- By an understanding with the Japanese Government the number of Japanese immigrants arriving on Canadian soil has been limited to 120 por year. -An Ottawa letter refers to an important, step laving heen taken by the Customs authurities in connection with the collection of returns of exports by means of compulsory export entries at ports of exit. Collectors at all ports of exit near a correpponding port in the United States. have been instructed to ehtek Canadian expert entries with the report inward to Unit.al States Customs. By this means it is hoped in secure full rodurns of exports not reported outwards at the Canadian port of exit.
-The new british serew steamer Stratheona, built to the order of the Ihamilton \& Dort Villiam Navigation Company, IHmailton, Ont., sailed from Middlesbrough, Eng., on the 2rth ult. 'Ihe Strathcona was launched June $2 S$ from the yards of the Caledon. Shipbuiling \& Enigineering Compuny. Itid., at. Dundec, Scotland. The vessel was specially designed for the Canadian grain trade. Her principal dimensions are as follows: Length, 255 feet; breadth, 42 feet 6 inches; depth, 23 feetis inches; gross toniage, 2,000 , and carrying enpacity about 3,000 tons.

## LUMBER.

Tumber denlers in the Ottawa Valley, who have been fortimate enough to possess supplies of the lower grades of brards and deal culls, have been making pr: fits of late which do not often fall to the lot of the jobber or manufacturer of so staple an article. Prior to the fall of :0n Canadian lumbermen were subject for many years to an over-production of-what they dealt in, and a slow and limited market. But those who wit must eventually win, so hast year when all commodities went up with lengthening bounds, lumber finally followed suit, the early fall seeing quite an achance in prices owing to a good demand from the U.S. markets. The subsequent fire at Ottawa and Fall put a stain on the resonmees of the lumber mills which has been taxing their limits since, both for outside orders and lecal rebiniding. An Ottawa report states that ten yenrs ago deal culls were an overproduction and sold slowly at $3: 3.50$ and $w t$ per thousand, to-day they sell at $\$ 0.50$ to $\$ 10.30$ in Ottawa, and if the rush of building keeps up there is a likelih:od of seareity at the close of the season. In the better grates prices have not recently advanced.
Although there is a large decrease in shipments, most, of the English buyers make their purehases belore the suason opens, and mucli of the lumber burnt, in the great fire had been previously sold. Most of the mills around othawa aro ruming night and day, and a moch larger outpot is looked for this season. The Booth mills will likely cut eighty million feet. The Ihall Lumber Co., about 25,000,000: W. C. Edwards, $30,000,000$; and Rockland Mills absut twice the latter amount; Mctaurin \& McLaurin, 2ü,000,000; MoLaren of Ruckingham, 30,000,000; Gilmour's Full mills, 40,000,000, and mills at Braeside, Arnprior and Penbroke, 100,000,000. Atogether the output of the large mills hear Othawa shoald reach nearly $500,000,000$. 'Ilsere are in addition many smanl mills along the Pontiae and in the Giatineau distriet, which wil molload there, so that there should be no scarcity of building material at the end of this season.

JFE SIPREGTH OF A BANK.
Questions as to what ennstitutes the strength of a bank, and by whal tests itt is to be graged, demand for their solution a consideration of a variety of conditions, some of. Which do not appear on the surpace of a hank's statements. When the strength of a bank is affirmed as relatively high or low in degree compared with others, is it meant that it is more or less in a position to stand firm in a finmenal stom, strong, that is in resourees by which a "run" could be met without embarrassment? Or, is it meant, that if the bank were put into liguidation its issets would be ample to cover all linbilities to the public and to the stockholders? Ilhese two conditions are by no means involved the one by the other. A bank may have sound assets fully equal in value to all its oblịgations, yet might be found to be very weak indleed were

This is a very common condition in England, where numbers of the strongest banks are very inadequately equipped with such resources as are needed to meet a sudden "rum." If they had not the Bank of Englanid to help them out in an emergency it would take very little to compel hundreds of English banks to suspend payment, yet, if wound up, they would gencrally be found to have a considerable surphus over all liabilities.
Whether the Rescrve Fund is large or small in proportion to capital, or to discounts, is a factor of no moment in considering whether a bank is strong in the above sense, that is. in its being prepared for sudden calls, unless that fund has been invested with an special view to its hecoming immediately available int an emergeney. This is not customary, though, with few exceptions, the banks of Canada hold immediately available assets consideraluly

The total inmmediately available assets of the whole of the banks amomet to $\$ 115,000,000$, and the total of their reserve innds is $\$ 31,700,000$, that is, the banks have assets of this class amounting to $\$ 83,300,000$ in excess of their aggregate reserve funds. The average percentage of the immediately available assets of all the hambs to the cleposits is 40 per cont. It is manifest, therelore, first, that the Reserve Fund, as a rule, is so jovested as to be a promptly available resource and next, that the total of the jmme' diately available resources of the banks is a high percontage of those fimbs which are hable to be called for when a "rum" occurs.
It may be taken as a reasonable conchusion that, inasmuch as no dividend has to be paid on the Reserve Fund, the larger it becomes the greater is the opportunity atforded to a bamker for increasing his momediately available assets and thereloy incerensing his strengeth to the extent that strength is mensured hy capacity to meet a sutden tin won his dejosits. Here, the bills muter discomet are not regarded as assets of this chass, but in thigland they are so classed and relied, upon, as, in a dew hours, any amount of cash cim be raised on hills of a short date, when endorsed by a reputable banker. I!le whole banking system of England ilejends for its regular working upon the immediate convertibility into cash of bills discounted by banks. Thicy. therefore, can work "nearer the bone", that is, can put outall their resources, reserve limd included, into discounts safely and so make better profits than where, as in this country, it is desimble to have a large reserve invested in promptly convertible securities that are not as profitable as discounts. In time, as capital accumulates. the business of discounting bank paper will develop, just as there has
been an enormous development of loaning on other classes ol- scouritias, as bonds and stocks. Meanwhile, the policy is wise of protecting the credit of a bank, not merely by whatever strength an ordinary Reserve Fund allords, but ly holding a considerable amount of assets in reserve, that is. assets invested in such securities as would be soon turned into cash were need to arise. The strength of a bank while its busiuess is being actively comducted, comsists in the power to maintain its credit mimpaired uniler any emergency. The Reserve Fund is one of the elements of that power but it is not a leading. lactor. The main clement of that power is a body of assets capalle oll being utilized to discharge whatever liabilities are demanded by the bank's creditors.

