BROCKVILLE.

On the north shore of the beautiful River St. Lawrence, at the foot of the thousand islands and surrounded by scenery of the most picturesque character, is located the important and thriving town of Brockville. It is situated in the Township of Elizabeth, County of Leeds, and is the capital of the United Counties of Leeds and Grenville. The town is well built, the buildings being mostly of stone or brick, while the streets are straight, of a good width, and, with a few exceptions, cross each other at right angles. The public buildings are numerous, and impress one with the conviction that the community who were instrumental in their construction must have been sufficiently wealthy to have disregarded, to a great extent, the question of cost. During the season of navigation all the steamers plying between Montreal, Kingston, Toronto, and Hamilton stop at Brockville daily. It is also a station on the Grand Trunk Railway, and the terminus of the Brockville and Ottawa Railway, by which it is connected with Perth and the back country generally.

Brockville is a port of entry, and the amount of trade carried on there is shown by the following figures. The exports for the year ending June 30th, 1865, amounted to \$180,658, and the imports for the same period were of the value of \$268,790, while the duties collected were \$10,973. For the half-year ending December 31st, 1865, the first mentioned amounted to \$414,130; the second to \$112,114; and the last to \$3,096.73. The facilities which the town possesses for the importation of merchandise gives its business men a decided advantage, and enables them to sell goods at a very low figure. Among the principal merchants of the place are the following:—

George Reid, importer and wholesale and retail dealer in Hardware. Mr. Reid is the only merchant in Brockville who deals exclusively in this class of goods, and his stock is the largest of any in this section of the country. He is enabled, therefore, to offer superior inducements to country buyers.

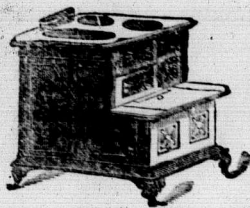

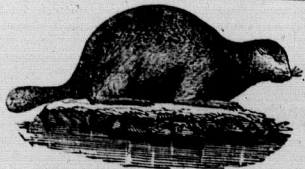

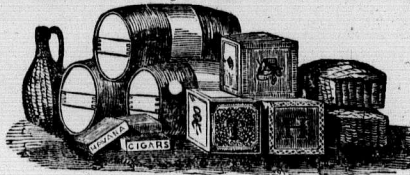

## PERTH.

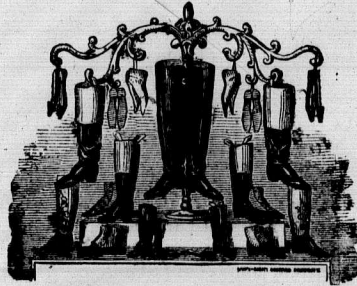
Perth is built on the river Tay, and is situated in the Township of Drummond, County of Lanark, South Riding. Until quite recently it was the County Town of the United Counties of Lanark and Renfrew, but owing to the separation of the last from the previously mentioned one, it is now the capital of Lanark only, while Pembroke has been chosen for the metropolis of Renfrew.

The township in which Perth is located was founded by the Government, and was settled for the most part by retired British officers. The town is well and regularly laid out, possesses many fine edifices, and enjoys the advantage of being the emporium of a large extent of country, which is both an excellent agricultural, and a wealthy one.

Perth contains a large number of mercantile establishments, one of which is that of John S. Coombs, Foster street, apothecary and druggist, and importer of genuine drugs, medicines, chemicals, perfumery, toilet articles, paints, oils, dye-stuffs, spices, and in fact, every article appertaining to a first-class business, of the nature of that in which he is engaged. His facilities for buying to advantage being unsurpassed, he is enabled to supply the country trade at the lowest wholesale rates.

There are three good weekly papers published in the town, and its hotel accommodation, though not on the whole equal to that of many places of a similar size, is still very fair. The principal hotel is the Lewis House, than which there is not a better in the Counties. It enjoys a great portion, in fact almost all, of the patronage of the travelling community.

