THE GOLDSTREAM QUARTZ DISCOVERY.

What a Chinaman Found in the Cutting.

Mr. Antonelli, contractor on the Goldstream section of the Esquimalt-Yanina Railway, came into town yesterday bringing with him several fine specimens of gold-bearing quartz from the lodes recently discovered by the railway contractors.

He says that four lodes have been discovered in the rock cutting, which is 20 feet in depth. One of these lodes is six feet wide and another four feet wide. The width of the others has not yet been determined.

Some of the specimens shown by Mr. Antonelli contain fine gold. One contains a small amount of silver.

It is of course, too soon to determine the value of this new find. From external appearances the quartz is richly considerable work may be done on the lode before a large investment of capital will be required.
