter be so far under the direction of the Church of England, as to make it a proper seminary for a race of clergy in the country, it will then serve for, what it must be hoped will before any great length of time be, the diocese of Montreal, and Bishop's College will still be the reliance for that of Quebec." I am aware that Bishop Mountain did not see that the secularization of colleges was as inevitable as the secularization of the clergy reserves, and I do not quote him as a justification of my own conduct and that of my predecessor in erecting a Diocesan College and affiliating with McGill University, but I beg to observe, that, opportunity being given, the Bishop did anticipate the advantages of a Diocesan College for the separate see of Montreal. When he wrote that extract McGill was passing through trials not peculiar to itself, vexatious law suits and other depressing experiences. There was at that time no regular Arts course. Now the students in Arts at McGill number 135. How many of them are members of the Church of England I am not prepared to say, but I believe a large proportion. At all events as matters stand at present we have in our Diocesan College 10 students, of whom four are also students of Arts at McGill. While on subject of the Theological College, I must most gratefully notice the munificent act of a member of St. George's Church, A. F. Gault, Esq. Mr. Gault has informed me that he has purchased Saybrook Hall at a cost of \$22,600, with the intention of presenting it to the Montreal Diocesan Theological College. In making this offer he naturally feels that the churchmen of the diocese should liberally assist with funds to carry on the work in a manner becoming its importance. He, therefore, proposes to supplement his gift with the sum of \$4,000, provided \$40,000 be raised or to contribute \$1,000 per annum for 5 years provided a guarantee fund of \$5,000 per annum in addition be provided for 5 years. You must permit:

me to say that his views on the subject appear to me as liberal as his intention; and I cannot imagine that any difficulty can arise to prevent our availing ourselves of the liberality of our fellow-churchman. For the present, the whole matter remains in the hands of the Bishop.

ORDINATIONS AND CONFIRMATIONS.

I have now further to say that since the last meeting of Synod, I have visited 119 missions and stations; 655 persons have been confirmed. I have ordained, of Montreal students 3, and of Lennoxville 1; I have also admitted 5 deacons to the order of priesthood. I have formally opened with special services the new church in East Farnham and consecrated the new church in New Glasgow. One clergyman has been received by license to the work of the Church and several laymen.

OBITUARY.

Two of our oldest missionaries have been called to their rest during the past year, the Rev. Thos. Johnson, appointed to serve in the Diocese of Quebec in 1819, and the Rev. Wm. [redacted] appointed in 1837. Mr. Johnson was placed on the retired list when the S. P. G. made mention in their annual report of his missionary services. Leading a quiet healthful life, his early labors, our aged brother lived far beyond the usual years of man, and died honored and beloved by all around him.

REVISED NEW TESTAMENT.

Since our last meeting the revised version of the New Testament has been given to the English-speaking world. The book comes to us without (what I may call and not be misunderstood) authority, but I feel that it ought to be received by the Church with deep respect as the result of the united and long-continued labors of the greatest Christian scholars of the age. Some time will probably elapse before any requisition for its adoption in our public worship will be made. In the meantime I trust that our clergy, especially, as the teachers of the Church, will prepare themselves for the important question by devout, careful, and long-continued study both of the old version and the new. In conclusion, I now commend you to God, and earnestly pray that his Holy Spirit will guide, govern and assist our deliberations and lead us into all truth. Let us never forget that we need the grace and help of God to make us wise, as well as to make us good, and while we endeavor to do our utmost for the evangelization of that portion of the world which falls to our share, let us determine only to follow where the spirit of God should lead. Therefore, my beloved brethren, be ye steadfast, immovable, always abounding in the work of the Lord for as much as ye know that your labor is not in vain in the Lord.

Rev. H. W. NYE begged respectfully to appeal to the House against this ruling. The ruling of the Bishop was sustained.

A discussion ensued, and it was decided that the revised list of grants contained in the report before the House shall be the basis upon which the Executive Committee shall act; but that grants made to Missions may in special cases be reconsidered when sufficient grounds for reconsideration exist.

Mr. BRYDGES' motion was then put and *carried*.

The eleven receiving the highest number of votes shall be the delegates, and the next six highest following in order shall be substitutes to take, in the order of their election, the places of any delegates unable to attend through sickness or any other cause. The delegates and substitutes elected shall remain in office till their successors are chosen.

CANON ON SUPERANNUATION.

1. Each clergyman shall pay an annual fee of \$5.00, and also take up an annual collection in aid of the Fund in each church and station within his charge.
2. Any clergyman may, for the time he has been in the Diocese, pay up all arrears at the rate of \$5.00 a year from 1870, when the Fund was established, and such payment of arrears shall be treated as part of the payments required under the next clause.
3. No clergyman shall be eligible for superannuation until after ten years' active service in the Diocese, and until he has paid his annual subscription for ten consecutive years, and also taken up a collection in aid of the Fund every year after the passing of this canon.
4. Each clergyman having complied with the above, upon being superannuated, shall receive a grant of \$300 per annum, and, in addition thereto, \$10 per annum for each and every year of active service in the Diocese above ten years; but in no case shall the allowance exceed in the aggregate \$400 per annum.
5. Until the Fund shall have an income of \$1,200 a year, it shall be allowed to accumulate untouched.
6. That in case of the superannuation of any clergyman, the amount of grant payable under section 4 shall be paid, as far as necessary, from the surplus interest of the Clergy Trust Fund presently applied to the Mission Fund, the balance of said interest at the end of the year being given to the Mission Fund as heretofore.
7. Any clergyman satisfying the Executive Committee that he is incapable of, or being reported by the Lord Bishop of the Diocese as unfit for full duty in the Diocese, shall be entitled to superannuation, and to payment of a yearly allowance as hereinbefore provided.
8. That the Resolution passed at the 17th Session of Synod (p. 808) be rescinded, as also all previous canons on the Superannuation Fund which conflict with these rules.

Moved by Mr. BRYDGES, seconded by Mr. L. H. DAVIDSON:

That the Clergymen now in the Diocese be notified that all who do not become subscribers to the Superannuation Fund by the 1st January next cannot be allowed to rank on the Fund.

That the Bishop be requested to make it a condition with all Clergymen he may hereafter appoint that they must become subscribers to the Fund on assuming their charge, or they will forfeit all claim upon it.—*Carried.*

In reply to the questions put by Mr. L. H. Davidson, I beg to make the following report:

I. The resolutions relating to the title and dignity of Metropolitan of Canada, referred to in the inquiry, were communicated by me, "to each of the Bishops of the Upper House of the Provincial Synod, and to the Lower House through its Secretary," in accordance with the resolution of this Synod adopted at its 21st Annual Session.