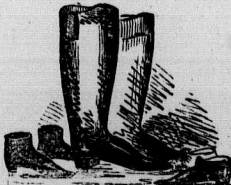

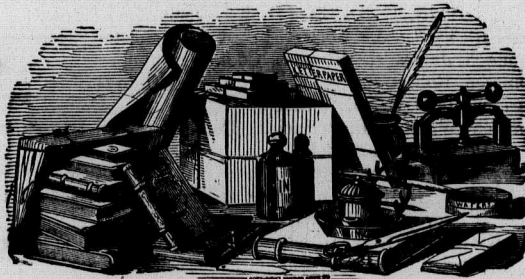

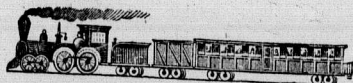

SMITH'S FALLS.

An incorporated and thriving village, advantageously situated on the Rideau Canal, and a station on the Brockville and Ottawa Railway. It is located in the Township of Elmsley, and County of Lanark. Its position on the Canal brings it in direct water communication with Ottawa, the Capital of Canada, and Montreal, the commercial metropolis of the Provinces. Smith's Falls possesses a good water power, and contains some fine manufacturing establishments, amongst which are those of G. M. Cossitt & Bro., Frost & Wood, William Williamson, &c.

G. M. Cossitt & Bro. are the proprietors of the "Rideau Foundry and Agricultural Works" and manufacture all kinds of agricultural implements, iron water wheels, circular sawing machines, shingle machines, and all descriptions of mill work. The Rideau Foundry was erected in 1858, and has been in successful operation since that period. The building is 100 feet by 40 feet, and is three stories in height. In connection with the Foundry, this enterprising firm have an extensive Planing Mill, where lumber of every variety is planed and matched. G. M. Cossitt & Bro. have also, situated within a few rods of the above, a large Saw Mill, in which they manufacture immense quantities of lumber for the American market. The whole of their machinery is driven by water power.

Frost & Wood.—The well-known Foundry and Agricultural Works of this firm is one of the most important and longest established in the County. They occupy convenient premises, on the bank of the Rideau Canal. Their buildings are mostly substantial stone structures. The one nearest the Canal is 50 feet by 120 feet, and two stories high. The front half is used as a moulding room, and has attached to it a wooden building, 40 feet by 60 feet, in which castings are cleaned, and coal and wood stored. In the rear of the moulding room is the machine shop, which is handsomely fitted up, and well supplied with lathes, planers, drills and other machinery. In the same building, up stairs, all the wood work required for their machines is cut, finished, and put together. When this is accomplished they are removed to a warehouse, two stories and a half high, and 36 feet by 100 feet, where they are painted and otherwise got ready for sale.

The Messrs. Frost & Wood are largely engaged in the manufacture of the "Buckeye" reaper and mower, improved threshing machines, cross-cut sawing machines, for sawing logs in the woods, steel ploughs &c. These articles of their make are so well known, and extensively used, that little need be said in relation to them. By a combination of the best material and workmanship they have obtained a first-class reputation. This firm also possesses superior facilities for executing mill castings, and other general work, as they have a large stock of patterns, good machinery and experienced workmen. Besides the establishments we have briefly alluded to, there are several other considerable manufactories at Smith's Falls, but want of space will not permit of their being mentioned. The village is distant from Perth, the County Town, 12 miles, and from Brockville, 26 miles. Its population is about 1600.

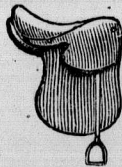

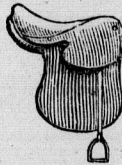

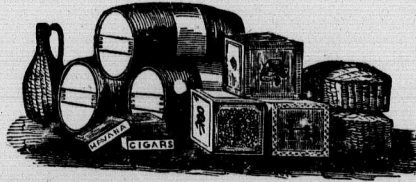

ARNPRIOR.

An incorporated and thriving village, situated on the Ottawa, and at the mouth of the Madawaska River, in the vicinity of the Chats Lake, Township of McNab, and County of Renfrew. It was first settled about the year 1824, but it was not regularly laid out until a period of twenty-seven years had transpired from that date, when, or very shortly after, it began to assume the appearance of a flourishing village. From that time—1851—its progress in wealth and population has been unusually rapid. The river Madawaska furnishes it with a superior water power. On this stream are located the grist, flour, and saw mills of D. McLachlan, Esq., the last mentioned of which, is said to be the most complete and finest structure of its kind in the Province. The regularity with which the village is laid out, together with the pleasing scenery by which it is surrounded, renders its appearance unusually attractive. Arnprior is a station on the Brockville and Ottawa Railway. At present, this road is only open as far as Sand Point, a small village of some fifty inhabitants, distant from Ottawa 48 miles. It is expected that during the current year, and probably before the fall, active operations will be commenced for its completion to that city.

