INTERESTING NOTES.

The local printings of the New Zos. lands are coming out very slowly. They seem to be in no particular harry to print from the power series of plates. Report says they see wait ing for watermarked paper. If that be 41, then the propert printings on unwatermarked paper will be worth preserving, especially upused. So far I have seen local printings of the 21d. 5d, Gl, 8d, 9d, 2s and 5a, They are all perf. It: that does not oxist in the Waterlow printings. Meanwhile, old types, all perf. 11, are being used plentifully, but the shades vary from former printings.

There is to be a new issue of stamps for the Peanch Congo. The work is to be in the fluest style, and the set should prove an attractive one. The values from 1 cent to 15 cents will show a design of a passion at bay, valurantlyed with a shiels; these from 20 cents to 73 cents will show a famals of the tribo of Bakabla, satgranthed with a bratch of the rose tree; those from 1 fr. to 2 fr. will have as a disting an alloy of communitation in Librarille, and as a watermark a branch of other.

The Dominican Republic is issuing a commemorative series. The four bigher values are the 20 centaron, representing Toscanelli replying to Columbus 50 centaron, I as Cassadefending the Indiancy I peo. Columbus in the Junta of Salemes; and 2 peecs Mausoleum of Columbus in the Cathedral of San Domingo.

All the obsolcts stamps of the island of St. Vincent remaining in the hands of the Government with the exception of the 4d. yellow, 4d. Illac, and 5s. Iska. have been destroyed. The entire quantity that disposed of consisted of \$00,000 stamps.

A series of Aut can stamps surcharged for the Orient has appeared.

BENEFITS OF STARP COLLECTING

There is possibly no subject which absorbs the attention of the intelligent public, more to day and no subject which has envolved itself and forced its consideration upon thinking minds to a greater extent—than philately. Worcester, a few years ago, defined it as the mania for collecting stamps. To-day it is classified as a science, and occupies a column in some of the leading newspaper: of Canada, it also has been admitted into the Brooklyn Institution of Arts and Sciences as a science.

A person once said to me that the government would soon be inflictina a tax on collectors, but I referred him to the derivation of the word philatele ist (from Gr. philos, a friend and atelia exemption from taxation). Putting a tax on collectors would be like taxing education, as a collection of stamps is equal to a book on geography and history. For instance a person starting to collect stumps gets one he link never seem before, he looks it up in his cotulogue, finds the price and sees the coin table of that country, then he takes his geography and finds the location of it, and lastly he puts the stamp in his album, looks at the top of the page and sees whether the country is a kingdom, an empire or a republic; he also finds there the area, - the number of inhabitants, the capital, the number of inhabitants of capital and the cont of arms of that country. What more would you want? On some stamps there is pictured to you

the industries of the people, as in the Newfoundland Jubilees and on others you can obtain a knowledge of the history of a country, as on the United States Columbians.

As another instance of the educating influence of philately, in a certain school larely when a que tion was asked the class in Latin what part of Europe was now occupied by the Helvetians, its emed to stagger almost alt the class when one of the students who had taken considerable interest in things philatelic, premptly answered "In Switzerland" and then teld them that he saw Helvetia on the stamps of Switzerland.

It would astonish many of those who look upon a collection of stamps or the desire to get a collection as a foolish fad or manis but if you will show me a young man or woman who has got even a reasonable fair collection I will show you a bright well informed person especially in the goographical and political standing of the whole civilized would.
