### THE METHODIST CHURCH,

Held in the City of St. Thomas, Ontario, Commencing on Thursday, the Third Day of June, 1886.

THE Conference opened in the First Methodist Church at nine o'clock a.m., the Rev. G. R. Sanderson, D.D., President, in the chair.

The 753rd hymn was sung, and the Conference prayer-meeting commenced by the reading of Scripture lessons from Isaiah (12th chapter) and from the 1st Epistle of Peter (5th chapter) by the Rev. R. C. Parsons. The Rev. Dr. CARMAN and Mr. THOMAS MCCORMACK led the Conference in prayer. Then the 109th hymn was sung, and Rev. E. B. RYCKMAN, D.D., and Mr. C. Sanders led in prayer. Dr. Sanderson, by a short address and the benediction, closed the prayer-meeting and vacated the chair.

The Rev. A. Carman, D.D., one of the General Superintendents, then took charge of the first day's business, as by law directed.

The roll of the Conference being called, ninety ministers and eighteen laymen answered to their names.

The report of the Transfer Committee was then called for by the chair.

The following ministers were reported as transferred from the Conference:—To the Niagara Conference, William Morton and E. Lounsbury; to the Guelph Conference, John L. Kerr and James White. There were none reported as transferred into the London Conference.

The Rev. Dr. Carman then addressed the Conference and proceeded to the business of the election of a President. Balloting resulted in the election of the Rev. W. R. PARKER, D.D., as President.

The Rev. WILLIAM McDonagh was then elected Secretary of the Conference, and the Rev. B. CLEMENT, Assistant Secretary. The Rev. Walter Rigsby was appointed Journal Secretary.

### **OBITUARIES**

### REV. REUBEN E. TUPPER.

Rev. Reuben E. Tupper was born in the county of Leeds, on the 12th of December, 1809. When about nine years of age he yielded to the Spirit's pleading, and was led to trust in Jesus Christ for salvation. Much of the cheerful Christian experience and loving fidelity of his later years may be traced to his early acceptance of Christ as his Saviour and consecration to His service.

In 1836, in response to the Master's call, he engaged in the work of the Christian ministry, but after one year of service he was compelled, on account of his health, to locate for three years. Returning to the work, after the usual probationary term he was received into full connexion and ordained at the Conference of 1843. Never possessing a vigorous constitution, he was obliged in 1855 to superannuate, in which relation he remained for seven years. Returning to the work in 1862, he spent about five years in faithful circuit service, followed by four or five years in charge of the Mount Eigin Industrial School. He again superannuated in 1871. Three years more of rest, one of service at Mount Brydges, eleven of superannuation at London, and Bro. Tupper exchanged a changeful for a changeless life. On Sunday, March 7th, after a brief illness, he entered the rest that remaineth.

As a man, Bro. Tupper was respected and beloved. His quiet and often quaint demeanor, his kindly spirit and benevolent nature, won for him not only a very desirable place in private friendship, but also a large share of public esteem. He showed himself friendly and he had many friends.

As a Christian, he enjoyed a steady and constantly increasing wealth of happy experience. He had a strong love and reverence for the Word of God, and a growing attachment to the people of God. Their fellowship was his joy and delight. His zeal for the peace and prosperity of the Church was very marked. Her services to him were sweet and sacred. How often has he been heard saying how he loved the Lord, and with what gladness of spirit did he join in singing

"Beyond my highest joy,
I prize her heavenly ways,
Her sweet communion, solemn vows,
Her hymns of love and praise."

As a minister, he was called and chosen, and faithful. Though subject to continual physical infirmity, sufficient to dishearten many, yet such were his love and zeal for the work to which he was called, that he never hesitated to do his duty cheerfully and to the best of his ability.

On the 21st of February, Bro. Tupper attended service for the last time on earth, saying at the close of the service, "The Lord send thee help from the sanctuary and strengthen thee out of Zion," adding these words, "The good man's prayers have been answered to day." On the following Saturday he was taken ill without any expectation of recovery on his part. The thought of speedy removal did not disturb his mind. His trust in Jesus was unshaken; he richly enjoyed the rest of faith, and rejoiced in

strong assurance and hope of the rest of heaven. After one week's illness, in the triumphs of Christian faith, a consistent Christian and devoted minister passed home, shouting, "Victory, through the blood of the Lamb."