II. The only official communications which I have received in reply were the acknowledgments of receipt of the resolutions by the Lord Bishop of Fredericton, and by the Clerical Secretary of the Lower House of the Provincial Synod.

Mr. L. H. DAVIDSON then moved, seconded by Canon BALDWIN:

That in the absence of any such communication, the Delegates appointed by this House to attend said Provincial Synod be requested to meet, draw up and present, as early as possible during the present Session of this Synod, a written Report, first, of the action taken by them in said Provincial Synod, regarding the claims of the Diocese of Montreal touching the Metropolitan title and dignity, and, secondly, of the proceedings of said Provincial Synod in reference thereto.—*Carried.*

That in view of the continued open use by another than the Lord Bishop of the Diocese of Montreal of the title of "Metropolitan of Canada," a Committee be appointed to take such action as may be necessary to establish and maintain the rights of the Diocese, and of its Bishop in the premises.

Rev. J. PHILIP DuMOULIN moved, seconded by Rev. Dr. SULLIVAN :

That in future Sessions of this Synod, the third day of Synod be set apart for the consideration of our missionary work in its several departments, Diocesan, Domestic and Foreign.—*Carried.*

Moved by Mr. BRYDGES, seconded by Archdeacon LINDSAY :

That it be an instruction to the Treasurer that all sums at the credit of the Mission Fund at the end of each fiscal year beyond \$2,000 be carried to the Sustentation Fund, and invested in the usual way.—*Carried.*

Moved by Mr. BRYDGES, seconded by Rev. Canon Baldwin :

That, with reference to that portion of the Bishop's charge relating to the great importance of increasing the Sustentation Fund, especially in view of the reductions made in the grant by the S.P.G. and the falling rate of interest on investments, his Lordship be requested to name a Committee to act with the Bishop in an earnest and persistent effort to largely add to the present amount of the Sustentation Fund.—*Carried.*

That the Bishop be requested to appoint a Corresponding Committee to act in concert with similar Committees to be appointed in all the other Dioceses.—*Carried.*

In accordance with the request contained in this resolution, the Bishop named Rev. S. Belcher (Convener), J. F. Renaud, W. L. Mills, the Chancellor, Mr. C. Garth and Mr. James Hutton.

Mr. BRYDGES moved, seconded by Rev. Dr. SULLIVAN :

That the Synod confirm the action of the Bishop in the appointment of this Committee as a Corresponding Committee for the Diocese of Montreal to act in concert with the Central Board of Domestic Missions.—*Carried.*

That the Endowment Committee be requested to inquire into and to report on the sale of any church property, and on the change in the application of any funds given or bequeathed for special objects ; 2nd. The Committee appointed to draft an address to the Venerable S. P. G., in recognition of the great obligations of this Diocese to the same, beg leave respectfully to present the following.

Address to the Venerable Society for the Propagation of the Gospel in Foreign Parts, from the Diocese of Montreal in Synod Assembled.

1. That, in reviewing the history of the Church in this Dominion from its inception to the present time, and especially in reviewing the history of the Diocese since its separation in 1850 from the Diocese of Quebec, this Synod desires to express, and to put upon record, its deep sense of gratitude to the Venerable Society for the Propagation of the Gospel for the pious devotion and unrestricted generosity which not only planted the Church in this Dominion, but has continued to assist it during the whole course of its history.
2. That this Synod thankfully recognises the faithfulness which the Venerable Society has always manifested towards the servants of the Cross whom it has sent forth as Missionaries in this land.
3. That the Christian benevolence of the Society, in largely contributing to the erection of churches, which have become centres of light, truth and spiritual influence throughout our land, has placed this Diocese and the Church in Canada under great and lasting obligation.
4. That the Synod, holding in remembrance the unceasing concern of the Society for the perpetuity of the work of the Church in the inception of endowments, both Episcopal and Parochial, acknowledges the wisdom and generosity by which the stability of the Diocesan institutions have been thus in a great measure assured.
5. That this Synod cherishes the hope that the Divine favour, accorded to the Church in our midst while under the nursing care of the Venerable Society, may be continued, and that the work of the Church may be prospered and blessed until we can in our turn strengthen the agencies for the evangelization of the world, and take our part with the Venerable Society in extending the Gospel in Foreign lands.
6. That while a gradual diminution of the aid extended to our Missions may be required by the pressing demands of other parts of the Mission field, this Synod will always continue to take the warmest interest in the vast and Christ-like efforts for the salvation of souls carried on by the Venerable Society throughout the world.

REPORT OF THE EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE.

The Executive Committee beg to make the following Report of their proceedings during the year 1880-81 to the Synod of the Diocese of Montreal, at its twenty-second annual meeting in Montreal on 21st June, 1881.

MEETINGS.

The stated meetings were held in November, February and May; and special meetings on 17th June, 6th September, and 9th June instant.

GRANTS.

The following resolution was adopted, That in future no application for a grant for past services shall be entertained unless the Bishop report that he had made arrangements beforehand, and a special sum had been agreed upon.

North Shefford and Warden.—These two places have been formed into one mission with a grant of \$400; the separate grants to North Shefford and Warden being abolished.

Upton and Roxton Falls.—The grant of \$50 to Upton has been changed to \$100 to Upton and Roxton Falls, the missionary giving services in both places.

By these changes a saving of \$300 has been effected.

Of the grants made at last Synod, the following have not been drawn upon, or have been but partially drawn upon, owing to the parishes being vacant; Chelsea and Templeton, Hemmingford, Huntingdon, Thorne. The sums not called for amount to \$700.

It will be seen from the Treasurer's statement that this fund which commenced with a balance in hand of \$2,033.47, closes with \$4,012.16 to its credit.

A reduction of £200 has been made in the grant from the S. P. G. to this Diocese, the grant for the year 1881 being £1,000 sterling. Notice has been received that a further reduction of £200 is made for the year 1882, from £1000 to £800, which latter "sum will cover the amounts at present "received by Messrs. Anderson, Johnston, Lonsdell, Pyke, Jones, Sutton "and Young, who were appointed prior to November, 1849, and the pensions "of Messrs. Johnson and Whitten and Mrs. Abbott, and on the death of "any of the recipients above named, the grant to the Diocese will *pro tanto* "be diminished."

The sum received since last Synod, £1,150, amounted to \$5,524.09, of which \$4,675.40 has been paid to the pensioners and the clergy on the privileged list, leaving a balance of \$848.69 which has been paid to missionaries, forming part of the grants from the Mission Fund.

Two of the retired clergymen whose names were on the list of pensioners of the S. P. G. have died since the last meeting of Synod, viz., Rev. W. Brethour on 23rd January, and Rev. Thomas Johnson on the 24th March.

