PREFACE.

THIS League after having been projected during the two previous years, was formed, provisionally, by a few of the present members in October, 1892.

Its purpose is to answer the want of a Canadian National Society. The central, but by no means the exclusive, feature is an Annual Canadian Entertainment at Midwinter. On the 17th of February, 1893, the first or experimental entertainment was held in the Windsor Hall, Sir Donald Smith presiding. Principal Grant delivered the address of the occasion, three hundred school children were among the performers, and so satisfactory were the results that the provisional organization was soon afterwards changed into a permanent one, and a young Canadian National Society took its place in the community.

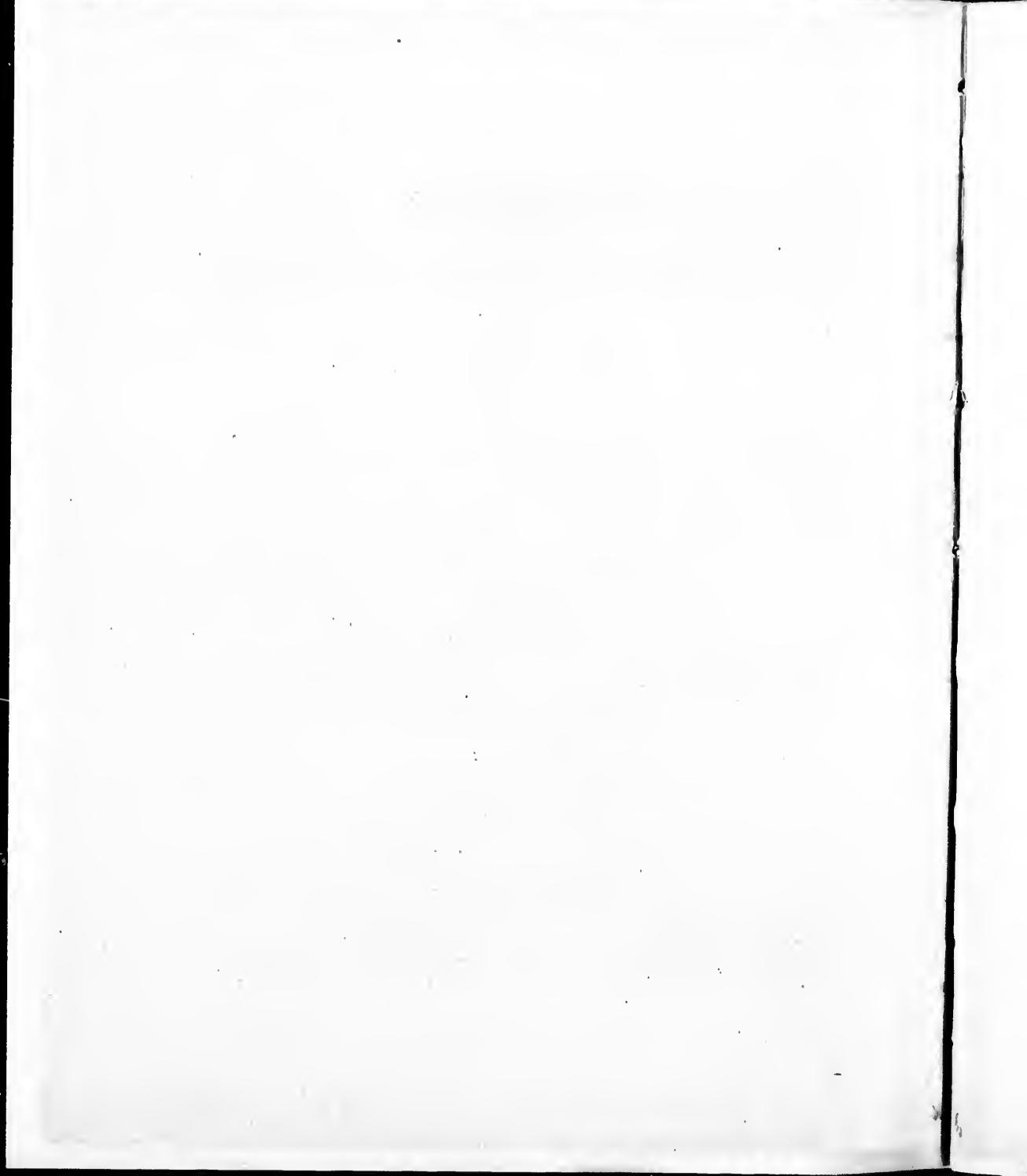

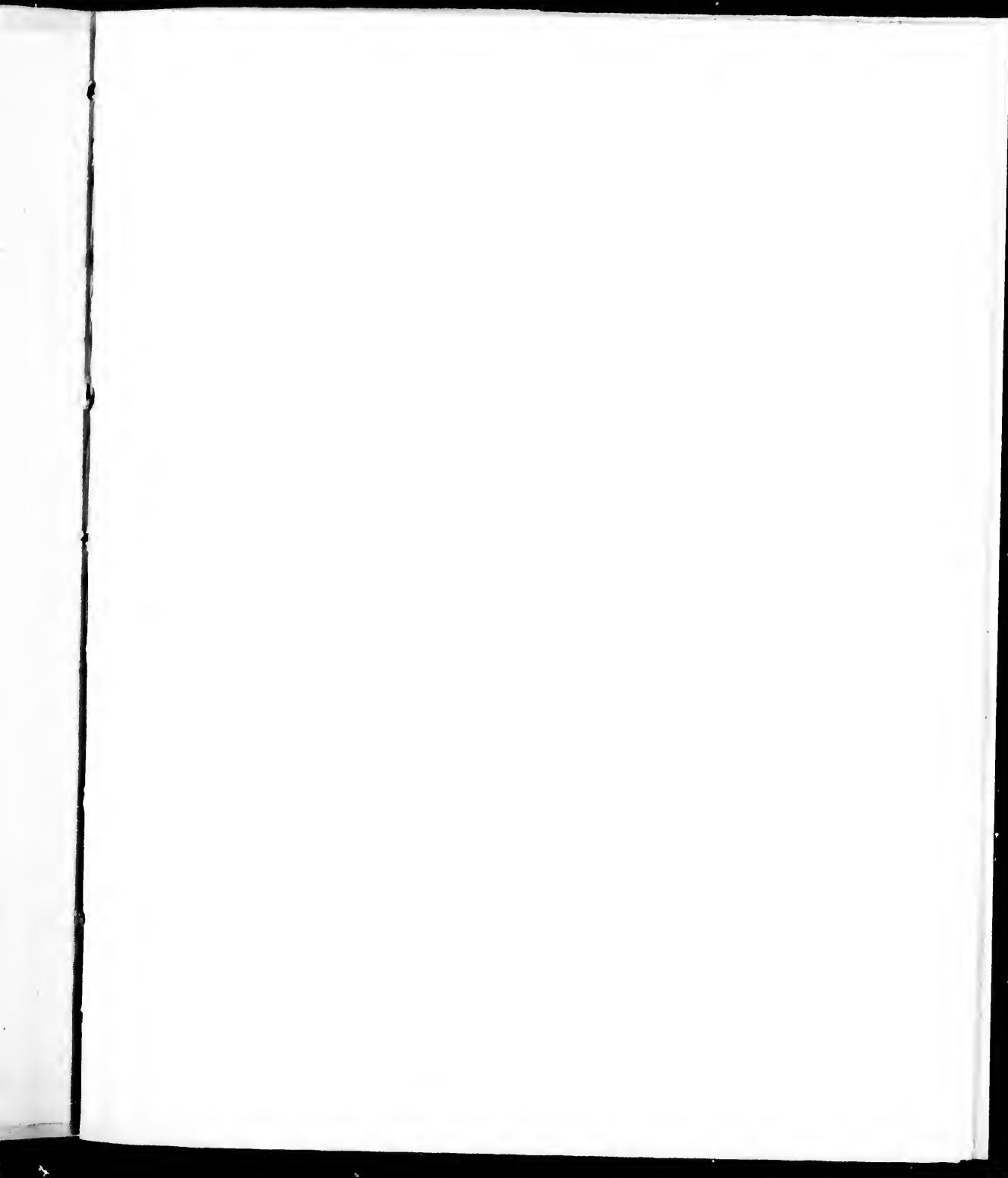


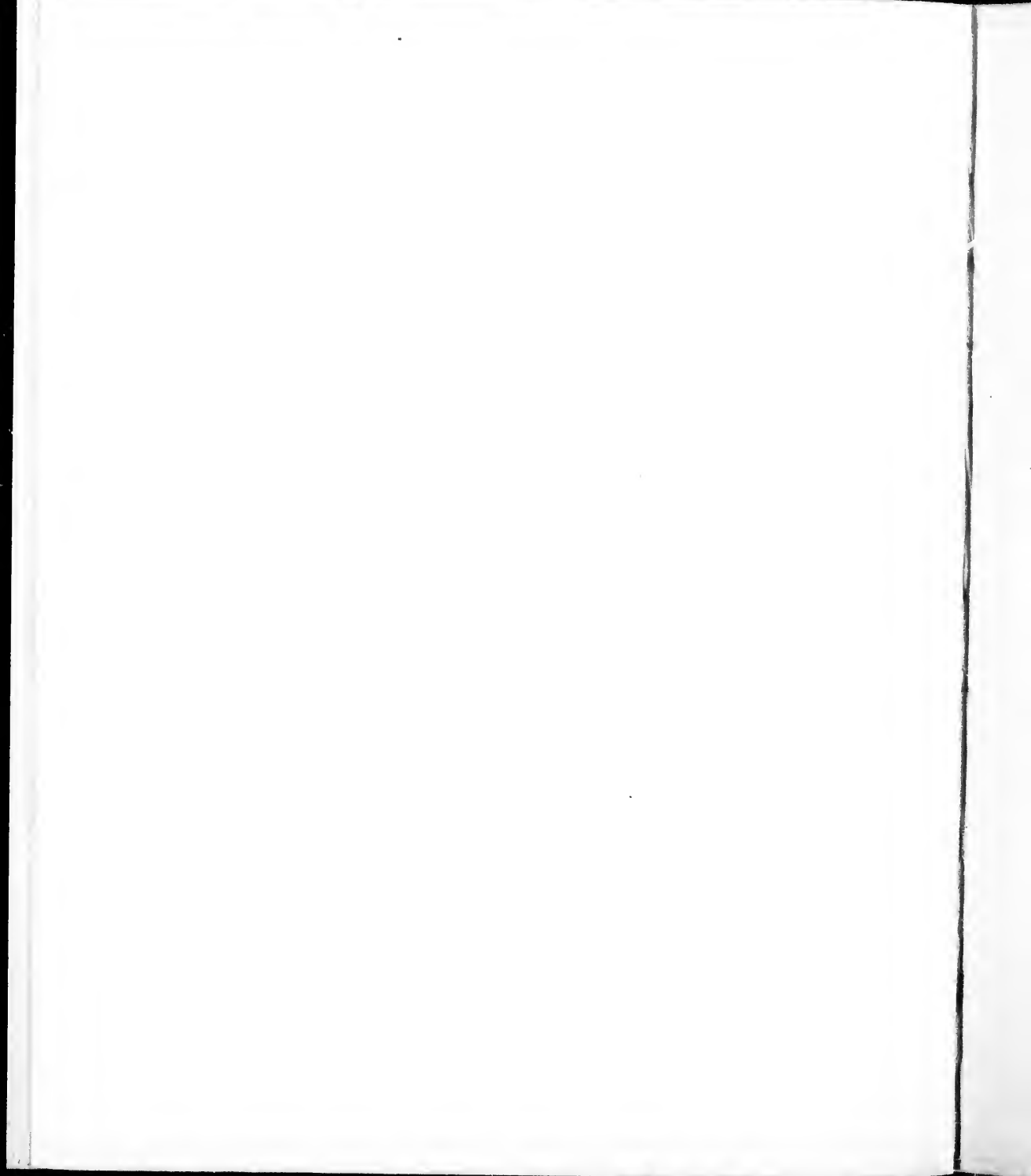
CONSTITUTION.