#### REV. WILLIAM MYLES FLETCHER, Ph. B.

The declaration, "In the midst of life we are in death," has been verified by the removal of our brother whose name stands at the head of this obituary notice. For him, though, death had no terror, its power being conquered by his risen Lord.

Brother Fletcher was born in the year 1853, in the township of Barton, a short distance south of the city of Hamilton. During his childhood he was surrounded by religious influences and taught in his home the importance of loving and serving God. As a consequence of this at an early age his mind was impressed with the thought that his life work would be to preach the Gospel.

His conversion took place when he was quite a young man, engaged as a school teacher in the State of Michigan. The impressions of his boyhood then took definite form in a call to preach, and he returned to Canada, having decided to engage in the work of the ministry in his native country, and in the church of his family and friends.

In the year 1877 he was admitted on trial by the Conference of the

late Methodist Episcopal Church held in St. Thomas.

During his probation he passed his examinations with credit, and was duly received into full connexion and ordained. His ministerial life was brief—but crowned with blessing and success. The following Circuits on which he labored, Oakland, Dunnville, Saltfleet, St. Davids, Essex Centre, and Shedden, give evidence of his concern for the salvation of souls and the extension of the Redeemer's kingdom. On each of these charges he proved himself to be "a workman that needeth not to be ashamed, rightly dividing the word of truth." In addition to his circuit duties he successfully prosecuted a course of study, and a short time before his death obtained his degree of Bachelor of Philosophy.

As a man, Brother Fletcher was genial and obliging; as a Christian, his daily life bore its own testimony; as a student, he was diligent; as a

preacher, he was effective.

Soon after returning home from last Conference symptoms of malarial fever appeared in his family. This gradually developed into typhoid fever, prostrating his wife and two children besides himself. The progress of the disease was stayed in the other members of the family, but the hopes entertained of his recovery were doomed to disappointment. During his illness of nearly four weeks he was graciously sustained by the presence of the Saviour, and when free from delirium he gave to his brethren in the ministry who visited him, and to others, the most comforting assurances of peace with God, and readiness to accept of life or death according to his Heavenly Father's will. He passed away on the 17th of September, 1885.

On the day of his death the Financial District Meeting, of which he was a member, was in session, and the sad intelligence reached the meeting

just after his name and Circuit had received consideration.

His wife and three children mourn the loss of a kind husband and loving father; his circuit, of a faithful pastor, and his brethren, of a devoted fellow-laborer in the vineyard of Christ.

#### REV. DAVID HARDIE.

Mr. Hardie was of Scottish birth, having been the eldest son of David Hardie and Mary Rae, the latter a descendant of the Rae family that held the barony of Canglor, in the parish of St. Ninians, and sheriffdom of Sterling, Scotland.

Rev. Mr. Hardie's parents belonged to the Established Church of Scotland. He was born June 14th, 1799, and from his youth feeling a desire for military life, he left home without the knowledge of his parents,

in May, 1819, to enlist in the army.

The first night after leaving home he awoke in great distress of body and mind, oppressed with the dread that there was no mercy or deliverance for him, he was such a sinner; and a feeling of utter despair began to come over him. But in his distress he was led to call upon the name of Jesus Christ, and while he was praying his heart was melted to tenderness, and when he believed on the name of Jesus, that moment his burden of distress was gone. He felt peace with God through faith in the Saviour's name.

A few days after this he enlisted in the 79th Regiment, a party of which was then recruiting in the city of Perth. In the year 1821 his regiment was in the city of Limerick, Ireland, and it was while here that he joined a Methodist class. He was wonderfully blessed once in hearing

a sermon in Dublin by Rev. Henry Moor, Wesley's biographer.

His regiment was sent to Montreal, Canada, in 1827, and in 1829 he felt deeply impressed that he should preach the gospel, and he recorded a promise that he would, by God's direction, make known His will to men, and proclaim His mercy and love. But not knowing how to preach or what to say, he became discouraged, until a few months later the conviction returned with increased power, and he made known his impressions to Rev. T. Turner, the Wesleyan minister stationed at Kingston, whither his regiment had been sent in May, 1829. Mr. Turner promised to bring his case before the Quarterly Official Board.