When a bank goes into liquidation the conditions relating to its strength are materially different to those required to show strength when it was "a going concern." The liabilitics existing at the time the business closed are a fixed quamtity, but the anount of assets available for Heir redemption is unknown. We present below a table bearing on these changed conditions in which are stated, (1) the perecentage of the reserve fund of the 24 leading banks to the paid-up enpital; (2) the percentage of the reserve fund to the discounts; (3) the percentage of the paid-up capital to discounts; (4) the percentage of the total reserves to diseoments; and (5) the percentage of the total reserves to total liabilitics. By the phrase "Inotal heserves" we mean, for present purposes, the amount of the ordinary reserve fund added to the capital. We do this becmuse when a baik las to be wound up not only the ordinary reserve fund is available for meeting the liabilitics, but there is a second line of reserve mate availalle ly the amount of the capital being lable to be yanin called up. mider the double liability provision of the haw:

\#lhese are taken as comprising the Reserve liund added to tha amount of the Capital, which is liable to be called in if needed.
The first column tells its own story. The second one which gives the percentage of the Reserve Fund to Dis-
counts, shows to what extent that fund would be able to supply a deficit in realising the discounts. The third column gives the percentage that the double liability, or a duplication of the capital, would make up for the depreciated value of the discounts. The fourth column shows what percentage the total reserves, that is, the reserve fund and double liability combined, would contribute towards making up the deficit caused by depreciated discounts. The last column gives the ratio of the total reserves, as explained above, to the total liabilities, hose reserves, of course, being in excess of the ordinary assels, and ready to supplement them to that extent if neelerd to pay off the liabilities when a bank is under liquidation. Such an event is very rare indeed in Camala, there is only one now going through that operation, and that one was a very obscure and quite small alliair.
The banks of Canada stand remarkably well as regards their Reserve Fund resources. which are ample for whatever purposes they are likely to be needed to be ntilized. But, underlying the problem as to how far they, or other features in a bank's statements, indicate strength. them is this question: What is the realizable value of the assets? Whether we rely upon them to le worth their face value depends upon our confidence in the sagacity, judgment and honour of the hanker. In the last analysis, indeed, the strength of a bank is centred in the management.

## THE ALLAN mTNER IUNTSTAN EN RTITE.

The arrival in port of their magnificent new stamship, the Ilunisian, was taken advantage of by the proprietors to give a banguet to which the members of the Federal Government, and representatives of transportation and mercantile bodies were invited. After the repast the chief host, Mr. Eugh A. Allan, addressed the guests on matters relating to the harbour, and the business prospects of this port. He took the rumour that the new piers at the East End are to be made free as a good omen for this becoming a free port, which would justify it being clained to be the national port of the Dominion.

In regard to the Tunisian and her sister ship, the Bavarian, Mr. Allam said: "They both comprise, in our estimation, the best type of steamer for the carriage of passengers and freight; a combination which is necessary on the St. Tawrence route. The Tumisian and Bavarian are practically the same size and are is large as it is possible to buid vessels to run to Montreal, under present conditions. Their gross registered tonnage is $10,56 \mathrm{~m}^{\mathrm{m}}$ aid 10,300 tons tespectively, and they hare accomnodintion for 200 cabin, 230 intermediate, and 1,000 to 2.000 stecrage passengers. 'llese two steamers have been built; for our passenger service after very mature consideration: in fact, we have had some eight years in which to make up our minds what class of steamers to build. For a long time we were deterred from taking definite action owing to the nocertainty with regard to the mail scrvice: but at last a decision was forced on us by the necessity of securing extra tomage, and these two stomers are part, of the result. $T$ say pint, becouse in addition to them we have built lately the Sicilian and Corinthian. of $\mathrm{S}, 000$ tons, and are building another of about the same size. In addition to these, we have purchased a new cargo steamer. just completed of 7,000 tons. We shall be glad to consider the construction of more vessels of large tonnage and grenter speed if the Government desire an improved mail service in the near future, peading the establishment
of a fast mail line. In order, however, that lines rum ning to the St. Lawrence may in the future compete with those runuing to United States ports. for which services larger steamer are being built, it will be necessary to push forward, with all despatel, the deepening of the chamel between Montreal and Quebec."
Mr. Allan complimented the Department of Agriculture upon its splendid work done in providing every possilhe facility for the transportation of hulter, cheose, eggs, poultry, fruit. and in fact all dairy produce. For this work those interested in the trade are much indehted, said Mr:' Allan, to Mr. Sidney Fisher, the Mrinister, and Professoi lobertson, his deputy in the Dairying Department. He also thanked Sir Wilfrid Lamier, Who was present. for the active interest he hatd takeil in these matters. Mr. Allan comsidered that the future of this comntry, with its enormous extent of tervitory', and vast resources, depends largely in facilitie: for and cheapuess of" transportation. In this comection he said: "I am comvinced that the tuture of Canada is almost entirely dependent on the course to be pursuel by the Govermment. If the Government eombines its frolicy of improving our "Facilities of transportation by deeproning the camals, en(onaging the milways, improving the St. lawrence chanHels, increasing the buoys and lights, and sulsidizing an improved mail service, the time cannot be far distant when, shiphuilding having become cheaper, a last line of mail steamers equal to anything on the Athantic, and wothy of our country, will be established and be suceessful. These facts ilo not need to be further pressed upon man of expericnce and sagacity, least of all upon a statesmen so wise and patriotic as the First Minister."
In his reply Sir Wilfrid said, however we differed in some matters, all agreed that "a[ontreal must he the great carrying port of Canada. We have what no other counbry con boast of-ipland navigation; and for my part. whether 1 ann in power or in the Opposition, I maintain that the St. Lawrence must be made the great highway, not only for the western States. Hardly onc-tenth of the products of the great West reaches the St. Lewrence at the present time, but this should not be the result in the next five years." The Premier clamed that this port should be made as free as possible, as it was gencrally admitted to be the national port. He regarded it, as most desirable to have the river as far as Quebee deepened in order to keep pace with modern requirements. Short, speeches of congratulation to the Allan firm and of appreciation of their invaluable services to the commercial interests not of this port only, but to all Canada were made ly the Mayor, representatives of the Board of Trade. Corn Exchange, the Grand Irronk Railway and the Canadian Pacilie.