A communication was received from the S. P. G. on the subject of an Immigrant Chaplain, and was referred for consideration to a committee composed of the Bishop, Rev. R. Lindsay, Canon Baldwin, Messrs. L. H. Davidson, and F. Wolferstan Thomas.

It was resolved: That the foregoing grants, amounting to a total of \$11,700, be recommended for the ensuing year. That, in accordance with the report adopted last session, page 162, the whole of the grants will require to be re-considered next year, and that all missions be informed of this necessity; and that it will be proposed that certain missions which are capable of self-support must be reduced annually by a certain percentage until self-support is reached.

It was resolved: That the following petition regarding the appointment of a city missionary be referred to the Synod:

TO THE EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE OF THE SYNOD OF MONTREAL.

This petition seeks for a grant of \$400 to supplement a like amount offered by the congregations of the city churches for the support of a city missionary. His duties have much to do with country work, as well as extra parochial work in the city. Sometimes families, sometimes lads and girls seeking employment come from the country. They move about frequently before they settle—they are lost sight of by the parochial organizations, and, for the want of some one specially appointed to look after them, are greatly lost to the Church. Young men come in from the country to McGill College who ought to be cared for.

Then there are the hospitals and the mission work on the roads leading from the city, two of which have been provided for by St. George's or St. James. There is the Longue Pointe Institution—the prisoners leaving the jails—men working Sundays at the railway stations, the fire stations, immigrants, sailors.

It is a larger work than any one man can do. If commenced it will probably work itself out in awakening an interest which at present does not exist because the work is not known.

The Ven. Archdeacon Lindsay, Rev. G. C. Robinson, and Mr. L. H. Davidson were named a Committee to consider and report upon the system of paying missionaries' stipends, which is called "the Quebec plan." They made the following report, which was received and ordered to be included in the report of the Executive Committee to the Synod, with a recommendation for its careful consideration by that body at the earliest possible period of its session.

REPORT.

The Sub-Committee of the Executive Committee, consisting of the Venerable Archdeacon Lindsay, the Rev. Geo. C. Robinson, Rural Dean of St. Andrews and Leo H. Davidson, Esq., appointed to consider and report upon the Quebec Plan, beg to report as follows :

That, in so far as they can ascertain, the principles of the Plan adopted in the Diocese of Quebec for raising funds for the payment of the stipends of the Clergy and for distribution of trust monies under the control of the Church Society or of the Synod for like purpose are these :

I. A *fixed contribution* for each parish or mission towards a general fund from which the stipends of the Clergymen are paid, such contribution payable to the Treasurer of the Diocese.

II. The amount of such contribution determinable and determined (a) on the occurrence of a vacancy in the parish or mission, (b) at the expiration of a period of three years, (c) or at other time by request of the Lord Bishop of the Diocese or of the Churchwardens.

III. A fixed income for the Clergy payable from the General Fund through the Board, and of like amounts to all wherever serving of like standing, in orders and term of service. (In the Diocese of Quebec, Clergymen of twenty-five years service and upward in the Diocese, at least \$750; fourteen years, and less than twenty-five years, \$700; over five years, and under fourteen years, \$650; under five years, \$600. Prior to 1873 a difference would seem to have been made between Deacons and Priests as to stipend, the former receiving \$400 for the first year of ministry, \$500 for the next four years and \$600 thereafter, but in 1873 the term "Clergymen" was used without distinction of *Orders*, the scale firstly mentioned being fixed.)

IV. Investigation into the causes of non-fulfilment of agreement by any parish or mission, and power to take such action as may be necessary even to withdrawal of Clergymen.

V. The appointment by the Synod and Church Society of a Diocesan Board of Missions for carrying out the scheme. (This Board is fairly enough represented by the Executive Committee of the Diocese of Montreal.)

Although this plan is known in the Diocese under the title "Quebec Plan," your Committee find that it is in operation in all essential particulars in the Dioceses of Toronto, Huron, Niagara and Fredericton; and it may be in others, and they also find that it was to all intents and purposes adopted by this Diocese in 1870 (see 11th Synod Reports, pp. 30, 31 and 40) and has been re-affirmed in different particulars separately on several oc-

casions since (e. g. 16 Syn. p. 642; 17 Syn. p. 801, p. 794), as well by the Synod itself as by the several Deaneries.

In view of these facts, and of the undoubted desirability of the Plan itself, if for no other reasons at least for those expressed in the resolutions of the Synods of Toronto and Huron, your Committee cannot refrain from expressing astonishment that the plan has not been put into operation here. The resolutions referred to affirm the desirability of the Plan *inter alia*, in order "to relieve the missionary from the unpleasant, invidious and derogatory task of pleading before his people for his own individual remuneration, and yet make it his duty and interest to urge the claims of the Mission Fund on them"; and actual use would seem to have proved the correctness of the principles affirmed.

It may be that the absence of any detailed provisions in regard to the manner of putting into effect and carrying out the plan has prevented its adoption, even though allowed by resolution of Synod in the case of any parish or mission choosing to act upon it. Your Committee, convinced of the advantages which would accrue from the enforcement of this plan throughout the Diocese in the case of parishes or missions receiving aid from the Executive Committee, would submit the following draft of a Canon for the purpose.

CANON.

I. The stipends of such of the Clergy of the Diocese as are laboring in parishes or missions receiving aid from the funds of the Diocese shall not be less than the following per annum:

For Deacons, other than permanent Deacons, \$500.

For Priests under 5 years service in the Diocese, \$600.

For Priests over 5 years and under 10 years, \$700.

For Priests over 10 years \$800, provided that no congregation enjoying the exclusive services of a Clergyman shall be entitled to receive any grant from the Funds of the Diocese towards the support of such Clergyman, except upon special recommendation of the Lord Bishop of the Diocese and for special cause, the sufficiency of which shall be determined by the Executive Committee; and (2) that no parish or mission which is considered and declared by said Executive Committee to be able to pay its Clergyman the stipend due him according to the above scale, and to provide him with a suitable residence or its equivalent, shall receive any such grant.

II. The said stipends shall be paid quarterly, reckoning from the by the Treasurer of the Synod to the said Clergy out of the fund known as the "Mission Fund" of the Diocese, augmented by the special contri

butions from each parish or mission towards the support of its Clergyman, fixed and determined and payable as hereinafter provided: which contribution shall be in addition to, and independent of, the collections and subscriptions ordered by the Synod to be taken up and made in all and every mission, parish or rectory in the Diocese.

III. All appointments to any mission or parish receiving aid from the Executive Committee shall be made by the Lord Bishop of the Diocese; but no such appointment shall be made nor grant be given by said Committee until the contribution payable by the mission or parish shall have been fixed, and an agreement for the payment thereof have been made as hereinafter provided.

