RETROSPECTIVE.

When the helpless state of man, if left in his natural condition, is considered, he, of all the animal creation, will be found most in want of society. By means of well regulated society the weakness of man is protected, his wants are relieved, his misfortunes alleviated, and his moral nature improved.

Society at large is highly benefitted by every institution which has a tendency to promote private friendship; the just observance of which gradually enlarges the mind and humanizes the heart. Friendship at first is confined within a very narrow compass; extending its care and attention to a few individuals. The sentiments of benevolence produced by such intercourse, soon beget a strong inclination in the human mind to extend the bounds of friendship; societies of particular ranks and descriptions of men are formed; new sources of benevolence are discovered; the understanding is improved; and at length generous sentiments of friendship to all mankind arise amongst those who at first associated only to extend their friendship to the natives of some particular spot of the earth. Minds thus prepared, consider the human race but as one society, and the wants and misfortunes of every individual equally entitled to compassion and relief.

On the 17th day of January, in the year 1786, a number of natives of the Kingdom of Ireland, inhabitants of the Town of Halifax, in the Province of Nova Scotia, (sensibly feeling the obligations which they owed to society, and zealously wishing to promote and encourage friendship and good will amongst men), held a meeting at the house of Mr. John O'Brien, in Halifax, and signed Articles of Association for the purpose of relieving the wants and misfortunes of their countrymen, which association was styled **THE CHARITABLE IRISH SOCIETY.**

The first regular meeting of the Charitable Irish Society was held on the seventeenth of February, 1786: a Constitution was adopted, and the following officers were elected:—

President,—Richard John Uniacke.

Vice-President,—Thomas Cochran.

Assistant Vice-President,—George William Sherlock.

Treasurer,—Charles Hill.

Secretary,—Gerald Fitzgerald.

Experience proving the utility of such a Society, its funds and numbers rapidly increased and the Society finding that the original Articles of Association were in many respects insufficient to govern the Society in its improved and enlarged state, CHARLES HILL and RICHARD JOHN UNIACKE, Esquires, were on the 17th day of May, in the year 1794, appointed a Committee, to review and examine the former Articles, and to report a new set of Constitutions for the future regulation of the Society.

On the 17th day of February, in the year 1795, at the Anniversary meeting of the Society, at Mr. Gallagher's, in the Town of Halifax, the Committee made its report, and a special meeting of the Society was ordered to be held on the 25th of March following for the consideration thereof; on which day the Society having met and considered the report of the Committee, a Constitution for the future regulation of the CHARITABLE IRISH SOCIETY was adopted and agreed to be observed by all its members.

In 1823 a committee, composed of Messrs. Bartholomew Hackett, Beamish Murdoch and Benjamin Salter, was appointed to revise the constitution and prepare a list of the members of the Society since its foundation, a duty which they performed to the satisfaction of the Society and for which they received its thanks.

In 1836 the Society celebrated its fiftieth anniversary in an appropriate manner, and elected the late Honorable Joseph Howe to the presidency, an office which he filled for three successive years.

A committee was appointed on the seventeenth of May, 1852, to revise the constitution; and the report of the committee was adopted on the seventeenth of August, 1853.

A committee to revise the constitution was appointed on the eighteenth of August, 1862, whose report was adopted on the second of February, 1863.

In 1864 the Society was incorporated by an Act of the Legislature; and a silver seal, costing ten pounds, was purchased.

The constitution was again revised in 1879.

On the seventeenth of January, 1886, the Society celebrated the centenary of its institution. There was an oration at the Academy of Music in the afternoon, delivered by the Honorable Thomas P. Gargan of Boston, and a banquet at Masonic Hall in the evening, at which some two hundred guests were present and a number of eloquent and appropriate speeches were delivered.

At the Society's quarterly meeting held on the seventeenth of May, 1887, the President, the Honorable James Butler, announced that the late Honorable Sir William Young had bequeathed ten thousand dollars to trustees who were to pay the income arising therefrom to the Society half-yearly. "to be applied to the general purposes of its benevolent and charitable work."

On the nineteenth of November, 1888, the Honorable L. G. Power, Mr. D. F. Power, the Secretary (Mr. A. B. Crosby), Mr. W. J. Butler, and Mr. W. A. Lyons, were appointed a committee to revise the constitution.

At the annual meeting held on the seventeenth of February, 1890, a letter from the executors of the late Honorable James Butler was read, announcing that their testator had bequeathed one thousand dollars to them in trust to pay the income therefrom to the Society half-yearly, so long as it should continue to exist.