## TITE STREET RAIT WAY SERVICTS.

'Ihis city has just cause for pride in its strect car scrvice. A few weeks ago we accompaniod a Torontonian oyer a considerable extent of the aren covered by the electric cars for the purpose of observing the city and comparing the service with that of Tooronto. Our visitor was exceedingly delighted with the attractive trips that enn be made within the limits of the city, the monotony of the strects and their closeness being here so frequentiy broken by public parks adnraed by beds of flowers. Our companion de voyage on this occasion has a wide knowledge of the cities on this continent, and expressed freely his opiuion that in wo one of them was there a street car ser-
vice so athractive of itself, a patt from its convenience, as Alat"provided by the Montreal Stitet Cat Company. The management is worthy of the heartiest commendation for the progressive spirit it is displaying. Those who use the car several times daily are more than satisfied with the frequency and the regularity with which the route trips are madd. As a rule, a person can rely upon starting from his oftice or store and reaching any point within the city limits in from 10 to 20 minutes. There are hundreds who leave the centre of the city at noon, reach home by a car, take a lunch without haste at a distance of one or two minles, and return to business within the hour. The company is about placing ears on the streets divided into two sections. one for those who wish to smoke and the other part for ladies and non smokers. At present it is not possible to avoid the fimes of tobacco reaching those to whom it is disngreeable, and, unhappily, it seems impossible to teach some men and youths that making a car platiorm a smoking room is a public nuisance. The car officials are evidently under orders to oblige the public as far as possible, and from continual observation we regard them as anxious to do their duty. The compmany has done a good work by fusing the rails trgether so as to aroid certain irregularities of surface incident to rails being discomected. This phan makes the rumning sinoother, obviates jars and elanees of necident. As to the complaints made of irrcgular time, we regard them-and we speak from daily observation and from the reports of many car patrons-as wholly unjustified. Delays must occur in street tralfic, more especially on such narrow streets as are many in Monfreal. A clumsily handed team, the break down of a cart, and other frecuent incidents compel the cars to lose time on some trips. The action of the aldermen in this matter has been dictated by malice or a desire to blackmail the compauy. Certainly, the petty persecution to which the Street Car Co. has been subjected of late has not been inspired by zeal for the public convenience. The company has shown such zeal abundantly, and very naturally so, for, as the managers and directors are business men, they are fully alive to the profitableness of catering to the tastes and the convenience of the public. The more cars are run, the more punctual the service, the more passengers are carried. The citizens of and the visitors to Montreal have every reason to be, and they are highly satisfied with the locai clectric car service.

## A MUNICTPALIIIY'S INDEBITEDNESS.

A subscriber at St. Mary's enquires, "What "is the proper way to quote a town or city's indebtedness, its debentures, or its debentures out and compons attachech. where there is no Sinking Fund?" The question has proved a very puzzling one to many besides our esteemed correspondent. The trouble arises from not clearly moderstanding what a Debenture really is, and what obligation it involves. A debenture is a form of promissory note, it is a document by virtue of which the municipality issuing it is bound to pay a certain sum to the holiter of the debenture on a certain date, with intercst yearly or half yearly, as specified. It is usual to attach coupons to each debenture which entitlo the holder to a certain sum at a certain date, such sum boing the interest then due on the debenture. Now, when these documents have been duly authorized by a by-law and formally signed in the name and on behalf. of a corporation they are ready to he issued as vouchers of a loan to that
extent having been made to the corporation hy whoever secures possession iff them by ping over mener forsurd loan. Suppese that 20 debentures lor $\$ 1.000$ each have heen pul into legal, negotiathe form for a total of \$20. 000 , and there are investors fomend who alvance this muney to the corparetion. It is manifest that the town of cily"* indebtedness in such an case is 苏: 0,000 . But, suppose that the dehentures lor $\$ 20,000$ are all in order allhengh invertors em only be fomen for hate of thems $\$ 10,000$, and the rest remain missued. It is expally mamilese that the tawn or eitys indebtedness is not the Whole amomit of the ilebentures prepared for issue, hut is moly the amome of those for which the money they represent has heen received. If, in such a case, the wnissued debentures are burnt, the imblebelness al the corporation is mut affected, as such docmments, until issuer for value, canry me obligation. If a comporation has reeeved value for certain debentures and then buys them back to serve its a sinking lumb, the operation is practically a redemphion of the debt to that extent. For bookkeeping jurposes the entire amomit of the debentures issucd may be conlinneat to be shown as the debt of the corpmation, and, on the other side of the aceount, will be shown the mament of the delentures, redeemed. or purehased back, so the true indeltedness is thas ohseme, as the real deb, is the amount of the delemtures issued less the amount of those relemed or purehased back. fet any one ask: What money would the corporation have to pay to clear oft its dehin? The answer to this will give the amount of its achaal indehtedness, hence the proper way to quote a town or city's indebtelness is to sate the actual amount it would have to pay to clear oft its formal engagements. Whon a corporation buys back some ol. its own debentures every year for sinking fime purposes, and waits untia the whole of them have heen purehased belore elosing its debenture debe secount, that aceomb, and the sinking fund account can both be elosed up ly one jownal entry, wilhout any transaction in money.