In May, 1830, the 79th Highlanders were removed to Toronto, his company being sent to Niagara. He finally obtained his discharge from the army, at Fort George, Niagara, in December, 1831, and entered upon the Itinerancy shortly after, under the direction of the Chairman; was received on trial in 1837, and was ordained at the Belleville Conference

in 1840, under the presidency of the Rev. Dr. Stinson.

In October of that year he was married to Miss Jane S. S. Walker, formerly of Falkirk, Scotland. The union was a very happy one, and only rarely is found a wife who so largely contributed to the happiness and usefulness of a husband as did Mrs. Hardie.

In 1872 he retired from the active work of the ministry and became a superannuate, still, however, working for the Master as strength and

opportunity enabled him to do.

Bro. Hardie was a good man and full of the Holy Ghost. For the last six years of his life he professed the blessing of entire sanctification,

and his daily walk and conversation corresponded therewith.

His son, Rev. A. Hardie, of Ottawa, for several days during his last illness was with him, and he states that his father was kept in great comfort of mind. "Bless the Lord," "Praise the Lord," were his favorite and

oft-repeated expressions. Among his very last utterances were the words, "All peace and all joy!" At the last he just fell asleep, and thus entered into the glorious rest of God's people.

Thus died Rev. David Hardie, the 8th of May, 1886, in the eighty-seventh year of his age and the forty-ninth of his ministry. The text from which Rev. Dr. Sanderson preached a very appropriate and impressive funeral sermon on the occasion was particularly applicable to the deceased—Matthew xxv. 21: "Well done, thou good and faithful servant: thou hast been faithful over a few things, I will make thee ruler over many things; enter thou into the joy of thy Lord."

#### REPORTS OF COMMITTEES.

# REPORT OF THE CHURCH PROPERTY COMMITTEE.

Your Committee beg leave to report as follows :-

That permission be granted to the Trustees of the Delaware Parsonage to sell six acres of their ten-acre lot, and apply the proceeds to the liqui-

dation of the debt on their parsonage property.

That the case of the former Trustees of the North Chatham (late M. E.) Church be recommended to the favorable consideration of the General Conference Embarrassed Trust Fund; and that the memorial presented by Mr. John Milne be forwarded to the Board of said fund, with the request that the sum of \$1,500 be granted for their relief.

That in the case of the memorial from the West Glencoe Circuit, touching the action of the Trustees of the Alliance Church, South Ekfrid, and the administration of the Circuit Superintendent in the case,—the whole matter be referred to the District Superintendent for adjustment

That we recommend the Conference to ratify the sale of the late M. E.

Squires Church, South Ekfrid.

That the request of the Trustees of the Frank Street Church, Strathroy, for financial aid, be referred to the General Conference Committee on Embarrassed Trusts.

That the request of the Quarterly Board of the Shedden Circuit, for permission to deed the former M. E. Church in Fingal to John Stafford, be granted.

Also, your Committee on Church Property make the following recom-

mendations :-

1. That permission be granted to sell the late M. E. parsonage at Florence, the proceeds to be applied to pay off the debt thereon; the balance, if any, to the liquidation of the debt on the North Dawn Church.

2. That permission be granted the Trustees of Kent Bridge Church, Louisville Mission, to sell the same and apply the proceeds to aid in

erecting a new church in that neighborhood.

3. That permission be given the Trustees of the late M. E. Church, at Wallaceburg, to sell the church and parsonage and apply the proceeds towards liquidating the debt on their church.

4. That permission be granted the Trustees of the Elizabeth Street Church, Chatham, to sell the church and apply the proceeds towards liqui-

dating the debt on their church.

- 5. That permission be given the Trustees of the Brick Church, Hamilton Road Mission, to sell the same and apply the proceeds as per Basis of
- 6. That permission be given the Trustees of James Street, Exeter, to sell their parsonage and apply proceeds to new parsonage.
- 7. That permission be granted the Trustees of Delaware parsonage to sell six acres of land and apply the proceeds to the reduction of the debt on their church property.

