intended for the insurgent army. The
vessel in this case is the well known and
alleged privateer "Batavia," but
the concession that under these circum-
stances she is entitled to clearance papers,
leaves the situation so far as she is con-
cerned quite as involved as before, as the
statutes prescribe that before clearances
shall be granted for any vessel bound to
a foreign port the owners, shippers, and
consignors of the cargo, shall state under
oath the foreign port at which the cargo
is to be landed, and severe penalties are
prescribed for violations of requirement,
including the confiscation of the vessel.
Some time yesterday the secretary of the
treasury received a telegram from the
attorney general, who had been advised
by the customs officer at Jacksonville, Fla.,
stating that the owners of the "Batavia"
would apply to the collector of
Customs at Jacksonville for clear-
ance to a Cuban port with a cargo of
arms, stating, however, that the customs
officer required by the statutes would not
be taken. The question was asked whether
under these circumstances papers would
be issued. Later in the day a telegram