IV. There shall be appointed annually by the Lord Bishop of the Diocese from the members of the Executive Committee, and immediately after the annual meeting of Synod, six laymen, who with the Archdeacons of the Diocese and the Rural Deans shall form a Committee on Missions.

V. Before any grant is made by the Executive Committee towards the payment of any stipend, as hereinbefore provided, it shall be the duty of said Committee on Missions, on notification from said Executive Committee, to communicate with and visit, wherever practicable, each parish and mission in order to examine into and ascertain its resources and liabilities, and to confer and arrange with the local authorities as to the amount to be contributed per annum by said parish or mission towards the stipend of the Clergyman; and said Committee shall report to the Lord Bishop of the Diocese within ten days after their visit, or after such conference and arrangement, the result of their enquiries, the arrangement proposed, and the action they recommend; which said report, with such remarks thereon as the Lord Bishop may see fit to make, shall be laid before the Executive Committee at its next ensuing meeting; when said Executive Committee shall decide as to the amount which it is able and willing to grant towards said stipend.

VI. When the several congregations in any parish or mission shall have agreed with the Executive Committee, through the Committee on Missions, upon the amount which they will severally contribute towards the stipend of their Clergyman, over and above the regular contributions to the Mission Fund, and upon the services to be maintained by him, under the direction of the Bishop, and have recorded said engagement by resolution passed in vestry (a certified copy of which shall forthwith be sent to the Secretary of the Executive Committee), and said Executive Committee have accepted the engagement and made the grant, it shall be the duty of the churchwardens of said parish, mission or congregation to remit such contribution in equal quarterly payments to the Treasurer of Synod, to form part of the General Mission Fund.

VII. In case of the payment of any portion of the contribution promised by said parish, mission or congregation directly to its Clergyman in produce or "kind," the same shall be taken and estimated at the lowest market rate, and shall be evidenced by the receipt of the Clergyman, which receipt may be taken by the Treasurer as cash, and be deducted from the quarterly payment to such Clergyman.

VIII. In case any congregation, parish or mission fails to make up and pay regularly, as hereinbefore provided, the contribution agreed upon towards the Clergyman's stipend, then on the requisition of the Executive Committee, or of the Lord Bishop of the Diocese, the said Committee on Missions shall revisit the defaulting congregation, parish or mission, and enquire into the causes of such default, and endeavour to induce the people to raise and pay the contribution promised; and it shall be the duty of the Clergyman and of the Churchwardens of such congregation, parish or mission in default to appear before the said Committee on notice, and such evidence as to the facts of the case as they or any of them see fit to adduce shall be heard and taken by said Committee, and shall be reported with their opinion on the merits of the case to the Lord Bishop forthwith in completion of the enquiry; and the Bishop shall transmit the same to the Executive Committee with his report thereon; and said Executive Committee shall then decide finally.

IX. Whenever the Executive Committee find that the default is attributable to the people of the parish or mission, it shall be the duty of said Committee to insist upon payment from said parish or mission, and in the event of their declining or failing to pay for a period of three months after such final decision of the Committee has been notified to them, the Clergyman shall, on requisition by said Committee, be removed by the Lord Bishop to another parish or mission; or said Committee may grant said Clergyman from the Mission Fund a sum not exceeding three months salary to enable him to remove to another Diocese, and in every such case no Clergyman shall be sent to said defaulting mission or parish, nor any grant be made thereto, until every mission and parish fulfilling its agreements shall have been supplied; nor until the said defaulting parish or mission shall have paid all arrears, and also the amount of any grant made as aforesaid, and the expenses of said enquiry.

X. Whenever the Executive Committee find that the fault is in the Clergyman, they shall so report to the Lord Bishop, requesting that three months notice of removal be given to such Clergyman, and at the expiration of said period his connection with said parish or mission shall cease; and if no other field of labor in the Diocese can be found for him, he shall cease to receive any grant from the funds of the Diocese. And in such case the Executive Committee may aid in appointing another Clergyman to said parish or mission, upon such terms as they may see fit to adopt.

XI. No Clergyman or layman shall act on said Committee on Missions on any such enquiry when his own mission forms the subject of enquiry; but the Clergyman may recuse any of said Committee for cause shown, to the satisfaction of the Lord Bishop, who shall then appoint another in the place of the one so recused.

XII. The actual necessary expenses of said Committee incurred in carrying out the provisions of this canon may be paid by the Treasurer out of the General Mission Fund of the Diocese.

AUDITOR.

In accordance with a resolution of the last Synod, p. 154, the services of Mr. A. H. Plimsoll, professional accountant, were engaged, to audit the accounts. Mr. Plimsoll has made an examination of the accounts of the various funds of the Synod every quarter, and presented reports certifying to their correctness.

SUSTENTATION FUND.

This fund now amounts to \$55,569.28. The Revenue from it last year was \$3,835.51; from which \$300.00, charged as proportion of expenses, has been deducted, and the balance, \$3,535.51, has been credited to the Mission Fund.

In addition to the above capital sum, the Treasurer has the care of Parochial Endowment Funds as follows:

The Treasurer reported at the meeting in February that the rate of interest to be obtained on first-class mortgages is much lower than it was last year, six per cent. being considered a good rate, and it was resolved, That the Treasurer be authorized to pay on Local Endowment Funds interest half yearly at the rate of six and a half per cent. per annum, until further notice, and that he be requested to notify all persons concerned that this rate will be paid from 1st July next.

The Secretary submitted a report on Endowments and Trusts, compiled from reports received from the several parishes in accordance with the canon adopted by last Synod, p. 145. The document was referred to a Committee, by whom the following report was made.

The sub-committee appointed at the last meeting of the Executive Committee to examine the reports sent in with reference to the endowments in the several parishes and missions in the Diocese beg to make the following report :

The returns referred to were called for in consequence of the following canon (page 145), passed at the last meeting of the Synod, viz. :

"It shall be the duty of every Rector or other Incumbent in this Diocese to furnish to the Executive Committee, on or before the first day of November in each and every year, a true, faithful, and exact statement, in detail, signed by such Rector or Incumbent, of any and all Endowments and Trusts held in favor of the parish or mission of such Rector or Incumbent, or in favor of any particular church or chapel, or for the general purposes of the Church of England and Ireland within such parish or mission, and of the mode in which each such endowment is invested, and of its exact condition at the time such statement is furnished."

The returns are not in all cases as complete and full as is desirable, and three parishes have not made any return at all, viz., Granby, Grenville and St. John the Evangelist.

From the returns that have come in the Committee find the following facts :

1. There is a large amount of land and buildings, the latter mainly consisting of churches, parsonages, school houses, &c., &c., and the Committee think it very important that a correct statement of all such property in each parish or mission should be made out and recorded in a book to be called the "Estate Book," and regularly kept in the Synod office of the Diocese.