## THE EVOTATION OT ADVERIMSING.

I.t is highly sigmificant to find the Amerienn Banker remarking upon the increase of advertising by banks. The old-lashioned idea as to the needlessness of alvertising to abouk is nothing more nor less than a survival ol: a prejudice which was the natumal product of conditions long since passed away. A banker who, in these days, iloes sot appreciate the value of advertising, simply prochaims himsell a finameial lip Van Winkse who is not yet wide enongh awake to realize the changes made in the world since he went to sleep years ago.
Some years ago the extent to which advertising was done was very limited. Insurance companies in England never advertised, nor did bunkers, nor protessional men, nor hotels, now leading merehants. The renson for this ubslinence is not far to seek. Newspapers had a very small circulation; very feer passed out of the place where they were issued; their readers were a limiled chass; there was no "public" to uppeal to in the morlern sense; competition hetween companies and lirms, and prifite traders was of a very mild type; it was indeed deprecated as uindignified. If a naw firm, or one nwakening to the new conditions springing up, began to advertise, there were many who regarded this course as undue presumption, as a breach of the etiquette of trade.

As time went on, and newspapers greatly enlarged their circulation. both in numbers and in the area wherein they were taken, there gradually arose a realization of the oprormaty olfored by advertising for inerensing business by directly soliciting it. The old-rashimed idea that such solicitation was undignified gave way before the experience inatit paid. All engaged iin meramite enterprises soon canght the spivit of the advertising em, they knew they were in trade to make money ami, haring learnt by experience how alvertising enlangel their business, they freely used the new medium for soliciting custom. Still, for years, some of the old spirit lingered in the directors and managers of insume companies and banks. They cherished the idea of their dignity be: ing imperilled by advertising, until some of these lossils began to see that their business was in peril from the imroads made in it by advertising competitors. When one insurance company decided to place its eard in a daily paper, one of its directors, a city magnate, was so shocked at the sight of his name in the alvertisement that he resigned. So fastidious were men of the ofd sehool that, years ago, on the bank oflices in many towns and eities there was no sign of any kind, not even a door plate, or an inscription on the window blinds. This privacy was a survival from days when commmitios were very simall, very self-contained, very little troubled with visitors, when everybody knew not only crerybody, but: everybody's business habits.
This avoidauce of publicity still lingers chiefly in the medical profession, the members of which, though longing for patients and half-starved for lack of them, are so bound by tradition that they will not let the fact be made public that they are at the service of patients. Lawyers are less hampered by old-time notions. but they assume a shyness in regard to advertising which is the only necasion they take for displaying modesty. The business man of to-day, be he "on his own hook" or the chicf ollicial of a company, who refirins from advertising is a survival of a past age. To keep up his outward appearance in harmony with his prejudices he ought to ilress in a blue coat with brass buttons; a flower-figured waistcoat; flesh-coloured pantaloons; shoos with large silver buckles; and have a deep friil on his shirt front; and wear a neck cloth of the Beau Brummel type. His antiadvertising notions are sadly out of hatmony with an up-to-date costume and with the prevalent customs of today. He ignores the revolution that has come over the conditions of business in the last hall coutury, which has made it necessary, for those who desire business to say so phanly, as the public now naturally judge that, those who keep silent have decided to retire from active mercantile life and are winding-up their aflairs ready tor exit.

The public is a very polite body; if it sees a trader or a company avoiding publicity, it has the good mamers to take the hint and shows its politeness by avoiding such trader or company, lest he or its quietude be broken. The non-advertiser advertises thereby that he does not wish to be disturbed. The busy, energetic men of the time to not care to be associated with such droning specimeins of: the antique as a non-advertiscr. As the classic phrase is, they "have no usc" for men of that class. Whe mon-aitvertiser gives himself away by this practice, an it is intallible evidence of his whole business make up being also slow; behind the times; out of harmony with modern ways and requirements. He is like a man on a sidewalk looking at a procession, he is "not in it"" with the movement and the life of the present day.


The banks in the United States are developing new advertising methods. They are issuing "leaffots, calendars, paper cutcers, and other reminders that the lomks are alive to the utility of publicity." The last phane "the utility of putbicity" puts the adrertising question in a mutshell. Those who do not believe in the utility of publicity, who do not wish their business to be widely known. who have no desire to see it expand, such persons keep in the backeground, but, whoever appreciates the utility of publicity takes such measures by arlvertising as commands public altention to be paid to the hasiness in which he is engaged.