9. That permission be granted the Trustee Board, Melbourne Circuit,

to sell one-third interest in the Union Church.

10. That permission be granted the Trustees of Glencoe West Parsonage to sell or exchange the same, and in case of sale to apply the proceeds to building a new parsonage.

11. That permission be granted the Trustees of the late M. E. Church, Cottam, to sell the same, the proceeds to be applied on their church debt.

12. That permission be given the Trustees of Gesto Church to sell the old church, the proceeds to be applied toward the erection of a new church;

13. That the Conference ratify the sale of the old C. M. Church, Petrolia, the proceeds to be applied toward enlarging and making repairs on the former M. E. Church.

14. That permission be granted the Trustees of the late M. E. Church, Croton, to sell the said church, lot, and church furniture, the proceeds to be applied to the improvement of the Croton Church, and the Huff's Church and parsonage furniture.

Church and parsonage furniture.

15. That permission be given the Trustees of the Brownsville Parsonage to exchange a strip of land on the south side of the parsonage lot

for a like quantity on the east side.

16. That permission be given the Trustees of the late M. E. Church, Corinth, to sell the same, the proceeds to be applied to liquidate the debt on the church now occupied by the congregation.

17. That permission be granted the Trustees of Mount Brydges, to sell the present parsonage property and apply the proceeds to the erection of

a new parsonage.

18. That permission be given the Trustees of the Oak Street Church, Bothwell, to sell the church and apply the proceeds to discharge the mortgage on the property; the balance, if any, to be appropriated to the Trust Board of the Elm Street Church.

19. That permission be given to the Trustees of the parsonage, Camlachie, to sell the north half of the parsonage lot, the proceeds to be

devoted to the erection of a church.

20. That permission be granted to the Trustees of the late C. M. Church, 21st Concession, West Williams, to sell the church and lot, the

proceeds to be devoted to liquidate the debt on the parsonage.

21. That permission be given to the Trustees of the late P. M. Church, Thedford, to sell the church and lot, the proceeds to be devoted to the enlargement of the church now used by the congregation, or to the building of a parsonage, as the Quarterly Board of the Circuit may direct.

22. That in view of the agreement reached by the representatives of the Warwick and Arkona Trust Boards, whereby Mr Peter Graham agrees to pay to the Trust Board of Arkona the sum of \$100, permission be granted to sell the property, and the President be authorized to sign the deed.

23. That permission be granted to the Trustees of the Bismarck Church to convey a certain lot of land to the Trustees of the Bismarck Parsonage.

# REPORT OF THE COMMITTEE ON TEMPERANCE.

We, your Committee on Temperance, in presenting this report, feel constrained to recognize with the deepest gratitude and most hearty thanksgiving to Almighty God, the guidance and blessing which have been vouchsafed to the temperance cause in our Dominion during the past year. We would remember the God of battles in our victories, while we invoke His grace, His infinite and promised wisdom, for the conflicts of the future.

We rejoice in the unity of Methodism on this most important issue now before our country, and that we, as a Church and Conference, stand pledged to the principle of total abstinence for the individual and prohibition for the state; and that in the conflicts of the past none have been found more truly loyal to the temperance cause than the members and ministers of the Methodist Church.

Yet we recognize the fact that every year brings with it a change of the battle front,—new questions to be answered, new difficulties to be overcome, demanding from us new expressions of opinion and new methods

of work.

We cannot but emphasize the fact that we have reached in an especial sense this year an epoch in the temperance movement that will demand from us not only an expression of opinion, but a step in advance of anything that has previously characterized our efforts as a Church in this direction.

We are thankful to say that, although the Canada Temperance Act of 1878, through lack of the machinery to properly enforce its provisions, is not accomplishing all that we could desire, nevertheless we rejoice that its good effects are visible in the decrease of drunkenness and crime, and the abolition of the treating system, throughout the counties and cities in which the Act has been in force.

The cry of "failure," so often heard, we believe to be largely the voice

of the liquor traffic proclaiming its desire rather than the truth.

