Opening of the Adjourned Session this Morning.

An Epitome of the Despatches From All Over.

St. John is to have a fortnightly temperance paper, to be called the Prohibitionist.

Mrs. Etta J. McGarran died at Providence, N. I., Monday, at the great age of 103 years.

The Quebec legislature opened Wednesday afternoon with the usual elaborate ceremonies peculiar to that province.

Lord Aberdeen has donated a bronze medal for the Campbellton N. B. high school annually during his term of office.

The Prince and Princess of Wales have received congratulations on the betrothal of Princess Maud to Prince Charles of Denmark.

Robertson, Dominion Dairy Commissioner, is back from the Northwest and British Columbia, and reports the travelling dairies are doing great work.

The French ministry resigned Monday in consequence of an adverse vote of the chamber of deputies, following an exposure of the South of France railroad scandal.

A tremendous explosion of gas wrecked two houses in Church court, off the Strand, London, England, Tuesday evening. Eight persons were taken to the hospital badly injured.

William Wiswell, clerk of the Queen Hotel, Halifax, failed to report for duty Monday morning, and on examination of his accounts it was found that he had overdrawn \$300.

C. M. Wiggins, postmaster at Young's Cove, Grand Lake, Queens county, and a prominent citizen and merchant of that place, died yesterday morning from an attack of pneumonia.

The trial of the Marquis de Navye upon the charge of murdering the illegitimate son of his wife, began at Bourges, France, yesterday, and promises the most sensational developments.

A bomb was exploded yesterday in the monastery of Corneil, in the province of Biscay, Spain, resulting in great damage. Several of the monks died from fright caused by the explosion.

Mrs. Daniel Sullivan died very suddenly, Woodstock, Sunday morning, of heart disease. One of her daughters, a student at the Normal school here, summoned by the sad news, went home Monday.

Miss Elsie Landells, a native of Gay's River, Nova Scotia, and sister of Robert Landells some years principal of the Woodstock schools, died at St. Joseph's hospital, Victoria, B. C., Oct. 24th.

An emphatic denial that Russia and China have entered into a secret treaty (on the lines of the Times' Hong Kong despatches) has been received in London from St. Petersburg. The Russian fleet at Port Arthur is there only on a passing visit.

In the First Presbyterian church, at Windsor, Ont., the Rev. J. C. Talmie created a sensation by advocating that the basement of the new \$30,000 church be fitted up as a gymnasium, with billiard tables, etc. Anything, he said, to ward the young man from the saloon and cigar store.

Ralph McDonald, son of Dr. McDonald of Antigonish, met with a peculiar accident Wednesday evening. While at supper a needle from a piece of bread lodged in his throat. It penetrated one of the tonsils and remained imbedded there. After an operation lasting one hour a surgeon removed the needle.

For about thirty minutes Thursday, the nerve, at which all men have marvelled, forsook members Holmes in the Philadelphia court, and bowed and broken he sank his head into his hands and sobbed like a child. Miss Yoke, the woman he persists in calling his wife, and upon whom he had pinned his highest hope, sat two yards away, telling a story that slowly but surely tightened the noose on his neck.

Dr. Skinner, whose surgery at the general hospital at Guelph, Ont., was attacked Tuesday night by a patient named William McPhedran, whose was admitted to the hospital a few days ago with a broken leg.

It was found necessary to call in the police and put McPhedran in a straitjacket. Dr. Shinner received several blows on the head with a urinal and lost considerable blood.

Wm. Redmond (Parnellite), M. P. for East Clare, delivered a speech at a political meeting at Dublin, Tuesday, in which he declared among other things that the Irish question would never be settled until European questions put England in a position that she would be unable to ignore or resist the Irish demands. If Ireland did not receive a measure of autonomy in the near future Irishmen would certainly endeavor to realize the old saying that England's danger is Ireland's opportunity.

In the international regatta at Austin Texas, England will be represented in the singles by Geo. Bubar, W. Hain and America by Jake Gaudaur, W. A. Patterson, Edward Hanlon, John Toemer, 'Rag' Rogers and Chas. Gaudaur. In the doubles, England will be represented by Bubar and Barry, Hain and Wingate, while America will have Hanlon and Peterson, Toemer and Ross.

In the fours, the Gaudaurs and Toemer Ross, will fly American colors, while Wingate, Bubar, Barry and Hain, will try to whip the eagle. Each of these events include the championship of the world.

Mrs. Mary McDade of Johnston, R. I., was shot and killed last night at her home by her son Thomas McLaughlin. She was terribly kicked and beaten before a bullet through her temple put an end to her sufferings. She was married two weeks ago to James McDade, and her son's disapproval of her second marriage is believed to have led to the crime. McLaughlin was captured in the swamp a few hundred feet from the scene of the murder. He had attempted to kill himself by shooting, but was unsuccessful.

A despatch from Salt Lake City, Utah says that a crowd of Mormons left Utah this week for Alberta, N. W. T., to locate in the British possessions. A big colony will remove in the spring, in case the land is suitable and conditions are favorable. A small colony under the direction of John W. Taylor, one of the Apostles, is now located in the Northwest, on the eastern slope of the mountains. The exodus is in harmony with the ideas of church leaders who believe that the more colonies they are formed outside of Utah the greater will be the church influence.