On the seventeenth of February, 1891, the committee appointed at the meeting of November, 1888, to revise the constitution, submitted their report, which was finally adopted at the annual meeting held on the seventeenth of February, 1892.

CONSTITUTION AND BY-LAWS
OF THE
CHARITABLE IRISH SOCIETY.

ARTICLE I.

THE TITLE OF THE SOCIETY.

The title of this Society shall be the CHARITABLE IRISH SOCIETY OF HALIFAX.

ARTICLE II.

MEMBERS.

SEC. 1.—Natives of Ireland, descendants of Irish men or women, persons born in the Province of Nova Scotia; natives of any other country who are inhabitants of this Province, and who are not members of any national society established therein; and descendants of any past, present or future member of this Society shall be eligible for membership.

SEC. 2.—A person desiring to become a member of the Society must be proposed by a member thereof at a special or general meeting of the Society; and any member proposing a Candidate shall hand in the name of the Candidate in writing, stating his occupation and place of residence; but before any Candidate is balloted for, the initiation fee must be paid to the Financial Secretary. In case of non-election the fee shall be refunded.

SEC. 3. The election of members must be by ballot, but previous thereto the Committee of Investigation must report favorably in writing.

SEC. 4. No person shall be elected a member of this Society unless three-fourths of the members present at the

meeting at which he shall be balloted for shall signify their consent thereto.

Duties of members.

SEC. 5. It shall be the duty of members, to assist the Officers of the Society in discharging the duties of their respective stations; to obey the regular summonses and all constitutional orders of the Society; to be punctual in their attendance at its regular and special meetings, and in every respect to promote its interests; in all cases to be governed by the opinion of the majority; to do everything reasonably within their power to aid the poor and distressed; on all occasions to interest themselves on behalf of the oppressed or afflicted, and to comfort and relieve them as far as they are able; from time to time to inform the proper officers of the Society, if cases come to their knowledge, where the poor or distressed may be assisted by the Society, and in every respect to act as the friends of those who cannot help themselves; on all occasions to behave as good subjects, and zealously to exert themselves in support of the laws of their country, carefully avoiding in the Society all controversy on religious or political subjects. To their fellow members they are to conduct themselves with courtesy, using every means in their power to promote friendship and harmony in the Society, and between the individual members of it; to be ready on all occasions, as far as their circumstances and abilities permit, to assist members when in adversity or trouble; in case of the death of a member, to assist at his funeral, and by all means in their power to comfort and assist the widow and orphans of the deceased. Finally, it is the duty of the members by their punctual attendance at the public services of the several religious societies to which they respectively belong, and by the regularity of their lives to set a good example to others, and thereby encourage the well disposed to unite in the support of a Society, which has no other object in view but to comfort the afflicted, and to promote harmony and good will amongst men.

ARTICLE III.

HONORARY MEMBERS.

SEC. 1.—Strangers sojourning in the city, having the qualification required by Art. 2, Sec. 1, upon the recommendation of any two Officers in writing, may be admitted Honorary members, provided three-fourths of the members present at the meeting at which they shall be proposed shall consent thereto.

SEC. 2.—Active members of the Society may be transferred to the Honorary list upon sufficient cause being shown; provided always that three-fourths of the members present at any meeting when such transfer is proposed shall consent thereto.

Ordinary members. Transfer of to honorary list.

SEC. 3.—Honorary members although permitted to be present at the meetings of the Society shall not vote nor speak on the business transacted thereat.

Honorary members not to take part in business.

SEC. 4.—Any Honorary member, if at any time desirous of becoming an active member, shall signify his wish in writing to the Secretary (whose duty it shall be to make it known to the Society and propose such Honorary member in the usual manner for membership,) and the Society may at once proceed to ballot for him, and upon admission he shall pay the regular initiation fee and quarterly dues.

SEC. 5.—If at any future time a stranger who has been elected an Honorary member shall become a permanent resident of the City, he shall within three months apply for active membership (in the manner provided in the preceding section): in default of which the Society may at their own option deprive him of the privileges conferred.

ARTICLE IV.

OFFICERS OF THE SOCIETY.

SEC. 1.—The officers of the Society shall consist of a President, Vice-President, two Assistant Vice-Presidents, (viz., senior and junior), Treasurer, Marshal, Secretary, Assistant Secretary, and Financial Secretary.

SEC. 2.—The officers shall be elected by nomination and ballot at the annual meeting in February, and shall enter upon the duties of their several offices on the 1st of March next ensuing.

How elected and when.

SEC. 3.—Every candidate for office shall be put in nomination by a member, and no candidate shall be considered elected unless he has a clear majority of the votes of the members present.