The observation and experience of your Committee in connection with the working of local and partial prohibitory measures, together with the unprincipled, villainous and vigorous efforts of the anti-temperance party and their political allies, to render the Canada Temperance Act of 1878 ineffective, by the mutilation of the Act itself, by their opposition to the appointment of the requisite officers for its enforcement, or by the appointment of unsuitable men to such positions, as well as by the more outrageous acts of personal intimidation, has led them to the conviction that the time has now come when the temperance people of our land should in some organized way take part in the politics of our country.

We can hardly expect the granting of suitable temperance legislation by either of the great political parties until we have shown our earnestness, determination and power. Only at the ballot point can we expect to win our wishes in this matter. If we place great stress on other questions, or let party take the place of principle, we need not wonder that our

servants in the legislature will do the same.

The temperance question must not only be made an issue, but the issue at the polls, and politicians made to feel that that party alone can stand

at least four of the Provinces of our Dominion, and would be possibly the

most feasible way of solving the liquor problem. It would be useless to pass a prohibitory act in any Province where the vast majority of the people were opposed to it. Such an act would place in the hands of each Province the responsibility of its enactment and enforcement.

We deprecate the action of the National Liberal Temperance Union, which, under the pretext of a wine and beer license, desires to re-open, or keep open the flood-gates of ruin and drunkenness in our land; and would

impress upon our people the necessity of using their influence to prevent the success of this anti-temperance movement. The pulpits of our land have been too silent on the political side of

this question, and it is time that the voice of the Methodist Church should nuation Fund. be heard in the land,-the Church that has for a hundred years led the very vanguard in the temperance movement cannot afford to have her lips sealed and her hands tied by party politics.

We congratulate our co-workers in this noble cause who have so worthily and successfully performed their part in the struggles of the past, and pray "God bless the Women's Christian Temperance Union."

It is with feelings of unbounded hopefulness that your Committee observe the growing interest taken in the temperance work in our Sabbath-schools, and would recommend to the consideration of the Conference the publication of a monthly Sunday-school temperance paper, believing that the hope of the future is in the childhood of the present.

Your Committee would express their confidence in the ultimate and glorious success of the temperance cause—the cause of God and humanity -a cause in which lies embodied, to a large extent, the destiny of our nation and our race.

The Secretaries of Conferences will greatly aid in getting the Fund into a system by which it will be more easily managed in future, as well as greatly assist the Treasurer in his work, by inserting in the Minutes of Conference the following

# RECOMMENDATIONS :-

- 1. The Annual Conferences should exercise great care in Superannuating ministers, and only those who are actually worn out in the work should be placed on the list.
- 2. In the appointment of Financial Secretaries (or District Treasurers) only those of known financial ability should be selected.
- 3. All parties sending money to the office should send with each remittance the names of all Circuits, or Ministers, or others to whom the money is to be credited. Sending money in bulk sums leads to great inconvenience, and makes it impossible to tell what Circuits or Ministers have paid their claims in full. In order to keep the books so that the amount paid by each Circuit or Minister can be traced, this request must be rigidly observed.
- 4. The Schedules sent out by the Board should be carefully filled uptaking the names of claimants as found in last years Minutes and accounting for them-showing who are still claimants and who have ceased to be claimants, and why they have so ceased, and then adding any new claimants, with their proper address, as per Schedule.
- 5. Then Schedules should be published in full in the Minutes of the several Annual Conferences as an official document for the guidance of the Treasurer in the payment of the claimants.
- 6. A statement of the amounts paid on each Circuit for ministerial support and ordinary connexional collections for the past year, together with the names of claimants, new and old, for the coming year, should be prepared by the Secretary of the Conference (or the Statistical Committee) and a certified copy immediately sent to the Treasurer at the close of the Conference in order to enable him to prepare his estimates in time for the Financial District meetings.

# REPORT OF COMMITTEE ON EMBARRASSED TRUSTS.

Your Committee report the total receipts from the various Circuits of the London Conference as amounting to the sum of \$323.26.

'The following cases were brought before the committee for its consideration, and dealt with according to its best judgment:—

1. Arkona.—In regard to the case of the Arkona Parsonage Trust, the Committee appropriated the sum of \$500, which action was accepted and unanimously passed by the Conference. The above amount to be paid to the trustees of Arkona Parsonage.