That such statement should shew in whom the property is legally vested, and a description of the title under which it is held. It is also very important that all these titles should be carefully examined, and a report made upon each by some competent person appointed to perform such duty.

2. The Committee find that a part of the Endowment Funds set out in the returns is reported to consist of promissory notes in the following parishes :

No information is given as to the promissors for these notes, whether they are secured or not, when they fall due, how long they have been running, what rate of interest they carry, or whether the interest is regularly paid.

Looking to the financial condition of the country during the last few years, it is considered by the Committee of the greatest importance that all these mortgages should be carefully examined and the titles to the properties mortgaged enquired into. It ought to be ascertained when these mortgages become due, what interest they carry, whether it is regularly paid, and in fact that they should be thoroughly looked into and reported upon by a competent person appointed for that purpose.

The aggregate amount of these mortgages is considerable, and it is very important that they should be carefully investigated.

Investments in Government debentures and in Montreal Corporation bonds are considered to be satisfactory, but it cannot be looked upon as right to invest trust funds for Church purposes in banks or any similar corporate bodies. The Church by such a process becomes in fact a partner

n commercial or industrial undertakings, and runs the risks incident to all such matters. The Committee are of opinion that all such investments should be sold out, which can now be done on satisfactory terms, and the proceeds invested in sound mortgages on real estate, or in Government Debentures, or approved Municipal Bonds.

5. It further appears that there are the following bequests, interest on which is paid but the principal has never been received, viz :

CLERGY TRUST FUND.

The Revenue from this fund for the year was \$4,002.52, of which \$2,092.68 was paid to the Clergymen who have a claim on the fund, \$300 charged as proportion of expenses, and the balance \$1,509.84 has been credited to the Mission Fund.

WIDOWS AND ORPHANS FUND.

The collections and subscriptions to this fund for the year ending 31st May, 1881, were \$919.40. In the previous year they amounted to \$656.70, thus showing an increase of \$262.70 last year.

The revenue amounted to \$4,524.10, of which \$1,474.25 has been paid to annuitants; \$300.00 proportion of expenses, and the balance added to the capital account. This fund now amounts to \$56,239.57.

SUPERANNUATION FUND.

The following resolution was adopted at the meeting in June, 1880, and was communicated to all the Clergy by the Bishop :

" That the Clergy be called upon seriously to consider the position of the Superannuation Fund, and be urged most strongly to become subscribers to, and to take up collections for, this Fund.

" That their attention is directed to the canon adopted by the late Synod which secures to the Clergy the benefits of this Fund, but which cannot be made perfectly satisfactory until fully supported by the Clergy annually subscribing themselves and taking up collections as provided for in the canon.

The Treasurer's accounts show that this fund now amounts to \$4,969.45, an addition of \$778.49, made up as follows: clerical subscriptions, \$222; collections in the various churches, \$509.59; interest on capital invested, \$174.63, less \$127.73 proportion of expenses.

Applications for superannuation allowances were received from Rev. J. C. Davidson and Rev. W. C. Merrick. The applications were referred to the Committee on Superannuation, who made report at the meeting held on 9th November. It was then resolved that a grant of \$400 a year be made

At the February meeting, Archdeacon Lindsay made a report of a meeting, which, at the request of the Bishop and this Committee, he had with the vestry of the parish of Berthier, whereupon the following resolution was adopted; That, in view of the application of the Rev. W. C. Merrick of Berthier for superannuation, and of the action of the vestry of Berthier, communicated to the Committee this day, and of the resolution passed by this Committee fixing the general rate of interest on investments at six and a half per cent., it be resolved that six and a half per cent. interest be paid to the said parish on the amount of their Endowment Fund now in the hands of the Treasurer, to wit: \$3,140, and also that an additional sum be voted year by year sufficient to make up the interest on said sum to seven per cent. per annum; this arrangement to hold during the lifetime of Rev. W. C. Merrick, in place of his superannuation.

No. 1 *The Clergy Trust Fund*, shows that \$3,902.52 has been received for interest, \$2,092.68 paid to the several clergymen ranking on this Fund, \$300 paid as proportion of expenses, and the balance of \$1,509.84 at its credit has been transferred to the Mission Fund. The Capital of this Fund is now \$56,500.

The City Churches have paid in \$5,453.59, or \$421.81 more than the previous year.

The Country Churches have paid in \$2,190.15, or \$243.63 more than the previous year.

The drafts on the S. P. G. amounted to \$5,524.09, being \$974.67 less than for the previous year.

This grant is reduced to £1,000 stg. per annum. The special charges upon it now amount to \$4,675.40 per annum.

The interest received from the Sustentation Fund was \$13,535.51, or \$44.87 less than the previous year, and the interest from the Clergy Trust Fund was \$1,509.84, or \$113.85 less than the previous year.

Clergymen's stipends amounted to \$11,035.03, against \$10,517.88 for the previous year, being \$517.15 more than for the previous year.

Several missions have been vacant during the year.

No. 8, Episcopal Endowment Fund. A total amount of \$87,246 is invested on this account, and there is \$3,536.23 on hand waiting to be invested.

I think it will be safe to appropriate the sum of \$11,000 for Clergy-
men's stipends during the current year.

The S. P. G. grant continues steadily to diminish, and will only be
continued so long as the special payments now paid out of it continue to
be required.

As I have already said, the rate of interest is steadily declining, and all
our investments will before long be down to not exceeding 6 per cent. per
annum, with a prospect, if the present plethora of money all over the world
lasts, of a still further reduction in the rate of interest to be received.

I therefore advise great caution in expenditure, and a careful avoidance
of any outlay which may again lead us into the financial difficulties from
which we have now so happily emerged.

It is satisfactory to be able to report that the funds under the control of
the Synod have passed through the bad hard times without any loss so
far, and that there is every reasonable certainty that the different sums
invested are perfectly secure. In only two instances has it been necessary
to resort to legal proceedings. In one the full amount due was recovered.
In the other the matter is not yet concluded, but it is possible there may
be a small loss upon it.

REPORT OF THE COMMITTEE ON THE MONTREAL DIOCESAN
LIBRARY.

To the Synod of the Diocese of Montreal:

The Committee appointed in reference to the Library of the Diocese beg to report as follows:

Your Committee met immediately after their appointment on 9th November, 1880, and have since held four meetings; they found that although the Library contained a large number of volumes, there was no regular Catalogue thereof; that the Rules and Regulations which had formerly been in force had become a dead letter, and that in fact only one printed copy of such Catalogue and Rules could be found; that little use was made by either Clergy or Laity of the Library, and that nothing like a regular subscription thereto, or of a membership therein, existed.