Arnprior is distant from Almonte, 40 miles; Brockville, 92 miles; Carleton Place, 46 miles; Hamilton, 338 miles; Kingston, 140 miles; London, 414 miles; Montreal, 217 miles; Niagara Falls, 383 miles; Ottawa 40 miles; Pembroke, the County Town, 50 miles; Perth, 50 miles; Quebec, 388 miles; Renfrew, 21 miles; Toronto, 300 miles; and Windsor, 521 miles. These distances, with the three exceptions of Ottawa, Pembroke and Renfrew, are by rail.

The population of the village is about 1025.



RENFREW.

An incorporated village situated in the Township of Horton and County of Renfrew, at the second chute of the Bonnechere, about nine miles from its confluence with the Ottawa. At Renfrew the river has a fall of about one hundred feet, in a succession of cascades, over a bed of white limestone. In consequence of this the village possesses the advantage—no mean one—of having one of the finest water powers in the Province. It is situated in a fine, healthy, wheat growing country, and because of the excellent agricultural district by which it is surrounded, will always command a good local trade. Consequent upon the separation of the County of Renfrew from that of Lanark, it was expected by not a few of the inhabitants of the County, that Renfrew would be made its capital, but as Pembroke has been fixed upon for the County Seat, these expectations, like a great many others, were not realized. Had this place been selected it would certainly have been of vast advantage to it, as it would have caused, as everybody knows, without being told, a considerable addition to its population, a large increase in its business, and a proportionate rise in the value of its real estate. Up to the present time Renfrew has been both progressive and flourishing, and, as there are no reasons to the contrary, it will in all probability, continue to be characterized by its present spirit of advancement and enterprize.

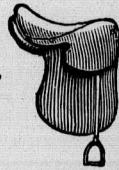

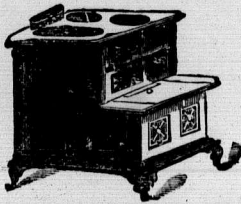

PEMBROKE.

The County Town of the County of Renfrew is situated on Lake Allumette, the waters of which may be said to be part of the Ottawa, in the Township of Pembroke and County of Renfrew. Less than thirty years ago the ground on which it is built was a perfect wilderness. In 1840 it was laid out by Alexander Moffat, Esq., and within the short period which has elapsed since that date, it has become the capital of one of the largest Counties in the Canadas. Its location is very pleasant, being, as before mentioned, on Lake Allumette, a beautiful sheet of water, presenting from its varied landscape, in conjunction with the fine surrounding scenery, a view such as is not often beheld, either in this or other countries. Pembroke is the depot from whence the provisions required for the sustenance of the large number of men engaged in the lumber business in it, and in its environs, are obtained. Its trade therefore, which is good at all times, is especially so in winter, and equals if it does not surpass, that of any place of the same size in the Provinces. There are quite a number of good stores in it, among others we mention the following:

In the neighborhood of Pembroke are quarries of lime and free stone. The County Buildings on Pembroke Street are built partly of the one, and partly of the other. In other words, the Jail is built of limestone, and the Court House, in which is contained the County Offices, of freestone, obtained at Hawley's Island, which is situated at the entrance of the Alouette Rapids, on the Ottawa River, about three miles from the Town. The cost of the buildings was fifty thousand dollars.

Pembroke is the contemplated terminus of the Brockville and Ottawa Railway. It is distant from Arnprior, 50 miles; Brockville, 142 miles; Chatham; 533 miles; Eganville, 23 miles; Guelph, 402 miles; Hamilton, 393 miles; Kingston, 190 miles; Liverpool, 3197 miles; London, 469 miles; Montreal, 267 miles; Niagara Falls, 438 miles; Ottawa, 87 miles; Petewawa, 10 miles; Portland, Maine, 559 miles; Prescott, 154 miles; Quebec, 447 miles; Sandpoint, 48 miles; St. Catharines, 425 miles; Toronto, 355 miles; Westmeath, 14 miles; and Windsor, 578 miles. Its population, within the corporation is about 1000, but including Campbelltown, or the lower town, which stands in the relation of a suburb to Pembroke, it numbers over 1150.