2. BLENHEIM.—In the case of the Blenheim Church indebtedness, amounting to \$8,000, the Committee beg to say, that whereas the Trustees of said church ask for the sum of \$4,000, an amount equal to the one-half of their indebtedness, the church Trustees guaranteeing the payment of the balance by themselves, we recommend the case to the favorable consideration of the Trust Relief Fund of the General Conference for the sum of four thousand dollars.

3. AYLMER.—In the case of the liabilities of the trustees of the late M. E. Church, in Aylmer, who are personally responsible for the sum of \$1,500, without any assets, your Committee beg further to report that whereas the Aylmer District has assumed the sum of \$1,000, we recommend that the balance, \$500, be paid out of the Embarrassed Trust Fund of the Conference next year.

The Committee also recommend that the Rev. A. G. Harris be appointed treasurer of this Embarrassed Trust Fund.

# REPORT OF THE SUNDAY SCHOOL COMMITTEE.

Your Committee would respectfully report as follows:-

The general outlook of Sunday-school work in the Conference is encouraging, indicating a growing interest in all departments of the work.

It is a matter of gratification that we are able to report the large number of 1,142 conversions among the children of our Sunday-schools during the year. The interest of our scholars in our class-meetings seems to be increasing. 4,100, or more than 1 of the whole number of scholars in our schools, are reported as meeting in class.

It is very pleasing to note that our Sunday-school periodicals and publications are growing in favor. There is a handsome increase in the number of our own periodicals and lesson helps taken by our schools, and a corresponding decrease of the patronage awarded other publications. In four or five years, at the same rate, our own will have wholly supplanted the foreign publications. We are happy to report an advance of \$25.95 in the contributions from our Circuits to the Sunday-school Aid and Extension Fund. This collection was taken this year by all our Circuits except five, whereas sixteen Circuits failed to take it last year.

We observe that for 68 out of a total of 327, or more than one-fifth of the preaching places within the bounds of the Conference, no Sabbath-schools are reported. In some instances there are union schools at such places. We would recommend that in such cases the schools be reported as union schools, and that wherever practicable, Sunday-schools controlled by our Church be organized at all our preaching places.

We would again urge the introduction and faithful use of our catechisms in all our schools.

Believing that the lesson helps are greatly abused by both teachers and scholars—in many instances used in a merely mechanical way—we would recommend that as far as possible the helps be used at home in the preparation of the lesson and not used in the classes.

In many schools the lesson-leaves are superseding the Bible in the hands of the scholars. We deprecate this, and would earnestly recommend that the Bible be placed in the hands of all our scholars, and that the Sunday-school superintendents be requested to give effect to this recommendation.

BELOVED BRETHREN,-

Grace be unto you and peace from God our Father and from the Lord Jesus Christ. We thank our God always on your behalf for the grace of God which is given you by Jesus Christ, that in every thing ye are enriched by Him in all utterance and in all knowledge; so that ye come behind in no gift, waiting for the coming of our Lord Jesus Christ, who shall also confirm you unto the end that ye may be blameless in the day of our Lord Jesus Christ.

Assembled in our Annual Conference we most affectionately greet you and salute you in the name of our Great Master. You are with us colaborers in the glorious commission assigned His disciples by our Lord and Saviour. You are joined with us in the blessed work of helping to save the world. We have this treasure in earthen vessels, that the excellency of the power may be of God and not of us. Yet unto us as a Church this power has come. It has been in us a force, a reality, an experience. We unitedly render thanks unto our God that the year has been one of progress, of victory, and great joy in all spiritual labours. The Lord has crowned the year with His goodness. Financially, numerically and spiritually we have had great prosperity.

nation and are subjects of a spiritual King. His laws should govern your life. His life should vitalize you. Ever retain vivid in your mind, and real in experience, the truth of the figure of the branches in the vine. May there flow into every action of your life the unction and power of the Divine Spirit, that His nature and character may be as ripe, beautiful and rich fruit in your whole life. Seek alone in your clearest and holiest moments to come nearer to God, and find a place that will be to you as the mountain was to the Lord Jesus, that free from all the world you can often find within your soul a thrilling consciousness of communion with God. Such shall scatter all doubt and fear. It will shed light on any darkness of your mind, strengthening your faith, and make the fountain of your life purer and deeper. It will make you wise for every duty. "The fear of the Lord is the beginning of wisdom," "and the knowledge of the Most High is understanding," Make your homes sacred to God; they will thus be in a still better sense homes to you. Permit in them nothing either in act, conversation, or amusement which would expel the Spirit of Christ. Consider that in the intermingling of your family, character is being formed for eternity.

