New York, July 10, p. m.—A large fire at Wechawken, N. J., last night in the Eric Oil Works, caused by lightning striking an oil tank, about 7 o'clock, which contained 15,000 barrels, and the flames immediately shot apward to the height, as bystanders say, of 300 feet. The flames had gained such headway in the combustible material that one tank after another had to be abandoned by the firemen, who were utterly powerloss to arrest the progress of the fire. Five large tanks containing 16,000 barrels each, and another containing 20,000, were burned. There was little hope at the latest accounts of saving any of the oil on storage. The same oil works were struck by lightining a few years ago, but the fire was systumizated without much damage.