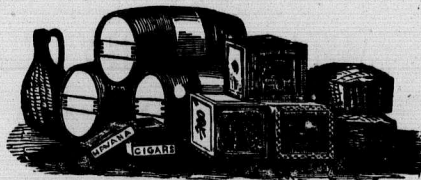

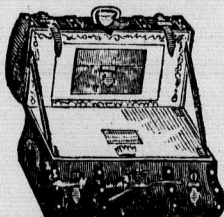
KEMPTVILLE.

PARCEL POST.

Parcels closed at the ends and sides, and not exceeding 3 lbs in weight, may be sent to any place in Canada at a charge of 25 cents for each lb or fraction of a lb, and may be registered on payment of 5 cents. Letters cannot be inclosed, nor any explosive matter, glass, &c., and the size must not exceed one foot in length or breadth, or 6 inches in thickness. The postage must be prepaid.

BOOK POST.

Books bound or unbound posted in Canada to any other place in Canada, British North America or the United States, are charged 1 cent per oz, to be prepaid by stamps.

Book parcels are sent from Canada to the United Kingdom and *vice versa* by Canadian Steamers, at the following rates:

Newspapers from England by the Cunard Packet Mails are charged 2 cents each on delivery. This is the American transit charge.

United States Newspapers, brought by mail into Canada, are charged one cent each on delivery.

Periodical publications other than newspapers passing by mail in Canada, except those addressed to or received from the United Kingdom, and those exempt by Statute, 1 cent per 4 oz. or fraction thereof; this rate is payable on delivery on all periodical matter from the United States, except editorial exchanges. Transient periodical matter must be prepaid by stamps. Canadian periodicals to United Kingdom by Canadian Packets, 2 cents per number, to be prepaid by stamps.

Canadian booksellers and news agents may send British American or Canadian periodicals to subscribers without prepayment.

Printed circulars, prices current, hand bills, and other printed matter, posted in Canada, to any place in British North America, or the United States, pass for 1 cent per oz. prepaid by stamps.

The Orders are drawn in sterling, the commission-chargeable being for £2 and under, 25 cents; from £2 to £5, 50 cents; from £5 to £7, 75 cents; from £7 to £10, \$1.00. No order can be drawn for more than £10; but any number of orders for £10 each may be procured.

PENAL CLAUSES.

The Post Office Act contains the following penal clauses :

To inclose a letter or letters, or any writing intended to serve the purpose of a letter, in a Parcel posted, for the Parcel Post, shall be a misdemeanor.

To inclose a letter or any writing, or to make any written marks to serve the purpose of a letter, or to enclose any other thing in a newspaper posted to pass as a newspaper, at the rate of postage applicable to newspapers, (except in the case of accounts and receipts of newspaper publishers, which are permitted to pass folded within the newspapers sent by them to their subscribers,) shall be a misdemeanor

Courts of Law.

COURT OF ERROR AND APPEAL.—Constituted for the hearing of appeals in civil cases from the Courts of Queen's Bench, Chancery and Common Pleas; and appeals in criminal cases from the Courts of Queen's Bench and Common Pleas. From the judgment of this Court, an appeal lies to her Majesty in Privy Council, in cases over £1,000, or where annual rent, fee, or future rights of any amount, are affected.

COURT OF IMPEACHMENT.—For the trial of Judges of County Courts in Upper Canada, under Con. Stat. U. C., cap. 14.

COURT OF QUEEN'S BENCH.—The jurisdiction of this Court extends to all manner of actions, causes and suits, criminal and civil, real, personal and mixed, within Upper Canada, and it may proceed in such, by such process and course as are provided by law, and as shall tend with justice and dispatch to determine the same; and may hear and determine all issues of law, and also with the inquest of twelve good and lawful men (except in cases otherwise provided for) try all issues of fact, and give judgment, and award execution, thereon, and also in matters which relate to the Queen's Revenue (including the condemnation of contraband or smuggled goods) as may be done by Her Majesty's Superior Courts of Law in England.