Your Committee were therefore obliged to enter upon a complete re-organization: they prepared new Rules and Regulations for Membership and for the use of the Library, and the same are herewith submitted; through the ready assistance of the Rev. J. Empson, Secretary of Synod, they secured the rearrangement and classification of the books on hand, and a new catalogue thereof, of which they have had a number of printed copies prepared for the use of those who may desire to become members; they issued a circular in the month of January last calling attention to the existence of the Library, and to the effort which was being made to render it more useful, and requesting subscriptions as members, and co-operation and assistance in the way of donations of money or books.

A Managing Committee was named, consisting of the Revs. Canons Norman and Henderson, and J. Empson, the latter being also appointed Secretary Treasurer of the Library Committee.

Your Committee are pleased to be able to report that their efforts have already been to some extent successful. There are now seventeen subscribers to the Library who have paid the required annual subscription of \$1.00, but it is hoped that the number will be largely increased before the present meeting of Synod closes as well by Clerical as by Lay subscriptions.

They have also received donations in cash from Charles Gibb, Esq., of fifty dollars, to be applied in the purchase of such new books as might be considered most important for immediate use, and from Geo. Drummond, Esq., through the Rev Canon Norman, of \$25. The following books have also been donated to the Library:—

A "Suggestion Book" has been opened by the Librarian in which the Subscribers may enter the titles of books which they consider desirable, and which being approved by the Committee will be procured as opportunity offers.

ABSTRACT OF EDUCATIONAL REPORT.

DEANERY OF HOHELAGA.

Two instances in which buildings have been erected for purposes of Church education. One of these is in connection with the Church of St. John the Evangelist; the other is at Berthier, where a building and land, erected and acquired for the purposes of a Church school, were transferred by deed to the then Bishop of Montreal in 1869. Building since enlarged. Both schools are in operation. Kildare and De Ramsay receive grants from Colonial Church and School Society.

The Principal of the Montreal Diocesan Theological College reports that the Endowment Fund is now \$2,800. A commodious building on Dorchester street has been purchased by A. F. Gault, Esq., for presentation to the College on certain conditions, which it is hoped may be fulfilled.

DEANERY OF ST. ANDREWS.

Two schools to which grants are made by Colonial Church and School Society, one in Mission of Grenville and the other at Lakefield.

DEANERY OF IBERVILLE.

No Church schools, except Sunday schools.

DEANERY OF BEDFORD.

Christieville.—By bequest of Major Christie a school building was erected and \$200 bequeathed by the same person for maintenance of school. School in active operation.

Nelsonville.—Building erected by subscription, and acre of land deeded to the Church on condition that school be kept up. If it be closed for space of six consecutive months the property would revert to the donors. School in operations.

Dunham.—Ladies College, which has been closed for some little time, will be re-opened in September, 1881.

West Farnham.—Building erected by subscription for purposes of Church education. Land also bought for same purpose. Has been closed, but will probably be re-opened shortly.

St. Johns, P.Q.—The High School Buildings are Church property, but the school was converted by Act of Parliament into a High School proper, though under control of the Church corporation for the time being.

Bolton.—A Church school recently established by Rev. F. H. Clayton. No land or building yet acquired.

Granby.—\$320.20 were bequeathed by Mr. John Wetherbee twenty-five years ago for the endowment of a Church school. The sum is now being allowed to accumulate.

St. Armand East.—Building erected for school purposes, but school not in operation.

At the meeting of the Provincial Synod last September the following resolution was adopted :

1. That two boards of missions be constituted : (a) a Board of Foreign Missions, (b) a Board of Domestic Missions.

2. That the functions of the Board of Foreign Missions be to organize for the collection of funds throughout the ecclesiastical Province in aid of Missions to the heathen outside of the Dominion ; that the functions of the Board of Domestic Missions be to organize for the collection and administration of funds for the support of the Church in the North West, including Algoma and other parts of the Dominion where need may be.

3. That there be a Central Board of Foreign and also a Central Board of Domestic Missions with corresponding Committees in the several Dioceses.

The Central Board of Foreign Missions has issued a Circular to all the corresponding Committees which your Committee has sent into all the parishes and missions of the Diocese. The Central Board recommends to all India as the sphere of its work.

India with its vast population of over 200,000,000 belongs to our Empire. They are our fellow-subjects. In India our missions are protected. In India all the great heathen religions of the world are largely represented. The great success which has been granted to our missions in India demands much increased help.

The Central Board recommends that all the contributions for Foreign Missions should be sent through it direct to India, from which reports would be received and circulated through the Dioceses, and that as soon as the Church in Canada is able it should take some unoccupied portion of the heathen world where the Banner of the Cross shall be planted by a Bishop and Missionary Clergy maintained exclusively by the Church of England in Canada.

The Committee feels that this movement of the Provincial Synod is an evidence of the increasing interest of the Canadian Church in the great mission field of the world, and is a cause for our thankfulness.

The Committee would recommend to the Synod to concur in the recommendations of the Central Committee on Foreign Missions.

REPORT OF COMMITTEE ON WORKS OF MERCY.

The Committee on Works of Mercy have to report to the Synod upon three subjects: (1) The Jails; (2) Immigrants; (3) City Missionary.

(1) Jails. The Committee has communicated with the clergy in whose missions or parishes there are jails, and also with the Rev. J. D. Borthwick, Chaplain of the Montreal jail, and the Rev. J. Allan, Chaplain of the St. Vincent de Paul Penitentiary. In the answers received they say they will give what ministrations they can to members of our church, and inform the clergymen of their parishes or missions when the prisoners are coming out. The great evil of our jail system is the want of classification. This is particularly the case with the jail in Montreal. Young persons committed for a first offence, it may be a very trivial offence, are in continued intercourse with those who have led a long course of crime. The result of such cannot but be evil. (The Committee have prepared a resolution to be submitted to the Synod, urging upon the Government the importance of correcting this evil).

(2) Immigrants. The Committee feels that this subject has received a very important advance by the S. P. G. appointing a very efficient emigrant chaplain at Liverpool.

That chaplain asks for the appointment of an agent at Quebec, clerical or lay, who thoroughly understands the geography of the dioceses and missions both of Canada and the Western States, who would travel with the immigrants on their arrival at Quebec, in order to give them letters to the nearest clergyman to the places where they were going, and to give them advice and afterwards to write to the Clergy of those places about them. Nearly one-half the immigrants that come to Quebec go to the Western States. A larger number of immigrants come to this city than the Committee expected to find. They are directed by the immigrant agent to different parts of the Diocese; over 1,000 came to Montreal last year. They were nearly all Protestants from the rural parts of England. In all probability more than one-half were members of our Church, and yet, if the Clergy of the Diocese were asked how many of this number they knew, the Committee feel that it would be but very few. This applies with much greater force to cities like Toronto, Hamilton and London, as much larger numbers stay there. Until the chief agent is appointed at Quebec it is of no use to appoint agents in such cities, because they cannot be informed when or where immigrants will arrive.