SEC. 4.—When the ballot has been taken the President shall declare the number of votes each candidate has received, when (should there be no choice), the name of the candidate having the least number of votes shall be dropped and the balloting proceeded with for the others, until one shall be declared elected.

ARTICLE V.

DUTIES OF OFFICERS.

President,
his duties. — SEC. 1.—*The President.* It shall be his duty to preside at all meetings of the Society, to preserve order and decorum, to state all questions which shall arise for consideration, and, after debate, to declare the opinion of the Society according to the will of the majority thereof present; and in case any doubt shall arise with respect to the judgment of the President as to the majority in any case, he shall proceed to ascertain the opinion of the Society by a show of hands or otherwise, the majority thus ascertained to determine the question and preclude further debate thereon. He shall also have custody of the seal of the Society, and shall have power to call special meetings of the Society, and exercise such other powers as the usage of the Society has heretofore vested in him.

duties. — SEC. 2.—*The Vice-President and Assistant Vice-Presidents.* shall assist in conducting the business of the Society, and in the absence of the President shall, according to their rank, perform his duties.

Treasurer, —
his duty. — SEC. 3.—*The Treasurer* shall have charge of all funds, property, securities, books not in use, sashes and vouchers of the Society, pay all orders drawn upon him by the Secretary, when countersigned by the President or acting President, also pay all orders of a majority of the Committee of Charity to the amount of the appropriation made by the Society; he shall attend all meetings of the Society or its Officers when required, with all necessary books and papers relating to his office; shall meet with any Committee whose duty it may be to act in relation to the finances of the Society; also, at each quarterly meeting, render a written statement of the receipts and disbursements of the funds, and when going out of office shall deliver to his successor, or to whomsoever shall be appointed to receive the same, all moneys, securities, books, writings and property of the Society which may be in his possession or under his control.

his duties. — SEC. 4.—*The Secretary* shall attend all meetings of the Society, keep a correct record of the business transacted thereat, keep lists of the members of the Society, ordinary and honorary; shall summon the members to attend all regular and special meetings giving at least forty-eight hours

notice; shall previous to sending the summonses to members for regular meetings forward the same to the Financial Secretary in order that the amounts due by them respectively may be entered thereon; shall have charge of all books and papers pertaining to his office, and of all property not otherwise provided for; and all official correspondence of the Society shall be conducted by him.

The Assistant Secretary shall help the Secretary in the discharge of his duties.

SEC. 5.—*The Financial Secretary.* It shall be the duty of the Financial Secretary to keep just and true accounts between the Society and its members, credit the amounts paid and pay the same over to the Treasurer immediately, taking his receipt for the same. He shall, previous to the regular meetings, notify each member of the amount due by him to the Society, and shall report in writing to the Society at its annual meeting the amount of moneys received and the sources whence derived during his year of office, with a statement of the amount due by members to the Society. He shall make out a list of members in arrears over two years, and shall forward a notice in writing to each delinquent, requesting him to pay up arrearages. In case of such delinquent's non-compliance, his name shall be erased from the roll of membership upon the written report of the Financial Secretary; provided, however, that such person may be readmitted as a new member at any future time, on being proposed and ballotted for in the usual manner, and paying up all arrearages, and without being compelled to pay a second initiation fee.

The Financial Secretary shall keep a ledger; and a blotter as a check thereon.

SEC. 6.—*The Marshal* shall conduct all processions of the Society, subject to programme of officers or Committees, and previous thereto shall see that all banners, flags and other insignia, to be carried in such procession are properly fitted and in good order, and at meetings of the Society shall assist the President in enforcing order, and shall perform such other duties as the Society shall from time to time determine.

SEC. 7.—*Messenger.* The Society shall also appoint annually a messenger, whose duty it shall be to attend all Regular and Special meetings of the Society, and funerals of deceased members; and to perform such other necessary duties as the Society shall require. He shall receive for his services such remuneration as may be fixed by the Society.

SEC. 8.—On all public occasions, also at all meetings of the Society, the Officers are to wear green sashes with such

motto thereon as the Society shall from time to time determine; and the members of Committees of Charity, Investigation and Audit and Finance, plain green sashes.

SEC. 9.—Should any of the offices of the Society become vacant by the death, resignation or removal of the incumbent, or through any cause whatever, the Society may at its next meeting (in the usual way) proceed to elect a member to the vacant office.

ARTICLE VI.

STANDING COMMITTEES.

SEC. 1.—At each annual meeting of the Society there shall be elected a Committee of Charity, a Committee of Investigation, and a Committee of Audit and Finance, as herein-
after provided.