We rejoice in the success that has attended the evangelistic efforts of the year. The Church feels in every department of her work the quickening effects of this revival. The returns of the year show a large net increase in membership, and the brethren come from their fields of labor much encouraged and stimulated.

The temperance question lays upon us the responsibility of still greater activity. Very much has been gained, but very much remains to be done. The Canada Temperance Act is effective. It is the highest legislative ground yet reached. We should, therefore, stand firmly that we be not dislodged from our present position of advantage, but be on the alert and ready to promptly occupy still higher ground. Let us as a Church think, speak and act as a unit in this direction, where success may be expected to crown our Master's cause, and where that cause absolutely demands victory.

We greatly regret the socialistic spirit of the times, and we feel confirmed in our faith that nothing but the Spirit of Christ will secure the largest possible liberty, and effect a perfect adjustment of conflicting interests. There is an obligation resting upon every Christian to secure and maintain his rights, and he should be equally careful not to exceed his rights, but remember the powers that constitutionally exist are the ordinances of God. "Let patience have her perfect work."

We commend to you the Educational Institutions of our Church. In the severe financial pressure of a Church growing so rapidly in every direction some needs may seem more direct, but we dare not neglect these College interests. They are a broad foundation under the whole Church structure. Any indifference, any superficial work, any false economy in this department will great imperil the future. All our schools and colleges are abreast of the times. They are not excelled by either Church or State institutions in our country anywhere. We commend them to your liberality, to your sons and daughters, where a good education may be obtained under proper moral supervision.

Our Publishing House has had a year of unparalleled success. Do you take the Christian Guardian, the Methodist Magazine, and the Sundayschool papers? Do you read them? They should be in every home. They are true to our country, our Church, and our doctrines. We earnestly ask our membership to replace any doubtful or impure books with such as have passed the hands of those who have their deepest interest at heart, and feel, in the preparation of their reading matter, the care of souls. We therefore commend our Book Room to your patronage and confidence. The class of literature it seeks to disseminate, it is hoped, will prove helpful to our doctrine and distinctive teachings, and thus contribute to the greater efficiency of our Church as an agency for good in the intellectual, moral and spiritual interests of the people.

We would remind you, also, that the distinctive spirit of Christianity is benevolence. Responsive to this spirit our missionary work calls for the earnest co-operation of all who love our Lord Jesus Christ and the salvation of the world. We would urge greater zeal and enlarged liberality in this direction. Thus will fields already white to the harvest be entered and occupied by earnest laborers for Christ, who shall gather the sheaves into the garners of God.

We commend to your remembrance the aged and worn out ministers. and widows who have claims on your liberality. Give them to feel that not of necessity but as of a willing mind would you seek to comfort and bless them in the eventime of their life.

The sanctity of the Sabbath needs to be securely guarded against the encroachments of worldliness, which threatens this shelter of moral and religious life. Let us put forward our best endeavor that the day may be kept holy unto the Lord.

The Sabbath-school is a most important agency for good, a fundamental factor in Christ's Church work. In it earnest Church workers are doing much for God, and for the present and future welfare of the Church. The many conversions during the past year within the fold of the Sabbathschool is an assurance that this work is of God and is permanently useful. Let your influence and effort, as far as possible, help to still greater efficiency and usefulness the efforts of those who are seeking to train their children for God.

Let us be more than ever true to our Bibles. Let us make the Word of God a part of our life. This Word is a lamp to our feet and a light to our pathway. The Bible is the only true guide to faith and practice in this world. While you seek the guidance of the Divine Spirit, permit His operations largely to come to you through the written Word. In these times of unsettled religious opinions the only safety is in the Bible, studied under the direction of the Spirit of God, with a sincere heart.

May the promises of the Bible constantly cheer you through life, and comfort you in the final hour. Amen!