1. NAME.—The name of the Society shall be the
CANADIAN NATIONAL LEAGUE.
2. OBJECTS.—The objects of the League shall be :
To advance and maintain our national unity
and integrity, to disseminate a spirit of
patriotism, to promote an interest in citizen-
ship, its duties and rights, to spread a know-
ledge of Canadian history and resources,
and other like objects.
3. MEMBERSHIP.—The membership shall be open to
all favoring the objects of the League.
4. MEMBERSHIP FEE.—The ordinary membership fee
shall be one dollar (\$1.00) a year, payable

to the Treasurer on admission, and renewable at the beginning of the Annual Meeting. Further contributions may be made by members, either for special objects or for the general purposes of the League.

5. BRANCHES.—The formation of similar societies in other localities will be encouraged.
6. ANNUAL PUBLIC GATHERING.—A public gathering shall be held in February of each year for which a programme of Canadian character shall be arranged, which shall include a patriotic address.
7. SPECIAL WORK.—Special efforts shall be made to induce all connected with our educational institutions to foster a patriotic spirit in the minds of the young.
8. PARTY POLITICS.—No vote shall be taken on any question of current party politics, unless by unanimous consent of the meeting.





BY-LAWS.



1. ORDINARY MEETINGS.—Ordinary meetings shall be held, unless otherwise determined by the Council, on the third Monday of every month from September to April of each year, the programme for which shall be of a literary, musical or social character, as may be arranged by the committee. Ten members shall form a quorum.
2. SPECIAL MEETINGS.—Special meetings may be held on the call of the President, or at the request, in writing, of any five members of the League, and shall be summoned by the

Secretary, or, in his default, by the President or requesting members.

3. OFFICERS.—The officers shall consist of an Honorary President, and of as many Honorary Vice-Presidents as may be determined by the Council, and of a President, 1st and 2nd Vice-Presidents, Treasurer and two Joint Secretaries and a Council of eight who shall be elected by ballot, and shall hold office until their successors are elected. The Council shall have the management of the League. Five members shall form a quorum of the Council. Any vacancies in the Council may be filled by the Council itself.
4. ANNUAL MEETING.—The annual meeting for the election of officers and other business shall be held at the regular October meeting, and shall be called by notice of at least one.

week, and in a manner to be determined by the Council.

5. ELECTION OF MEMBERS.—Members shall be nominated at a meeting of the League, or by letter addressed to the Secretary, who shall notify the Council of such nomination. The election shall be by the Council, in such manner as it may determine. Ladies may be members of the League.
6. EXPULSION.—Any motion for expulsion of a member shall be made at an ordinary meeting and referred to the Council, who shall duly notify the member interested, and bring the matter before the next regular meeting, which shall vote thereon by ballot, and a two-thirds majority shall decide the question.
7. ORDER OF BUSINESS.—The order of business at

regular meetings, unless otherwise provided at the time of meeting, shall be :—

1. Reading of minutes.
 2. Business arising out of minutes.
 3. Reports from the Council.
 4. Unfinished business.
 5. New business.
 6. Literary or other programme.
8. AMENDMENT OF THE CONSTITUTION OR BY-LAWS.—
- No change in the Constitution or By-laws shall be made, except at the Annual Meeting, after at least one month's notice being given of the intended change. Such notice shall be intimated to all members in the circular or notice calling the Annual Meeting. A two-thirds vote of the members present shall be necessary to effect any change.