## THE DANGER OR MUNICIPAL CORRUPTTON.

A scandal has arisen in connection with the aftairs of the monicipality of St. Pancras, one of the divisions of the British metropolis. The affair, so far as it has been exposed, was a mere trille as such things go on this side. Indeed, there are sume who consider the practice of the officials under censure as not blameable being little more than the receipt of favours from tradesmen and contractors who tumished supplies to the corporation. The London "Fconomist" admits the pettiness of the charges as compared with "the wholesnle bribery and downright stealing in New York, Philacielphia and other American cities." but points out the necessity of stopping such: mean and petty oficnces before they grow into dangerous public scandals. Our contemporary uses the incident for comment upon the danger of mmicipal corruption.

Municipal corraption has attained to its full height in America. In Europe, as a whole, it is not nenaly so ohvious, while in one great Europan comtry-Cermany, it may be said, practically not to exist. In Germany there are old and high traditions of honour, the municipal office extends over a long term of yenrs, and Govermmental supervision is rigorons. The result is that the office is sought after in Gemman cities ly men of high standing who bring to their publie work that laborious elficiency,
and that desire to do something thoroughly and well which have raised Germany to such a lafty pimate in our time. The Trench municipality is not so groot, but it is improving under the legistation of 1.884. Here again, however, the Govermment exercises stringent control over the finances of municinal comencils. and so does much to provent pilfering. Italy and Spain reprosent a lower level of municipal tife, and in the former combtry the scandals of which we are treating lave not heen mknown. But even here we inagine that inefliciency is prebably a more serious enemy than positive coryption. Why the municipal life of the United States should have displayed such a dark record in comparison with that of Ingland and the Continent is not easy to explain. Patly, it is due to the fact that a heterogencous population assembled purely for money-making is gathered lugether in one spot, destitute of commoni interests or tralitions, and in many cases, speaking diverse languages. Such a population is the olvious prey of any political adventurer. Soon the relations between the "hoss" and the constituency take a definite chameter and an organized attitude. Tammany has in the main robbed the rich, but it has paid poor labour at a high rate of wages, and lans given the roughs limitless opportunities for drinking, while, at the same time, enriching the drink sellers by ontribntions.levied ona the latter for political purposes. In this way a solid community of interests has heen built up, which it has been vainly attempted up to the present to break down. In nearly all comentries theye is more danger of corruption in municipal than in national aftars. This camot be entirely due to the more direct supervision over the latter than over the former. It is far easiec for the inhabitant Tititle Peddlington to look closely after his local rates and expenditure than it is to follow the complicated finance of the Govermment. He is alko more interested in it. The thing is mader his own nose, and concerns itself with his daily occupation. The persons responsible are his own neighbours, and he can tackle and criticise them directly. But "the Government" is some

IThe reasm, theretore, for greater danger of en er ruption in tocal than in mational altairs, must be snoght elsewhere. The chief reason probably lies in the fact that local ofices are not accounted particulaty honom? able, white any great mational olfice is associated with greal interests, with high honomr, with a complex-mesh of sembiments about the lligg and the eomitry which camol be expected in local matiers. IPhe truth is that it wquires at mither high moral chatracter to administer lamell allairs. 'Ihere is no pay, there is mo glory, there is mol a litide drulgery it one's duty is to he done. And as high morad qualities are rare, and the mass of men demand some palpable material gain for anything they do. it tollows that there is a permanent risk of local work being attended by a grod ileal of corrupt instinet, and some alsolutely corrupt pratices.

Ihis thanger is now perepubly inerensed by two late: the entargement of the lunclions of the municipality, and The immense growth of modern cities. Mimicipal life is really intended for neighbours who know one another. and who can, therefore, ensily and eorrectly judge of one mother's character anil capaety. lint in large citios Where are no ncighbours, exeept in in merely physical sense; noboily knows or carces who lives next door, so long as there is no positive misiance. Consequently, the check of incessant; publie eriticism and watehtuhness is largely ibseut, and one must rely on the inpertect ageney of the Press to diselose mul disenss jublie scmindals. It is clear that the dangers of municipal corraption ate not small. Still elearer is it that such corruption, if it once appeared on any eonsiderable seale. would play serous havoe with the interests ol daily life. This week Philadelphin is busy with two seandals, the city architect
and building-inspector having heen proved to be stameling in with a contractor for a city sehool, and a weathy brewer has confessed to the grossest bribery of electors when emulidate for oflice of conucil man.

## THE MURDERED KLING OT IMATY.

On Sunday evening last King Thumbert of Ttaly was nssassimated when leaving the gromuls at Momza where he hand witnessed and distributed the pri\%es of a popular gymastic exhibition. On entering his carminge amid We cheors of a large crowd of his subjeets, he was struek dead by: three shots lirom a revolver. The assassin was seized and with rilliculty saved from swift punishment by the onlookers. He is an Hatian who had lived some time in the States where doubthess be imbibed the antimonarehieal notions which inspired his crime. There have been kings whe courted vengemee by their tymany. But; by a strange irony of fate, the rulers who most deserved punishment: lave escapeci, while others who were imnocent of any wrong done to their subjects, or to those they governed. have been sent, suddenly to their account, like the King of Denmark,--
" Unhousel'd, disappointed, unamel'd,
No reckoning made--"
The Czirl of Russia. who was killed so horribly was one of of the best and most progressive of the rulers of that Empire. Lineoln and Garfield, the two American Presidents, who were assassinated, were wholly guittless of any ileed justifying the wrath of an enemy. The Empress of Austria, who was so foully slain by an Thalian, was a singinlarly inoffensive womam. with habits and tastes that made her highly popular. History affords ample material for those who choose to

Under his rule the railways of Ttaly have heen extended, the school system very widely extended, and the pemal coile remodelled and made as humane is becomes a eivilizeil combtry. He was a most gencrous promoter of the liberal atts and of science. Thaly stamds in the front rank for its electrical experts, thamks to King THubert's gremerous aid to scientific research. His manmers were by some suid to be "Jacking in dignity," in lie was so approachialle and so free from hanteur or the austerity which some mistake for dignity. Why slich a man should be foully murdered admits of no answer heyond this that the very virtues, services, popularity of a king excite the demmiac hatred of men embued with anti-momarchical illens. Denth loves a shining mark, so also does the demon of social anarchy.