SEC. 2.—The Committee of Charity shall consist of six members, three of whom (the senior members) shall retire from office annually (but shall be eligible for re-election), and the Society shall elect three others in their places. This Committee shall from time to time distribute the ordinary relief of the Society to such persons as it shall think deserving, and in such manner as shall be most beneficial to the persons who receive the same, rendering quarterly reports to the Society of the expenditure of the sums voted. No relief shall be granted but with the consent of the majority of the Committee expressed in writing; and in cases of doubt or difficulty the Committee shall consult with the President and Vice-President.

SEC. 3.—As the community makes provision for the support of the poor, it shall be the duty of the Committee to interest itself on behalf of the distressed, (who by residence are entitled to a share of the public relief,) and to put them in a way of obtaining that assistance from the community at large, which by law they are entitled to.

SEC. 4.—It shall also be the duty of the Committee to attend carefully to orphans, and the children of parents whose misfortunes or vices have put it out of their power to support their offspring, taking care to have such children placed with good masters or mistresses, who may bring them up to useful employments, and, in cases of difficulty, to apply to the proper authorities, who, by law, are bound to relieve distress of this description.

SEC. 5.—It shall be the duty of the Committee to point out to the Society such measures as shall appear necessary for the Society to adopt to discourage as far as in its power the growth of vice and immorality. To discourage vice.

SEC. 6.—In all cases where the poor suffer oppression, it shall be the duty of the Committee to interpose in their behalf; and if occasion should require it, to call for the aid of the Society, which, as far as its means will permit, will have recourse to the legal authority of the country for their relief. To aid oppressed poor.

SEC. 7. In all cases where the misfortunes of individuals shall require assistance beyond the means furnished to the Committee quarterly by the Society, the Committee shall report to the Society, at their next quarterly meeting, the cases of such individuals, and suggest to the Society the means of relief; and the Society will receive no application for its extraordinary interposition until the Committee shall have first reported thereon. Cases needing extraordinary help.

SEC. 8. The Committee of Investigation shall consist of four members, two of whom, the senior members, shall retire from office annually (but shall be eligible for re-election); and the Society shall elect two others in their places. This Committee shall carefully investigate the character of every person who may be proposed as a member of the Society, and shall report thereon at the next meeting. Committee of Investigation, — mode of appointment, and duties.

SEC. 9. The Committee of Audit and Finance shall consist of three members, and shall be appointed at the annual meeting by the retiring President. Their duty shall be to examine the books and accounts of the Treasurer and Financial Secretary and Committee of Charity, and other Committees, for the year, and report thereon at the annual meeting; and also to examine and certify to the correctness of all accounts against the Society previous to their being passed for payment. In cases of great urgency bills may be paid by the Treasurer on the certificate of the Audit and Finance Committee and the order of the President. Committee of Audit and Finance, — mode of appointment, and duties.

SEC. 10.—Reports of all Committees shall be in writing, and signed by a majority. Minority reports shall also be receivable. Reports, — how made.

ARTICLE VII.

FINANCE.

SEC. 1.—Every candidate for membership before being ballotted for shall pay towards the funds of the Society the initiation fee of two dollars.

SEC. 2.—Every active member shall pay the sum of sixty-cents as dues at each quarterly meeting.

SEC. 3.—Of the amount received as initiation fees and dues at each quarterly meeting one-third shall be appropriated for charitable purposes, and two-thirds for the general expenses of the Society.

SEC. 4.—The principal of the munificent bequest of the late Sir William Young shall, in accordance with the terms of his will, remain untouched; and the income arising therefrom shall be appropriated to the charitable purposes of the Society as hereinafter provided.

SEC. 5.—The income from Sir William Young's bequest and any other bequests or donations shall be appropriated to a fund to be known as the Bequests Fund, which shall be expended only for purposes of local charity.

SEC. 6.—From this Bequests Fund the Society shall at each quarterly meeting appropriate by a majority vote to the Committee of Charity such sum as circumstances may require to be by said Committee applied to the relief of distress in Halifax.

Charities

SEC. 7.—One-third of the initiation fees and quarterly dues shall be appropriated to a fund to be known as the Charities Fund, which shall be expended for purposes of charity generally.

Quarterly

SEC. 8.—From this Charities Fund the Society may at each quarterly meeting appropriate, by a two-thirds vote, to the Committee of Charity or otherwise, such sum as circumstances may require to be applied to charitable purposes.

Balance in
Treasurer's
hands—how
disposed of.

