RAILWAY TO THE YUKON.

McKenzie and Mann Put Up a \$250,000 Deposit.

The Road to Be Completed by the First of September Next in Time for Next Winter's Traffic—The Contractors Will Push Forward Men and Supplies at Once—The Haulage to Be Executed by Agreement.

Toronto, Jan. 27.—The Globe this morning publishes the details of an agreement between Messrs. McKenzie, Mann & Co. and the Dominion Government for the construction of a railway to the Yukon. In the absence of the complete agreement the following summary is made from the Globe's Ottawa special.

The agreement provides for the construction of a railway from the City of Ottawa to the mouth of the Yukon River, in British Columbia, near the mouth of the Pacific Ocean, a distance of about 150 miles, thus giving connection with the Lewis or Yukon River and connecting with a port on the Pacific coast to Dawson City. This route must be completed and open to traffic by the first of September next. The contractors must also construct a practicable railway from the mouth of the Yukon to the mouth of the Yukon River, and provide suitable shelters and stopping places for travelers at intervals of ten miles or less, and the road and shelters must be available for use not later than six weeks after the first of September next. The contractors must also provide suitable transport of freight and passengers by the mouth of the Yukon River, north of 100 acres a mile of mineral lands, or 2,700,000 acres in all, to be selected from the Klondike provisional district and from the Klondike provisional district and from that part of the North-West Territory in the Yukon north of the Mackenzie River and south of the 60th parallel of latitude. It is provided that all the mineral lands to be selected shall be reserved for the Government.

Details of the disaster are as follows: The disaster occurred on the 11th of the month, when the Yorksire Regiment, under the command of Major-General Sir William Lockhart, was engaged in a battle with the Afghans. The result was a disastrous defeat, and the loss of the Regiment was estimated at 600 men.

RAILWAY TO THE YUKON.

McKenzie and Mann Put Up a
\$250,000 Deposit.

The Road to be Completed by the First
of September Next in Time for Next
Winter's Traffic. The Contractors Will
Push Forward Men and Supplies at
Once—The Bargain to be Realized by
Parliament.

Toronto, Jan. 27.—The Globe this
morning publishes the details of an agree-
ment between Messrs. McKenzie, Mann
& Co. and the Dominion Government for
the construction of a railway to the Yukon.
In the absence of the complete
agreement, the following summary is
made from the Globe's Ottawa special:

The agreement provides for the con-
struction of a railway from the existing
Canadian line at Kamouristagan, near the
mouth of Telegraph Creek, Glengora, or
the mouth of Clear Water River, north-
ward to Tealin Lake, a distance of about
150 miles, thus giving connection with
the Lewis or Yukon River, and an all-
Canadian route from Kamouristagan to
Dawson City.

No portion of the lands to be con-
tracted for shall be reserved for the
use of the Government. The contractors
must also construct a practicable
sleigh road from the mouth of the Tealin
River to Tealin Lake, and provide suit-
able shelters and stopping places for tra-
velers at intervals of not more than
fifty miles.

The lands to be reserved shall be
shelters must be available for use not
later than six weeks from now. The
contractors must also provide steamboat
transport of freight and passengers be-
tween Tealin Lake and Dawson City.

It is also provided that in deter-
mining the selection of lands for the con-

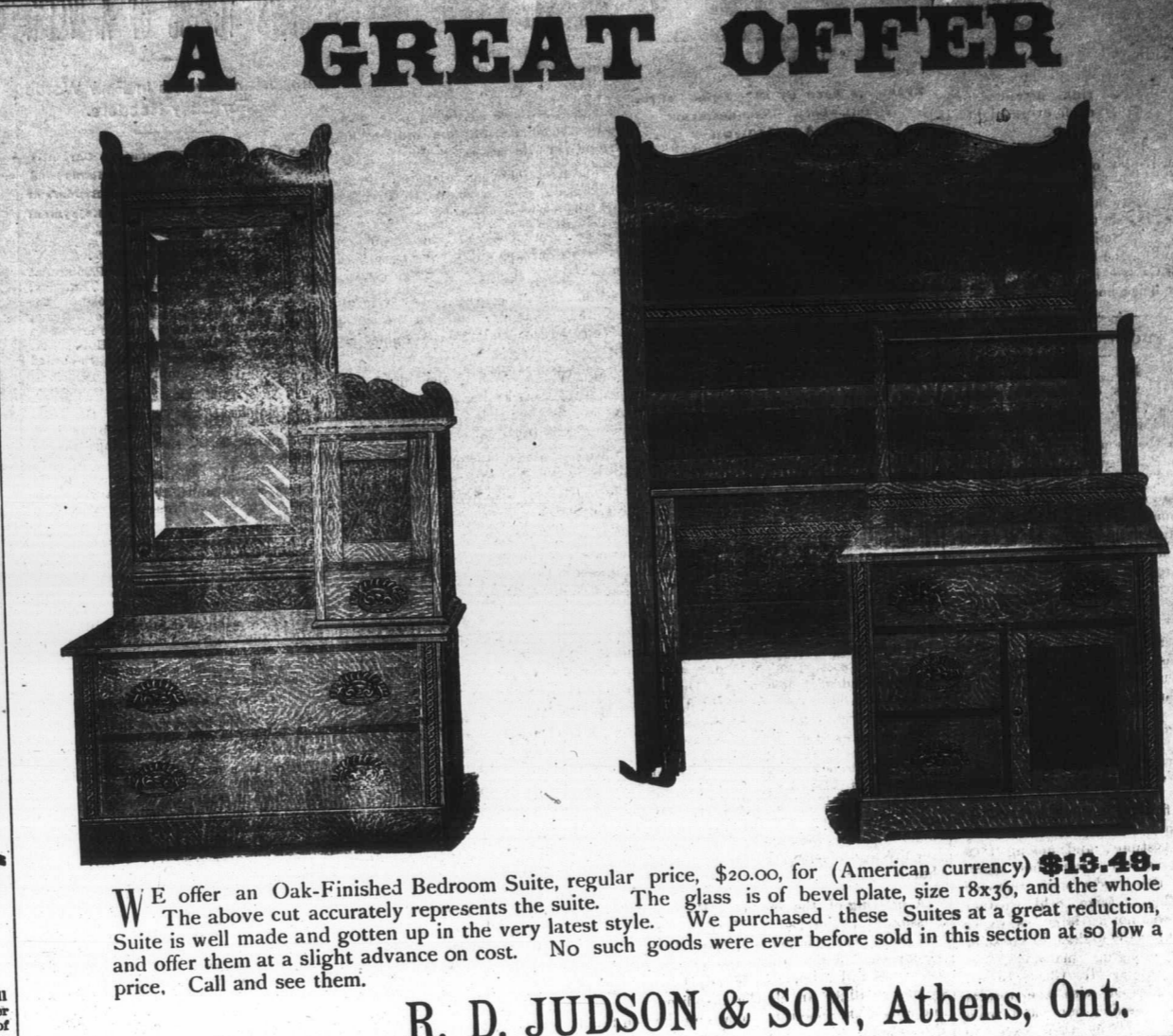

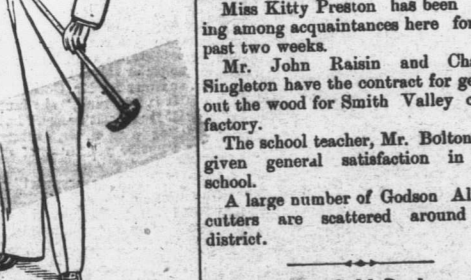