COURT OF CHANCERY.—This Court has the like jurisdiction as the Court of Chancery in England, in cases of fraud, accident, trusts, executors, administrators, co-partnerships, account, mortgages, awards, dower, infants, idiots, lunatics and their estates, waste, specific performance, discovery, and to prevent multiplicity of suits, staying proceedings at law prosecuted against equity and good conscience, and may decree the issue, repeal or avoidance of letters patent, and generally the like powers which the Court of Chancery in England possesses to administer justice in all cases in which there is no adequate remedy at law.

COURT OF COMMON PLEAS.—This Court has the same powers and jurisdiction as a Court of Record, as the Court of Queen's Bench. Writs of summons and *capias* issue alternately from either court.

PRACTICE COURT AND CHAMBERS.—One of the Common Law Judges holds a Court during each Term, called the "Practice

Court," for hearing matters relating to the adding or justifying bail, discharging insolvent debtors, administering oaths, hearing and determining matters on motion, and making rules and orders in causes and business depending in either of said law courts. Chambers are held each day in Common Law and Chancery by one of the Judges of the said Courts, for such business relating to suits therein as may be transacted by a single Judge out of Court

HEIR AND DEVISEE COURT.—Commissioners, the Judges of the Superior Courts, and such other persons as may be appointed by commission under the Great Seal. Their duties are to determine claims to lands in Upper Canada, for which no patent has issued from the Crown in favor of the proper claimants, whether as heirs, devisees or assignees. Sittings at Toronto, first Monday in January and July in each year.

COUNTY COURTS.—Presided over by a resident Judge in each County. Their jurisdiction extends to all personal actions where the debt or damages claimed do not exceed £50; and to all suits relating to debt, covenant or contract, where the amount is ascertained by the acts of the parties or signature of the defendant, to £100; and to all bail bonds and recognizances of bail given in the County Court, to any amount; but not to cases involving the title to lands, validity of wills, or actions for libel, slander, crim. con., or seduction. An appeal lies to either of the Superior Courts of Law. These Courts also possess equity powers, to the amount of £50, subject to an appeal to Chancery.

SURROGATE COURTS.—The jurisdiction of these Courts relates to all testamentary matters and causes, and to the granting or revoking of probate of wills, and letters of administration of the effects of deceased persons having estate or effects in Upper Canada, and all matters arising out of or connected with the grant or revocation of probate or administration, subject to an appeal to the Court of Chancery. The County Judges are also Judges of the Surrogate Courts.

COURTS OF QUARTER SESSIONS.—Chairman, the County Judge in each county, who, with one or more Justices of the Peace, holds a Court of Quarter Sessions in his county four times a year, for trials by jury in cases of felony and misdemeanor, but treason and capital felonies are exempted from their jurisdiction.

RECORDER'S COURTS.—In the Cities of Toronto, Hamilton, London, Kingston and Ottawa, the Recorder's Court takes the

place of the County Sessions, the Justices for Counties having no jurisdiction in the Cities—the care of which is confided to the Recorder, Mayor, Aldermen, and Police Magistrate of each. Sessions held first Monday in March, June and September, and third Monday in December.

INSOLVENT DEBTORS' COURTS.—By the “Insolvent Act of 1864,” 27 & 28 Victoria, cap. 57, passed on the 30th June, 1864, provision is made “for the settlement of the estates of insolvent debtors, for giving effect to arrangements between them and their creditors, and for the punishment of fraud.” In Lower Canada, this enactment applies to traders only. In Upper Canada, to all persons whether traders or non-traders. In these courts, the County Court Judge in each county presides—the only appointment made in pursuance of this statute being those of “official assignees,” who are to be nominated “by the Board of Trade at any place, or the Council thereof, within the county or district in which such Board of Trade exists, or in any county or district adjacent thereto in which there is no Board of Trade.” This important statute is proving a great boon to the community, in enabling parties who from unavoidable circumstances find themselves paralyzed by hopeless liability to obtain relief, and recommence business.

DIVISION COURTS.—For the summary disposal of cases by a Judge; but a jury of five persons may be demanded in certain cases. Their jurisdiction extends to actions of debt or contract amounting to £25; injuries or torts to personal chattels amounting to £10; but not to actions for gambling debts, liquors drunk in a tavern, or notes of hand given therefor, ejection, title to land, &c., or any toll, custom or franchise, will or settlement, malicious prosecution, libel, slander, crim. con., seduction or breach of promise, or actions against a J. P. for anything done by him in the execution of his office, if he objects to it. Courts are held once in two months in each division, or oftener, at the discretion of the Judge. The Divisions are established by the Courts of Quarter Sessions.