The S. P. G. requested the Bishop of Quebec to appoint a chaplain at Quebec for this purpose. The salary of £100 sterling was to be paid in equal proportions from the grant to the two Dioceses. This salary is utterly inadequate, as there is no other source of income. The immigration begins very early in the year by way of Halifax. The winter months would be needed to perfect the arrangements through Canada, the Western States and in England. The salary should not be less than £300 sterling and expenses. The Committee would, therefore, recommend Synod to

convey to the S. P. G., through the Bishop, its deep sense of the importance of this work.

(3) The appointment of a City Missionary. There is a continued influx of people to the city from the country, especially from missions to the north of the city. Families come, or young men and young women come in seeking employment. They move about often before they find what they are seeking. Our parochial organization cannot follow them. Students come into McGill College. They go from church to church, and often cease going to church at all, and we have no organization which can meet such cases. Then there are the immigrants and the sailors, the hospitals, the fire stations, the railroad stations. Then there is the mission work on the roads leading from the city. Going north, south and west from this city it is some distance before a mission is reached and yet on all these roads members of our Church are settled. By the action of St. George's Church in this respect the parishes of St. Judes and St. Matthias have been formed, and the missions of St. Lambert and Outremont are being planted. In this way St. James the Apostle has planted a mission and built a church at Côte St. Paul, a like work is needed to be done on the other roads. To aid in all these works a City Missionary is needed. The city Clergy have promised \$400 per annum towards it, and a petition is before the Synod to aid it by another \$400, which the Committee hope the Synod will assent to.

In conclusion, there is a movement towards the establishment of a City Charities organization, whose object is not to interfere with existing charitable institutions but so to direct their efforts that, whilst relieving want, they should not foster pauperism.

A most successful work has been done in the City of London, England, of which the Queen is the Patron, and the Bishop of London the President. Thoughtful minds consider how different charities can best carry out their work of helping the poor to help themselves, and the best modes of relieving the varied forms of distress.

These reforms may be summed up under two heads:—

First, The procuring a uniform scheme of Biblical instruction for the use of our Sunday Schools throughout the Diocese, and,

Secondly, The establishment of a Depository in the City of Montreal from which Sunday School Libraries, periodicals and other religious matter may be obtained at cheap and easy rates.

course of Biblical instruction which was an adaptation of the well-known International scheme of lessons to the peculiar wants and necessities of the Church of England.

In this arrangement while all the many advantages of the International scheme were fully secured, the various festivals and sacred seasons in our ecclesiastical year were brought before our scholars in regular sequence. It may be mentioned, also, that in this scheme the catechism was so adjusted to the lessons that it could be fully studied in the course of the year.

As regards the acceptance which this plan met with, your Committee desire to say that they found the difficulties in the way of preparing such a scheme greater than they had at first anticipated, and, as a result of their enforced delay, their scheme was not issued in full time to meet the wants of the coming year—many Clergymen having already supplied themselves from other quarters.

Having now, however, learned by the experience of the past your Committee propose to issue their scheme much earlier this season, and, with some important changes as may further commend it to the notice and acceptance of the Diocese.

Your Committee would urge, for the careful consideration of all, that a uniform plan of Biblical Instruction will ensure the possession of a vast amount of useful literature that would otherwise be lost, while the material help given by such books will not fail to be appreciated alike by teacher and by taught.

As regards the second subject, namely, the formation of a Depository in this city, your Committee have much pleasure in stating that arrangements have now been made with Messrs. Dawson Bros., by which such a Depository will speedily be established, and the benefits proposed be fully secured.

The reason of the delay in the past has been the crowded state of this establishment, which precluded the possibility of further additions to their stock, but now, having taken additional premises, they will be able to proceed with the proposed plan, and your Committee hope before long to be able to send to the various Clergymen of the Diocese a printed statement of the reduced rates at which books for Libraries and periodicals may be obtained, as well as to draw their attention to other benefits the Depository is calculated to convey.

By the amalgamation of Warden with the mission of North Shefford, the cures in this Deanery have been reduced from 29 to 28, since the last report. 12 of these are self-supporting, 1 is aided by the S. P. G., 2 by the Clergy Trust, 1 by the Colonial Church and School Society, and 12 by the Mission Fund; all are provided with resident Clergymen, with the exception of Adamsville, Glen Sutton and Phillipsburg. Adamsville is supplied for the time being by a student of the Diocesan College. Mr. H. D. Bridge is acting as Catechist at Phillipsburg, and is to be appointed to this Rectory on his ordination. For Glen Sutton, a new and important field of Church work, no provision has as yet been made.

been succeeded by Rev. A. A. Allen. Rev. A. Lee has removed from Rougemont, where he acted as assistant to Rev. F. Robinson. Rev. W. B. Longhurst has been appointed to the Rectory of Granby. Rev. G. A. Forneret has resigned the Rectory of Dunham, and is succeeded by Rev. J. Ker, who leaves the mission of Glen Sutton. Rev. L. N. Tucker has removed from Sabrevois, with the Missionary College, over which he presided, to Montreal.

CLERICAL INCOME.

The Parochial Reports show that in 5 rectories, 2 parishes and 3 missions, the Incumbents severally receive over \$600; in 5 rectories, 1 parish and 2 missions, the salary stands exactly at \$600; while in 2 rectories, 1 parish and 6 missions, the incomes are less than \$600—in 2 instances even less than \$500.

ENDOWMENTS.

18 cures have endowments, ranging from \$100 to \$7000, and amounting in all to \$46,400. Christieville is wholly endowed, the income being, by a bequest of the late Major Christie, an annual charge on the revenue of the Local Seignior. The endowments generally exhibit a slow, but gradual increase. We must except, however, that of Clarenceville, which in the Synod Report of 1873 is returned as amounting to \$2,112, but which in the Parochial Report of this year is represented as having no existence, or "invested in the purchase of a Rectory."

CHURCHES.

The church at East Farnham has been completed, and is now in use. The Stewart Memorial Church at Frelighsburg is so far advanced that service is held in the basement. The church at Farnham has been improved by the elevation and re-roofing of the belfry. There is every probability that the church at Mystic will be completed during the present year, a large proportion of the necessary funds have been already subscribed. Work has been commenced on a new church at West Shefford to replace that now existing, which has become unsafe and unsuitable to the present requirements of the parish. Great credit is due the Rectory of Waterloo, for a large reduction made this year in the debt on its beautiful church.