## CHTNESB DIS'IUTBANCTS AND TPADE:

Whatever may be the peceise nature of the disturi, ances in China, respecting which the authorities of that Fimpire have been sending out a flood of dalsehooils. there is no doubt as to such troubles having an mpressive influence on its foreign turde. : The chief sufferen will be England, as hy far the harge parion of the goods lought by China and the greater part of that empires ex-
ports are sold and bought respectively through British houses. The prospect, at present, of cnormous expansion in the internal trade of China by the building of railroads is not bright, nor is it likely that the consumption of European goods will be as great after the troubles are settled as they have been, for there will be even greater prejudice than before against the introduction of foreign goods. On the other hand. the development of manufacturing industries in China, which have beon spoken of as threatening to be a danger to the trade interests of Europe in the Tast, will be seriously checked by the present disturbances. After, a violent storm there continues to be a heavy swell on the waters for a length of time, so, after the commotion such as is going on in China has passed its more acute stage, there will be for yenrs probably a degree of disquietude and lack of social stendiness which will be most unfavourable to the growth of new enterprises. The present troubles nere being made a factor in the stock market tending to depress prices. The N. Y. Financial News discusses this aspect of the China ruustion in a recent issue. The question, however, arises, if the loss of the trade which will undonbtedly for the time be sustained is not being over-estimated. 'Ithe simple statement of Americom trade with China in 1899 shows that in the year specified the States imported from that coumtry $\$ 18,000,000$ in round figures, the total being about two millions less than any one of the four preecding years. The general character of these imports is such that to a very considerable degree they can be replaced by similar imports from other Asiatic sourecs. and but fow are of an ahsolutely essential chameter, nearly half of the total being compriset of silks. Thuning (o) the T. S. exports for the past year, we find the total sum is $\$ 14,000,000$, which in contmast to decrensing imports constituted the largest exports ever made by the United


States to China. Here ${ }_{n}$ then, we have a total import and export trade of approximately $\$ 32.000,000$, an amomit not equal to the country's last month's excess of exports ( $(\$ t 5,000,000)$ over its imports. Such would be the loss of trate were China entirely eliminated from all international trade. Here, however, arises the question whether in comection with the invaling armies now landing on her shores with the intent of penctrating the interior, the States will not be ealled upon for exports that will ath least equal those formerly made to China itsolf. The magnitude of these requirements must be talken in comnection with the fact that tramsportation as krown to Europe or This comatry existed to but a very limited degree, and that such as it was has been absoluteIy destroyed. Rven were supplies in Europe as abmo dant and chenp as in America, geograhpieally this contiuent is the nearest base from which Europes amies can be supported. It also semens to us that it will in many ways prove a stimulant to trate with the Philippines. It will raise their importance as an intermediate base of sulphies and as a coaling station of Buropers navies and fransports. so largely gathered in the Bast, and which can he supplied probably at less cost, with A merican enal than mader existing high priees abroad than that shipped from Great Britain or Germany. Atagether, we iloubt if the loss of the direct trade of the States with Chinti will ereate more than a ripple in merenntile circles. Of eourse such articles as come exclusively from China will muloubtedly become searee and adrance in price, but: they are not of a characer that is in any way essentiat, fond in the majority of eases if will be found that high
prices will lead to new sources of supply. Did we but tee as sure of loss of life being as small in the prosecution of the Chinese war as we do of losses thirongh our altered business relations, it would lead to but little apprehension or anxiety.

## ITHE ANNEXAIITON BRIGADE.

Smith, and Mr. Honore Mercier. Theso persons, we learn, were consumed with a desire to be the Jiberators of Canada, and the annexers of this Dominion to the Onited States. Mr. Dana is dead, Mr. Mercier also, Mr. Goldwin Smith is a political back number, and the only one left of the quartette of conspirators is Mr . Wayland Glen, who. by a sort of premature metempsychosis, has been transformed into an incarmation of the Continental National Union movement. For ladies' wear it is also known as a shirt waist but the name blonse is more genemally applied. In men's wear this gament is also called a jacket but the former is generally used. Now, as to the difference in color, there is sometimes little and often nome. In men's shirt waists or blouses navy or ultra-marine "blue, predominates, a sky blue and white check following as a close second, while for indoor wenr a white, in twill (not pique) or plain weave is preferable.
As to make, the male garment does not come under the the decree of fashion as regularly as its varying sister. It adopted at the outset, which, according to history, was at the building of the great wall of Tadrian and first introduced in Canada at the buijding of the Tachine canal, either an ordinary folding collar, an extended point 'or firemen's collar, or felled seam without collar. 'Ihese

Various reports are to hand dealing with the Manitoba wheat crop，and for the possibilities of the yield it is well that they do not all agree．This is natural in reports com－ ing from various centres，compiled from varions sources and collected in various ways．＇that they each give unbiased accounts is accepted，but from all must be gathered the substance which is most likely to prevail after the crops are Gureshed．A net yjeld of 11 to 12 bushels or 9 to $91 / 2$ bushels on the area sowed and allowed to mature，seems likely．The following sent by Thon．J．A．Davidson，Minister of Agrient－ lure，does not quite compare．Ife states that according to reports being received by the department the erop pros－ peets for the year are not promising．The grain which it will be possible to cut will not average above ten bushels an ucre throughout the province，but the crop on about twenty－five per cent．of the acreage sown will not be cut， thus reducing the average yield of the province on the laud verded to about seven bushels per acere．This means that the fotal yield for the province for the year will be in the neighborhood of from ten million to eleven million bushels of wheat．liour millions will be rectuired for next yents seed and local consumption，leaving only about seven mit－ lion bushes for export．

