## RRNEWAL OF EARTHOUAKE SHOCCS ADSS TO TERROR OF PEOPLE W STRCCHE TOWWS

London, Jan, 17.-While the main Russian army has been busy repelling what Grand Duke Nicholas, in his official report, describes as series of violent attacks by Field Marshal
Von Hindenburg to break his way through to Warsaw, other Russian forces have stormed and taken Kirlibaba Pass on the bussian forces have stormed and Transylvania, and have made further progress in their advance along the right bank of the Vistula toward the German frontier.
The Germans in force have delivered seven successive attacks, which developed into desperate bayonet fighting, on the Russian lines on the left bank of the Vistula, and have Further south there have been similar attacks, in each se preceded by heavy artillery engagements. The Russians have succeeded in silencing the heavy Austrian guns, which from the banks of the Dunajec have been bombarding the town of Tarnow.

The capture of Kirlibaba Pass, through which roads leading into the heart of Transylvania is likely to have a political as well as a military effect. It will possibly hasten the action of Roumania and will compel the Germanic allies to send troops for the defence of Easten Berchald, the former