Attention is drawn to the state of the church at Henryville, which is reported as having fallen into a condition of hopeless ruin. It seems desirable that the building should be taken down, and the materials either sold or employed in the erection of a smaller edifice, for which there appears to be some demand.

PARSONAGES.

The parsonage at North Shefford will be completed this year. We are glad to be able to state that a debt of \$530 on the parsonage at Brome Corner has been paid by the efforts of the Congregation.

The church property of the Deanery is very generally covered by insurance; but the reports show that there is no insurance on the churches of St. Thomas, Clarenceville, Milton, Phillipsburg and Sabrevois, nor on the Parsonage at Milton.

MISSION FUND.

Meetings in aid of this Fund have been held with three exceptions, Christieville, Sabrevois, Clarenceville, in all the parishes of the Deanery. The collections at these meetings amounted to \$225.27. In their total contributions, 16 parishes equalled or exceeded, while 12 fell short of the sums apportioned them. As a whole, the Deanery has contributed \$50 less than its assigned proportion of the fund for this year.

On the question being put, "Is the property of the Church in your incumbencies insured?" it was found that there were no insurance at Edwardston, Havelock, Franklin and Ormstown; steps were taken on the spot to see that they should be effected without delay.

The following were the proposed subscriptions to the Mission Fund for 1881-1882. Edwardstown, \$10.00; Franklin, \$20.00; Havelock, \$15; Hemmingford, Hinchinbrooke, Huntingdon and Lacolle were not represented at the meeting; Ormstown, \$20.

1st. Hemmingford and Bogton by the retirement of the Rev. J. C. Davidson from the active work of the ministry. 2nd. Huntingdon and Hinchinbrooke by the removal of the Rev. A. A. Allen to Clarenceville. 3rd. Valleyfield not yet filled.

Returns were made from all the parishes and missions except Huntingdon and Hinchinbrooke.

RECOMMENDATIONS.

(1) That the mission of Hemmingford and Bogton as well as that of Huntingdon and Hinchinbrooke be filled as soon as possible. (2) That this Deanery unanimously recommend the adoption of the Quebec Plan for the collection and payment of the Clergymen's stipends.

RURAL DEANERY OF ST. ANDREWS.

MY LORD,—

The annual meeting of this Deanery was held at Aylmer, June 1st, 1881.

Notwithstanding the large extent of the Deanery, the missions at the extremities being upwards of 150 miles apart, east and west, and one of the Gatineau missions upwards of 50 miles north of the Ottawa river, thirteen Clergymen and five laymen were present, representing fifteen out of the nineteen incumbencies.

No reports were received from three Missions, including that of Chelsea, now vacant more than three years. Reports from some others were incomplete, in some instances from changes during the year, or from the illness of the Clergyman.

The following changes have taken place during the past year: The Rev. W. B. Longhurst resigned the charge of Eardley, and was succeeded by the Rev. A. Lee; the Rev. S. C. Thicke, that of Aylwin, to which the Rev. W. P. Chambers has been appointed.

CHURCHES.

The new St. Paul's, in Shawville, parish of Clarendon, built of stone, and complete in all its furnishings, was freed from debt and duly consecrated to the worship of Almighty God, an ordination being held at the same time.

St. Augustine's, Eardley, another substantial and commodious stone church, and an enduring monument to the zeal of the late Incumbent and the people of Eardley, was opened for divine worship.

A neat and substantial church is far on towards completion in Lachute.

A church is also being built at St. Amédée, an out-station of the mission of Papineauville.

Work is begun on a stone church in Onslow, to replace the present wooden structure.

Funds are being raised towards extensive improvements in Christ Church, Aylmer. The amount now on hand exceeds \$1260. It is proposed to secure the necessary means before beginning work.

PARSONAGES.

A beginning has been made upon a parsonage at North Wakefield, to replace that destroyed by fire in 1879. Substantial improvements have been made upon several others.

INSURANCE.

In every parish or mission from which reports have been received there is insurance on Church property, ranging in amount from \$350 to \$4,300, but whether on church or parsonage is not, in all cases, stated. The total amount of insurance reported is \$35,500.

DEBT.

Six incumbencies report debt, ranging in amount from \$9 to \$13. Total, \$2,465. Seven report arrears due on stipend, from \$15 to \$75.89; as against eight last year, ranging from \$4.50 to \$135.27. Vigorous efforts have evidently been made to clear off arrearages of stipend. It was not too soon, for, with the increased prosperity of the country generally, there has been a material rise in the price of necessaries, and Clergymen on fixed salaries are actually worse off now than in times of depression when prices were low.

STIPENDS.

In two cases only of those dependent on the Mission Fund does the stipend exceed \$700. In two others it is less than \$500 after paying house rent.

The scale of grants to missions was carefully considered. No reduction was thought at present possible without unfairly reducing the stipends of the Clergy.

Contributions to the Mission Fund also engaged the earnest attention of the meeting. Eight reports show an increase from last year; three reports, a slight decrease. From fuller information as to the capabilities of the several incumbencies, the following list was agreed upon as representing what might fairly be expected for the coming year:

A resolution was passed recommending that the name of the Mission heretofore known as Gore be changed to Lakefield.

A discussion of the "Quebec Plan" led to the unanimous adoption of the following resolution:

Resolved,—"That this Deanery again expresses its desire for the adoption (by Synod) of the 'Quebec Plan,' with such provisions as may seem to be needed by circumstances of the Diocese."

The question of the introduction of reading into the missions of a colporteur being that of a Rural Dean be furnished with a copy of the report, and be useful by others for the information of the Clergyman so disposed should be put in circulation by aid of the agency.

There is generally throughout the older missions a feeling of emigration and other causes being opened up, calling for the attention of the Clergyman. Christ died should be careful to debar them from spiritual neglect of Christ's poor within the Gospel Dispensation.

All of which is respectfully

The question of the introduction of Church literature and other suitable reading into the missions of the Deanery was discussed. The employment of a colporteur being thought impracticable, it was suggested that the Rural Dean be furnished with lists of publications recommended, or found useful by others for the information of those desiring it, and that each Clergyman so disposed should place such works on sale, or cause them to be put in circulation by aid of volunteer colporteurs, or some other suitable agency.

There is generally throughout the Deanery quiet, steady progress. Some of the older missions are steadily adding to their strength; others, through emigration and other causes, are not so hopeful. New settlements are being opened up, calling for increased missionary efforts. Souls for whom Christ died should be cared for by his Church. Their poverty should not debar them from spiritual privileges; one of the distinguishing features of the Gospel Dispensation is "to the poor the Gospel is preached." Any neglect of Christ's poor will be visited by Him as a neglect of Himself.