TERMS OF THE COURTS.

APPEAL TERMS commence on the second Thursday next after Hilliary, Easter and Michaelmas Terms.

LAW TERMS.—Hilliary begins first Monday in February, and ends Saturday of the ensuing week; Easter begins third Monday in May, and ends Saturday of the ensuing week; Trinity

begins Monday next after 21st August, and ends on Saturday of the ensuing week; Michaelmas begins third Monday in November and ends Saturday of the ensuing week. Long vacation from 1st July to 21st August.

CHANCERY TERMS.—*Examination Terms*—From 1st Tuesday of February to the Saturday after 2nd Tuesday of April; and from 1st Tuesday of September, to the Saturday after 1st Tuesday of November. *Hearing Terms*—From 4th Monday in April until Saturday of the following week; and from 3rd Monday in November until Saturday of the following week. The Court also sits every Tuesday (except during the regular vacations) throughout the year for hearing motions for Decrees, motions for or to dissolve special injunctions, and appeals from the reports of the Master or Deputy Masters. Long vacation from the 1st July to 21st August.

COUNTY COURT TERMS commence on the first Monday in Jan., April, July, and Oct., and end the following Saturday.

CIRCUITS OF THE COURTS.

LAW CIRCUITS.—The Circuits are held twice a year in each County, between Hilliary and Easter Terms, and between Trinity and Michaelmas Terms, except in the City of Toronto, and United Counties of York and Peel, where there are three in each year, commencing on the Thursday next after municipal elections in January, the second Monday in April and the second Monday in October, in each year. There are six Circuits, as follows, viz; The *Eastern*: Perth, Cornwall, Ottawa, L'Orignal, Brockville, Kingston. *Home*: Niagara, Hamilton, Barrie, Owen Sound, Milton, Welland. *Western*: St. Thomas, Sandwich, Sarnia, Chatham, London, Goderich. *Midland*: Whitby, Peterboro'. Cobourg, Belleville, Picton, Lindsay. *Oxford*: Simcoe, Brantford, Guelph, Berlin, Stratford, Woodstock, Cayuga. *Toronto and York and Peel*; Toronto.

CHANCERY CIRCUITS.—For the examination of witnesses and hearing causes are held in the Spring and Fall of each year as follows:—*Toronto*: Toronto. *Home*: Whitby, Barrie, Hamilton, Niagara, Brantford, Guelph. *Western*: Simcoe, London, Chatham, Sandwich, Sarnia, Goderich, Woodstock. *Eastern*: Ottawa, Cornwall, Brockville, Kingston, Belleville, Cobourg, Lindsay.

COUNTY COURT AND QUARTER SESSIONS SITTINGS.—For the trial of issues of fact, and the assessment of damages, on the second Tuesday in March, June, September, and December, in each year.

Table of Stamp Duties.

On every promissory note, draft, or bill of exchange, for \$25 and under, 1 cent; over \$25 to \$50, 2 cents; over \$50 to \$100, 3 cents.

On every promissory note, draft, or bill of exchange, executed singly, for the first \$100, 3 cents; for every additional \$100 or fraction of \$100, 3 cents.

On every draft or bill of exchange executed in duplicate, for the first \$100, 2 cents; for every additional \$100, or fraction thereof, 2 cents.

On every draft or bill of exchange executed in more than two parts, for each part for the first \$100, 1 cent; for every additional \$100, or fraction thereof, 1 cent.

The duty to be paid by stamps affixed at time of making, upon which the signature or some integral portion of the instrument shall be written. The stamps to be affixed by the maker or drawer of the instrument, or if drawn out of the Province, by the acceptor or first indorser in the Province. Penalty for neglect to affix stamps, \$100.

Stamps in all cases to be defaced at the time of affixing the same, by writing or stamping the date thereon, and such stamp shall be held *prima facie* to have been affixed at the date stamped or written thereon, and if no date be so stamped or written thereon such adhesive stamp shall be of no avail.