This judgment is an important one, in that it is the first judicial ruling recognizing the status of the National Irust Compalty and its qualifications to carr:out the duties of liquidator in this Province. There is a growing feeling What the interests of creditors of insolvent estates would be greatly safeguarded and their dividends increased were trust companies to be more generally used in matters of insolvency, mother than private firms or individ"ais acting as assiguces, trequently without the necessary office or stafi equipment, and as a rule unable to ofler suflicient tinancial guarantee. The large capitals of the trust companies here, of which there are now. thres, the National Trust Company, limited, the Royal Trusi Company, and We Montreal I'rust \& Deposit Company, is the best guarantee that their lunctions as trustees and liquidators in all cases will be performed economicalIy and correctly in every respect-they must make grood any errors, whereas (as may be the casc) impecunious assignees have nothing more substantial
than regrets to offer for errors of judgment or worse.

Although exciting bulletins are being posted which seem to put a better cinuplexion on the Chinese situation, we have been too often deccived by reports hrom that quarter to heed any until better authenticated. The money mariset is much disturbed by the prospect of heuvy expenditures in the bast by all the chief powers of the worta. All being more or less involved in war operations, or preparations, cach will have its resources tied up, and the needy ones will have ditliculty In securing help. United States finauciers are speculating upon in consideruide drain of gold to burope being calisud by the war. As gold is Howing in trom the Klondyke and Austra1a, and lie exports of grain and proauce are about to be heavy, the stock oi grold in the States will stand a drain without causing any condition of a reshrictive nature. 'lhe uncertainties of the siluation are giving the bears plenty of scope for stamping around. yn the local change business has been annost suspended. Opinion as to the Manituba crop of wheat seems settling down to accepting it as about half that of last year. 'Lhis is a serious drop, , ub prices are about $31 / 2$ cents per bushel higher so there is some compensation. The world's crop is being es timated at a good average, and that of the states lugher than last year by 5 mulliun bushels. 'lhe railways are having arger passenger receipts than last year, indeed on some lines the receipts are umprecedented. Consols are quoted at 97 5-16. In London the rate of discount in open market yesterday was 4 to $41 / 8$ for 3 months. In New York, money on call was nomiually at $11 / 2$ per cent.; prime mercantile paper, 4 to $4 \frac{3}{4}$ per cent:. Sterling exchauge steady, at $4.871 / 2$ to 4 .$875 / 8$ for demand and $4.837 / 8$, for sixty days. Posted rates, $4.841 / 2$ to 4.85 and $4.881 / 2$. Commercial bills, 4.83 to $4.831 / 2$. Silver eertificates, $611 / 4 \mathrm{e}$ to
$621 / 2 \mathrm{c}$; bar silver, $607 / 8 \mathrm{c}$; Mexican dollars, $481 / 2 \mathrm{c}$. Government bonds, steady. In this city sterling exchange stands, between banks, sixties, $813-10$ to $87 / 8$; demand, dialts, $95 / 8$ to $91-16$, and cables $93 / 4$ to $97 / 8$. Over the counter sixties 9 to $91 / 8$, and emand drafts $93 / 4$ to 10 , and cables $101 / 8$. Commercial sixties $81 / 2$, and three days' sight drafts $91 / 4$. Despite the inactivity which is expeeted bo mark midsummer trade, business in most limes in Montreal is showing a fair degree of animation. Leather is heing steadily shipped to lingland at satisfactory prices. Dairy products are high in price and fairly brisk in demand, which is much capital in the poeket of the larmer and manufichurer. Groceries are steady, with more movementin tea, molasses, sugars and currants. Dry grods are inclined to quietness owing to bad weather conditions. Harvesting has begun and the older provinces will reap good yields. Manituba is hoperul of better returns than last ollicial dispatches indieated. 'luryentine has dechined. Glass is likely to atvance.
Burusen--Dilne market is showing a quicter apparance, urade, since the opening of the week, being light. Still, prices show little or no change and stocks are held with confidence. Finest creamery is dealt in at 21 c to $: 21 / 2 \mathrm{c}$. lin dairy there is a good business passing, orders coming in freely, principaliy for Bristol and Manchester account at trom 17 e to $171 / 2 \mathrm{c}$. Boxes readily bring the outside price. Medium grades are more plentiful. W guote prices easier at 140 to 15 c .
Cembenis, Efc.-Arrivals for week ending 31st ult., were: 43,000 fire bricks and 1,550 brls. German cement. A lair jobbing trade exists but nothing beyoud small lots is reported moving or on point of changiag owners. Quotations remain steady.
Cimese.-The marleet is quite strong with colored in light supply and commanding $1 / 4 \mathrm{c}$ advance on finest white. Sales runge at between $91 / 2 \mathrm{c}$ to 10 c , as to color. Quebec product is quoted at 9e to $91 \%$ c. At Woodstock, Ont., on the 1 st , 1 ,s83 boxes were oflered.