SEC. 9.—All amounts remaining in the hands of the Treasurer over and above the quarterly vote to the Committee of

Charity, shall be deposited in one of the banks of the City of Halifax, to be drawn out on the cheque of the President or acting President, countersigned by the Treasurer.

SEC. 10.—The funds at any time in bank may, with the approval of the Society, be withdrawn and re-invested at interest in the name of the Society.

ARTICLE VIII.

MEETINGS OF THE SOCIETY.

SEC. 1.—The annual meeting of the Society shall be held on the 17th day of February, and quarterly meetings on the 17th days of May, August and November, unless any such day shall fall on Sunday, in which case the meeting shall take place on the following day. All these meetings shall commence at 8 o'clock, p. m. Twenty members in addition to the Chairman shall constitute a quorum.

SEC. 2.—Special meetings may be called by the President, under Article 5, Section 1, and also on the requisition of at least twenty members; but in the latter case the object for which the meeting is requested must be set forth in the requisition.

SEC. 3.—At all meetings of the Society members desirous of speaking on any subject under discussion shall stand and address the presiding officer, and no member shall interrupt another while speaking, or ask questions of anybody other than the presiding officer without special permission of the Society.

SEC. 4.—No member shall speak more than twice to any original resolution, or more than once to an amendment to a resolution, and the moving of any amendment immediately after a resolution shall not in any manner interfere with the privilege above accorded.

SEC. 5.—In the absence of any member who has given notice of a resolution, such resolution may be moved by any other member who is in favor of it.

Order of
business at
meetings.

SEC. 6.—At all meetings of the Society the following shall be the order of business:—

- Reading of Minutes of previous meeting or meetings.
- Reconsideration or Rescission.
- Reading report of Committee of Investigation.
- Ballotting for candidates proposed at previous meeting.
- Proposing of candidates for membership.
- Reading resolutions (if any) of which notice was given at previous meeting.
- Discussion of the same.
- Receiving reports of special or standing Committees, (if any.)
- Discussion of the same.
- Reports of Financial Secretary and Treasurer.
- Presentation of accounts and referring the same to Committee of Audit and Finance.
- Announcement of collection of evening.
- Vote to Committee of Charity.
- Election of officers.
- Any other business.
- Adjournment.

SEC. 7.—In all cases not herein provided for, the rules which govern Legislative bodies shall prevail.

ARTICLE IX.

ANNIVERSARY CELEBRATION.

Mode of
celebrating
Festival,—
how pro-
vided for.

SEC. 1.—The Society will celebrate the Annual Festival on the seventeenth day of March. On that day each member of the Society is expected to wear in his hat or on his breast a sprig of Shamrock. If the 17th of March happen to be Sunday, the Festival shall be celebrated on the Monday following. The mode of celebrating this Festival annually shall be regulated by the Society at the anniversary meeting on the 17th February; and the expenses incident thereto shall be paid as part of the general expenses of the Society.

ARTICLE X.

SEAL OF THE SOCIETY.

Seal,—mate-
rial of, de-
sign and
motto.

SEC. 1.—The seal to be used by this Society shall be of silver, having engraved thereon the figure of a woman resting on a harp, and bearing in her right hand a cross surrounded

by a wreath one half Shamrock and the other half Mayflower, with the motto "*Ubique Patrum Reminisci*;" the whole encircled with the name of the Society, the name of the City of Halifax, and the date of the Institution of the Society.

SEC. 2.—The seal shall, as before provided, remain in the custody of the President, and shall be affixed to all official documents. By whom held.

ARTICLE XI.

FUNERALS.

SEC. 1.—It shall be the duty of the Officers of the Society, upon the fact of the decease of a member being made known to them, to call upon the Society by advertisement in the newspapers or otherwise to attend his funeral, and to take such other steps in reference thereto as they may deem proper. Death of member. Duty of officers in regard thereto.

ARTICLE XII.

FRIENDLY RELATIONS.

SEC. 1.—The members of the Society will, by every means in their power, cultivate and keep up a friendly intercourse with all Societies which are or shall be formed for the purpose of granting relief to the distressed, and will use their endeavours to promote the welfare and prosperity of such Societies. Relations with sister societies.

ARTICLE XIII.

CERTIFICATES.

SEC. 1.—A certificate under the seal of the Society, and signed by the President and Secretary, shall be granted to every honorary member on his admission. In case any active member removing from the city or province shall desire a certificate, he shall apply to the Society for the same; and if a majority of the Society (on a ballot to be taken for that purpose) shall agree thereto, such certificate shall be granted to him. Certificates to honorary and active members.