95 sc bid but refused. At Picton,Ont, on same date, 1,020 boxes offered, all colored, 540 sold at 9 15-16c.
Diry Goobs.-I'rade has been rather slow of late, hindered somewhat by the excessive rains and changeable weather. Among samples of new spring dress suitings are shown velvet effects in dots and stripes, one of black and white irregrular stripes being particurarly noticatible. Another fabric of silk and cotton, the silk in undulating stripes, is salid to be very popular on the other side. 'These goods are catculated to sell as high as $\$ 3$ to $\$ 3.50$ a yard. A wide variety of mohairs in blacks, navies, pastel shades and fancy colorings both in phain and figured ellects will also bo favored. Perola erepon is another new fabric which will solicit lavor. P'rospects are that values will hold firm at present prices.
EgGs.-Receipts are more liberal and quality is running very unsatisfactory, dausing ,much trouble to receiveus who tre obliged to sell loss oft. This brings a slatinkage of 1 to 4 doz. per case as to quality. Strictly fresh egges new crop in better request, present receipts meeting with ready sale at 14 c to 15 c .

Flour \& feed.-Hollowing a preciod of aetivily at the recent reaction from high figures the flour manket is agrain quiet as a result. Wheat indications are for a term of steady prices as littie change from the estimates of previous weeks is shown in latest returns. Ontario and Manitoba wheat fields are inviting the reaper, the former bearing the appeiarance of a good average yield. beed is in good demand. Rolled uats is quiet in movement. Hiy will be a fair average crop both in Ontario and Quelsec, the heavy mins threatening mildew, buti of this there have been no complaints so far. .'The U. S. Quartermaster's Department has given out at contriact for $6,000,000 \mathrm{lbs}$ of timothy hay for use at ilanilla. The amount seems large but 7,000 mules, would consuive it in a month and lick for more. The quotations are: Nour-Winter wheat patents, $\$ 3.90$ to $\$ 4.25$; straight rollers, $\$ 3.85$ to $\$ 3.90$; in bags, $\$ 1.50$ to $\$ 1.55$; Manitobi patents; $\$ 4.65$; strong baleers, $\$ 4,35$; bran, bulk, $\$ 14$; shorts, \$Li6; moulle; $\$ 19$ to $\$ 22$ ton; ontmeal, $\$ 3.30$ to $\$ 3.35$; and $\$ 1: 6^{1} 0$ to $\$ 1.65$ per bag; baled hay, No. 1; $\$ 9.50$ to $\$ 10$; No. $2, \$ 5.25$ to $\$ 0$; clover and mixed, $\$ 7$ to $\$ 7.50$. Best timothy hay in bulk is
held at $\$ 8.75$ to $\$ 9$ per load, averaging $1,500 \mathrm{lbs}$.
Gireen Hides.-An advance of 10 c in lambslinins this week is the only notable leature of this generally quiet branch of summer business. The rise is natural, with the growth of lambs as the season advances. Other hides are dull. Chicago packer hides are being held at a fraction over buyers' limit. A sale of 6,000 native steer hides, JuneJuly take ofi, was made this week, at 10c, but most holders refused this price and held on to stock for $1 / 2 \mathrm{c}$ more. The New York market showed a simijar disposition on the part of salters and little business was being transucted :grainst dirm prices.
Gitocenies.--The high mark reached by sugurs tep days ago has been held with firmuess since. Trade is brisk even at these unusual prices, for they acted ats the time of year when this staple is in greatest demand. Granulated is $\$ 5.20$ with yollows $\$ 4.50$ to $\$ 5$, as to grade. As to the probabilities it is haril to judge. Foreign markets seem to be comparatively short of refining supplies, and it is salfe to presume the U.S. refiners will keep priees at a redeeming point as long as possible. Currants are very firm. A Montreal importing house sold 50 brls. this week on wholesale account at 5 c . 'Molusses' is steady. 'Two sailing vessels, the Alice and Glemosa, arrived in por't this week from Barbadoes, with 1,400 puncheons for Laporte, Martin \& Co. 'Ihe greater portion has already beeu sold. I'ea appears to be gaining in firmness every way. Japans are creating greatest attention, particularly in low to medium grades. There is nothing under 15 c on the market. Cunned corn is scarce at $\$ 1.25$ for lowest. Prunes may be dearer as the Califoria combine has 90 per cent. of the fruit engaged and will look out for profits. Canned salmon will, in all probability, be dearer as the entire West coast is short and consumption shows a steady annual increase. Mail idvices from Patras, Greece, report the currant market in a very excited state, and that it is extremely diffcult if not quite impossible to buy. The weather continues wet and the damage to the new crop increasing. Hills Bros. Co.'s advices say regarding the retention law that while it might be correct to suppose that the Government would not change the minimum amount of currants to be taken into

the Retention stores from 10 per cent. still damage to the new crop is so exceptional and the diminution so serious that it is possible the Government may reduce the percentage of the Retention to five per cent. or even less. Whatever course the Govermment pursues will be finally decided before August 1 . Continuing, the advices say: Even should the Greek Government decide to entirely repeal the Retention law for this year, which is improbuble, such action would have little if any ellect on the market, the crop being so. small that it will probably not be suflicient to cover the world's requirements even at high prices." They ilso advise that the quality of the new crop will be in no wise affected by the peronosporos. 'lhe bunches and berries which are aftected by this disease are altogether destroyed leaving the untouched berries in a healthy and sound condition. The quality of the new liruit can now only be aflected by wet weather during maturity and the drying period. The latest advices variously estimate the outturn of the crop at not over 70,000 to 80,000 tons.
Wardwate \& Metals.-Local prices on hardware have remained steady for the past week, with the exception of bar ivon which has been reduced 5 cents per 10 pounds, making base for car lots now \$2.15, and for smaller quintities 5c extia. Provisions.-There has been a decline in hams and bacon equal to $1 / 2 \mathrm{c}$ per lb. on some grades.
